LIGHTERAGE PROBLEM IN TANGANYIKA.
Government Denies Intention of Creating State Monopoly.
GOVERNOR'S PLEDGE.

Unofficial Members Give Their Support to the New Measure.
Some months ago the declared intention of the Tanganyika Government to turn the lighterage services at the Port of Dar-es-Salaam into a public service aroused considerable criticism, both in the Territory and in London. The position with regard to the lighterage services, outlining the intentions of the Government was published, as will be seen from the report of the debate given below, the position has been made still clearer and the bill passed its third reading without opposition.

THE BILL'S REAL PURPOSE.

In moving the Second Reading of the Bill (Public Service), Mr. the Hon. the Acting Chief Secretary said that the lighterage services of the ports of the Territory were essential services, and it followed that, under Article 1 of the Mandate, the Mandatory Power was free to organize, control, and operate such services as docks, cranes, and the ordinary facilities on the wharves.

As to the present conditions at Dar-es-Salaam, which he described as a chaotic state, there were some companies operating in the port, but they were not controlled. They owned their own wharves, but otherwise shared facilities on the wharf, and so a chaos of activities there, which he thought it necessary to regulate, and to prevent any further chaos, he proposed that the arrangements should be made smoothly. The position at present was that the companies had no control, and he proposed that the Government should take over the wharves, and that the companies should be allowed to continue to operate, but under the control of the Government.

CARNATIONS.

The following are extracts from Montagu E. Alcock's book "Carnations", with notes on the application in this Colony.

The following extracts are more important and can be followed in detail in this Colony.

The First Stopping: Among the difficulties that confront the average grower are when to stop or pinch the top of the plants of Paeoniac Carnations, the correct conditions in which to have the young plants for stopping, and where to stop them.

It is very important to encourage side growth and to build up a bushy plant, which in turn will produce a large quantity of flowers.

Regarding the actual stopping itself, there is only one correct way of doing it.

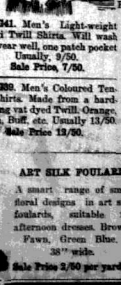

POPULAR TRANSMISSION SYSTEMS.

Open Shaft or Torque Tube?

CONSIDERATIONS OF THEIR PROS AND CONS.

Apart from the introduction of one or two cars with front-wheel drive, and one or two others with independently sprung wheels and a final drive carried on the frames, there have been no striking innovations in the design of the transmission system for many years.

"Fly-Off"

From this one might imagine that there is little to choose between the two systems, and this view is supported by the fact that the cars on the British market today are all equipped with one of the two systems.

In the Hotchkiss drive, the rear axle is usually carried by half-elliptic springs attached to the frame of the car at their forward

ends by a simple pivot joint and at their rear ends by a shackle. The axle casing is bolted rigidly to the centres of the springs, and the open propeller-shaft must be provided with a universal joint at each end.

At one time it was quite common to find an open propeller-shaft with a separate torque member which was attached to a frame-cross member. This system, however, seems to have fallen out of favour of late, designers apparently preferring to employ the true Hotchkiss drive or a torque tube rather than to take a middle course.

Torque Tube Lay-out

When a torque tube is employed at the forward portion of the centre part of the axle casing, it is the part that houses the bevel pinion—an extended forward tube to meet the gear box, or a

substantial cross member of the frame, to which it is attached by a large spherical roller. For the relative movement between axle and frame, only one universal joint is necessary, and that is located within the spherical joint on the upper link. Half-elliptic springs are shackled at each end and a tension bearing is also introduced at the point of attachment of the springs to the axle casing.

ended by a simple pivot joint and at their rear ends by a shackle. The axle casing is bolted rigidly to the centres of the springs, and the open propeller-shaft must be provided with a universal joint at each end.

Regarding the Hotchkiss drive, its chief advantage, particularly in a saving of weight, for when a torque tube is used part of its weight must be regarded as unused, and as this is carried by the axle casing it involves the provision of additional strength and, therefore, weight in the casing itself.

A Material Advantage

Another advantage of the open shaft system is that the drive of each wheel is taken by a member close to it—namely, the forward half of the spring. This is an advantage, because there are variations of strain between the two rear wheels which may impose a severe bending stress upon the axle-casing-torque-tube assembly.

