

AFTER THE BRITISH GENERAL ELECTION.

Some Reflections on the Situation

THE NEW M.P.

Result Which Disappoints All Parties.

(STANDARD CORRESPONDENT.)

London, May 4.

Since the result of the Election was to leave the Conservatives the larger Party and since the Liberals had not so strongly condemned them throughout the campaign as a generally felt that Mr Baldwin has taken the only possible and probably the best course in handing in his resignation and letting the Socialist Party form a Government. Some people maintain that it would have been better if Mr Baldwin had resigned his Ministry and met Parliament as a private Member. As the latter alternative would hardly be considered in view of Mr Lloyd George's pronounced opposition it would have been a matter of certainty that the Conservatives would have been taken out of office had they adopted this course.

By making it quite clear immediately that they have no intention of carrying on in face of the country's verdict they have met the main aim of the Socialist Party, the feeling of uncertainty which would have been very harmful to trade. There has also avoided the delay that would have been involved in their meeting Parliament. This could not have been avoided from the beginning of the day and the transitional period to the inevitable Socialist Government would thus have been harmful prolonged.

Whether their resignation will benefit them in the end remains to be seen. There are those who hold that it would have been better to have made the Liberals directly responsible for putting a Socialist Government to power by their action in voting against the Government in the debate on the Address or by their abstention from voting. This course proved disastrous to the Liberal fortunes in 1924 and it was felt that such a surrender of power might be repeated. There is now the possibility that the Liberals will be able to blame the Conservatives for putting the Socialists into office. View it was not essential to do so but in view of the present situation and the avowed intention of the Liberals to give the Government support it does not seem probable that this accusation will ever carry much weight.

The future, however, will alone be able to decide this question.

Agriculture. NATIVE AGRICULTURE.

The Problem of Accumulations of Stock Curtailing Cultivation.

(Continued.)

In continuing the account of Native Agriculture during 1925, Mr. E. Harrison in the Report of the Agricultural Department for that year refers to the natives regarded for a time as a firm of hand. The difficulties of improving the quality of the stock in the Reserve is explained and the possibility that the wrong policy has been adopted in inoculating all stock in the Reserve rather than only those of good quality is mentioned.

The report states:— "A matter affecting the progress of native production is the uneven distribution of the population. In North Kavirondo native people can be found as thinly distributed as thirty to the square mile and as densely as 1,000 per square mile. It is with a pressure as high as one thousand there can be but little surplus, regarding that there are practically no industries save agriculture. Large swamps of country similar in many respects to that so densely occupied can be found 50 to 100 miles north. Some effort at securing migration should be made, even if expenditure on some scale is incurred. An opportunity for the establishment of improved villages presents itself if only the people could be induced to venture and migrate.

To what extent the system of tenancy common in the Kikuyu Reserve is responsible for the curtailment of production cannot be estimated, but it is surely wrong that a family, in order to secure enough land to cultivate, should have to journey from one small patch to another some miles distant and to yet another. Stock problems are ever with us and are constantly under examination. During the year the Commission appointed to make recommendations regarding the utilization and improvement of native stock presented its report.

The Native Stock.

As has been pointed out so frequently, natives regard live stock, particularly cattle, as a Bank and so their accumulations

increase more and less to be found for the stock, or the limited land is trodden and grazed until the value is much deteriorated. As the natives become wealthier and we to expect a curtailment of agricultural work due to "bank" accumulations needing the grazing? This is a most pressing problem and unless suitable for these accumulations are provided, or they are in some way prevented from increasing, some native reserves will all too soon be inadequate to the "needs" of their inhabitants. The accumulation of very large value live stock may in time threaten the very existence of the tribe, in other words natives will be overwhelmed with their "wealth" as natives apparently have not the will to restrict it or to find some other form of investment.

Little Headway.

Heavy stock taxation for all animals in excess of a certain minimum per married woman may have an effect, on the other hand it might easily result in generally reduced production of salable commodities, as well as have other, serious manifestations. Quite possibly in heavily stocked areas we may have done quite the wrong thing in inoculating all live stock to prevent loss and we might easily see inoculation as the means of having the better class of stock by refusing to inoculate poorer types; there is, unfortunately, something of the justice in such a policy, however useful it may be in correcting the evil.

There is no manner of doubt that as regards native live stock in parts of Kenya we are making but little headway and appear to have problems similar to those existing with native live stock in Southern Africa.

Numbers of Livestock.

The following figures are extracted from the Agricultural Census Report for 1925—Cattle 2,262,000; Sheep 2,650,000; Goats 2,850,000; Horses 200; Mules

200; Donkeys 25,000; Camels 20,000. There is evidence to show that cattle, sheep and goats show a steady if small annual increase, but in the circumstances it is possible only to quote approximate figures. Thus, representing cattle we know that the well-estimated.

It is not generally realized that production by natives demands the introduction of but little capital, and the potential energy of the people, together with a medium of sound direction, is capable of largely increasing the annual yield returns of this Colony. This, it is believed, may be accomplished without much interference with the extent of the activities of any other section of the community.

Plantation Crops.

Whilst the time may not be ripe for the introduction of plantation crops, there is no doubt that, properly organized such crops will be produced in the future in co-operation with European and otherwise. One very promising plantation industry of special value to the Kikuyu who are short of fuel supplies, is the cultivation of the black wattle, chiefly in small patches and as windbreaks. Reports of dry back and the supply of green bark to the Extract Factory has already commenced. The great difficulty regarding plantation industries is the necessity of getting the crop planted in advance of the provision of the factory for its treatment. Large areas near the forest around Mount Kenya are suitable for wattle and other plantation crops, but as present there is no certainty that factories will be provided when required.

Exports.

The returns of exports leaving Mombasa, calculated as being of native origin do not show great expansion over the past three years, but in common with the rest of the Colony, native areas, as a whole, have not enjoyed good seasons. Furthermore, we have evidence that many native products are not so largely exported but to an increasing extent are consumed within the Territories. Kavirondo maize, formerly exported in large quantities, is now being ground into flour at Kisumu. Cattle as stock, but crabs are taking place more extensively within the Colony. Railway work in Kikuyu and Nyanza Provinces, together with the provision of many new bridges and better roads all are having, or will have, their influence.

