This is a proposal to lease for
25 years of an area of 50 sq. miles
for collecting & cultivating fever.

The burns are similar to those
appear in similar cases & the
only difficulty is that it is
in a native reserve. The area

of the reserve is 1800 sq m
for 115,000 people and the
part affected is situated like
unoccupied, & the nearest
village 8 miles distant.

In reply to Mr. Hearn, 25449/4
it was stated that answer to
be communicated exapt with the

consent of the natives. This consent
may be difficult to obtain from
the head of any representative body
of persons who could consent in the
name of the tribe. I think that
if the enterprise is granted at all, it
will be explained to the natives
that the land will revert to the
Government at the end of 25 years,
and that in the meantime the rest
of royalties received by the Govt
from the land will be spent
for the benefit of the natives of
that region either in making
roads or in educating them etc.
This will be a rather bad scheme
but worth the trouble of establishing
in a round figure.

If it possible that the particular area might be leased without injury to the native population at the moment, but it would create a dangerous precedent, and might excite suspicion of our good faith as to reserves generally. I do not see how the account of the natives could be effectively obtained, but if it really could, there might be ground for re-opening the question. Meanwhile I am not prepared to consent to any alienation.
