MINISTERS CLASH ON CRISIS MOTION

Unprecedented scenes in Kenya's House of Representatives took place yesterday as Ministers clashed vehemently over whether a motion of no confidence in the Government to state their intentions should be passed. The Government's motion was finally carried in a 74-hour debate in which several Ministers were ordered to leave the Chamber.

Television script read

Mr. Odinga spoke in favour of the magazine *Africa* and the *East African*, which was banned by the Minister for Education, Mr. Moi, last week. The Minister for Education also read what he claimed was the script of a television interview given in Lagos by the Minister for Finance, Mr. Githuru.

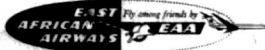

MARKETING AMALGAMATION

HOW THAT THE MARKETING side of Kenya's agricultural industry has been under the most radical reorganisation is taking place to centralise, and to co-ordinate, the functions previously spread among five or more boards operating in the same field.

Recently, the Minister for Agriculture announced the amalgamation of the Dairy Board and the K.C.C. into one Commission for the dairy industry. Then Mr. McKenzie intervened in the affairs of the West Kenya Marketing Board, which act by a caretaker board pending reorganisation. He was the subject of some disquieting remarks. He was asked to look after its interests until a new and permanent arrangement could be made. The Minister then took the form of another amalgamation. Mr. McKenzie has established a central organisation to undertake the functions carried out by the Maize Marketing Board, the West Kenya Marketing Board and the Kenya Agricultural Produce Marketing Board.

Comment on the affairs of these boards is inhibited by the circumstances of legal action in the case of one or a judicial inquiry. It may be possible to indicate, as a matter of public interest, that a statement of policy regarding the three boards was given in his capacity of evidence in the Maize Inquiry by the State Council, Mr. Humbold, who said they were more or less cooperative bodies to run making considerable demands on resources of skilled manpower. It appeared, he continued, that the most economical and effective control could be carried out under a much larger body than the present Maize Marketing Board.

This statement was made to the inquiry last Friday. The Minister's announcement came on Sunday. There can be no doubt that, whatever other factors were involved, some of the confusion that has clouded the maize situation is traceable to overlapping between separate authorities.

Control control in every field

The Agricultural Produce Marketing Board, which is being drawn into the triad under central administration has had, however, a most successful record showing excellent financial results. It was constituted less than two years ago and as Mr. McKenzie said, "has been well managed and had at all times the interests of producers at heart" with Mr. Khababala and Mr. Opondo at the top, as chairman and general manager, respectively. This board of activities and methods can form a model for the new organisation under Mr. Ngila's able chairmanship.

Three aspects of the maize industry need constant attention if shortages are to be avoided — production, marketing and distribution — applying to greater or lesser degrees, also with other edible crops. There is, therefore, a strong case for central and one hand in every field. Mr. McKenzie and his Ministry staff have long been persuaded that a strong national board, with central direction of marketing and controlling of maize and certain other produce throughout the country, to quote the words of his statement, would increase efficiency and decrease overheads.

Their contention is an economic truth of streamlining and central direction, providing always that efficiency is maintained through the smaller staff relative to the combined numbers previously. Mr. Ngila is the man for the job, but he must have the support of well qualified and reliable expert staff. Mr. McKenzie has mentioned the question of redundancy through merging staffs, but promised that all will be dealt with equitably and considerately.

Another pointer to the Government's determination to get out the duties of all its statutory boards and co-operative agencies, sometimes found to be tangled a plan in President Kenyatta's decision to appoint a working party headed by the Minister for Economic Planning and Development which will examine all aspects of their operations. Mr. Khababala and his colleagues have a gargantuan task, since there are more than 30 such organisations, and a highly important one in view of their place in the national economy.

Hard to examine structure of local government

COMMISSION of inquiry, with very broad lines of reference, is to be set up to examine whether the present structure of local government in Kenya's towns, the Assistant Minister for Local Government, Mr. E. K. Njiru, said at a meeting of the Association of Local Government Authorities in Nairobi yesterday.

The Minister, Mr. Sagini, had been concerned for some time about the future of local government, and, feeling that the future of local government, he had asked the President to appoint a commission of inquiry, he said. It was expected that the commission would start an inquiry in March or April and would report by June.

LACK OF FISCAL CONTROL

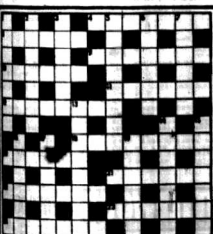

ROCKET BASES ON THE MOON

THREE SATURDAY pieces are supposed to be light-hearted attempts to poke fun at the prevailing theory that you laugh with amusement or weep with pity. You are going to read a queer sense of humor in finding anything funny in that one, based on the Russian recovery given to the nations for over-fluorinating disarmament at Geneva.

