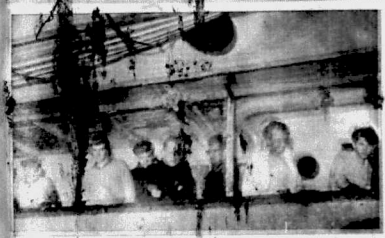

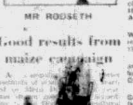

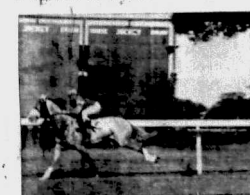

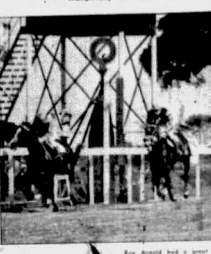

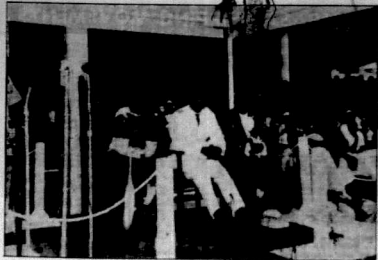

Nearly 200,000 head of cattle can be stamped out by the drought, many thousands are likely to die. Serious crop failures have also been reported, and even if rain comes soon, the possibility of saving much of the affected crop is small.

Government officials have offered to start a major relief programme to meet the drought situation, but it is being asked that the move may come just in time to save thousands from death and their owners from economic financial loss.

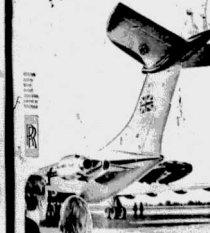

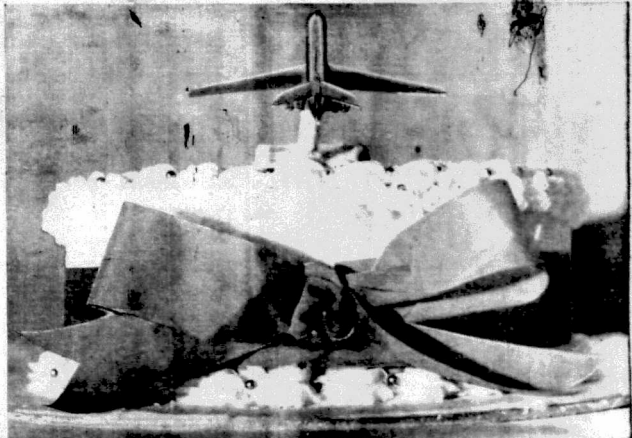
Swarms of butterflies invade Nairobi

RHODESIA PETROL CUT AGAIN Hopes of end to Tashkent deadlock

Britain may impose stronger sanctions

BRITAIN yesterday revealed the full extent of the fuel crisis caused by Rhodesia's oil embargo. The new regulations, which take effect on Tuesday, will restrict private motorists to one or two gallons a week, depending on the size of their car.

This is less than half the amount of petrol allowance made under the temporary rationing scheme imposed on December 29. Bulk buyers, including farmers and commercial users, will only get 50 per cent of the average amount of petrol they have drawn over the past 12 weeks. Commercial aviation operators, including Ceylon Airways, will get a similar allowance of petrol.

Foreign airlines are also affected. Aircraft registered outside the country will be able to draw only enough fuel to get to their next scheduled landing point.

Kenya Puts Ban on Russian Troops
A ban on Russian troops has been imposed in Kenya. The ban is part of a series of measures taken by the Government to support the United Nations embargo against Rhodesia.

Oil: Three for Week

Uganda Meat Packers Ltd. has stopped buying prime grade meat from Kenyan exporters of prime increase.

Mr. S. N. Makris, the general manager of the firm, which imports half of all the top grade beef which comes into Uganda from Kenya, said yesterday that they had expected to buy beef this year, and would not do so until an agreement had been reached with the Kenya Meat Commission.

Other buyers who import dressed beef from Kenya say they are expecting to put up their prices for first grade beef because they are having to buy the most of about 15 cents per pound more.

They are expecting their prices to go up by 15 cents per pound, depending on the cut and the grade of beef. Buyers said they are not complaining just about the new prices. They say that they buy live beef from a number of factors for 75 cents per pound.

ONLY HALF SALEABLE

Half of the meat is saleable after it has been dressed and the other is made of about 1,000 in round first grade meat. On top of that they have to allow for a loss of 10 per cent during the time between the time the meat is packed for export transport cost and the time it is sold.
