## Kenya and Cyprus 'joined by common ideals'

## President Makarios of Cyprus said yesterday that Kenya and Cyprus shared the same ideas on international issues and that it was the earnest desire of both countries that international relations based on friendship, respect and co-operation should be promoted.

The Cypriot leader, who was speaking in Nairobi at a civic luncheon given in his honour by the Mayor, Councillors and the City Council, said that the two countries shared a common colonial heritage as well as a determination to guard jealously their hard-won independence.

Turning to Councillor Eugene, he said he was happy to be in the beautiful city of Nairobi where he had once lived "at a most difficult time".

"I have been struck by the reception I have received in this country both at the coast and in the capital. There were friendly and cheerful people everywhere full of enthusiasm."

The Archbishop said that his visit to Mombasa had been a very moving occasion since he had passed through there 14 years before on his way to exile in the Seychelles.

"It was also moving," he added, "that years back, when I was in Nairobi, many Kenyans visited me at the Greek Orthodox Church despite the restrictions placed on them by the colonial government. Many gathered to see me despite attempts by the police to make them disperse."

The reception, he said, was now happily in the past. He was glad to be in Nairobi as a free man in a free country.

I am happy to have met Mr. Kenyatta whose friendship I value so much. I thank him for giving me the opportunity to visit this country which I shall remember throughout the rest of my life.

The Archbishop was cheered when he ended his speech by saying in Kiswahili: *Shukuru sana kwa Tanzania* (thank you very much for inviting me).

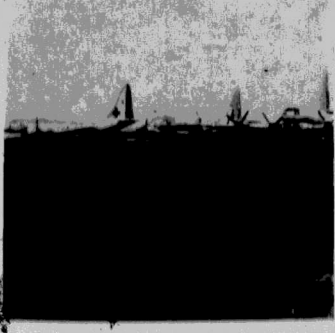
Earlier, when welcoming President Makarios, Councillor Eugene said Nairobi and Mombasa had some concrete ties in both the commercial and industrial fields.

"I believe I speak for all when I say that Kenya welcomes your participation, Nairobi, as the central city and the commercial and industrial hub of the country, plays a vital role in foreign trade. We are ready to help in every way we can and I trust that this visit will lead to concrete ties between us in these fields."

Kenya, Eugene said, that the people of Nairobi and Kenya as a whole were aware of the need for closer co-operation between all peoples in the developing world.

President Kenyatta yesterday sent a message to Maj-Gen. Gowon, appealing to him to let in aid from member States of the O.A.U. to help refugees in Biafra.

The President further appealed to external powers not to use the existing situation as an excuse in meddling in Nigeria's internal affairs.

The message, sent yesterday to Gen. Gowon, said:

It is with a feeling of great relief that I welcome the news of Biafran surrender. Your struggle for a united Nigeria has triumphed.

I am hopeful that the question of relief and rehabilitation will not be mired with urgency and haste. The Government and people of Kenya are in the process of despatching appropriate assistance to their brethren in Biafra in the spirit of African fraternity and goodwill. The Federal Government might wish to favour all forms of assistance from member States of the O.A.U.

I appeal earnestly to external powers not to use the existing situation as an excuse for meddling in Nigeria's internal affairs.

The Government, the people of Kenya and I remain firmly convinced that the Nigerian as a whole will now establish a lasting peace, unity and prosperity with a united Nigeria. Their material, moral and other resources will no doubt be directed towards the achievement of this overriding objective.

I trust that just as you have shown remarkable resolution and courage for the cause of Nigerian unity during the period of this crisis, you will continue to show magnanimity and goodwill in the future.

## Biafran leaders begin talks on armistice

A Biafran economic delegation flew into Lagos from Port Harcourt yesterday for armistice talks with Nigerian Federal Government leaders.

The armistice delegation was headed by the economist, Chief Justice Sir Louis Mbanefo. Other members were Mr. J. J. Enunobio, Attorney-General, Professor Eni Njoku, former Vice-Chancellor of Lagos University, Chief A. E. Harey and Mr. E. Aguma.

The delegation, headed and accompanied by military members at the airport and was ushered into cars with an escort of three army jeeps containing at least a dozen armed soldiers. The convoy then moved off for an unknown destination.