HOW WEIGHT AFFECTS PERFORMANCE.
 The Relationship of Horse Power.

A USEFUL CONSIDERATION.
 The question of power-weight ratio is one of considerable importance to all motorists, because upon this factor depend all the problems relating to good performance and economical running. Ordinarily a light engine, when its light chassis will provide a better motor performance than a heavy engine in a heavy chassis. The tendency, therefore, is to build up to reduce weight as much as possible, whilst at the same time improving the efficiency of the engine.

In this article we are considering mainly the weight of the complete vehicle as distinct from the weight of the individual parts which go to make up the engine or transmission system. It must be appreciated that when a car is built, the weight of the chassis has to overcome not only general friction, road resistance and wind resistance, but also the force of gravity, because, in fact, it is lifting the car as well as propelling it forward.

In this connection it may be interesting to observe that one of the main reasons why complete cars have to be fitted with high-powered engines is because the engine has to lift and sustain the weight of the complete machine, whereas with road vehicles the weight is supported by the road and only a comparatively small proportion must actually be lifted when a car is climbing a hill.

In the old days of heavy bodies and weak engines, the chassis builder in cutting solid axles and making them up from full-size and the resulting very heavy body, was handicapped by a not very efficient engine. In the modern era, on the other hand, the light chassis and the light of pneumatic tires have led to a more efficient car.

Nevertheless, by the use of special alloys in the engine and chassis construction, and by the use of light chassis wood frameworks, covered with fabric or thin sheet metal for the body, a tremendous amount of weight reduction has been made. At the same time, engine efficiency for a given capacity has

TRAFFIC ASKARS WITH WINS.

Memoria Adapts a Singapore System.

PROGRESS WILL.

STANDARD CONSIDERED.]

 The system of traffic signaling which comes from Singapore, now being used in Memoria, promises well. It is something quite new for the island, and should prove a great advance upon past methods. One of the troubles in the past has been that of getting the subjects on point duty to signal intelligibly. Usually, however, the average driver, while very willing and anxious to obey, is not very clear in his mind as to what to do, and standing up ready to do duty, was very liable to give signals very difficult to follow.

The new method, consists of a booklet with "wins" painted white and decorated with red lines, one of the troubles in the past has been that of getting the subjects on point duty to signal intelligibly. Usually, however, the average driver, while very willing and anxious to obey, is not very clear in his mind as to what to do, and standing up ready to do duty, was very liable to give signals very difficult to follow.

How it Works.

The mode of operation is as follows—Instead of, as is usual, merely extending the arms to stop all traffic in a certain direction, the subject, when turning through a right angle, places both arms above his head to indicate to oncoming traffic that he is about to release traffic in one direction. As soon as the turn is completed, he drops his arms to his side. When about to release traffic in the opposite direction he performs a similar manoeuvre. In the event of a car which is standing his desire to turn to the right or left, as the case may be, the positioner keeps the one arm raised and signals that car on with the other arm down to it.

It is hoped, by this means, to solve the problem of efficient signaling and, so far as the new scheme has gone, it is favourably commented upon. It is, as yet, too early to offer any decided opinion as to its efficiency, especially as the test drivers and others have not yet got used to it, but the preliminary to everyone concerned being satisfied as to the workability, Memoria hopes that, at last, a system has been found which will obviate some of the confusion resulting from the busy times of the day from inefficient signaling and, presumably, if the new method proves a success it will be adopted generally throughout the town—and the country.

HOW WEIGHT AFFECTS PERFORMANCE

The Relationship of Horse Power.

A USEFUL COMPARISON FORMULA

The question of power-weight ratio is one of considerable importance to all motorists. It has been up to us based mainly on the problems relating to good performance and economical running. Obviously a high-powered engine will give a better road performance than a low-powered engine in a heavy body. The tendency, therefore, among designers is to reduce weight as much as possible, without at the same time impairing the efficiency of the engine.

In this article we are considering mainly the overall weight of the complete vehicle as distinct from the weight of the individual parts which go to make up the engine or transmission system. It must be appreciated that when a car is climbing a hill the engine has to overcome not only general friction, road resistance and wind resistance, but also the force of gravity, because, in fact, it is lifting the car as well as propelling it forward.

In this connection it may be interesting to observe that one of the most important considerations here to be fitted with high-powered engines is because the engine has to lift and maintain the weight of the complete machine, whereas will not maintain the weight as supported by the road and only a comparatively small proportion must actually be lifted when a car is climbing a hill.

In the old days of heavy bodies and high axle loads, the coach builder in cutting steel wheels and shafts would use the full size and the resulting very heavy body was hauled by a very efficient engine, the road performance in the light of present-day experience, has to be desired.

Nowadays, by the use of special alloys on the engine and chassis construction and by adopting light dexion wood transverse, covered with fabric or thin sheet metal for the bodies, a tremendous amount of weight reduction has been made. At the same time, engines are efficient for a given capacity has

increased by, in some cases, as much as 50 per cent. Even so, however, the addition of a number of heavy accessories, a second spare wheel or similar comparatively weighty articles will make an appreciable difference to the power-weight ratio of a car.

It is not suggested, of course, that any owner-driver should go to the inconvenience of cutting down his useful accessories to a bare minimum or that he should limit his luggage very strictly when on tour, but indiscriminate loading of a car should be avoided, whenever possible if maximum economy is desired.

It is probable that few owners know the exact weight of their vehicles; sometimes the weight is given in the manufacturer's catalogue, but it can so easily be forgotten that there is no one weighing for that there is no one for any owner remaining ignorant upon this point.

Here are a few examples: The M.G. Midge weighs just over 10 cwt. and the engine develops 38 h.p. It will be seen, therefore, that the weight is about 24 lb. per h.p., an extremely satisfactory figure. In the case of an average 10 h.p. fabric saloon car, with an about 17 cwt., we have a figure of 20 lb. per h.p. when the h.p. developed is 22.