It is plain that with the open shaft system, when the torque and thrust are taken through the springs, the result is a certain amount of elasticity in the drive, which is of advantage to the transmission as a whole, as it forms a means of avoiding shocks. This elasticity in the drive exists there is no doubt, as one may see on watching any car with Hotchkiss drive starting on a severe gradient. This may, however, be a disadvantage in certain circumstances, for such a car may be brought to rest on the grade frequently, to the detriment of the rear axle "judging" to such an extent that sufficient oil will be maintained the forward movement of the car cannot be obtained. The

fact that in such cases the tightening of the rear shock absorbers will overcome the trouble can hardly be claimed to remove this drawback. It is, of course, obvious that as the springs have proved unequal to the task of supporting the drive and torque the shock absorbers are called upon to help them.

It must not be forgotten, also, that when the brakes are applied that the thrust and torque stresses are not eliminated—they are merely reversed. This, of course, affects the torque tube system just as much as the open shaft drive, but the torque tube is expressly designed for such stresses whatever by their direction, whereas with the open shaft the stresses are taken by members which primarily are intended for other work.

Pros. and Cons.

It is sometimes claimed that the open shaft is a simpler design than the torque tube system, but just as many engineers are prepared to refute this. In the Hotchkiss drive two universal joints are necessary, and one of these must be arranged to allow of a plunging movement—this is, an alteration in length of the propeller-shaft due to the movement of the rear axle. Against this, however, the torque tube involves a spherical or forked joint at its forward end, and a spherical bearing for the springs on the axle casing, although only one universal joint is required. On the scores of design, therefore, which type is preferable probably depends upon the details of design and the methods of production.

Finally, one is forced to the conclusion, already expressed, that the advantages and disadvantages of the two systems just about balance one another, but it does not necessarily follow that this will always be so. For the adoption of a different form of suspension would materially alter the various factors which have to be considered. Several deaths occurred among the fanatical tribesmen during the riot, the dead including their leader and one of his wives.

A GALLANT CHIEF.

An enquiry into the circumstances connected with the outbreak of plague in the village of Kalagala near Masaka, Uganda, was held yesterday.

On July 20, between 10.00 and 1.00 p.m. a riot occurred at Kalagala, a village near Masaka, in the gambusia of the Mutoro III.

From the evidence I have taken in this enquiry I am satisfied that the facts are as follows: The deceased belonged to a section known as Malakite. This section had some 400 members.

A small group of these people under the leadership of a man named Kanyisa who appears to have been an extreme fanatic, instigated a riot.

On July 20 the Gambusia Chief, Susani Mutoro, proceeded to Kalagala to get these ringleaders to surrender to the Native Government.

The Malakite leader was 'bravely' of Susani, intending visit (by Susani himself). From the evidence of the Malakite witnesses it is evident that the Chief's lawful authority was being challenged.

The Mutoro III showed cool courage, great tact and a sense of responsibility in his endeavours to get these fanatics to reason.

LIGHTERAGE PROBLEM IN TANGANYIKA

(Continued from page 1.)

bill. The first was that the fee for licences was provided at 1,000 shillings per annum. In the original paper it was suggested that a fixed fee of the order of 500 shillings per annum might be charged; but on further consideration, the Government did not propose to go on with this alternative. In view of the many difficulties it foresaw.

The further point was that Clause 11 (C) of the bill provided that the decision of the High Court as to any application under the ordinance should be final, and that the matter should not be subject to appeal to any court. On further consideration, the Government did not consider that this clause was desirable, or that the right of appeal should be taken away. Accordingly, the clause would be deleted. (Hear, hear.)

The Hon. Major Lloyd said this bill had been before the Government for some considerable time, and by time had been examined, both by the major interests concerned and also by interested sections of the general public. The unofficial members were present in discussing the measure, in that this bill would be subject to further inspection by the Secretary of State in the light of their remarks, and they said it might have an influence on whether the bill would or would not become law.

It was clear that in a country of this description, ports and the trade built by public enterprise, and by private enterprise. In such circumstances, it was essential that the governments of such countries should have some controlling power. It would be a better course for the Government to take on such matters, but that was presumed by the work carried out solely by commercial means.

A Port Trust?