The Biafran leader, Gen. Philip Ebhoza, has said the delegation would be prepared to negotiate a peaceful settlement of the civil war on the basis of terms demanded by Federal Nigeria.

Gen. Ebhoza yesterday announced the formal end of the Biafran rebellion.

The commander of the Federal Third Marine Division, Lt. Col. Oshagiri, presented Gen. Ebhoza on a small group of Biafran leaders to Gen. Gowon and said they had come "to formally give up aggression and report for appointment and re-employment."

Gen. Gowon warmly embraced Gen. Ebhoza and said "welcome back Philip, welcome back."

At the ceremony, held before a small group of Nigerian journalists and five foreign Pressmen, Gen. Gowon renewed his pledge to grant an amnesty to "practically everyone" who had served the cause of Biafran secession.

Gen. Gowon, in a television interview in London, promised "gentle" treatment for defeated Biafrans but had bitter words for Gen. Ojukwu.

"We want to prove to the world that we are men of our word," he said, adding that his troops had been instructed to ensure that in Biafra there was no massacre.

Asked why he thought Gen. Ojukwu had left the country, the Federal leader snarled and said, "Your guess is as good as mine."

He said Gen. Ojukwu had run away and left his people whom he had led into "self-destruction" and now had to beg for mercy.

## Aid groups 'shocked' by Nigerian ban

Speakers for one of the main relief groups, blacklisted by the Nigerian Government yesterday expressed "shock and outrage" at the Federal decision and said they hoped they would be allowed to continue their work under Nigerian control.

A spokesman for the Swedish Lutheran Church which participates in the now banned Inter-Church Aid, Mr. Bjorklund, said "We hope the Nigerian Government will reverse their decision and authorize us to distribute food and medicine to Nigeria as well as Biafra."

Mr. Bjorklund noted that a Swedish delegation including a Swedish Red Cross and a Joint Church Aid member had arrived in Lagos for talks with the Nigerian authorities.

Also banned by the Nigerians are the Nordic Red Cross, the French Red Cross, the Catholic organization Caritas International and Christian Aid, a private Canadian group, as well as all aid from France, Portugal, South Africa and Rhodesia.

## Britain admits girl Kenya sent back

An 18-year-old Asian girl with a British passport who was refused permission to enter Britain last week arrived back in London yesterday - and this time she was allowed to stay.

"I have had enough of flying for a little while" said pretty Miss Manjula Modha when she arrived from Nairobi.

She was refused permission to come into England last week and was sent back to Nairobi, where officials said, "I couldn't go back into Kenya and set me off to London again," she explained.

Miss Modha spent six days in a room in a Heathrow Airport detention block in London when she returned.

Representations were made to the Kenya Government last Friday and the British Home Office Junior Minister, Mr. Marilyn Rees, reportedly authorised an expulsion order on Monday following information from the British High Commission in Nairobi not objecting to the girl's repatriation.

London was irritated over Miss Modha's detention because it was not clear whether she was a British citizen or not.

NEWS FROM THE PROVINCES
MORE TEA PLANTED AT KAKAMEGA

Green leaf yield last year in Kakamega District of Western Province totalled 1,355,972lb. according to the Kenya Tea Development Authority annual report released by Mr. O. J. Kibingo, Tea Officer for Kakamega.

Mr. Kibingo's report stated that the whole tea planting area suffered from potato aphid infestation which was controlled by spraying M.P.K. fertilizer as a top dressing to all the mature tea.

Under the authority's credit scheme, a total of 10,000 tons of fertilizer were ordered and applied to approximately 269 acres of mature tea. This, he said, was only 40 per cent of the expected fertilizer application.

Mr. Kibingo said that nearly 500 acres of tea were planted in May/June and all have been doing well except one.

THE ASSISTANT MINISTER for Tourism and Wildlife, Mr. J. M. Kariki, has presented the Bishop of Nyeri, the Rt. Rev. C. M. Gatimu, with a cheque for 160 for the Nyakimbi Harabees Secondary School.

The money will be used to buy beds and other equipment for the dormitories for the school which opened at the beginning of last year.

The Bishop, who said he ran 26 schools, among them 18 Harabees schools, four paraffin schools, two orphanages and two schools for deaf and mute children, had to close an orphanage for boys due to lack of funds.

