Sir,

I have the honour to request that steps may be taken to fill the post of Assistant Entomologist rendered vacant by the resignation of Mr. R. H. Deakin.

2. The Government Entomologist has been seconded for military duties and is now engaged in the investigation of the tsetse fly areas in German East Africa. On his return, his present tour of service will be approaching completion, and in order that the work of his division may be resumed on the cessation of hostilities, it is very desirable that an assistant should be available who has had an opportunity of making himself conversant with local conditions, and will thus be able to carry on the research work when Mr. Anderson proceeds on leave.

3. I am well aware that the present moment is somewhat inopportune for making this request, but I trust that every endeavour will be made to obtain a suitable candidate.
