There are several inaccuracies in this correspondence.

(1). The Secretary to the Syndicate quotes the Indian rate of 2 annas 6 pies per truck of not exceeding 70 sheep. No 4-wheeled metre gauge truck will take more than 50 sheep and the limit of 70 refers to broad gauge vehicles.

(2). Our advertised rate is 8 annas per truck per mile with a limit of 50 sheep per truck. If this number is put in it comes, for 390 miles, to 32.4 pence = 5/2 per head. As I have repeatedly explained before the reason why it cost the Syndicate 10sh. 1d. per head was that they only put 26 sheep into each truck.

(3). Mr. Antrobus quotes a rate of 12 annas per truck per mile for 100 sheep taken from page 25 of our Goods Tariff. This is for a double decked truck we built as an experiment and which is very little used.

As there is only one of these trucks it will be of little use for the 5,000 sheep.

Our rate is Rs. 0.8.0/- per truck per mile and the cost per head all depends upon the number of sheep the syndicate puts into each.