So far as light cars or cycles are concerned, the Super-sports Morgan three-wheeler tops the list on the whole, with a light ratio being about 21 lb. per h.p. The engine, which develops over 40 h.p. and is rated at 40 h.p., provides a striking example of the advances which have been made in design alone, say 1905 when engines rated at 10 h.p. gave very little more than 10 h.p. but, at the same time, were expected to pull quite heavy bodies.

The question of tyre resistance is of considerable importance when considering the performance of a car because the difference of only a few pounds per square inch has a considerable effect upon the area of contact between the tyre and the road. Thus, if the tyre air runs out the increased area of contact, especially on loose-surfaced roads, increases the tyre resistance, thus slowing down the vehicle or, alternatively, requiring greater power to drive it at the same rate of speed—greater power especially will mean tyre and increased wear and tear. In hill-climbing especially will mean tyre and increased wear and tear. In hill-climbing especially will mean tyre and increased wear and tear.

It is important to note in this formula that all the main dimensions are in centimetres instead of the more usual millimetres. To assist those who are not quite clear upon the point, we should mention that 27.8 cm. is the same as 11 inches; the majority of light cars have a "motor-car" of 85.5 cm. It can be taken that the majority of light cars will weigh less than one ton with the full complement of passengers.

It will be seen that the formula will, therefore, be some decimil of a ton.

It will be seen that the formula does not take into account the efficiency of the engine; that is to say, it is not concerned with the brake horse-power developed at any given speed. This is no disadvantage, however, as it is obvious that by disregarding actual h.p. the formula can be given a more general application. In this respect it is similar to the R.A.C. formula applied by the Treasury for horse-power taxation purposes.

Interesting Calculations.

By the use of suitable tables or additional formulae many interesting facts concerning any kind of car can be worked out, knowing the value of "K". For instance, it is possible to calculate the theoretical maximum gradient which a car will climb in top gear, provided that the value of "K" has been worked out correctly. By knowing the amount of petrol used in a given time, the consumption in the miles per gallon can be found out so forth.

Calculations of this kind do not perhaps interest the average owner-driver, but he may find it both interesting and instructive to work out the value of "K" for his own car and those of his friends. The value for most normal types of light car does not vary very considerably, but averages about 200.

This, of course, when stated by a series of kind-heartedness or by a lack of sympathy for their vehicles, might be criticised, but with passengers or with luggage upon the least precaution, should work out the power-weight ratio

As soon as the turn is completed, he drops his arms to his side. When about to release traffic in the opposite direction, he performs a similar manoeuvre. In the event of a car driver ignoring his desire to turn to the right or left, as the case may be, the policeman keeps the one arm raised and signals the car on with the arm towards it.

It is hoped, by this means, to give the problem of efficient signalling and, so far as the new scheme has gone, it is favourably commented upon. It is, as yet, too early to offer any decided opinion as to its efficiency generally as the taxi drivers and others have not yet got used to it, but the evidence points to every one concerned being satisfied as to its workability. Mombasa hopes that, at least, a system has been found which will obviate some of the difficulties resulting at busy times of the day from inefficient signalling and, presumably, the confusion resulting therefrom. It will be adopted generally throughout the town and the country.

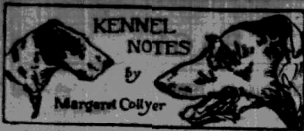

KENNEL NOTES

Margaret Collyer

Miss Collyer, Oflag, to whom all addresses should be sent, is responsible for accuracy of statements by her correspondents.

I have just discovered that there is a pedigree imported coloured bull-terrier in the country. He belongs to Mr. John Russell, E. and T. Co., and K. H. H. W. W. N. F. F.

The letter I have received from this gentleman runs as follows:— "Dear Madam, I have been reading your article to-day in 'The Standard' of May 15 regarding 'disturbance in white dogs.' I am one of the few in the Colony who has a brindle one. I should say black and tan. I have never seen a dog like this before. I should like to buy a good white bull terrier puppy to put in my dog. I have Mr. Downing or any of my other dogs for sale that might suit. It must be small, sound in coat and dark of eye. I don't mind if it has some sound blood in it, but neither on both sides.

Letter No. 2 re "Bloodlessness in a dog." As a common complaint amongst dogs, as well as many other animals, and because it does not always clear that because a dog is sound in coat and dark of eye it is necessarily free from bloodlessness. There is a chronic form of anemia as well as an acute form. There are many causes given for anemia. One authority says that it occurs especially in the young and stunted dogs and in those generally resulting from deficient nutrition, early weaning and withholding of meat till it is growing fast. More rarely it may be due to unfavorable dam quarters, and insufficient exercise. It may be consequent (depending from weakly or improperly nourished bitch) or possibly due to defective development of the arterial system. Anemia also occurs in the course of numerous acute and chronic diseases. Other causes are intestinal worms, blood parasites and certain poisons. The symptoms are based on the reduction of the normal number of red corpuscles and the resulting lowering of all vital processes.

The general appearance and symptoms of a dog suffering from chronic anemia are, the skin and visible mucous membranes in particular are very pale. Weakness is noticeable in all the movements and often a straggling sort of gait, they are easily tired, and sleep is gross. The pulse is small, weak and slow, the temperature rises, usually below normal, and occasionally slightly above. Hemorrhage, like the fishes, it accedes, and both are temporarily

further increased by periodic or bodily anemias. Blood taken in light, an animal determined and has a watery diluted appearance. There is a tendency to diarrhoea and vomiting. I have several times seen these during my long experience. The general condition of animals in not good, the mucous feet flabby to the touch, and the appetite is poor and capricious. Digestive disturbances aggravate the trouble. The general condition is often referred to as perniciosa anemia. The treatment is first to remove all possible causes, and to promote blood formation by nitroglycerin, iron, and small amounts of regular intervals, milk, eggs, etc. Even in some forms of anemia, if the animal is regularly and properly treated it often recovers.

I may be entirely wrong, but I have had this case out of ten of anemia amongst animals in Kenya are caused by intestinal parasites and not full of worms and conditions of worms, and it is almost an impossibility to keep dogs clear of them.

