LONDON FORECAST

It is authoritatively believed in London yesterday that a visit of Prime Minister Harold Macmillan to Moscow by the Prime Minister will be given to Parliament in the next few days.

Although an official confirmation of the Prime Minister's plans was forthcoming, it was expected that he would discuss with Mr. Dulles, who is in London yesterday.

AFRICANS CHEER ON ROUTE

HER MAJESTY QUEEN ELIZABETH THE QUEEN MOTHER is in Kenya. A few minutes before 2 o'clock yesterday afternoon the Britannia aircraft which had brought her from the chilly darkness of London to brilliant sunshine and blue skies, landed at Nairobi Airport.

It was the signal for a warm-hearted demonstration of the loyalty and affection which was re-echoed in the streets of the city during the ceremonial drive to Government House.

In Delamere Avenue many Africans climbed trees to join in the welcome that greeted from the crowded balconies and other vantage points. Kilted pipes heralded the Queen Mother's arrival.

Nairobi had closed its shops and offices two hours before — so that it could open its heart to its Royal visitor. Except for the route, lined by cheering crowds, the city seemed deserted.

Flowers thrown in front of car

Her Majesty had responded with a gracious tribute of her own. She wore a striking dress of Kenya blue — and with the Governor, Sir Evelyn Baring, seated at her side she acknowledged the reception with a friendly wave of her hand.

At some points during the drive groups of Asian children threw flowers in front of the car. The Queen Mother was given a rousing welcome when she arrived at Nairobi Airport.

Though the general public had been excluded there were thousands of V.I.P. members of the British League African Chiefs and airport employees with their families waiting to welcome the Queen Mother as she walked through the terminal buildings.

Outside, hundreds of Africans waited to see the Royal car start on its 10-mile drive through the city.

Weather conditions in the Nairobi area were such that the Queen Mother's arrival was delayed about 15 minutes. It came to a halt in time for the airport waiting band when the Governor, Sir Evelyn Baring, was waiting to greet the Queen Mother.

The Queen Mother was accompanied by the Hon. Mrs. P. E. Toyn and the Commissioner of the African Highlands, Mr. Vincent M. J. Heath.

These two pictures are typical of the joyous street scenes, and the pageantry, in Nairobi.

So that the people could get a better view, the Queen Mother chose to sit in the back seat of an open car. She was accompanied by the Governor and, in the close-up (left), she gives her famous wave at the cheering crowds, a comparison of length of Africans.

On the right, she is walking across the lawn of Parliament Buildings, escorted by the Speaker and followed by the Governor and the Chief Secretary.

In the past Greece has supported British claims between Cyprus and Greece — for Great Britain has asked for partition of Cyprus. Initially, both Governments had agreed to accept Cyprus, but both sides now show a readiness to reject the Greek proposal.

Greek diplomatic circles yesterday expressed "renewed optimism" regarding the negotiations of the Zurich talks.

KRUSHCHEV ASKS EISENHOWER TO VISIT MOSCOW

LATE FLASH: The Soviet Premier, Mr. Khrushchev, has asked the American President, Mr. Eisenhower, to visit Moscow on February 21 for a two-day visit. It was officially announced last night.

Mr. Khrushchev yesterday invited President Eisenhower to visit Russia, making his closing speech at the Soviet Communist Party Congress in Moscow. The Russian Prime Minister said Mr. Khrushchev would be received with special hospitality by both the Government and the Soviet people.

The President could talk with him whenever he chose — they will all be welcome guests.

Mr. Khrushchev said that he extended the invitation without insisting on set dates.

"Let Mr. Eisenhower have a look at a map of the Soviet Union and choose areas of our country which he would like to visit. This country is vast and it contains many interesting places."

Earlier Mr. Khrushchev had invited American leaders for a "cold-shoulder party."

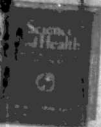

DULLES URGES U.S. TO SPEND MORE IN AFRICA

Communist activity 'very intense'

COMMUNIST activities in Africa were "very intense and pretty effective," Mr. Dulles said in evidence presented in Washington. He added: "They spend a good deal of money there, the propaganda is very effective, and I do not feel satisfied with the results of what we are doing."

The United States Secretary of State, who was appearing at a closed meeting of the House of Representatives Foreign Affairs Committee on January 28, appealed to Congressmen to provide more money to develop United States relations with African nations. At present, he said, not enough money was forthcoming for these purposes, and funds allocated were very often reduced by the House of Representatives. Mr. Dulles had been asked what offensive plan the State Department had in contemplation with emerging African States, especially in consideration of Afro-Asian Communist activity in those areas.

He replied that the United States had a new Assistant Secretary of State for African Affairs (Mr. J. C. Baker) and was training and equipping officers and people to go to Africa.

"I think you will find if you talk to our Assistant Secretary of State that we have a very comprehensive programme for dealing with that situation," he continued. "I do not say it is all-encompassing."

