Sir,

In reply to your letter of March 29th, in November 1918 I arranged for Captain P.T.S. Maxsted, East African Local Forces, to go to the Riviera, and to stay at Miss Paget's Home - Chateau Garibondy, Cannes, free of charges. The expenses of his journey amounting to approximately £12, were paid by this Department. While Captain Maxsted was at the Chateau Garibondy, he became ill and was taken to a nursing home; during which time the expenses of an operation he was obliged to undergo, and his nursing fees amounted to £118. I suggested to Captain Maxsted that when he left the nursing home, he should go to the Hotel Californie, Cannes, which has been taken over by us as a Convalescent Home for Officers, and where he would be able to obtain the best possible nursing and treatment. Captain Maxsted, however, preferred to make his own arrangements to stay

at the Riviera Palace Hotel, Mentone. He is, therefore,  
no longer under our care, nor are we responsible for  
any further expenses in connection with his  
convalescence in the South of France.

I may add that it is very unusual for us  
to pay so large a sum for the treatment of any  
single officer, and that we sent Captain Maxted  
to the Riviera on the understanding that he was a  
convalescent case, and would not require any special  
treatment; otherwise he would, of course, have gone  
into a regular Hospital until he was strong enough to go  
abroad.