Paying tribute to Mr. Kariki, the Bishop said that he was grateful the Assistant Minister had come to know of the burden 160 carried by him but had presented him with the money.

Mr. Kariki stressed the need for opening orphanages in the district in the province.

# Breaking down the bridges

An eminently sensible article, written for *The Guardian* Africa in a different light from that represented in some quarters in these countries.

For example, the V.O.K. broadcast a commentary in customary slanting language which gave the impression that India and Pakistan had rightly boycotted South Africa because of apartheid in sport, so this supported the cancellation of the M.C.C. tour in Kenya. What the V.O.K. did not say was that India and Pakistan, for that matter New Zealand, had not boycotted the M.C.C. or any other organisation of English cricket.

A correspondent this week pointed out vigilantes should be on their guard against "double standards". Every year the M.C.C. plays against Surrey. Though contaminated by this contact — the M.C.C. having supposedly played against South Africa or at least committed at the invitation to South Africa to send a touring team to the UK — Surrey has played several Sunday matches against a club called East Molesey to raise funds for charity. Now see what has happened.

"The double standards of the M.C.C. have, to the incalculable benefit of cricket and human relations generally, been widely spotted and publicised," the correspondent went on, "but the infected and guilty men from East Molesey were here in 1967 to pollute the free fields of Kenya by playing cricket."

Some correspondents suggested that, to be consistent, Kenya and Uganda should break other relations with countries having ties with South Africa. Why not boycott any country, black, white or barred, that carries on diplomatic or trade relations with South Africa? And go the whole hog, refusing to accept any aid from such sources.

Omar Kureishi is Pakistan's leading cricket commentator. Very clearly he entertains misgivings about the wisdom of cancelling the M.C.C. tour deeper than any expressed by some of his own kith and kin in Kenya. He fears a chain reaction but doubts whether the governing cricket boards in the "Coloured Uganda." Moreover, he finds it "ironic" that England should be singled out, considering the "firing example" set in its multi-racial sport.

Like all other reasonable people, he is dead set against apartheid. Much confusion arises at this point, because the issue is clouded by emotionalism. Those who disagree with the M.C.C. ban should not be accused of pro-apartheid feelings. The central question is how best to defeat apartheid. A great many ordinary folk feel preventing an innocent game of cricket in South Africa. This is an allusion to the contention that playing against South African teams and athletes puts them the chance to see how wrong apartheid is and how friendly multi-racial relations can work out.

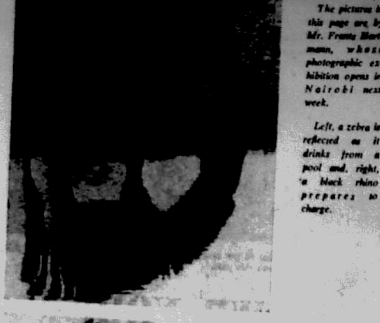
Argument over the ban may be merely dilatory at this stage, since there is scant prospect of the M.C.C. carrying out the tour even if the decision were rescinded. But the argument emerges from the academic plane and enters the real world when the implications are considered and discussion may help to shape future decisions.

These countries have attracted adverse publicity because of the ban, contrasted with the praise for Kenya's liberal policy when approval was originally given. Who is likely to take the risk of an other-tour in arrangements by undertaking to organise an inter-racial tour from the U.K.?

If this sequence continues, there will soon be pressure in a number of countries left for Kenya to compete against. To be logical, as Mr. Lugiano suggested, Kenya should not take part in the Commonwealth Games. He did not mean "ban the Games," as sometimes misinterpreted, he was pointing out the unwanted but natural limit to the policy.

The M.C.C. invitation to Kenya had been approved by a Minister acting for the Government. The Ministers changed, but the Government did not as a result of the elections. Therefore the Government's initial policy could reasonably have been expected to remain unaltered.

There is also a misconception, again seen in the V.O.K. comments, that the M.C.C. players were those who intended to play against South Africa, a year ago, until D'Oliveira was barred, causing their tour to be cancelled. It is strange anybody should think the M.C.C. is the kind of club that flecks the same team consistently. Membership of the M.C.C. during the same tour is not the same. Suppose the team currently under question had been valued the Cavaliers or Dorset Dell Wanderers, would there have been any cause for prohibition?

