In our despatch of the 31st of July on Gov./62012/16, the Secretary of State has definitely declined to consider the separation of the administration of native and non-native districts before the end of the war. Mr. Ainsworth's special appointment will, therefore, not come into being yet awhile. The native problems will, however, be specially difficult in the interval, and I can well believe that Mr. Ainsworth would be specially valuable to the Officer Administering the Government in the capacity of Adviser on Native Affairs for some considerable time to come. I would therefore, propose to reply as in the draft telegram herewith.