To return for a moment before closing this article to the origin of the present dog bull-terrier. The old "Black Country" fighting and rat catching dog was essentially taken in hand by canine sports and crossed with the old English terrier, a breed that I believe now to be quite extinct. My recollection of these is that they were all white light boned, racy looking dogs with whip tails, fairly, but not quite smooth in coat, and with short drop ears. This second cross with the terrier gave the original rough leg bull-terrier the longer face and refinement of chest that they now possess. All breeds of dogs that in old days were shown with crop ears have the bull-terrier to thank for eventually getting that wickedly cruel practice entirely done away with. There had always been more or less of an agitation against the practice which, besides being terribly cruel, was illegal. From time to time prosecutions had taken place but it was not until the result of one instituted in 1850 became known that steps were taken by the breed club to entirely do away with cropping.

The Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals took proceedings against one, Henry Cooper and Robert and Mary Cutting, for causing to be tortured, and for actually torturing and ill-treating by cutting its ears, a certain dog. "Cooler" the owner of the dog, sent it to the Cuttings, who were experts in dog-cropping to be operated on. Mrs. Cutting told the dog while her husband used the scissors. The facts of the case were not disputed but for the defense it was brought forward that it was necessary to

SAVING EMPIRE FORESTS.

Remembrance of Two Years Ago.

FERTS OVERLOOK.

There are wrecks other than those that sink at sea parties. Britain recently threatened the wonderful New Zealand forests in the shape of a wood waste that was playing havoc with the trees.

The insect was increasing rapidly and attaining an unprecedented size in its new home.

The New Zealand Government was so alarmed by these reports that it begged our Imperial Bureau of Entomology to do something about it, writes an Entomologist in the Daily Express.

As it happened, there was a young man—Mr. H. Christy—in England who knew a good deal about these wood wastes. He and a companion—Mr. T. G. Myers—were asked to go further into the matter.

Together they returned to a small wood of fern and pine at Taharoa, Otago, to observe the way these wood wastes lived, and to see whether some sound method of dealing with them could be found.

Fruitless Beauty.

It is, as usual, the female which does all the damage. This female beauty—she is large, handsome, deep blue in color—lays her eggs in larva wood by means of her ovipositor, a long bodiless egg-stick. With this she also burrs a hole in the wood, about half an inch deep, and lays her eggs in it.

Tunnelling a hole in the tree is not enough, but the eggs hatch out, and the larvae, after one hasty gluttony, perhaps up the tunnel, now straighten into the wood, empty playing, the same with it.

There is always a mass somewhere. And the mass in this case is another female, also large and handsome, and unsexually to boot—thrice, perhaps, that is the name she goes by!—then may be seen "hanging round" from May to September.

An Ex-Prisoner.

FIGHT WITH POVERTY RAGED BY A PRISONER.

M. Monis, aged eighty-three, a Prime Minister of France twenty years ago, and a prominent politician until the outbreak of war, died suddenly recently.


He was found endeavoring to live on an ex-convict's pension of 200 francs (2s.) a month at the beginning of 1927. The Government initiated a bill, which was rushed through, granting him an annual pension of £300.

M. Monis was appointed Premier in 1911, one of his principal colleagues being M. Caillaux, but the Ministry lasted only four months. He was present with M. Bostaze, the Minister of War, at one of the secret cabinet meetings at Bay-le-Mulhouse, when an airplane crashed into a group of officials, killing 4 and wounding and injuring M. Monis severely.

M. Monis was then unable to appear in Parliament to support the Government, and when the Cabinets fell soon afterwards.

He was defeated at the senatorial elections in 1920. He had once been one of the leading members of the Bar, and when he was defeated he returned to the courts thinking, "I shall be able to support myself. He had been almost forgotten, and he could continue to earn only at small fee.

It was found on inquiry that the little money he had saved in the days of his prosperity had been spent on preparing his son for the law.

THE HARBOR COMMISSIONERS,
 Kampala, June 27.
 The capacity of the harbor of Kampala has been estimated and the results of the survey are set out in the enclosed report which is a very comprehensive survey of the harbor during the last few years. Figures are also given for 1929 so that alterations of the harbor may be regarded as being right up to date.

The Commission comprised Sir William Murray, Director of I.B.E. (Chairman), the Hon. Mr. A. D. Jones M.L.C., Mr. F. W. Adcock, (Chief Assessor), P. N. J. and Mr. N. F. S. Andrews of the Secretariat. The Commission commenced their sittings in Kampala on March 11 and after making an extensive tour of the various centres, concluded sittings at Entebbe on May 22.

As the Report has only just been issued there has been no time as yet for the various committees and organizations concerned to meet for discussion, but meetings will be held in the very near future when undoubtedly the Report will be considered in all its aspects.

Town Planning.

The many improvements that are needed in the Township have been held up pending the arrival of these experts, and it is to be hoped that it will not be long ere some sort of definite scheme is evolved whereby the present unsatisfactory state of affairs is remedied.

EAST AFRICAN RECIPES

Using Kenya Fruits.

(By a Kenya Housewife)

Kenya mulberry trees are so prolific that frequently the berries are left to the birds or to fall on the ground, and yet with a little trouble they can be used in many ways. A few salad for the front table makes a look more attractive; the sweetest jelly obtained by pressing the ripe ones cooked berries through a wire sieve will make the customary rice puddings and plain blancmanges look more attractive, and there are numerous ways of using the seeds of fruit in pie, puddings and tarts. But for those who do not like the seeds in the berries the following jelly is easily and quickly made.

Mulberry Jelly.

Pick and wash three pounds of mulberries. Core and slice three green apples, and place in a pan with a small cupful of boiling water, and the juice of a small lemon. Stir until the apples are soft and pulpy. Then add the berries and continue to cook until the whole is very soft. Strain carefully through a piece of fine muslin allowing it to hang dripping all night. To each pint of juice add a pound of sugar, add, and gently boil the jelly when a little is dropped on to a cold plate. Cover closely in small pots and keep in a cool place. If the jelly has not set sufficiently after standing for one day, leave the pots uncovered, and it will gradually become firmer as the moisture evaporates.

Mulberry Ring.

Place the pulp, tied firmly in the muslin, in a pan with a pint and a half of cold water, and boil gently for fifteen minutes. Take out the muslin and while the

water, which will now look like juice, is still boiling, divide in half an ounce of powdered gelatine. Pour into a boiler heated to set and when required turn out and fill the centre with Orange Spicing.

