RESUME of WAR DIARY from 27th May 1916 to  
2nd June 1916 (inclusive).

May 27th.      Lake Detachment.      Belgian Operations. - Report  
no change.

1st Division.      Eastern Column (No.1) has joined  
up with the Centre Column (No.2), and this combined  
force is advancing by road East of Southern Pare  
Mountains to the Genya Gap.

2nd Division from Kondoa report that that place  
was again shelled heavily.

May 28th.      Lake Detachment.      Belgian Operations. - A junction  
has been effected between Colonel Molitor's Column  
with Olsen's Column at Niansa and Rouling's Column  
at Kageye.

1st Division.      Western Column (No.3) reached a  
point on the Pangani River, 20 miles from the junction  
of road and railway, without opposition.

2nd Division from Kondoa reports no fresh  
developments.

3rd Division.      General Brits commenced organi-  
sation of 2nd Mounted Brigade, at Mbuyuni, which has  
been arriving in separate units from South Africa.

May 29th.      Lake Detachment.      Belgian Operations. - Report  
no change.

1st Division.      Western Column (No.3) reached a  
point 10 miles from junction of Pangani River and  
railway. Its advanced troops were heavily shelled by  
enemy

enemy 4.1" gun from direction of railway.

2nd Division from Kondoa reports inter-tribal fighting and raiding at Umbulu.

3rd Division. - No report.

General Northey from Nyasaland reports that his force occupied New Langenburg, which was evacuated, leaving large stores of S.A. ammunition and food. The enemy is being pursued, much demoralised, towards Iringa.

Portuguese Forces attempted to cross the Rowama River, near the Coast, but were thrown back with a loss of 308 killed and captured; number of wounded unknown. (This action occurred on May 26th).

May 30th.

Lake Detachment. Belgian Operations. - Report no change.

1st Division reached South end of Pare Mountains, and found enemy entrenched at narrow neck between Mountains and Pangani River. The Eastern and Centre Columns, which were following the road East of Pare Mountains, reached Gonya and was expected in two days to be in a position to outflank enemy at Kikacheni.

2nd Division from Kondoa report no further developments.

Intelligence Report - (1) Estimate of enemy's forces, (2) Distribution of enemy's forces, (3) Enemy's strength and artillery and machine guns attached.

May 31st.

Lake Detachment. Belgian Operations. - Report no change.

1st Division. Pangani Column (No.3) engaged enemy

enemy on May 30th, and occupied position covering defile between Pangani River and the South end of the Pare Mountains, three miles S.E. of Mabirioni. Our casualties - 2 officers, 7 men, wounded. Enemy's casualties unknown.

2nd Division from Kondea report heavy bombardment at that place (May 30th); our casualties - 2 men killed, 2 wounded.

No. 10 Battery (Naval 4-inch) left Ufiome for Kondea May 30th.

June 1st. Lake Detachment. Belgian Operations. - Report no change.

1st Division carried enemy's position at Mikacheni. Enemy retired to Mkomazi station, blowing up railway bridge there and leaving a wrecked train in our hands.

The Pangani Column reached Buiko station.

The Column which marched round the East of the Pare Mountains reached Shégulu bridge over the Mkomazi River, enemy falling back on Mombo.

2nd Division from Kondea reports usual bombardment.

June 2nd. Lake Detachment. Belgian Operations. - Report no change.

1st Division are concentrated at Buiko, occupied in completing bridges over Pangani River and improving roads for transport preparatory of further advance.

Commander-in-Chief arrived at Moschi from 1st Division en route for Kondea.

2nd Division from Kondea report daily bombardment;

also that on May 30th our garrison at Umbulu was attacked by 15 whites and 100 askaris; attack was repulsed, enemy leaving 11 killed, 4 wounded, on the ground, and many prisoners. Our casualties - 9 killed, 5 wounded.

No further reports from Nyasaland or of Portuguese operations.