It would seem to be necessary to consider the formation of a Port Trust or authority which would set in the way and which would be wholly necessary, and which was beyond question, that the control of the ports must soon be divorced from the Government, and with the legislature of the country. Pending such time one had to examine what steps could be taken to preserve the even running of affairs, and to ensure that the public who are paying for and providing facilities for public companies to work were not being fair treatment. The lighterage interests themselves would admit that they had to face some measure of government control, which would not exist were it not that public money was providing the facilities. He did not think that there would be much opposition on the part of lighterage companies to licensing and some measure of control.

Bill's Broad Powers

The powers of the bill, however, appeared to him to be too broad, it would be dangerous for Government to attempt in any way the enlargement of the present services of the country by taking over departmentally the sole working of the ports. He knew the Government did not contemplate such a step. Many Governments would not be willing. But from the public point of view, the bill gave Government the power to take such a step, without any further legislative measure. On such grounds,

agreed—and the Government would legislate by a public law. Now that it was quite clear that it was not an attempt at nationalisation of public services, the public would be more agreeable to the ordinance, and a wasteful competition.

He was glad to think that there had been a change of public opinion as to the bill in consequence of Government's confirmation of the principle of nationalisation. It was in the public interest that the principle should be affirmed without delay, and therefore he gave his support to this bill because he had all out for the expansion of trade in the harbor. (Hear, hear.)

Port Allied.

The Hon. Mr. Ghose said the public had been alarmed when the bill had been first published, but that fear had now been allayed. There was now not so much opposition to the bill as at first. He had full sympathy with the bill. Licensing was probably the best method, but the public sought an assurance that the lighterage would not be turned into a Government department, and his reference to the public. Assurance was not given in the bill.

Artificial Light?

The Hon. General Boga-Moss said he had not intended to speak on the measure, but since the Chief Secretary had said that possibly the Secretary of State might be given a veto, he thought it necessary for him to appear in support of the bill. In his view, the objection against the bill was largely artificial. People objected to Government interfering with private enterprise. The bill merely affirmed the lighterage of wharves to be an essential public service, which was already agreed. The present measure, taken in conjunction with the assurance that Government merely protected the lighterage companies, was not an interference with established Government. It was an assurance that he had no intention of taking over the lighterage service, and this should be welcomed by the lighterage companies.

The Hon. Mr. Stewart said he did not speak at the risk of repeating the views of others, but he felt he ought to add his support. It would be general agreement that some measure of this nature was desirable. The business was being done by public money on harbour development, and it did not seem unreasonable that Government should exercise more control over the port services.

No Complaint From Companies.

If it were the Government that remarks had been made, which might lead the public to think that the Secretary of State only regarded the views of Hon. members in special instances. Such was not the case. In important discussions the views of unofficial members were always sent to the Secretary of State. Major Lloyd had believed that no representations against the present measure had been made from any of the three companies operating at Dar-es-Salaam. He was correct. Government had received no representation from any of them. It was an acknowledged fact that the plant at the port as it was, was not a very satisfactory one. It was a company which that measure would be being done by one company only. This meant a wasteful competition, as well as a locking-up of capital.

The Governor's Plea.

Regarding the undertaking requested by Hon. members, in a

letter addressed by Government to the Dar-es-Salaam Chamber of Commerce on April 18, it was stated that it was an attempt at nationalisation of public services, namely, employing an agent company as at Kisumu, or approving by Government a company which would be established without the vote of the Legislative Council, and he felt he could pledge the Secretary of State that no steps would be taken in the direction of taking over the public wharves, or providing service as a public wharves, until the Council, signified by resolution. In saying by Government that it was like to make one remark, it would be a good thing if they could get Government instead of "Public" Government money was public money, and Government service was public service.

Not Departmentally.

As to running the service as a departmental service, as the instance of the late Secretary of State, if H.  Sir.—So far as the "kharazi" striking in Indian merchants' shops concerned, they have to thank God and the Government, that the Shop Hours Act has been passed otherwise merely like dumb driven cattle. I would like to point out that as the police have been serious towards the question of closing the shops half a day on any of the work days in the same way if they will be serious regarding the number of working hours and other rules and regulations of the Act, the servants will really thank them.

Also it will be far better if there can be established a good organization to protect the work hours of the servants, so that the shopkeepers might not get extra work from their employees under the excuse of the hours of the day. If the work is up to 7 p.m. and arrangements show on every Saturday and Sunday.

