My Lord,

With reference to Your Lordship's despatch No. 769 of December 28th last respecting the estimates I have the honour to make the following observations:-

2. Taking Your Lordship's remarks on the proposals made in order.

(1) I regret that it is not thought possible to fix the salaries of my Aide-de-Camps at £300 instead of £250. This is less than is drawn in Northern Nigeria where the expenses of living in the way of clubs and subscriptions are much lower and where the social duties are very considerably less onerous.

(2) I have already addressed Your Lordship on the subject of proposed reductions in the Secretariat vide my despatch No. 72 of February 14th from which Your Lordship will perceive that the Staff, even at its present strength, is very fully occupied in performing the duties expected of it.

I would however observe that the posts of Chief Clerk and Shorthand writer in my office will be combined and that the creation of two separate appointments is not contemplated. I gather that this has