Some of our lions have snapped more times than a Holly wood film star. Cal-clambering zebras have not more publicly for certain types of vehicles on a day than an energetic public relations man could hope to win in a month.

Yet it is surprising how many hundred visitors one hears from residents who take rest days in the parks. How many have had cameras just when that elephant flaps its ears in mock charge? How many others have produced blurred or over-exposed pictures of that cheetah or kill?

The plain truth is that very few local amateur photographers are local amateur photographers at all. Many have two, three or even a dozen fancy cameras but very few, even after years of picture taking, have enough interest to mount an exhibition of their work.

Francis Hartmann, whose wildlife photographs will be on display at the New Stanley Art Gallery next week, is one of those few whose pictures and skill with a camera have been rewarded with a fine collection of pictures of animals, birds and the land in which they live.

Mr. Hartmann, who is a keen naturalist and photographer, is already well known to readers of *The East African* through his regular contributions to the magazine. His last couple of years and his colour shot of Anselmi's current issue.

"I am extremely worried about the future of Anselmi," he tells me. On the edge of Southern Masailand, 1,010 square miles of open plain, dense woodland, thicket and swamp have been added to Tanzania's already vast National Parks system. The former Tarangire Game Reserve was officially Gazetted as the Tarangire National Park last month. BRIAN JOHNS, the Standard's Arusha reporter, has just visited the area. Here is his report.

The Tarangire National Park, the third largest in Tanzania, taking in the Serengeti and Ruaha, each covering 1,000 square miles, and although in the very first stages of development is a great potential, according to the Park Warden, Mr. Stephen Ellis, well known in Kenya for his work for many years in the Tarangire National Park.

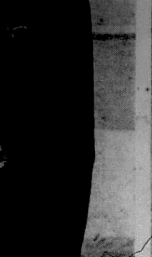
One cannot but admire the skill of Taylor and Burton in making a torrent of words seem important when they are being delivered but variations on all that has gone before in half a dozen similar scenes.

More than 1,600 older schoolchildren have been asked about the kind of world they would like to see in the year 2001. It was a fascinating exercise and here GAMESNEVIRATE reports on what disappoints and what excites them in Britain about their elders' ideas.

What will the world be like in 2001? As the states ended and the seventies began, 1,600 children from schools in London to consider the future. The children were aged 15 and 19 will be approaching 50 at the turn of the century. From among these age group will be drawn the men who lead tomorrow. "Soldiers and statesmen—civil servants and captains of industry—their generation will provide them." This is, if the present pattern survives. The consensus at this meeting of senior children held at Central Hall, London SW, was that it would be disastrous if the pattern does continue. The standard of the many hundreds of entries in the competition was so high that the task of eliminating them down to one winner was a difficult one.

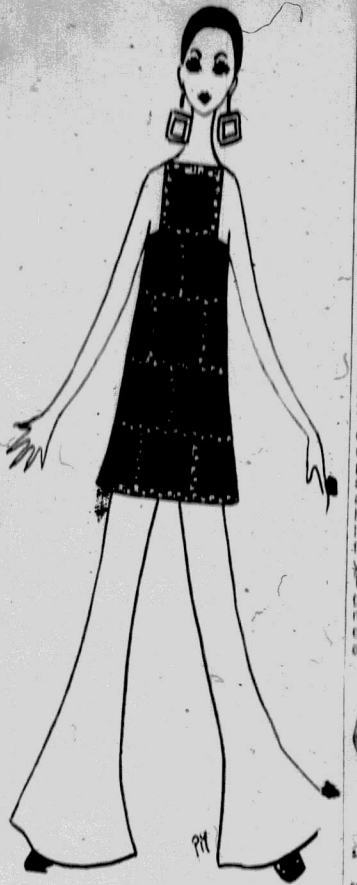

Mr. Coaker said he hoped these "modest" increases would not lead to an increase in handling charges which should remain stable during the next year, which was for ten months from January 1.

The employers said this would encourage producers and exporters to ship their goods direct, by-passing the warehouses. This, in turn, would increase the over-making handling very considerably.

The Government was already examining the possibility of making handlings cheaper and it had been suggested that the Maize and Produce Marketing Board might consider special containers and erect silos at Mombasa to reduce handling to a minimum.

The union replied that mechanisation was a process already going on and the trend would continue to increase in the future. They rejected the idea that the amount of goods already lost to the employers was large.

