



# Big rise in Kenya's exports to Britain

## DECIMAL SYSTEM ATTACKED

BRITISH businessmen and the general public have only two criticisms of the decimal currency system. The Government plans to introduce it in 1971, according to a survey among both groups showed.

## COMPUTER INCREASES FARMERS' PROFITS





WEST COAST BROTHERHOOD

INCEIVED BY DR. NIKUMAH and President Charles T. Ford, the Casablanca Powers are indulging in dangerous headbanging on the West coast. What possible right has the President of Ghana (whichever of the two holds the title) to go up and down in Ghana, demanding the overthrow of a régime of tyrannical despots on the word of Mr. Yahn Telegaph, a "truly national revolution of the Ghanaian people"?

Mr. Telegaph, a Ghanaian trade union leader who is also the All-African Trade Union Federation, claims the Federation is a "national liberation force," despite a statement issued in Casablanca saying the Federation is "a purely military force" with force. The Ghana T.U.C. led by Mr. Beke, says the overthrow of "tyrannical despots" is the desire and popular wish of the Ghanaian workers. So it just will not work unless the T.U.C. is supported by Dr. Nikumah to protest that the T.U.C. is not a Western neo-colonialist.

However, regarding a military rising may be, because it cuts across constitutional practice, this coup was the culmination of bitterest among people whose opposition had been driven underground and who had no constitutional means open to express their dissatisfaction.

President Sekou Toure's hysterical outburst led to the ultimate of political absurdity in making Dr. Nikumah President of Guinea, though he does not appear to have registered the appointment by announcing himself. In a martial frenzy, he threatened to invade Guinea to restore his régime, but he does not propose to march himself all those weary miles from Guinea to Ghana. If he could master a ferry, which route would they take? Across the Ivory Coast, or could they sail to a spithead, across Upper Volta? Both these countries are sovereign States and have recognised the new Ghana.

### Idol with feet of Red clay

The head of the Federal Nigerian Military Government, Gen. Irons, is being treated with respect as the result of another military coup, has warned those seeking adventures in Africa that the situation would be created if African States interfere in Ghana's internal affairs, violating the principles of both the U.N. and O.A.U. charters.