LUPINS AS FODDER
To the Editor "E. A. Standard"
 Sir.—As this most valuable plant does not yet appear to be much known or cultivated, I would like to say that it is a very important in this matter in West Australia that a leading group of companies there is doing a business from £80 to £1,000 for the best 100 acres cultivated and several new varieties have been evolved, these stock owners are very pleased with the results. I do not think it possible to over-praise this very valuable plant which in good soil will give amazing and almost immediate results.

The lupin is an annual leguminous plant, noted for its wonderful soil-binding properties, and its heavy yield of nutritious fodder is almost equal to the famous lucerne and will thrive in any class of well drained soil, even on that which is not so good as wheat and clover. In first class country in West Australia it is said to yield over four tons of sheep per acre, and that one patch of very poor soil is gravely well that at one time would not have been classed as sheep to the acre country. Although lupins will in places grow shoulder high, the ideal crop is said to be a bush stand about thirty inches high when but a single cutting is taken, and in some instances, mature farmers have for a long time past been well aware of their worth. It is also stated that several prom-

inent pastoralists who for years past had practically all their lands were given advantages of the lupin. This is also one of the very best crops for fattening stock and rapidly and quickly matures the soil.

Lupins and Wimmera Grass are found to grow successfully in much less than 12 inch rainfall and in two together they form an almost balanced ration. It is well known that in several European countries lupins have been extensively cultivated for many years past for feeding, and it is worth noting that the soil and for the beans, which are as good as feed, and they have been much learned land in the field pastures.

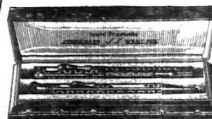

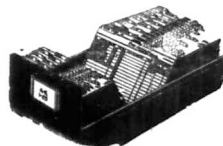
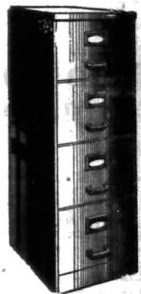

The championship meeting opens on Friday, August 20, playing before the Nairobi and Civil Service clubs' courts. It may be taken as granted that the tennis will be representative of the very best in the Colony. The entries constitute a new record in the history of the championships.

A RECORD MEETING.

The Men's Doubles, with 30 entries, has one less than the Mixed, and is an event that is quite likely to leave the prophet all wet.

The holders, Whelan and Turner, are not defending their title this year, while both last year's runners-up, Hest and Harrison, are on home leave. These absences make the event a very open one and a contest more difficult.

In the last eight of the following names should appear—Dawkins and Hayward, Minton and Bowler, Rhodes and Thomas, Sorabjee and Nowrojee, Drivas and Lewis, Sands and Duncan, Pines and Rafessath, Bradley and Allen.

In an exciting Dawkins and Hayward it is assumed that anyone partnering Hayward is likely to be a strong player in which case these two should have little difficulty in reaching the last eight. Minton and Bowler should make a strong combination, and the latter created a very favourable impression by his performance in the recent Tennis Championships. Rhodes and Thomas must use Mombasa Tennis Club's Beatle in the first round, but their better knowledge of local conditions should serve them in good stead.

Sorabjee and Nowrojee did well last year, defeating Rhodes and

have shown up strongly in previous Championships but he has been able to get to Nairobi to participate.

In regard to the names for the eight couples Bradley and Allen must be included in the first round, and the result of this will depend largely on whether Bradley can reproduce his old form or not. 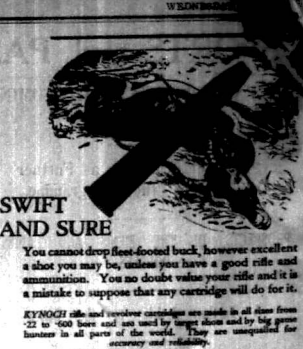

Tanganyika Crops.

OFFICIAL REPORTS TO END OF JUNE.

Following are the official crop reports to the end of June issued by the Tanganyika Department of Agriculture—

COASTAL AREA: NORTH

Panaji—All crops doing well. Baganjoro—Harvest of food stuffs not yet general. Cotton doing well.

COASTAL AREA: SOUTH

Indoi—Rainfall negligible. Early cotton good. Much lowland cotton complete failure due to early cessation of April rains. One hundred per cent increase over last year expected. Harvesting rice general, but east, except Mjoro and west, failure central. Millet fair. Hill lands, failure west.

