Sir,

I have laid before the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury Mr. Fiddes' letter of the 25th ultimo (22212/1911) relative to an application received from Mrs. Boileau for the grant of a pension or gratuity in view of the circumstances attending the death of her husband, the late Major Boileau, a Stock Inspector in the Veterinary Department of the East Africa Protectorate.

In reply I am to request you to inform Mr.

Secretary Harcourt that My Lords see difficulty in applying the analogy of the Warrant under Section 1 of the Superannuation Act, 1887 to East Africa; irrespectively of this consideration it does not appear to Them that, in the circumstances stated, Mrs.Boilean's case satisfies the conditions which would be necessary for an award under the warrant.

While, however, for these reasons by Lords feel. Themselves debarred from awarding life. Boileau any pension from public funds. They are willing in deference to the representations of the Secretary of State to overlook the fact that her case does notfulfil in point of destitution the conditions prescribed for the grant of compassionate gratuities, They accordingly suthorise the payment to

her.
