With reference to your despatch No. 670 of the 19th of August 1913, I have the honour to report that the total number of cases of enteric fever known to have occurred among the European population of the East Africa Protectorate during the year 1912 was 25, and during the year 1913 was 24.

2. As these cases include those which were attended by private practitioners, it is probable that they differ in some degree from certain of the Statistical Returns for the years in question.

3. There is no evidence that any of the patients had been inoculated prior to the natural onset of the disease.