Orange Spicing.

Divide in three quarters of a pint of boiling water, quarter of an ounce of powdered gelatine. Add five good tablespoonsful of sugar and one tablespoonful of lemon juice. Stir and leave until almost cold. Then whisk into a stiff froth and pile in the centre of the mulberry ring. Decorate with chopped almonds and angelica.

Cape Gooseberry Jelly.

Put the gooseberries in halves, measure, and add half the same measure of water. Boil together until the fruit is quite soft. Strain through a muslin, and to each pint of juice add a pound of sugar. Boil until the syrup when tested on a cold plate. Cover closely in small pots.

Liquor or Quava Jelly.

The same recipe is suitable for both liquors and quavas. Cut up the fruit, and place in a pan with enough water to cover it completely. Boil until the fruit is soft and pulpy. Strain through a muslin and to each pint of juice allow a pint of sugar and a tablespoonful of lemon juice. Boil until the syrup jellies.

Grandville or Rosella Jelly.

These may both be made from the same recipe. Prepare and boil as for liquor or quava jelly, but to each pint of boiling juice allow a pint and a half of sugar and the juice of one lemon. Boil until the syrup jellies when tested and store in a cool place.

MOTOR RESEARCH

Improving the Economical Output.

WATER GREATER ADVANCE HAS BEEN MADE.

Some interesting research work with a direct and practical bearing on improving the economical output of high-speed petrol motors is being carried on mostly by, or in private mechanical laboratories on behalf of a few members of motor and long-distance coaches. It is useful to note this first says a writer in "The Glasgow Herald" whose attention is being directed to more or less novel ideas in engine types and layouts, which they be regarded also as forming part of the principal power and transmission units.

What the future holds regarding more or less radical departures from the familiar, representing forms of engine in favour of other types of gas-power generation seems likely to be determined rather by the economic aspect than by reference to those being interesting departures from well-established design. Some types of engines seem likely to fail under this sort of comparative test, because that they will be too costly to produce because of machining and other production difficulties comparable with present types of engine.

As an instance of what is being referred to, the writer recently ascertained for nearly a half-score separate machining operations, and nearly as many re-settings in jig, required on a combined cylinder block and head like casing of a design illustrated in the upper figure. Possibly the difficulty could be overcome by designing special tools, but as far as that design is concerned it seems impracticable to bring it into line with the economical requirements of existing type petrol motor production.

High Speed and Large Mileage.

The high speed motors at base and coaches represent, up to aircraft motors, the greatest advance in petrol engines. Able to run at speeds of 3,000 revs. for prolonged periods on the road, and to stand up to the work for 16 hours a day and mileage of 1,000 and more per week, are some of the requirements of the vehicles concerned. High engine speeds and a high compression, even up to 10.5 to 1 in some instances, have to counteract in high temperatures under the bonnet, which is not to the advantage of the normal cast-

Iron opportunity whether magnets or not distributed. Ignition specialists have important responsibilities in this development with mechanical specialists responsible for pistons and bearings. If it were possible to publish even a summary of the many-sided study and technical research employed in this connection, possibly it might control the quest after more or less fresh types of petrol motor, especially those of the turbine order. Fuel economy which is most essential, the use of fuel to the fullest and best advantage, is one of the principal studies involved.

Expansion Cylinders.

Attempts to utilize the fuel charge to the best advantage as passively have been a constant effort, either by increase of volume or by passing the exhaust through an expansion cylinder before discharge into the atmosphere. The possibilities of increasing the stroke-bore ratio seems to be limited by other requirements of a high speed engine. The use of an expansion cylinder on the compound principle has been tried and abandoned because of the small actual gain effected. Even Dr. Diesel was interested in the compound system at the end of the last century of crank engine problems. Messrs. Graham and Fox, of New York, built a three-cylinder compound petrol engine, with two expansion cylinders which they fitted into a larger expansion cylinder. The cost was increased 32 per cent, but the fuel economy was 10 per cent. It did not justify the cost. Within more recent years a former small British car and motor firm established a chassis at an Olympia Show with a three-cylinder compound petrol motor. The marked increase of compression and the greater heat and higher velocity of the modern engine's exhaust might improve the possibilities of the compound system and introduce a possible competitor with the steam engine for more economical use of the exhaust.

Apparently research on this score is tending in the direction of assisting ignition and a correspondingly longer use of the gas, by exhausting with a temperature of the velocity and temperature of the exhaust. Some research is proceeding along this line of investigation, with which, it is expected, some closely connected.

Recent Research Efforts.

SOME STRIKING DISCREPANCIES

MOTOR RESEARCH

Improving the Economical Output.

WIKER GRAYNER ADVANCES THE THREE MARKS

Some interesting research work with a direct and practical bearing on improving the economical output of high-speed petrol engines is being carried on mostly by, or in private mechanical laboratories on behalf of a few makers of motor buses and long-distance coaches. It is useful to note this first says a writer in "The Glasgow Herald" when attention is being directed to more or less novel designs in engine types and layouts, whether they be of the type as at present the type of combined power and transmission units.

What the future holds regarding more or less radical departures from the familiar reciprocating form of engine in favour of other types of gas-power generators seems likely to be determined rather by the economic aspect than by reference to their being in-vented departures from well-tested designs. Some recent designs of engines seem likely to fall under this sort of category, but it is doubtful that they will be too costly to produce on a combined cylinder block and barrel-like casing of a design illustrated in the notes below. Possibly the difficulty could be overcome by designing special tools but so far as that design is concerned it seems impossible to bring it into line with the economic requirements of existing type petrol motor production.

High Speed and Large Mixtures

The high speed motors in buses and coaches represent, next to aircraft motors, the greatest advance in petrol engine construction. Ability to run at speeds of 3,000 r.p.m. for prolonged periods on the road, and to stand up to the work for 10 hours a day and mileage of 10,000 and more per week, are some of the requirements of the modern commercial High speed engine and a high compression, even up to 16 to 17 in one instance, have their counterparts in high temperatures under the hood, which is not to the advantage of the normal ignition apparatus, whether magneto or coil distributor. Ignition specialists share important responsibilities in this development with metallurgy specialists responsible for pistons and bearings. If it were possible to publish even a resume of the many-sided study in this connection, possibly it might contain the quietst after more or less frank types of petrol motor, especially those of the turbine or turbo-compressor type, which in many respects is one of the principal studies involved.