Kilimo—Maize of rain is reasonable for small yields. Cotton and millet will be below average. Other crops poor. Shortage of food is now certain in some areas.

Lindi—Cotton fair. Simsim unduly good estimate six per cent increase. Domestic food supply of area adequate but shortages in small localised areas.

CENTRAL LINE AREA.

Dares-Salaam—Cotton a decidedly a failure throughout the district. Along the coast south of Dares-Salaam there is much rice—elsewhere this crop is poor.

Morogoro—Prospect unaltered since last report which stated insufficient rainfall last two months results in all crops being backward and below average. Kilimo district cotton reported good, but maize and millet a complete failure. Dry conditions still prevailing. Kiaki cotton in good condition but poor around Morogoro.

Kilimo—Rice good and millet satisfactory. Maize not up to expectations and below average. Cotton prospects good. Dedona—Harvesting completed.

Harvest will amount to just over half last year's crop. Maize Harvest gathered. Shortage in places but it will suffice.

Tabara: Crops of groundnuts fair. Prospects of millet crop poor.

NORTHERN AREA

Lushoto: Cessation of rains probable. Exception crops anticipated in the District.
Moshi: Slight local rains. In the hill area crops continue to progress favourably. Prospects for lowland crops suffer badly from drought. Harvesting commenced, fair yields expected. Legumes progressing favourably. Cotton suffering badly from drought. Prospects uncertain.

LAKE VICTORIA AREA

Shinyanga: Harvesting of food crops and early planted cotton in progress.

Negosi: Rainfall 102 inches. Crops mostly harvested, results very poor in all areas except Manyoni and Mwarakumbi. Native soil planting potatoes and cavares for supplement. Maize failure. Cotton crop very poor owing to drought and late planting.

Kahama: Crops in eastern area good but in western area poor. No rain since last report which said: "Crops in eastern area still promising well. Western area not so good owing to lack of rain during the month."

Mwanza: Harvesting of groundnuts, simsim and millet. Rain throughout the Province at end of month will raise the cotton production slightly. Native holdings groundnuts due to low prices. Sh 27 per fraud.

Biharamulo—No rain. Cotton picking commenced. Millet crop being harvested.

SOUTHERN AREA

Mabanga: Rainfall June 50 inches. Harvesting nearly completed and serious decrease fifty per cent, but a little recovery confirmed. Ample food for district.

Iringa: On plateau maize crop estimated twenty-five per cent short. Maize basic normal. Lower areas crop eight per cent short. Shortage caused by drought. January, February.

Tukuyu: Crop prospects on time good.

Songea: Harvest of food crops practically over. Cotton and tobacco continue poor because of drought. Njombe: Rainfall June nil (trace crop now being reaped giving yield considerably below normal.

School of Economics.

LORD PARFIELD GIVES AN ADDRESS.

(STANDARD CORRESPONDENT.) London, July 4.
Last Friday, on the occasion of a lecture in the Chamber School of Economics and Political Science, the Secretary of State for the Colonies, delivered the Commencement Address. Lady Steel-Maitland, with a reception by the Commencement Ceremony, had just read the Hon. Sir Nathan Sola-Maitland in Chairman of the Court of Governors. At the Commencement, Sir Lord was at the head of the list of the members of the School. Sir William Harcourt, the report of the work of the school. MOTORING.

ROAD PROBLEMS.
Question of Safe or Smooth Surfaces.
CONTRIBUTORY CAUSES.

The problem of providing safe road surfaces is by no means a simple one. It is apparent from the recent actions of various transport authorities. Naturally, attention is drawn to contributory causes apart from choice of material, and mainly can be dispensed with whether conditions, soil, and oil and grease droppings all have an influence on the road surface. The latter, however, goes on to suggest methods of dealing with existing surfaces, and then plainly hints that improved methods of road-making are employed by local authorities. Road Fund grants may not be forthcoming. The very fact that such a circular letter was deemed necessary shows that even the most authoritative ruling that it is not quite as it should be in this matter.

