My Lord,

With reference to my despatch No. 6 of January 6th transmitting a list of posts in the Protectorate Service which it is considered desirable to secure, I have the honour to report that the Chief of Customs is anxious that such posts in his Department should be secured at once without waiting for a change in the present holders, as suggested in paragraph 4 of Your Lordship's despatch No. 201 of November 8th. No guarantee has hitherto been required in the case of these officials.

2. Mr. Major is doubtless best qualified to judge in a matter of this kind in so far as it affects the subordinate officials of his Department and I would therefore recommend his proposal for Your Lordship's sanction.

3. In the event of its being approved I would request that the necessary arrangements may be made with the Guardian Assurance Company through the Crown Agents.