Expansion Cylinders.

Attempts to utilize the fuel charge to the best advantage

Attempts to utilize the fuel charge to the best advantage especially have been a constant effort, either by increase of compression or by passing the exhaust through an expansion cylinder below discharge into the atmosphere. Possibilities of increasing the stroke ratio seem to be limited, or other requirements of the high speed engine. The expansion cylinder on the compound principle has been tried and abandoned because of the small actual gain effected. Even Dr Diesel was interested in the compound system at the outset of his study of organic engine problems. Messrs. Grayner and Fox, of New York, built a three-cylinder compound petrol engine, with one of the high speed cylinders discharging into a larger expansion cylinder. The cost was increased 50 per cent, over the normal type of two-cylinder four-cycle petrol motor, but the net power gain (about 6 per cent) did not justify the cost. Within one month years a former small British car and marine motor firm exhibited the attraction of the Olympia Show (1909-10) with a compound petrol motor. The modified increase of compression and the greater heat and higher velocity of the modern engine exhaust might improve the possibilities of the compound system and introduce a possible competitor for more successful use of the exhaust.

Apparently research on this score is tending in the direction of earlier ignition and a correspondingly longer use of the gas before exhausting, with consequent lowering of the maximum temperature of the exhaust along this line. The work is proceeding along the lines of investigation, with which attention experts are closely concerned.

Recent Research Efforts.

Reference to other factors cannot now be made; it will suffice to recall that Mr. L. Pomeroy, W. E. Fox, chief engineer of the Daimler Co., called attention in a recent I.A.E. paper to the lubrication and other aspects of the heat and pressure problems of the high-speed engine. In Europe each State used to have its own time, and it was not until the First World War that the Greenwich meridian was chosen as the standard. France, the Netherlands, the United Kingdom, and the United States of America were the first to adopt the system, and since then it has become a custom. In Kenya we have been using the Greenwich meridian time, but it is now being proposed to change to the East African Standard Time, which is based on the meridian 35 degrees East of Greenwich or two hours East of London. In Africa, Morocco adopted West European time while Egypt and the Sudan adopted East African time. 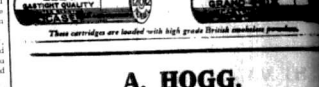

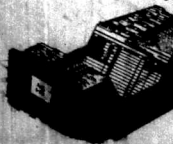

ALCOHOL AS AN ANAESTHETIC.

Chimed by Two Mexican Doctors.

SUCCESSFUL RESULTS.

Two Mexican doctors, Dr. M. Garcia Marin and Dr. Manuel Ortiz, who were delegates to the recent International Medical Congress in London, are doing their utmost to popularize a form of anaesthesia which, they claim, has none of the disadvantages of chloroform and in several ways is an improvement on it.

The method, says the "Morning Post" medical correspondent, consists in brief, in injecting ethyl alcohol (i.e., ordinary alcohol) directly into the blood stream by means of the veins, thereby producing anaesthesia.

It is claimed they have issued for publication the results of their experiments that may "falter" from the present methods of anaesthesia. These claims is that surgical failures arise from the fact that the anaesthetic used is in fact a poison.

No Initial Syncope.

In intravenous anaesthesia, as practised by them, they claim that there is, on the other hand, complete abolition of the initial syncope caused by the irritation of the mucous membrane. As is well known, this irritation is transferred by the nerves to the heart.

In the case of chloroform, Dr. Waller showed years ago that, when it is administered, there is immediately a high concentration

of the drug in the blood, with the result that there is a danger point at about the end of the third minute after administration. Once that point is passed the percentage of chloroform in the blood runs only very slowly and the danger period is over.

Dr. Marin and Dr. Ortiz claim that, by introducing the anaesthetic directly into the circulation, and may lead to an increase in the circulation is eliminated. The new method, it is stated, has been already used on 704 patients and on 200 human beings. In a statement the doctors say:

When the skull and face are involved the method of intubation besides being dangerous, is uncomfortable, and may lead to an infection of the area during the manipulation of the anaesthetic. It is such cases intubation is imperative because it not only insures freedom of action, but does away with all risk of infection. It has the additional advantage that there is no overflow of saliva and no risk of catching contagious diseases through the respiratory system. The extent of anaesthesia is very simple and readily controlled.

Further, ethyl alcohol is 157 times less poisonous than chloroform, while surgical anaesthesia can be obtained by means of a dose of three or four times less than the latter one. In the case of chloroform, the margin between the anaesthetic state and death is very much narrower."

"Great Future."

Discussing the problem a leading anaesthetist expressed interest in the method of anaesthesia described by the two Mexican doctors.

"It has for years," he said, "been a common practice to inject pentothalium by means of injections, but so far, I have had no experience of ethyl alcohol being used in this way. The solution, however, seems eminently reasonable, and I must say that when alcohol is taken by the

mouth, it is absorbed into the blood stream, and the amount of which the statement has been made is sufficient to benefit the patient, chloroform is not the anesthetic, and either to safe-guard the anaesthetic, or to

an paper read to the recent annual meeting of the Uganda Planters' Association by Mr H. Harcourt, Government entomologist.

I have put the title of my talk in the form of a question because there is still much to be learned regarding this subject. My remarks will be short. I desire to promote discussion and to stimulate your interest so that you will observe for yourselves and quite likely discover some factor which will be of use in preventing or reducing damage to crops by insects. You are able to wander through your crops any day, at all seasons of the year and in several districts, and you thus have splendid opportunities for making observations.

When land is cleared of its natural flora and a cultivated crop is substituted the usual food of certain insects is destroyed, and if they can find and multiply on the crop the insects will do so. Usually the wild food plants of pests are closely related to the cultivated plants which they attack. In some instances, however, the insect may feed on a number of diverse plants and such insects become general pests especially where no weeds are allowed to grow among the crop. An example of the latter type is the cutworm which attacks herbaceous plants such as tobacco and vegetables, and the seedlings of some woody plants like cotton, coffee, Cassia, etc.

