# STRIDOM DIES IN CAPE TOWN HOSPITAL

## Headline news shock to South Africa CABINET CALLED

Death was announced in Cape Town early yesterday of Mr. Johannes Stridom, Prime Minister of South Africa since 1954. He was 65 and had been seriously ill in hospital for a week, with an embolism of the lung.

Successor of Mr. Stridom's illness, the Minister of Justice, Mr. Swart, was appointed Acting Prime Minister of the Union three days ago. He presided yesterday afternoon at a specially-called meeting of the Cabinet, after flying back from the Orange Free State on hearing of the Prime Minister's death.

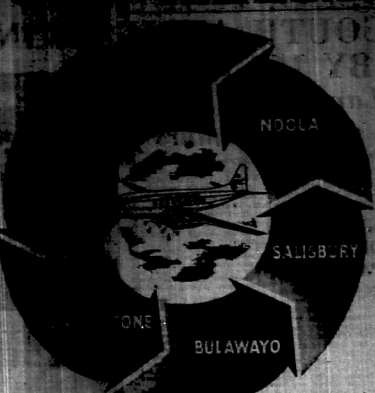

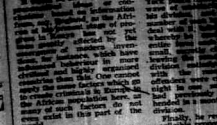

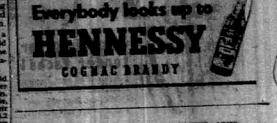
