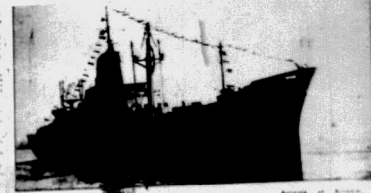

NIGERIA'S future was again thrown into doubt yesterday when the rebel major who led Saturday's attempted coup d'etat, in which 10 of the country's leaders were killed and the Prime Minister was kidnapped, made it clear that he would not do down terms before submitting to the new national ruler, Major Aguiyi-Ironsi.

President Gowon, who appeared at a Press conference in northern Nigeria, the centre of the revolt, side-by-side with Major Hassanu, said that one of the military groups appointed to Lagos by Major Gen. Ironsi, had been ready to march on Tuesday night that only a last-minute appeal from the rebel commanding officer prevented the march.

He said that he was handing over power to the military régime in Gen. Ironsi's name. He said that a five-point demand he had outlined for the rebels, terms for submission, had been accepted. He said that he was sure that there would be no progression, and an assurance that the politicians against whom the coup was directed would not be returned to power.

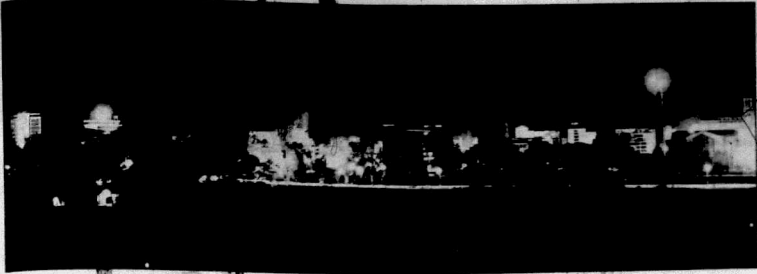

Democracy may end with military rule

WARNING that military rule might destroy democracy in Africa was given in Nairobi at the weekend by Kenya's Assistant Minister for Health, Mr. Moss. Addressing the students attending a course at the International Press Institute, Mr. Moss said that although some of the recent military coups in Africa had received sympathy from certain groups, if military rule prevailed it might destroy the civil democratic institutions in the continent.

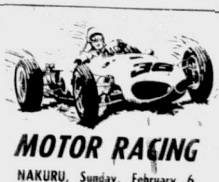

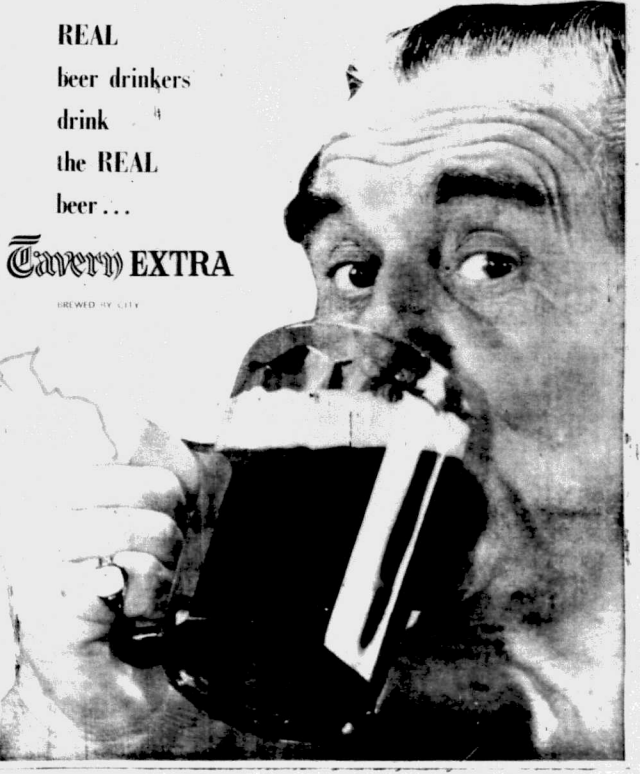