Cultivation of an area disturbs the complex balance which usually exists in nature between insects and their food and enemies. The larger the individual area put under cultivation of a single crop the more intense is likely to be the attack by these insects for which that crop is a suitable food. Thus on a large estate an insect pest may be a serious pest while on a small plot of the same crop some little distance away the insect may be difficult to find.

Influencing Factors

With a perennial crop, such as coffee, there are various factors which may influence directly or indirectly the occurrence of insects on pests. Among such factors are soil quality, depth of soil, and the amount of water in the soil.

soil favours attack by millipedes. (c) Termites—white ants. There have been many instances of attack by termites on various economic plants. In practically all such cases the presence of Phalaris, or other root disease, has been easily demonstrable. It is primarily responsible.

(d) Various small beetles have been recorded as borers of Para rubber trees. Here wood, or resin, or suspended latex flow, resulting from fungal or other diseases are the forerunners of attack by these beetles. Prevention is the only hope in this case because it is impossible to control the borer when once they have entered the wood.

Sucking Insects

I have passed up to insects of the sucking type which include the white fly, aphids, mealybugs, scale, woolly bugs and thrips. I shall review these generally because I believe that the causes of attack are generally similar.

Largely, observations over a period of years has led me to the conclusion that the presence in considerable numbers (that is, as pests) of most, if not all, species of sucking insects indicates a weakly condition of the attacked plants. In some instances the weakness is due to poor soil or to the presence of shade, while in other cases of cultivation or continued shallow cultivation are responsible. The abnormal increase of such insects is probably due to wide change consequent on the change in the plants, which favours rapid increase of the pest. This change is a result of the inability of the soil to supply adequate supplies of water and the various dissolved mineral salts under the varying conditions of climate. GOVERNMENT OUTLINES ITS POLICY.

(Continued from page 1.)

"My Ministers propose to introduce legislation to promote a selective policy of firm clearance to make further provision for housing in Urban areas."

"My Ministers have decided that this Bill has come to a healthy stage in the whole field of legislation relating to the sale and supply of housing for work and on their recommendation I propose shortly to appoint Commissions for this purpose."

My Ministers are engaged in a general survey of various national institutions and persons here in Mombasa a bill is being prepared to amend the Widows' Pensions (Old Age) Pension Act of 1920 so as to modify the conditions applicable to certain persons and to make provision in regard to the classes of persons entitled thereto. The measure will be introduced to remedy the situation created by the Trades Disputes and Trade Unions Act of 1927.

The extended fraying in the recent general election placed in the hands of the whole of my people of adult years the grave responsibility of guarding the well-being of the nation as a constitutional democracy. My Government proposes to institute an examination of the experiences of the election in order that a working law relating to Parliamentary elections may be brought into conformity with new conditions.

Debate on the Address.

MR BALDWIN
(BY WIRELESS.)

July 2. The debate on the Address to the reply to the Speech from the Throne was opened in the House of Commons this afternoon.

Mr. Stanley Baldwin equaled whether any reference to the report of the financial experts proposed as approved by the Government would be submitted to Parliament before the final decision was taken. He thought that the visit to the United States which the Prime Minister projected was absolutely right. Both countries suffered from absence of personal intercourse between their statesmen. Increasing the personal intercourse between statesmen in Europe was a matter of first importance and had, he believed, rendered possible such progress as had been made.

No Frictions Opposition.
He expressed full agreement with

what was said in the Speech on unemployment, improved transport and trade, but asked the Government's intention regarding the safeguarding of industry.

Concluding, he reminded the House that the Government was a minority one, but said that his supporters had no desire to offer frictions opposition. They had decided to assist His Majesty's Government being carried on but it would require self-control on both sides. In approaching the grave difficulties that faced the country it would be an occasional session for the country and Empire to face the world in our United Parliament.

THE PRIME MINISTER

The Prime Minister immediately replied. He said that it would be the care of the Government if representations were made to them by the respective leaders of the party asking for opportunities to discuss matters of great import to the House or grave importance to the nation to see that they were given.

In view of the present position at home and abroad, he wondered how far it was possible without how far by abandoning any of their party positions or surrendering any issues of their party principles and outlook, to consider themselves more as a Council of State and less as arrayed opponents facing each other. As far as they were concerned, co-operation would be welcome in putting ideas into a common pot and bringing legislation and administration that would be of substantial benefit to the nation.

Proceeding, Mr. Macdonald said that the Government existed to deal with two dominating concerns.

The first was unemployment and social betterment and the second peace to be secured by the cordial co-operation of nations. An essential to the first was a sound policy to stimulate trade that would raise the standard of living of the people and produce confidence that far play was being done all round upon which alone industrial peace could rest.

An essential to the second was a better understanding with America. He would communicate with the leader of the Opposition when he was in a position to make a definite statement on that subject. Conversations with America had already been started. The war history of a preliminary and exploratory character. No time was being lost.

regarding on methods of procedure and order in which the problem should be approached.

DISARMAMENT

The Fact of Peace known as the Kellogg Pact has continued had been agreed to practically the nations of the world. The Government was anxious to build upon that disarmament policy and would recognize that Pact as a living and controlling influence upon international policy. Both Governments seek at once to cooperate with other great naval powers as soon as negotiations had reached their proper stage. It was well-known however, that a preliminary understanding between America and Great Britain was necessary if success was to crown their efforts. Mr. Macdonald stated that the Chairman of the Preparatory Commission on Disarmament said that the League of Nations had said that conversations should be held between naval powers. The British Government was undertaking their work in the hope that it contributed towards the solution of the problem engaging the attention of that Commission.

REPARATIONS

Regarding reparations, he said that the experts report was a document of great complexity requiring much explanation. The Government had intended the British expert to whom it referred his most accurate thanks. He had to accept compromises which he did not altogether like but she did their best to secure British interest. Three Departments of State were deeply interested. The Treasury, Foreign Office and Board of Trade.

At the moment they were examining the report with the leader of the Opposition for the convenience of the Government which must accept. The immediate questions to be considered were the rate and date of the Conference. The Government had suggested London. He would make a definite statement as to in the procedure and main points which had to be raised at the Conference.

