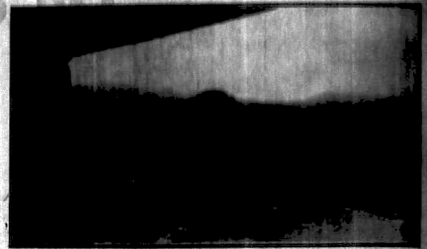

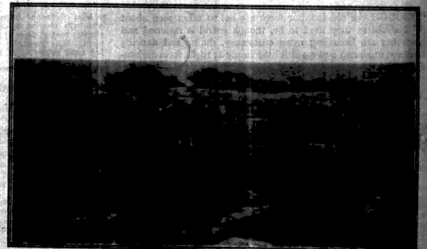

# WAR CHAOS SPREADS

## The History Of Revolutionary Crises

**PROFESSOR GUGLIELMO FERRERO**, of the University of Geneva.

THE present war has not been, like that of 1914, from an entanglement of political conflicts between the great and small powers, it is the results of the revolutionary crises which, from 1917 onwards, have brought about the transformation of the majority of the larger European States into totalitarian regimes.

It is because of these governments that the neutrals can no longer rely upon any kind of guarantee and that the war is spreading so rapidly in every direction.

BEFORE the war, there were many Scandinavian opponents, statesmen and journalists who came more or less regularly to Geneva for the meetings of the League of Nations. Common to all of them was the absolute, almost mystical confidence, that whoever happened in Europe, war-countries would continue in peace. War might break out between France and Germany; it would be fought out on the Rhine. How could this affect the countries of Northern Europe? If a prophet had then foretold that the Scandinavian countries would be the first victims of the new Franco-German war, they would have burst into laughter.

The task of foresight is merely a vast instance of an old and somewhat inhibited. What the leading classes of all European countries have for a century failed to realise is that Europe suffers from the same malady in as far as, for these hundred years, it has been composed of small and medium-sized States, themselves differing by language, race, religion and historical traditions, overpopulation and limited geographical dimensions. These classes have for a hundred years ignored the fact that the conditions under which these people are living are those of enforced collaboration and permanent conflict. It is the form of enforced collaboration, for it is clear that none of these States could live exclusively on its own material and moral resources. The existence is caused by various factors of competition and this, hate and proximity makes war an easy matter.

It is no longer realized that in these circumstances—right as they may be found in Europe—the existence side by side of the greater and smaller States is comparative security depends upon the general acceptance and observance of certain principles and rules in their mutual relations. Nor is it any longer perceived that the observance of these principles and principles—which include the rights and the obligations of the neutral—constitutes

# THE IDEAL COMPOSTING METHODS

By V. D. Wad, of the Institute of Plant Industry, Indore, in "Agriculture and Livestock in India."

THE deliberate use of rotting organic matter—vegetable and animal—for the purpose of growing large quantities of healthy crops is as old as the art of agriculture itself. It is a conservative, primitive, but may be used advantageously (1) to protect the soil from the ravages of insects and weeds, (2) to improve the soil, (3) to improve the possibility of artificial cultivation of crops, and (4) to improve the soil.

At any rate, the importance of farmyard manure to crop growth has been stressed in ancient Indian and European literature on agriculture (Russell and Richards, 1917). King (1928) has described in detail how the Chinese prepared old tuck elaborate care to collect all available wastes and convert them systematically into well-rotted compost. It is noteworthy that in every part of the world this system of returning to the soil the material to land has maintained the fertility in spite of continuous cropping through the ages. The civilized population of China is credited with the practice of the use of the soil after its agricultural use for four or five centuries. This is perhaps the most convincing proof of the perfect success of ancient system of agriculture with its environment. It is a system that modern composting technique has very much improved. This is the principle underlying the Chinese method of making manure from agricultural wastes.

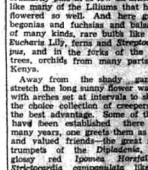

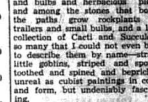

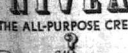

# SHIPPING SPACE FOR KENYA COFFEE

## Industry's Board Approves Chairman's Work in London

### A HELPFUL VISIT

The Coffee Board of Kenya has received a report from its chairman, Mr. R. S. Wain, on the information he obtained and the representations he made during his visit to London. This report was adopted by the Board which expressed itself well satisfied with the visit. The chairman dealt successfully during the visit with shipping problems, publicity, import and exchange control, the needs of the British home market and many other questions of importance to the Coffee Industry.

It is, however, for many reasons impossible to publish this report in its entirety. It is too long and too confidential. But parts of it have been published in the Coffee Board's official Bulletin. The Board's official officials are now fully conversant with the problems and difficulties of the industry and the Board is confident that it will do everything within its power to see that the industry is able to carry on its business in the best possible manner.

