Mr. Pitt objects to questioning

Cathedral tribute to sacrifice in service of people

PHOUSANDS of people lined the roads of Nairobi during the weekend to see the Queen Mother drive through the city to attend official engagements.

On Saturday morning the royal party drove along the Nairobi Road to Mitchell Park, where the Queen Mother attended a rally of 10,000 schoolchildren.

From lunchtime onwards cars streamed towards Government House, where the Queen Mother later attended a luncheon for 7,000 guests at the Royal garden party.

The two Royal engagements yesterday were Divine Service at All Saints' Cathedral and an informal visit to the 1st Bn. The Camerons, in whose company the Queen Mother had a happy and patient time to see both outward and inward journeys.

Many of the roadside spectators were Africans and children waving flags and banners cheerfully and patiently to see the Queen Mother at both outward and inward journeys.

High standard

All Saints' Cathedral was packed by the Bishop of Nairobi, the Rt Rev L. J. Burcher, and the Queen Mother to her place. In his sermon the Provost of Nairobi, the Very Revd. Dr. G. C. Green, said the Royal Family had set a standard of service which no other monarchy in history had equalled.

They have so completely sacrificed themselves and put themselves at the disposal of their peoples at all times, in every situation of trial and comfort, in countries places all over the world," he said.

More than an hour before the Queen Mother was due to arrive at the Cathedral, the pavements of Delancey Avenue and the churchyard

DULLES URGES U.S. TO SPEND MORE IN AFRICA

Communist activity 'very intense'

COMMUNIST activities in Africa were "very intense and pretty effective", Mr. Dulles said in evidence yesterday in Washington. He added: "They spend a good deal of money and it is very effective, and I do not feel satisfied with the result of what we are doing."

The United States Secretary of State, who was appearing at a closed meeting of the House of Representatives' Foreign Affairs Committee on January 28, appealed to Congressmen to provide money to develop United States influence in African nations. At present, he said, not enough money was forthcoming for these purposes and funds allocated were very often reduced by the House of Representatives. Mr. Dulles had been asked to comment on the State Department's handling of relations with emerging African states, especially in consideration of accelerated Communist activity in Africa.

He replied that the United States now had a new Assistant Secretary of State for African Affairs, Mr. George C. Marshall, and was training and equipping officers and people to go to Africa.

"I think you will find if you talk to our Assistant Secretary of State that we have a very considerable programme for dealing with that situation," he continued. "I do not say it is sufficient."



TRIBUTE TO ASIAN ROLE IN KENYA

Queen Mother's hope of future progress

HRH ELIZABETH, the Queen Mother was given a tremendous reception by Nairobi's Asian community in City Park yesterday, where thousands had gathered in hot, sunny weather for what might prove to be one of the most colourful engagements of the Royal tour.

In her reply to a loyal address read by the Asian Minister without portfolio, Mr. C. B. Madan, Q.C., the Queen Mother paid tribute to the work which Asians had played over many years in the gradual and peaceful progress of Kenya. She expressed the hope that the momentum in the years ahead would, by their efforts and example, ensure continued development of the Colony.

On leaving before the Queen Mother was also a large thousand were assembled in Nairobi's main street and others formed colour parties—men and women, wives and dressers, while uniforms of the attendants and white turbans worn by most of the Sikhs present.

Exultation rose when Mr. Madan, through Governor-General Nominated Member of Legislative Council, announced over the radio that the Queen Mother had arrived at Nairobi, and the Minister for Works, Mr. E. Nallon, and Mr. A. A. M. Admas, Chairman of the Reception Committee.

After the National Anthem the Queen Mother was presented with a bouquet of flowers by Miss B. Sethi, of the Aya Khan Society, followed by Mr. S. D. Sethi, of the Aya Khan Society.