He proposed that every constitutional method that was proper would be used in order to communicate the situation as fully as possible to Parliament. Mr. Macdonald concluded the House that the publication of the report from the League that could not remain a mere novel longer and that some sort of agreement must be reached. In reaching that agreement he said he hoped everyone would understand that

whatever negotiations may govern the situation we shall go back on none of our contracts."

SAFEGUARDING OF INDUSTRY.

Passing on to domestic affairs he said that the Government had come into possession of the report on the wool industry which they would publish but not put into operation until they had considered the late Government's proposals known as the White Paper. Safeguarding requires while safeguarding requires action. Regarding existing Safeguarding duties, the supporters of the Government had consistently opposed their imposition and made it abundantly clear that they would reserve their right to remove them when practicable. The opposition to all protective duties had just been overwhelmed as passed by election. It must be therefore understood that Government would in no case renew those duties should they remain in operation until the statutory period had expired and they reserved the right to repeal them at earlier dates than those fixed for their expiration if it appeared practicable and desirable to do so.

In coming to conclusions, the Government would have regard to the inconvenience which the changes of policy inflicted on traders in the revenue aspects of the question.

Proceeding, he referred to the coal, cotton, and steel industries to the need for changes in the way regarding other industries.

Wheat Exposed From New Variety.

THE FARMERS' POSITION.

WARRANTS (CORRESPONDENT.)

In their capacity of Medical Services and Colonel James Mackintosh returned here on a visit to the district. A determined effort is being made to stamp out malaria.

Motor Accident.

A bad accident occurred Tuesday on the Mbeale Road. A motor bus carrying a number of Amansio Natives overturned owing to the breaking of the front axle. The Indian was killed and several natives injured.

Outbreak of Plague.

Malaria is present in various parts of the district and a number of deaths are reported among the Indians. In fact there is a great wave of sickness in the port but we are pleased to report that the three Europeans who were sick with blackwater fever have recovered.

Drop Prospects.

The rains have just started again after a break of about two weeks and may be expected to continue now up to the end of August. Farmers are busy getting in their crops and there is great activity on all sides to get the work done and finished with. The earlier plantings are coming along alright, and if the locusts and other pests do not do us any harm we should get another good crop. A great deal more Kenya Government wheat has been planted in this district, this year, and quite a few farmers have given up Equator altogether, since Kenya Governor has proved itself much more satisfactory than all round. This is an advantage since the latter has proved itself a much heavier yielding wheat. A good deal of interest, locally, centres round a new wheat now growing this year for the first time, which has been supplied to us by the Government Plant Breeder. It is known, at present, as P.202, and the Burni Forest has been especially selected to multiply a considerable quantity of this new wheat, for the Plant Breeder, for general issue to farmers next year and the year after. The Plant Breeder has great hopes of it as an improvement on anything we have at present. It is said of it, that while it does not yield quite so well as Kenya Chama, it is better than Equator in this respect, and is absolutely true proof as far as can be said at present, and also has good winter wheat. More should be known about it after this season, as it is being grown on various soils around here now, and at slight varying altitudes, and the results are awaited with interest. We also have some quantities of several other new wheat.

Labour Plaintiffs.

There is a very marked amount of discontent among the natives as to the position in the native service and very day natives are applying for work all over the district. It is clear that the native is feeling the effects of the present high prices of things in the native service in the country, as well as the European. There is a general tendency on the part of farmers to send down their labour force as much as possible, and to do this with as few natives as they can.

"Yes, real live brain cells from a chicken preserved," said the long scientist.

Like a couple of schoolboys at a play, they ran to a microscope, peering and chattering, and whispering each other on the back. For it was the matter for which they had travelled to the Royal Society at Burlington House, and at that, their delightful sharing scene, telling each other of new discoveries, making every little joke about "relations of nerve fibres to normal and resigned equilibrium," and behaving like the greatest of normal, and that the matter was what a clever lad I am! scientist in the world.

Municipal Valuations.

The necessity for the strengthening of the staff to deal with valuations in the Municipal area was stressed at the meeting of the Nairobi Town Council on Tuesday and it was agreed that approximately not exceeding £100 should be incurred in the first instance. A letter from the Chairman of the Nairobi Area Town Planning Authority was read to a recent meeting of the Municipal Town Planning and Health Committee. The new attention to the fact that the present staff was unable to carry out the required work in connection with valuations and the Council made arrangements for it to be strengthened. The Committee decided that the staff should be increased to the funds allocated for the work not being exceeded. The first instance, authorized Messrs. Murrison and Pecher of Messrs. Murrison and Pecher £100 worth instructions to submit their report hereon a month hence. The Town Council adopted the recommendations of the Committee without discussion.

Suburban Shopping Centre.

PERSONAL NOTES AND NEWS.

STANDARD CORRESPONDENT.

London, June 4.
I learn on most reliable authority that Sir Edward Grigg is looking forward to being back in Kenya in ample time to deal with the preparation of the Estimates. Captain Gust went down at Bristol because there were two Liberal candidates in the field, one himself, backed locally by the Constitutional organization, and the other by the official Liberal Body. The constitutional vote was therefore fatally split. Sir Arthur Shirley Bean closed his young Parliamentary career with a defeat at Portsmouth by a dockyard official who has stood times without number. Perhaps no one regrets the defeat of Mr. Saklatvala which was very conclusive since he only managed to poll 4,554 votes out of about 25,000.

East Africa therefore will have both friends and foes in the House—perhaps a little more in the latter respect than the former. The only consolation is that the country was probably never mentioned in the election at all.

If H. H. Sultan of Zanzibar duly arrived in London on Friday, and in spite of the excitement of the elections this has caused a great deal of interest. The rumour-tidingsphere about the distinguished prince has first the magnification of all journalists and there is not a paper that has not published articles about his life, family, administration, kingdom and his appearance and habits. The Sultan was met by Lord Pirbright, Colonel Sney and other members of the Colonial Office at Victoria Station last Friday, and a large crowd was attracted by his magnificent robes. The party proceeded to the Hyde Park Hotel.
