 In reply to Your Lordship's despatch No. 2 of January 5th, I have the honour to report that if the sailing date of a steamer is inserted at Mombasa as suggested it will be impossible to issue officers' last pay certificates before they sail as is done under the present system.

2. In the event of a steamer sailing later than the advertised date, a note to this effect is made and the matter adjusted on the officer's return from leave.

3. Cases similar to that of Mr. Giles happened even when the Treasury office Headquarters were in Mombasa, and are, though of very rare occurrence, unavoidable.

4. Under the circumstances I trust that Your Lordship will agree to the present system being continued.
