You 14673

April following telegram received from Graham begins
April 22nd have sent following to Ward - begins -
convoy arrived yesterday and moving out again twenty
third. On arrival at Garrebahare will decide definite-
ly whether your battalion can return immediately; if
so, orders will be sent to be communicated to you on
receipt of which you will make your own arrangements.
Sending copy of this Bowring and directing Hickson
to proceed to Jubaland to take over from you - ends.
Soemes returned yesterday and considers possible most
hostile tribes coming in. Have telegraphed to
Salkeld to proceed expeditiously. Presume Governor
and Commander-in-Chief gives me carte blanche
regarding reduction in local garrison as circumstances
permit. telegram ends.
