1. All Assistant Surgeons, Sub-Assistant Surgeons and Compounders, though borns of the Strength of the Civil Medical Department in the East Africa, and Uganda Protectorates, will be inble for duty with the Military Department at the discretion of the Principal Medical Officer.

2. Qualifications.

- (a) Good character, physique, qualified in English.
 - b) Religion, immaterial.
- (c) Assistant Surgeons must possess a University Degree or Medical Diploma.
- (d) Sub-Assistant Surgeons must possess Certificates of Competency from recognised Indian colleges and schools, lists of which to be kept and supplied to the Agents in Bombay.

3. Period of Engagement.

Three years from the day on which the employee lands at Monbash until the day of his departure therefrom on his return as India. This term is subject to extension owing to exigencies of the service.

4. Pay.