### Shipping Space

The requirements of coffee in respect to space between East Africa and London were fully discussed with the Ministry of Shipping, after consultation and agreement with the Coffee Board. A minimum quantity of 10,000 tons for the coming year for East African coffee was set forth and it was stated to expect that this amount would be met. It was also stated that the war enters new phases which renders the provision of essential war materials or essential cargo in the United Kingdom a matter of great importance. The Ministry of Shipping was advised that the requirements were given. Arrangements could be made for storage of 10,000 tons of coffee in East Africa and that it was not possible to dispose of the 10,000 tons in the United Kingdom. It was also stated that it is unlikely that any special arrangement will be necessary.

### For the Middle East

The provision of space for coffee to the Middle East was also discussed with the Ministry of Shipping. 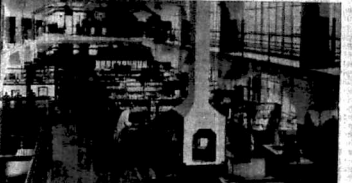

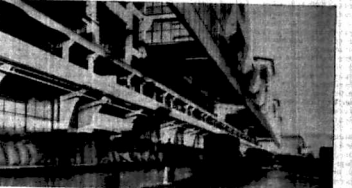

One-third of the world's production of cobalt, which is a constituent in magnet steel and many alloys, is derived from the Belgian Congo, and this addition places virtually the whole world's supply under the control of the Allies. The Belgian Congo comes over half the world's output of diamonds, the industrial uses of which are important and accessories of their extreme hardness. Diamond powder is the most effective abrasive known. Fragments of diamonds are used in rock drills for the mining of metal-working glass, stone, and metal in the diamond industry. The production of tin ore made by the Dutch East Indies (17 per cent) and the Belgian Congo (24 per cent) brings the total output of the world's supply available for the Allies to 56 per cent. The Congo has reserves of copper estimated at 15,000,000 tons.

In the field of medicine the Dutch colonies figure significantly, notably with 10 per cent of the world's supply of cinchona bark. The Belgian Congo and Canada are the world's predominant suppliers of radium. 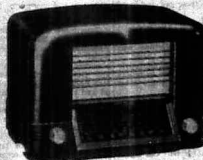

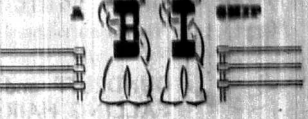

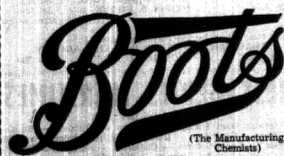

## Uganda Locust Position

The latest Locust Report issued by the Uganda Department of Agriculture covers the latter half of May and the position is well known at this date throughout the Province with little change in the five districts in the Eastern portion. Eastern districts now clear of locusts are—Lango, Karamoja, Central, Budung and Bugogo. The reports for five areas have not yet been received. It is further noted that during the corresponding season of the past two years.

Ahluo—One swarm, which set in the hills on May 18 and caused no damage, is the only report.

Bunyoro—Only one swarm is reported. This flew southwestward to Mubinda; a small swarm of 100 individuals passed from Mubinda District (probably the Same Lala) into Mubinda County.

Barotsi—One swarm was reported on May 14. What was probably the same swarm was observed on May 18 at Many where it flew northwards towards Lake Wandak. No damage to crops is recorded.

Manika—Delayed reports for the previous fortnight indicate increase of activity of both locust species. Restricted scale is reported for the present period and additional damage has been caused to food crops.

Two swarms are reported in the same region as last year. A swarm of *M. egipcia* is reported in Kitale County (from Anok) and in Mwanja County. Heavy crops have been hit.

Kisumu—A swarm of young locusts visited Kaganza and Nyamboni (Kisumu County) on May 28 and 27 and caused damage to crops.

The following refer to the earlier half of the month.

Bunyoro—Flights of locusts were observed at Kibinda, movement being mainly from east towards Lake Albert. Kilamba County set free of locusts and no damage was caused. Some damage was caused in Bunsira, mainia and busani at three places.

Ten is reported clear.

Anokh—A number of immature locusts were seen in the area. They were large, as were those from other counties of which Kibinda was the most affected. There is considerable damage was caused to crops including the Eggplant, maize and sugarcane.

Mr. G. Palmer of Calenden Town visits parrots—taking in various companions for Jolly people, most of them being those which have been with the Zoo, or others whose proprietor is a sportsman, and says that there is a growing demand for birds of all sorts, but particularly parrots, but there is a shortage because of the ban on the importation of parrots which has been in force since the war.