Mr. Coaker said the court was satisfied that the increased handling methods being undertaken by the employers would not lead to any labour-saving methods being undertaken by the country. The court felt that goods could be handled at Mombasa in an economic and efficient manner.

The diplomats were not named in the reports but the Express stated that they both had been declared persona non grata for security reasons. Its newspaper said the Express also said that the two men had been given 48 hours to leave the country.

The expulsion is the first in kind since June 1960 when two members of the Soviet Trade Mission were expelled from Britain.

The expulsion order comes only a few days after the arrest of a

68-year-old Labour Member of Parliament, Mr. William Owen, and charging with an offence under the Official Secrets Act.

Mr. Owen is a former secretary of the Parliamentary East-West Trade Commission and runs an East-West Agency in London.

Mr. Owen saw his solicitor in court today to arrange for legal representation which he appears to have secured.

Informal sources said an application for bail would be made during the appearance. His previous application, made in court on Friday, was refused by the magistrate sitting in a police station.

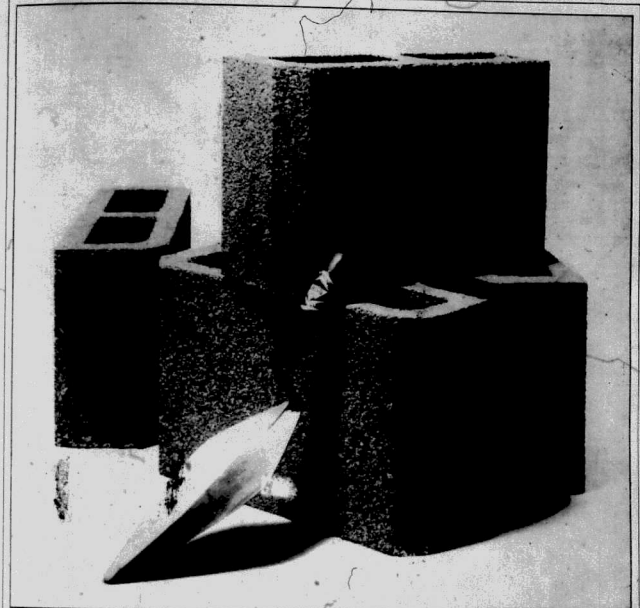

# Important place at entry points

The Customs and Excise Department assesses and collects duty on goods entering the East African market from outside and reflects excise from goods manufactured locally for the Partner States.

It also levies Transfer Tax on behalf of the Governments and enforces the laws relating to the national goods which are considered dutiable imports.

With the coming into force of the Treaty for East African Customs and Excise has been taken over by the Community Commission of Customs and Excise, East Africa, was redesignated Customs and Excise, East Africa. 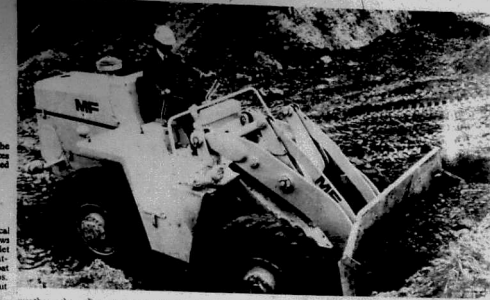
The no-glass glass

People who live in tropical countries often with the windows that let in light did not also let in heat. A new improved heat-rejecting glass called Spectraflex will, the makers, Pilkington Bros. of St. Helens, England, claim, cut down the cost of keeping cool.

In every hot country architects and builders planning giant blocks of flats and offices are trying to solve the problem of providing cool, comfortable, well-lit buildings and shutters built, but keep a lot of light. When clear glass is used for windows, 84 per cent of heat passes into the room against 67 per cent with Spectraflex.

Saving in air-conditioning costs varies according to climatic conditions. But Spectraflex's makers say that usually the initial cost can be reduced by seven per cent and running costs by 10 per cent. So the small differences between the price of installing it rather than conventional clear glass a soon pay for themselves.

The new glass will reduce heat discomfort in buildings without air-conditioning. During hot



weather the glass saves heating costs, for just as it keeps heat out, so it keeps it in.

