Sir,

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your Confidential despatch of September 9th, 1913, from which I learn that Mr Ainsworth has followed my suggestion that he should seek opportunity of discussing with the Colonial Office the proposals embodied in a series of memoranda prepared by himself on the subject of Native Administration.

The questions for consideration are of so comprehensive a nature that I find my personal knowledge of the subject insufficient to justify me in attempting to outline a policy for the future. I imagine that Mr Ainsworth may have been favoured with an expression of the views of the Colonial Office regarding some or all of the points taken in his memoranda, and I desire to receive from him an account of his interviews, as well as his assistance in the solution of the questions awaiting settlement before venturing to formulate any definite opinion.