There was nothing in history comparable to the programme which the so-called colonial Powers were granting, whereas the Soviet Union sought to deny political independence.

Since 1945 the West had granted independence to 21 nations with 100,000,000 people. In Africa, eight of these nations were "the beneficiaries of independence."

UGANDA AGENCIES have been asked to advise a minimum of 20 cents a lb. for coffee beans. The White Paper presented to the Uganda Agricultural Commission in February 1954, after a long period of study, has resulted in a reduction of 15 cents on the former price. For Arabica coffee, the price has fallen from 1/50 to 24 cents.

These prices have been fixed to meet the needs of the market and to ensure a reasonable margin for the producer. The Government has agreed to this reduction in the price of coffee beans, but has insisted that the price of coffee should be fixed at 2/00 for the white paper presented to the Uganda Agricultural Commission in February 1954.

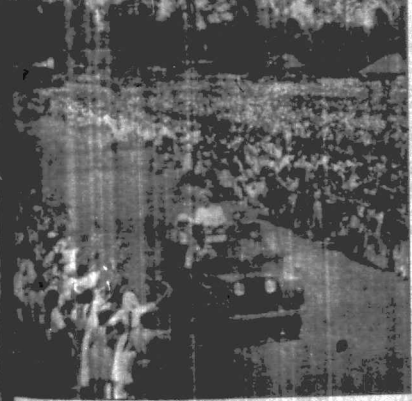

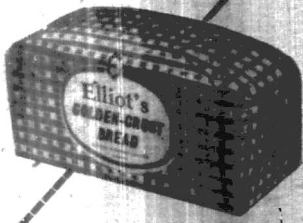

Crowds had gathered at all the main road junctions and roundabouts and the Royal car slowed down as it approached each group, but on the main road to the airport the car increased speed until it eventually caught up with the police vehicle. At times the Royal procession was spread out over almost a quarter of a mile.

The Royal plane was parked on a small apron near the start of the runway and there the Queen Mother was greeted by Air Commodore Sir Edward Fildes, Captain of the Queen's Flight, who was to accompany her; the Senior R.A.F. Officer, East Africa Group Capt. C. H. Simpson, and the Commandant of the airport, Mr. R. H. Thomson.

She was accompanied on the flight by the Minister for African Affairs, Mr. Johnston, and by one of her Ladies-in-Waiting, Lady Hamilton. The plane was piloted by Wing Comdr. H. Currell. The Governor, who was accompanied by Lady Mary Baring, left for Nark by an earlier aircraft.

Proposals and recommendations for changes in both the legislative and executive branches of government would be made this year, he continued. Referring to the establishment in March of a post-election committee and to the speech to be made on March 17 by the Governor to the new Legislative Council.

Mr. Fletcher-Cook said it would not be appropriate for the Council to prejudge what might come out of the next steps in constitutional development.

When he visited Tanganyika more than 11 years ago he had been impressed by the "largely commendable racial atmosphere" in the Territory.

"Momentous question" - It had been assumed that Tanganyika might be able to achieve the harmonious adjustment of relations between the indigenous African and the European and Asian who had made Tanganyika their home. It seemed that Tanganyika might well show the way to a solution on the continent of Africa.

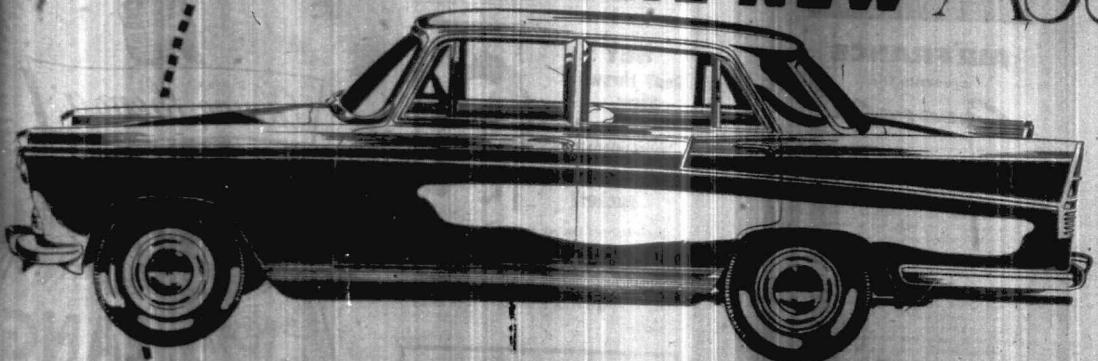

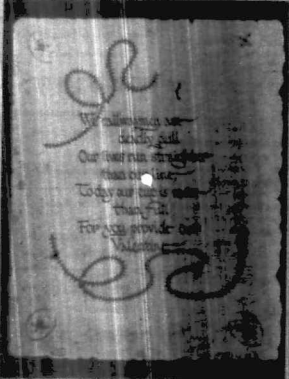