What makes Spectraflex different from ordinary glass? The makers explain that microscopically small metal particles concentrated immediately below the glass surface greatly increase the heat-absorbent factor, and at the same time tint a pale, pleasing bronze. It is not yet possible to make a heat-rejecting glass which is completely colourless, which means that the transmission of light is reduced a little. Clear glass gives natural light in a room up to a distance of 50 feet. With Spectraflex it is 16 feet. There is an advantage, though, for the tint helps reduce the glare that makes office work difficult.

Outside views can be seen in comfort. The eyes quickly adjust to the tint, so that true colours do not appear changed.

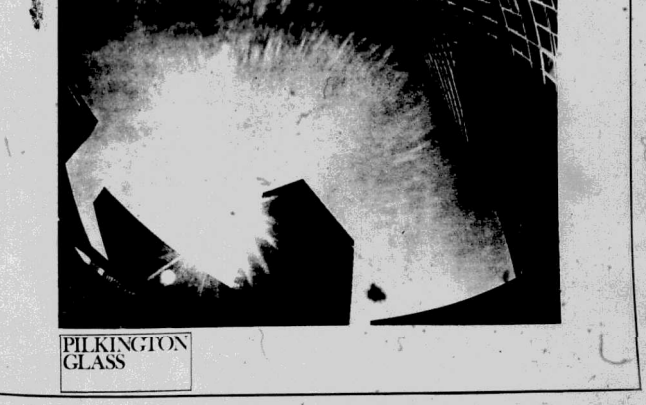

Several of the bodies of Pharaohs have been X-rayed by a team from Michigan University carrying out research on dental disease in ancient Egypt. The X-rays have shown that the bacteria which cause dental decay are present in the mummies. The researchers believe that the bacteria may be responsible for the decay of the mummies.

## Ocam to review its economic ties

It will also hold preliminary groupwork and draft resolutions for approval by Heads of State. Informed sources said that topics to be discussed include an examination of the Common Sugar Market. The conference will also discuss the establishment of a training centre for senior civil servants in the African continent and a proposal to harmonise immunities privileges for foreign experts in Ocam countries. The proposed meat marketing board will be drawn up on the same lines as the sugar board, which was set up in 1964. The organisation decided then to form a sugar pact with Lamy, the administrative supply and demand within Ocam. The conference is expected to finalise the establishment of a meat board. Chad and Niger are expected to provide enough meat for export. The Yaounde conference is also expected to agree on procedures for harmonising members' votes on collective support to candidates for world organisations and agencies.

# Mr. McNamara's visit

There was not much bull-bullish about the visit to East Africa of the president of the World Bank, Mr. Robert McNamara, but it may prove to have been a highly significant event for the area.

Mr. McNamara holds one of the most important posts in the world — even more important, in the context of aid to developing countries, than that of the U.N. Secretary-General. He was making his first visit to East Africa, to familiarise himself with its problems and needs, and to see how the World Bank can help.

The Bank is already significantly involved in the three countries, as was described in an article on this page yesterday. In Kenya it has helped finance agricultural developments, notably smallholder tea and the growing sugar industry, and to promote other sectors of the economy with loans and advice. In Saturday, the Mayor of Nairobi, Councillor Lopezov, discussed with Mr. McNamara his Country's plans to apply for a £3,000,000 loan to help pay for its ambitious water supply expansion.

At the start of his visit the World Bank leader announced in Dar es Salaam that the Bank was to lend the East African Community a further £18,200,000, which £14,700,000 is for railway developments and the rest to improve telecommunications. This brings the total assistance it has given to East African railways, harbours and telecommunications services to £26,700,000.

These are impressive statistics. What is even more impressive is that Mr. McNamara commented after meeting Ministers and expedition officials in the East African Community is "one of the most hopeful experiments in the world".

This is an encouraging tribute from a man qualified to judge how well the East African nations are doing their best. Mr. McNamara's words should allay the fears of those who tend to over-emphasise the stresses and strains caused by temporary trading restrictions and uncoordinated duplication of effort by Community partners. These shortcomings are to be deplored, but corrected where possible; but they do not threaten the basic strength of the Community's foundations.

Neither, though, can East Africa afford to be complacent about its stability and creditworthiness. The World Bank leader did not come only to praise, and in private no doubt had some searching questions to ask about the direction of future policy, especially on such basic issues as food production and population control.