Road surveys are inclined to suggest that they alone are blameless. Motorists take undue risks on wet roads, they tell us, and as a last resource they plead that need for economy in road surfacing. No doubt the harder and smoother the surface the longer life it will have, but unfortunately it is not so simple as it seems. Road surveys are generally the most slippery, it is a pertinent question, however, whether your existing road on a safe road should be the first consideration. It is a hard nut to think about to decide that a surface is the first and most important requirement. It may be cheaper for the local authority to maintain a smooth and safe road, but if they save skillings in doing so, they are doing it at the expense of the life of those who fall there. In the damage and injury fairly attributable to them, it would seem to be seen which were the really cheaper roads in the end. It is by no means that the ideal of the road surveyor, and should be so. It is not even the most important factor.

Confusing Technicalities.
The general public know little about the technicalities of modern road-making, and there is much confusion as to the difference between tar bitumen and asphalt. Well washed native bitumen was apparently a very good road material but much of the bitumen used nowadays is not cut and weathered in the same way, while asphaltic bitumen is largely used in the construction of roads. That the Government should allow for open a great extension to farmers, that they be allowed to look after their own interests without the inefficient help of the Veterinary Department.

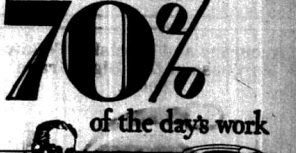

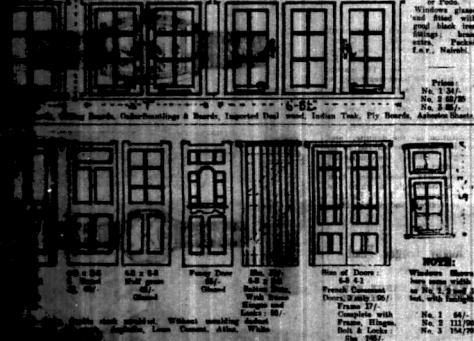

**ENQUIRY INTO LOSS OF
 S.S. "VESTRIS".**

**Finding of the British
 Court.**

**VESSEL OVERLOADED AND
 UNSEAWORTHY.**

**Not Fit to Encounter Perils of
 the Voyage.**

The British Board of Trade Court of Enquiry has delivered its judgment in regard to the loss of the s.s. "Vestris" which went down in the Atlantic on November 12 last during a severe storm. It will be remembered that an enquiry was held in America soon after the catastrophe when the finding included a number of strongly worded criticisms of the state of the ship and the actions of the officers.

The findings of the British enquiry, which lasted for 40 days, are equally critical.

During the course of his judgment, the Wreck Commissioner states that the ship was overloaded beyond her mark and was unseaworthy. Half of the doors on the upper deck were not water tight and tarpaulins, although supplied, were not available.

The life boats were in good order and the arrangements for manning and launching were efficient, but there was no evidence that definite orders were given to abandon ship. There was some disorganisation owing to passengers and crew going to boats other than those allotted to them. There was also a mistaken application of the traditional order, "women and children first."

HATCHES NOT BATTENED DOWN.

Mr. Butler Aspinall, the Wreck Commissioner gave evidence to-day in the Board of Trade enquiry into the loss of the liner "Vestris". The "Vestris" sank in the Atlantic on the American coast on November 12 with the loss of 112 lives.

The enquiry lasted forty days—the longest maritime enquiry held in this country. The tribunal had submitted a list of 59 questions to answer.

The Court found that overloading was a contributory cause to the loss of the ship. Among other causes was the undue condition of the ship, insufficient margin of buoyancy and reserve of buoyancy, and high wind which caused the vessel to list to starboard. The cargo and coal were properly loaded and distributed, and was secured from shifting, but should not have been secured in the upper holds.

Half of the doors on the upper deck were not water tight. Weather deck hatches were not latched down. Tarpaulins had been supplied, but were not available when needed. The vessel did not have a life boat in seaworthy condition and the arrangements for manning and

Export Markets.

The importance of developing the export trade of the country needs no emphasizing at any hand. The recovery of these markets, therefore you will readily understand necessitated considerable effort and expenditure. I am pleased to say that the work in this direction is now beginning to bear fruit, and that the outlook as to the foreign market is more satisfactory than at any time since the war. The Viril preparations are so helpful in the life conditions prevailing in many foreign countries, that we look forward to very considerable expansion of our trade in these parts of the world.

In regard to the development of our new preparation, Viril and Milk in powder form, you will see from the report that considerable progress has been made during the past year. The difficulties, however, which increased trade, to which I referred at our last meeting, necessitated the erection of a new factory at Napier, one of the richest milk districts in the Empire.

