Sir,

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your telegram of the 11th instant respecting the engagement of Messrs. Aston, Rice and Brown as European Constables.

2. The two latter are required to fill two of the five vacancies referred to in paragraph 5 of the Governor's despatch No. 236 of the 13th ultimo, and not any of those referred to in paragraph 2.

I should be obliged therefore if the Crown Agents could be instructed to fill the four vacancies mentioned in paragraph 4 of the despatch above quoted as soon as possible.
