My Lord,

I have the honour to enquire whether in the absence of the Governor on leave the Officer administering the Government is entitled to any acting allowance in addition to the Duty Allowance attached to the post.

2. The question has special reference to the case of Mr. F. J. Jackson, Lieutenant Governor, who last year administered the Protectorate from April 15th to September 15th, the dates of Sir James Hayes Sadler's departure and my arrival respectively. He drew duty allowance at the rate of £500/- p.a. during this period, but there were considerable savings on the Governor's salary in addition to this during the latter part

of the time and I should be very glad if these or at any rate some portion of them might be devoted to the payment of an acting allowance to Mr. Jackson. In any case I presume that he would be entitled to draw Duty Allowance at the rate of £1,000 p.a. from August 28th the date of my own appointment.

3. A salary of £1,500 p.a. is quite inadequate in the case of an Officer Administering the Government of this Protectorate. The responsibilities and expenses are equally heavy and the cost of living at Nairobi is abnormally high. A great deal of entertaining has to be done even in ordinary circumstances and the visits of Ex-President Roosevelt and Admiral Egerton during Mr. Jackson's tenure of office threw an additional burden on his shoulders in this respect.

4. I would therefore solicit the most generous treatment compatible with regulations on his behalf.