SQUAKS AND GRATTERING.
Many exhausts are not desirable, but if all stories are true they are often deliberately made so in order to draw the mechanical noise of the engine and the squeaking of the work. This may or may not be true; what is a fact is that far too many cars are noisy because of neglect on the part of the owner who permits his vehicle to continue running with many loose nuts and bolts, rods of adjustment, slack work and flexing on the chassis, spring shackles badly worn, old lamp brackets insecurely fastened.
While mechanical chattering and general noise does not affect the owner of the open car to the same extent as when a saloon is in use, the noise is there, and it is only when a general overhaul is completed that the driver notices the difference. At the same time it must be asserted as a writer in the "Chicago Herald," that manufacturers devote too little attention to the silencing of the modern medium-priced automobile. Metal valances fastened to the running boards and held in position under the coachwork by the body bolts are peculiarly susceptible to vibration, while the anchoring of the mudguards to those same running boards further aggravates the position.
Loose Coachwork.
To a greater degree than most other drivers imagine, loose coachwork is responsible for most of the noise of the open car. The rattling of the chassis frame very quickly loosens and ultimately wears through the holding-down bolts, with the result that the chassis rattles relative to the body and all sorts of groans and squawks make themselves heard. On saloon cars, door chatters can be most disturbing, and the provision

of adjustable doorstop pieces is long overdue. It is not a workmanlike job when these have to be unstrapped and advanced periodically only to find them so tight, so as to mesh deeper with the socket on the pillar. The old screw-bolts and the new ones are then much too close. Door hinges also work loose with distressing frequency, and far too few drivers take the trouble to tighten them. Windows work themselves in the frames, and when the packing has been loosened water finds its way into the upholstery. In such cases the old packing should be removed and new material worked in with a putty knife. Loose glass vibrates most annoyingly, and when its chatter is added to the other "speaking" parts motor-cars in closed cars are riddled with much of it.

THE EVOLUTION OF THE WAKIKUYU.

Interesting Lecture by Dr. Arthur.

20 YEARS AGO AND NOW.

The war proved to be a tremendous factor in the evolution of the Kikuyu tribe. Many of the natives who left their homes and went to the front with the Kikuyu Mounted Volunteers' Force, returned back with new ideas and new thoughts as the direct result of what they had seen and heard. From that day a new palimpsest method, and above that, a new program of development.

This was one of the many very interesting facts told to a large audience in the Nairobi branch of the Y.M.C.A. on Wednesday evening in a lecture on "The Evolution of the Kikuyu" by the Rev. Dr. Arthur. The lecture was profusely illustrated with lantern slides, many of which were taken 20 years ago.

In a graphic manner Dr. Arthur contrasted the early days of mission work in Kenya, when those who were engaged on it were regarded with suspicion and casters by the natives, with the present day when there are ordaining Ministers of the Kikuyu tribe and when natives freely come to the missions of their own accord.

During his 20 years work in the field, Dr. Arthur has made himself familiar with every phase of the life of the people amongst whom he works. His photographs are unique, many of them being subjects which it would be impossible to obtain in the present time, and they followed the work of the Kikuyu Mission through various stages of evolution. In dealing with the evolution of the tribe, Dr. Arthur showed the different sides of the work which has raised the Kikuyu from being a wild, and was a commonly known as "abominable" community to a law abiding and respected body of people. He explained how football has helped to take the place of the immoral dances of the past, how the modern doctors and hospital helpers with the latest aids of science have taken the place of the old witch-doctors and medicine men, with their extraordinary paraphernalia, and how the old rusticities have in which the people lived are now being re-

placed by modern buildings with broader doors and windows. Even in many small ways, moreover, development has taken place. The women who used to make their string bags from veridig make 'bags of raffia, make their own string from sisal fibre and afterwards dye it to obtain the artistic and schemes which are frequent by them.

Nairobi 10 Years Ago

In some amusing slides Dr. Arthur showed the development of some of the helpers and mission workers in the Colony. Canon Burda, who, modestly was an understated speaker, saw a slide which Dr. Arthur called "The Evolution of Canon Burda." The picture taken many years ago, which was taken while showing development road, Nairobi, as it was 120 years ago—a delightful looking avenue with no sign of the present day Nairobi. Other slides were of Mount Kenya, or Kilimanjaro, as it is known amongst the Kikuyu. The mountains have played a great part in the life of the Kikuyu people, who believe that God lives amongst the snows.

