2. As regards the ruling given in paragraph 2 of the latter despatch I do not think that you were aware that arrangements had been made to give effect to the instructions contained in your despatch No. 534 of July 4th. As a matter of fact the New Company from Nyasaland arrived in this country on October 8th and three-quarters of a Company was sent to Kauzibar on the 14th idem to replace the Armed Constabulary. It was not possible to send a full Company but the balance of men will be despatched as soon as possible.

3. I am not yet in possession of your final instructions as to the amount of the reimbursement which Kauzibar should make in respect of this new Company, vide your despatch No. 534 of July 4th, but whatever amount is decided on I think that its cost should be charge

charge against that Government from the day when this Protectorate is charged with the cost of the new Company from Nyasaland.

4. The contributions from the Zanzibar Government have in the past been based on the assumption that the strength of each Company was 100 rank and file. In the case of this new Company I understand that the Acting Agent and Consul General arranged with the Officer Commanding Troops that a pro rata contribution should be paid until the Company was brought up to its full strength. I shall have no objection to make to this arrangement, and I shall be glad to receive your further instructions as to the amount of the reimbursement by the Zanzibar Government in order that the necessary arrangements may be made to recover the same at the end of the financial year.