## KENYA MINING REPORT 1939 INCREASED GOLD PRODUCTION

### Expenditure During Year Nearly Half Million

**Kenya attained in 1939 gold to the extent of 287,426 ozs. showing rapid progress since first discovery.**

The Annual Report of the Mining and Geology Department for 1939 has just been issued. The report shows that the total amount of gold produced in Kenya during the year 1939 amounted to 287,426 ounces, valued at approximately £200,000, as compared with 60,000 ounces valued at approximately £50,000 during 1938. Thus, once again, the mining industry has shown considerable increase of activity and again retained its place as one of the most important and profitable sectors of the economy. This is all the more noteworthy in view of the fact that there is no fresh outside capital entering the industry at the present time, and that the discovery of the country's largest productive gold mine, the Lushoto, which is rich in silver and copper, has not yet been discovered.

**Effect of the War**

With the outbreak of the war the continued increase of production of gold was retarded in 1940 and 1941 for the first time since 1939, and although the output was not so low as in 1940 and 1941, it was nevertheless reduced to a level which was not high in the history of the industry. The production of gold during 1941 was 205,000 ounces, valued at approximately £150,000. This was a decrease of 82,426 ounces, or 28.7 per cent. on the production of 1939. The decrease was due to the fact that the war had interrupted the supply of machinery and equipment, and had caused a shortage of labour. It was only in 1942 that the production of gold began to recover, and during 1943 it reached 287,426 ounces, valued at approximately £200,000. This was an increase of 82,426 ounces, or 28.7 per cent. on the production of 1942.

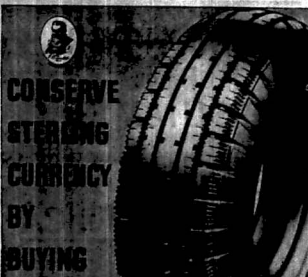

## Help For Coffee Planters

A scheme has been evolved by the Kenya Planters' Cooperative Union Ltd. to assist coffee planters to overcome difficulties which may arise due to lack of native supervisory control. The scheme is for the appointment of managers in military service. In a circular letter the Union considers that in the present conditions there must of necessity be a number of coffee estates in various parts of the Colony which are not receiving adequate supervision. This will undoubtedly be the case at a later date, both to the owners concerned and also to the Colony as a whole. The Kenya Planters' Cooperative Union Ltd. is anxious to assist its members as far as possible in this direction and, in cases of estates where visiting agents have not been arranged for—and individual opinion is desired—the Union has been prepared to arrange for a number of experienced inspectors who will be prepared to inspect estates and advise.

OVERSEAS SOLDIERS COMBINED EFFORTS FOR THEIR WELFARE

Many patriotic societies have combined to organize a movement for the welfare and comfort of the troops of all ranks and more particularly the men from the Dominion and Overseas arriving in England.

This includes arrangements for private hospitality, sight-seeing, visiting places of interest and the like.

The Empire Soldiers' Welfare Committee was formed at the outbreak of war under the leadership of Field Marshal Lord Milner, to provide help and hospitality to the men and women from overseas who are members of His Majesty's Forces or the auxiliary services.

The following thirteen Societies form the original Committee: the Royal Empire Society; the Overseas League; the Dominion Officers' and British Soldiers' Society; the British Empire Soldiers' Society; the British Empire League; the East India Association; the Royal African Society; the League of the Empire; the Theatre Day Movement; and the British Empire Tour Committee. All of whom have been extremely active during the winter and spring months.

Their Majesties the King and Queen Elizabeth have been graciously pleased to allow the title King George and Queen Elizabeth to be given to the Committee under its auspices for the use of men from the Dominion, India and the Colonies.

The Hospitality work of the Committee falls mainly under four heads:

- (a) The provision and maintenance of new residential Clubs for officers and men and the arrangement of special facilities in Clubs already established.
(b) Arranging for officers and men, to accept private step-down hospitality offered by individual houses and by social and recreational Clubs in London and other parts of the country.
(c) Maintenance of the Empire Rendezvous and Information Bureau in London as a clearing-house of information regarding home opportunities, including accommodation, entertainment, sight-seeing, personal hospitality etc. and as a starting point for introductions to Societies, Clubs and individuals.
(d) The setting up of similar local centres near camps and barracks where soldiers, sailors and airmen may obtain information as to all that which is available at a clearing house for local entertainment, sight-seeing, personal hospitality etc.

Large numbers of men and women have been given opportunities in visiting homes in different parts of the country, and these have been greatly appreciated. A charming story is told of a small party of Newfoundlanders who were invited for a weekend to a Scottish manor.

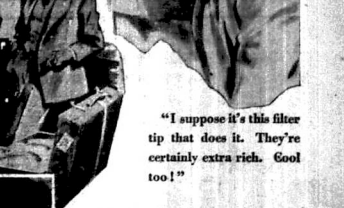
