RESUME of WAR DIARY from 10th June 1916 to 15th June
1916 (inclusive.)

10th June. Lake Detachment. - Nothing reported.

1st Division. - Momba occupied by Hannington on the afternoon of the 9th after opposition by two enemy companies, which retired towards Korogwe. One maxim and one German were captured; our casualties, six wounded.

Mkalamo was occupied 7.30 this morning; our casualties - killed, two officers, ten other ranks; wounded, twenty-six other ranks.

2nd Division. - Nothing reported.

11th June. Lake Detachment. - Nothing reported.

1st Division. - Nothing reported.

2nd Division. - Nothing reported.

Intelligence Patrol reached and occupied Muheza on the 6th June, capturing four whites, three blacks, and killed two blacks. On the 7th June the patrol was engaged by the enemy, and had to retire, but got all kit &c. away.

12th June. Lake Detachment. - Nothing reported.

1st Division. - Nothing reported.

2nd Division from Kondoa report that on the 10th instant the enemy strongly reinforced their right flank. Our casualties - fifteen wounded, four killed.

Nyasaland Force. - On the 6th June a party of the enemy was attacked and scattered in the Poroto Mountains. Four Europeans, one field gun, rifles, ammunition, and mules were captured. Six askaris were found dead. Many wounded escaped in the bush. Our casualties, one killed. Bismarckburg was occupied

occupied on the 8th June.

Navy. - H.M.S. Challenger reports that to-day a series of heavy explosions were observed in the vicinity of Tanga. All buildings on the pier destroyed systematically. The pier itself was standing at 5.15 this afternoon.

13th June. Lake Detachment. - Commanding Kagera reports a strong patrol was despatched from Businda on the 11th June to reconnoitre Bugara district. This patrol met an enemy force composed of two Germans and thirty blacks, at 6 a.m. on the 12th June, which dispersed and retired. Our casualties - one private of the King's African Rifles severely wounded. Enemy's casualties unknown.

1st Division. - On the 12th June Hannington's Column reached Mkuyuni, and Sheppard's Column reached Funda.

2nd Division. - On 12th June an aeroplane dropped bombs with good effect which resulted in violent bombardment by enemy, aimed at aerodrome, which proved ineffective. No change in position otherwise.

Navy. - A report from H.M.S. Vengeance states that Tanga is not entirely evacuated. Seaplanes were fired on during reconnaissance, and whalers met with sharp maxim fire on entering the harbour.

14th June. Lake Detachment. - Nothing reported.

1st Division. - Nothing reported.

2nd Division. - Nothing reported.

15th June. Lake Detachment. - Ukerewe Island occupied on the 9th June.

1st Division. - Hannington's Column reached Mauri Station on 14th June. Sheppard's Column at Kwedizewa, six miles