The customs of the tribe were mentioned and Dr. Arthur's intimate knowledge of the life of the people was very evident. He referred to the circumstances of women as being one of the great problems at the present time. The missionaries were setting their faces against this practice and he hoped that everyone would join in trying to get this custom abolished. Unfortunately the matter has become a political issue. The practice, he said, frequently resulted in the death of the first child and sometimes also of the mother. The matter was one which should receive the warmest consideration of all serious-minded people.

Dr. Arthur said that he contemplated the future of the Colony depended very largely on how people looked on the natives. He himself did not look on them as being people apart, but rather as brothers and sisters. If they were looked upon in the right way there was hope for the country, but if they were not there was no hope. The chair was taken by Mr. Brian Carr, who at the conclusion of the lecture presented a hearty vote of thanks to Dr. Arthur.

The Gospel of a Common Welfare.

The increasing number of constituents who by courtesy members of the Legislative Council find it possible to address audiences at Mombasa is a welcome sign of the times. The test is a sound if unhesitant recognition of common interests, the gospel of a common welfare. While a false unity would be an unhealthy condition of public opinion in any country, and while unity merely for the sake of a single view is neither possible nor desirable in the search for common sense, progress and understanding, nothing but good can emerge from this and proper strength being laid upon the mutual character of the responsibility which should be shared by every part of the Colony. The necessity imposed upon the country this year to face critical questions and to seek decisions on principles vitally affecting its future not only revealed the differences in view but the importance of finding a safe and trustworthy bridge. The bridge is being built on the foundation of frank explanations. While this policy is followed some need fear the ultimate cause. Realisation of the inter-dependence character of the functions which each member discharges has become more wide spread and with that recognition a sense of the need to work together harmoniously has developed which, though visualised differently, is essentially the same. The Elected Members who have been concerned in the approach to a better understanding have deserved well of the Colony, and the lead they have given should be closely followed. The work is not, however, completed. Frequent interchange of views and opinions is a necessary contribution to a better informed public opinion and we are glad to find it on its feet.

Mombasa signs of willingness and anxiety to make that contribution. On the basis of that understanding the work programme with greater confidence. While much has been done in the Highlands for Mombasa and the Coast for up-country interests, we are well satisfied to see the wealth of the Coast more fully exploited and its potentialities, economically, placed in their proper relationship to the development policy of Kenya as a whole. To that and greater knowledge of the Coast needs a required and we hope that as occasion permits, it will be forthcoming to guide and instruct those who perform the duty of legislating and directing the economic policy of the Colony. The formation of a new political organisation at Mombasa, following upon the inauguration of machinery in the Capital, to encourage more regular consideration of public affairs will greatly assist in that desirable direction and we are glad that members from up-country constituencies were able to support this Council conference at Mombasa in the discharge of so important a responsibility in Mombasa. We are glad, also, that opportunity was found to state clearly and frankly the real principles which govern the realisation of the Elected Members in preparation for their public work—organisation in which the Council members can play a valuable and important part with the support of their constituents. There is no doubt in our mind that careful consideration of the views of each Member of Council is of more use to the country than any other appearance in the Legislature. A sense of individual activity if past performance does not imply past performance independence and responsibility.

Nearly £5,000,000 Advances to Commerce and Agriculture.

1928 BANKING STATISTICS.

Remittances overseas from Kenya increased considerably while inter-territorial payments to the Colony dropped heavily.

Kenya and Uganda Trade.

FIGURES FOR JANUARY TO APRIL 1928.

The following statement of trade for Kenya and Uganda for the months January to April, 1928 and 1929 has been compiled by H.M. Trade Commissioner East Africa from figures supplied by the Commissioner of Customs.

Domestic exports from Kenya in 1928 were £1,111,841, and in 1929 £1,120,720. For Uganda in 1928 figures were £1,897,580 and in 1929 £2,008,964 and in 1928 £2,784,222.

Responsibility for Spread of Disease Denied.
CONTROL SUGGESTIONS.

Following the recent Conference with the Acting Governor on the subject of the removal of Somali cattle from Naivasha, the Council were requested to make their own investigation for the further consideration of the matter.
