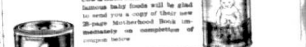

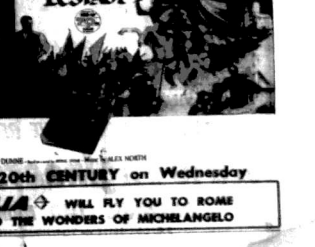

## THE GREAT EAST AFRICAN

THEY have been steadily declared by the press of many of the nations in the past few months, and particularly by the government of Dr. Nkrumah, who has done his utmost to present himself as a leader of the first of the continent's new independent States.

The request has been, at international level and the African level, to do what was wrong. It is there, as the Communist-leaning State alleges, a plan to bring Africa under a heavy imperialistic yoke through the use of military force. Or is local failure and the loss of power since independence?

The first theory would be that the overthrow of the governments in the Eastern countries is the only way it does not bring close examination, though, if it is the diversity of the government overthrown. The "imperialists" accused are presumably those of the Western countries, and it is true there will be mixed feelings over Dr. Nkrumah's departure.

But what reasons could "imperialists" have had to seek the overthrow of Federal Nigeria, whose enemies would not complain that it was too friendly to Communist military?

The overthrow of democratically elected leaders by serving soldiers has been condemned in those columns, and it is deplored no less in the case of Ghana than that of Nigeria. The only way for the army officers in power in many parts of Africa to justify themselves is by making plans for the early restoration of civilian government. But the army leaders would not have needed to seek power if the overthrow regimes had not sought to oppress and oppress themselves from the people and avoid future defeat, by postponing elections or by rigging them, and if the politicians had not practiced corruption to a stable degree.

That belief trails the way of a good and honest. What use is it to have been called "Ridometer" to a man who does not return to his homeland, or men who have been killed away millions of people in a Swiss bank and then murdered in the prime of life.

Some people forget that China for Africa is a noble conception, aimed at opening the door to betterment and opportunity for all its peoples, and to benefit a few. They should have realized that their fellow Black men would not only freedom from White domination, but they accepted the responsibilities that go with freedom.

Meanwhile, closer home, people should beware of loose talk suggesting that similar events could happen in East Africa. The African situation has made it clear that it intends to deal firmly with any corruption, if it is proved, but has also been against unconstitutional state-  
second-line citizens.

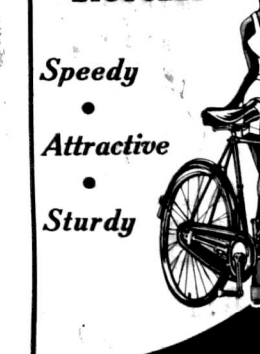

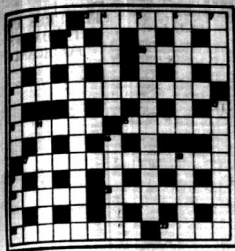

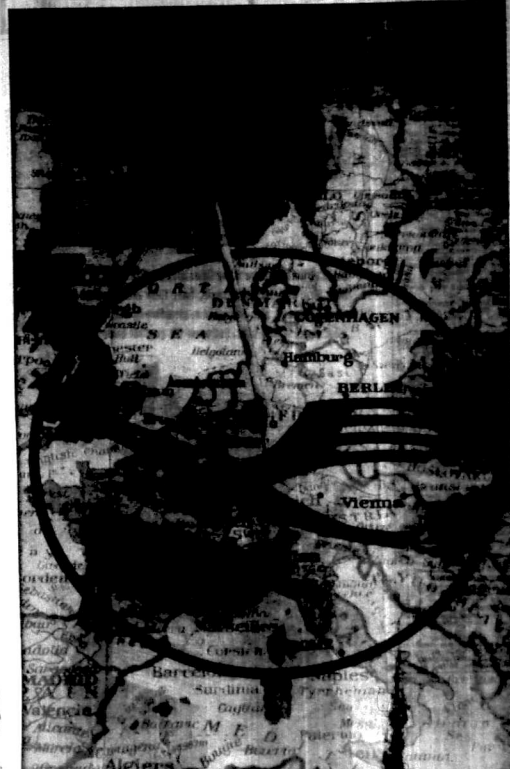

**ALL executive authority in Uganda — including that previously in the hands of the President and Vice-President — now rests with the Prime Minister, Mr. Obote. This was made clear in a declaration issued on a special issue of the "Uganda Gazette" last night.**

The declaration, which amplified the previous announcement by Mr. Obote that he was assuming control of the Government and had suspended the Constitution, said that he would act in accordance with the advice and consent of the Cabinet.

The Prime Minister said he addressed the nation tonight on the situation in the country. His speech will be broadcast and televised. It was announced yesterday that he had appointed five of his Ministers to hold the portfolios formerly held by the ex-Ministers now detained.

Kalema, Minister of Works and Communications (Health, from Dr. E. B. S. Lumya); Mr. C. Obumuga, Minister of Justice (Housing and Labour, from Mr. Mabejo); Mr. R. O. Oculu, Minister of Information (Mineral and Water Resources, from Mr. Kiroya).

### Mr. Ocheng flies to Kenya

Mr. Daniel Ocheng, secretary-general of the Kabaka Yekka Party, yesterday flew from Kampala to Nairobi, where he boarded an aircraft for Europe. Colleagues in the party's head office confirmed that he had gone but did not disclose his reasons for the flight.

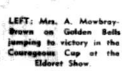
