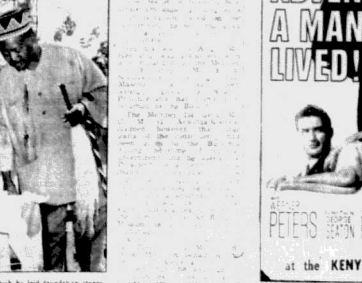

COST OF TRADE SANCTIONS

RELIANCE ON THE Rhodesian ports to speak plainly about the cost of the sanctions imposed on Rhodesia since 1961 is added while there are no signs of a total return to normal.

During the weekend President Vorster again harassed Mr. Wilson maintaining opposition to the sanction. He was also bitterly criticised for his failure to give a return to normalcy after the referendum has been decided in favour of direct rule.

While the British Government should make an early statement about the prospect of ending the sanctions, the agreement has not yet been signed. 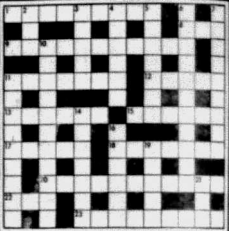

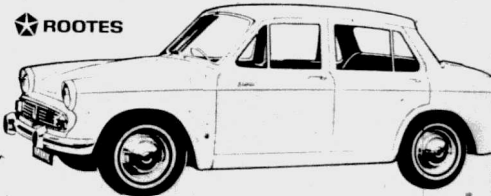

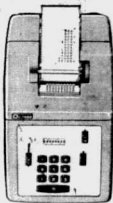

NEW U.S. MOVE ON VIETNAM Call North and South to Security Council

North and South Vietnam should be invited to take part in the United Nations Security Council debate on the war in Vietnam, the United States delegates, Mr. Arthur Goldberg, suggested when the council met in New York yesterday.

Mr. Goldberg said the U.S. was ready for discussions with any country without prior conditions whatsoever in the Security Council. He said the U.S. was ready for discussions with the Government of North Vietnam, with a view to the cessation of hostilities, fire control, ending of military and air operations, and arrangements for the return of prisoners of war.
