A. to insure secure the officers, & tell the Cpt. that we have done so, adding that this is done on the assumption, since he says nothing to the contrary, that ~~there~~ there will be no difficulty in deducting the premia from the salaries of the officers named, although they have not previously been required to give security.

If the Cpt. replies that he meant the Cpt. to pay these premia so long as the present holders continue in office, we should have, I presume, to go ~~ask~~ to the Treasury. At 15% on the amount involved, this means a charge of £27-10 p.a. It is worth while running this risk in a matter which, to judge from the "anxiety" of the Chief of Customs &