When Mr. McNamara was appointed to the Bank in 1968 he quickly announced a massive declaration of his aid programme for developing nations in a bid to reduce poverty. In five years, he said, the Bank planned to lend £75,000 to developing nations — as much as in its previous 22 years' existence.

A few months later, looking even further into the future, he sent the former Canadian Prime Minister, Mr. Lester Pearson, around Africa, Asia and Latin America to help the Bank formulate aid strategies. But Mr. Pearson was asked to advise on how aid resources could be channelled most effectively from the richer countries, and to check on "myths about waste of aid".

His report has been described as "one of the most important documents of the 20th century". It calls for greater efforts from both developed and developing countries to beat poverty and raise living standards, and makes practical recommendations on how they can do it.

Basic to these efforts is the need to ensure that population growth does not outstrip food production and economic progress in the newer nations. The World Bank is already acting in this direction. Its annual report in October warned of the dangers of "rampant population growth" and pledged finance for birth control programmes.

It also aims to help the developing nations to stabilise world prices of their primary products, and to put pressure on the richer nations to remove restrictions on primary products which is one of the major causes of the increasing gap between the richer and poorer countries of the world.

East Africa, and the rest of the continent, must prove by its deeds that it is equal to the challenge set by the World Bank, McNamara is not misplaced.

### Written national language

MIChAEL BOYDELL reports that after years of indecision and factional argument, the new leaders in Somalia may at last be able to break down one of the biggest barriers to progress in their country — the lack of a written national language. Advocates of Swahili as the official language of Kenya will be surprised at the seemingly insuperable barriers which have so far prevented the simple task of producing an official written version of Somali.

Somalia's choice of a national language is not really a matter of argument at all. It is one of the few countries in Black Africa which has an indigenous national language spoken by all its inhabitants. And yet official business in the country is still done in one of three foreign languages — Italian, English or Arabic — simply because Somali is still not written in an official form.

The reasons for this are not of a technical nature. Writing down Somali would be quite simple matter. In fact it has already been written down and several ways which are satisfactory.

What is at stake is a Government decision as to for which one to employ. But that decision, which has been hanging fire for at least 20 years, has not been made simply because whatever choice is decided on is certain to lead to some degree of resistance among the various schools of thought which have their own theories about the subject.

There are three possible scripts which could be used to write down the Somali language. Each has its own advantages, though some advantages which range from the technical to the traditional.

The one supported by what is known as the progressive, or the Latin script, has its own advantages. It is a Uroeso study group came out wholly in favour of it in its report issued in 1964.

The advantages of this script say supporters, are that it can easily be adopted to the Somali language using the unlearned letters, it is easy to represent sounds which are not covered in the system, it can easily be printed and typed using existing equipment, it lends itself to easy writing and it opens the door to school children to learn the important foreign languages.

It also offers out that the Latin script is the one most desired by the Somali people.

But the traditionalists are not convinced by these arguments. They favour a script which is derived from the Arabic script, which is used by the Somali people in their religious and social life.

So strong is this feeling that several Somali scholars have focused their minds on the Latin script would change the culture, history and even the religion of Somalia in the future.

These scholars fall into two groups, those who praise the script as the form for written and printed Somali, and those who propose an entirely new, unique script.

Arabic has some of the dis-

advantages of the Latin script in that modifications have to be made to make it fully all the Somali sounds. But once again it is political and religious factors which have the strongest influence.

Supporters of Arabic argue that it would be more dignified and more appropriate for a country which has a long Islamic history. They also argue that it is not surprising that many Somalis have been causing anger for some time for a long, controversial middle course.

The Uroeso study, which came out in favour of the Latin script, was not in favour of the Arabic script, but the traditionalists, considered that Arabic script was inadequate for the transcription of the lack of vowel signs.

The strongest objections seem to be over the emotional basis, and as in the case of the Latin script, the fear of domination from overseas.

In an impassioned plea against the use of Arabic, one of the researchers into Somali language and culture, Mr. Musa Galla, alleged that the Government of the United Arab Republic and U.A.R. teachers in Somalia were against the Arabic script and supported the adoption of Swahili as the national language.

U.A.R. officials are now believed to be in view of their impracticality in considering that half the population of Somalia are struggling to learn the Arabic script.

He claimed that the U.A.R. was not in favour of the Arabic script, but that it was in favour of the Latin script.