"Let us get on with our task," the chief Russian negotiator remonstrated. "Already, military circles are planning to set up bases on the Moon."

Who and what was Mr. Tsarpanin mean by this moonshot? He was reacting to congratulations on the success of Leningrad, although he did not specify which military circles he had meant. His Russian recovery given to the nations for over-fluorinating disarmament at Geneva.

Do not try laughing off the Russian's warning as an imaginative bluff from the Soviet equivalent of *Buy's Oyster Paper* or *The Magnet*, with their gripping and gruesome tales of tiny Martians who would feed the mid-50's were years ahead of the scientists, or you may laugh too soon. Much more than prestige is at stake in the lunar race.

Why, else, do you suppose the space-age nations spend astronomical sums to put their manna into their first, carrying their national flag into space by their own hands, staking out colonial claims to unoccupied lunar territory, when a fraction of that amount would feed the starving millions? Somebody who might be had spent \$4 million on a rocket which would take the world's first rocket experts whose target for tomorrow night is—the Moon," contributed a futuristic piece to the newspaper ten years ago.

SALE FROM COUNTER BATTERY WOK

Before rockets fly to the Moon, giant WVs will be built capable of destroying Moscow from New York and vice versa," he wrote. Throwing his lines away, he went on: "Another type of space platform to circle the earth could be built from Wv equipped with nuclear-headed artillery capable of destroying any continent beyond instead of churches, movies and super-circles."

Lunar observation posts would be able to discern targets on the earth as small as 100ft. across. There could be no significant infiltration, military civilians on the surface of the earth remaining undetected and safe from lunar bombardment. Long range rockets could be directed with the utmost accuracy. Any counter-battery work would be far less devastating. Because the Moon has no atmosphere, there would be no wind-spread effects, so a tank would have to hit the target plumb dead center. What was once a lunar base could be built on the side which is never visible to the earth in the enormous picture of an orbital station, mounting targets which do not seem feasible, even with bombing missiles that round corners.

Well, there are just a few simple thoughts on the importance of getting to the Moon first with the mooned, in the immediate future. If you are not yet able to find anything to cause even the slightest of very smiles, you must have a sense of humor of the famous last words type.

Without the devotion of medical auxiliaries it would be impossible to provide the public with a good medical and health service."

"The Government has made its decision and say time now you will be hearing the results. I hope it will be to the benefit of your pockets." In a speech which was expanded further when the Minister presented the construction of a central office for training medical auxiliaries to the Ministry on Saturday, he said the Government was beginning to see the results of the 1954-55 budget. Mr. Otiende said he had led 118 new health centres to the country, and that the Government had been able to provide at least 200 new high-level specialists and train them well rather than, as he said, "scarcely a little, the Principal of the University College, Nairobi, Dr. A. 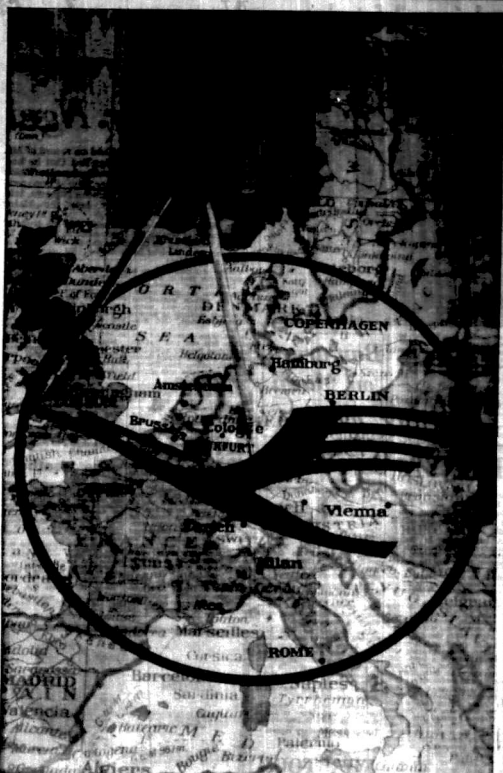

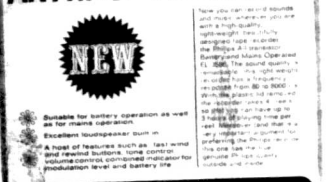
