Physical infirmity was the cause of his discharge

His leg is still stiff, but gives him no trouble.  
He has since 1900 served as Laboratory  
Asst. at Guy's Hospital 1902-1906 96  
London - 1907-1910 (April)

He has excellent testimonials from both  
Hospitals and must have acquired  
with experience. I think of Guy's Hospital  
superior to him as especially competent  
as regards bacteriology and experimental  
work on animals.

and child in England.

I think you agreed that the choice lies  
between Ford and Clark. Between a  
young unmarried man with knowledge but  
little experience, and a married man of  
39 with considerable experience and  
proved good character.

To appoint a man of 39 to the post would  
certainly be an innovation, and Mr. Clark  
would have considerably younger men  
above him. Apart from the question  
of age, I doubt whether there is a great  
deal to choose between the two.
