U.S. angered by Canadian move over Peking

Canada's intention to explore the possibility of establishing diplomatic links with mainland China has provoked predictable irritation in American official circles.

The Canadian Prime Minister, Mr. Pierre Trudeau, has often expressed interest in closer links with Peking, so the order by the Foreign Minister, Mr. Mitchell Sharp, that his Stockholm embassy should approach Chinese diplomats to discuss the recognition question was not unexpected for some time.

China specialists in Washington thought negotiations would be long and difficult since the Chinese are adamant on not recognizing the Republic of China as the only legitimate government.

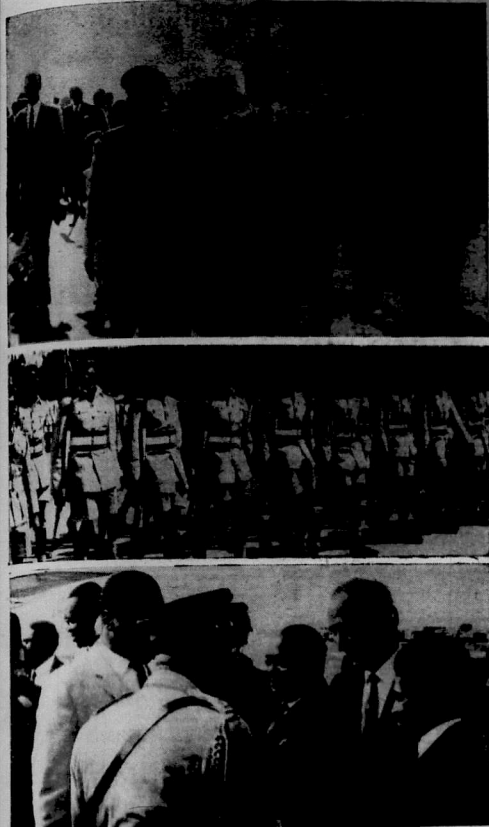

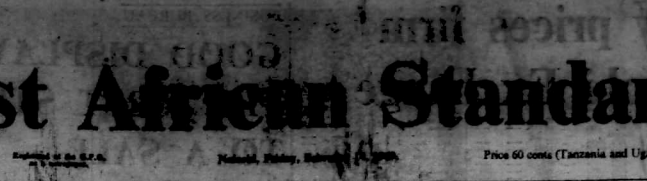

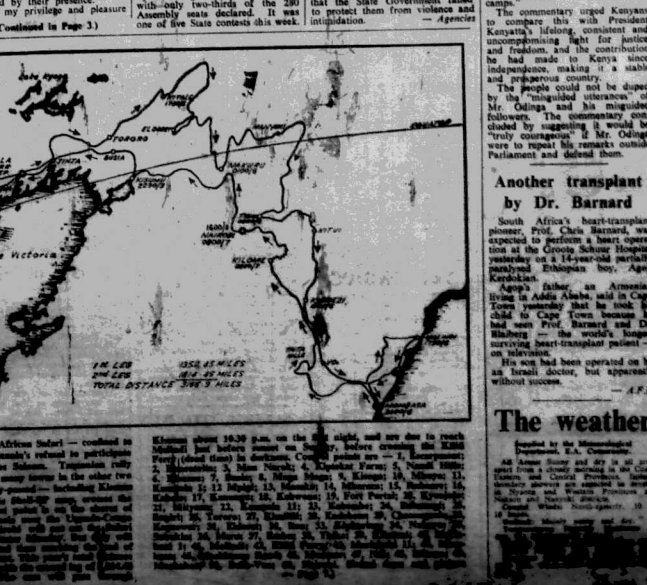

No tribal raids in Uthmanya says Attorney-General

There had never been tribal raids in Turkana and the Government was satisfied that the area was sufficiently protected, the Attorney-General, Mr. Njonjo, told the House at Question Time.

He was replying to a question by Mr. G. K. Ekelti (Kamu, Turkana South), who had asked what immediate steps the Government was taking to stop such raids in view of the fact that recently 700 Merille tribesmen crossed the Kenya border from Ethiopia and raided Turkana tribesmen.

Mr. Njonjo said that the Government had taken up the matter with Ethiopian authorities. He disagreed with a suggestion that people living on the border should be armed.

THE STRUGGLE FOR EDUCATION

'School in a Stable' snows the way

'Jesus was born in a stable, but I live in the stables where rats are as much a part of myself as anything else', wrote Alex Joel, a 15-year-old student at Afraha Secondary School, Nakuru.

In Kenya many students like Alex have their beds on cold, bare floors, no appetising meals are served and up to seven hungry but co-operative students share a pound of ugali.

For some living in slums it is even a privilege. But they are happy, despite the hardships, because they are endowed with something which millions remain without — education.

The Afraha Secondary School ('Afraha' in Swahili: literally means 'happiness'), a private, non-Government-aided Harambee school, illustrates the circumstances under which some schools have to work. Though often condemned, Harambee schools are the only source of inspiration to the thousands who pass C.P.E. and yet fail to obtain a place in Government schools.

The Afraha School is situated on a site where once people wondered to what use a row of stables, a bar and an abandoned restaurant decorated with cowbells could possibly be put.

When President Kenyatta performed the opening ceremony on June 6, 1966, of the 'School in a Stable' he gave new shape to the lives of hundreds in an arena where struggle is the motto.

At the Afraha School the classrooms have no ceilings. Old nail-holes in the corrugated iron roofs of the former stables, now converted into classrooms, allow rain to pour through on to the pupils' books and papers in bad weather. The wind blows biting between the walls and the iron roofs. Bats fly in by night, birds and bees by day.

Students have got accustomed to being grilled like sausages under the hot tin roof during the summer weather. The nail-holes seem to act like a burning glass when the sun shines directly through them.

Pupils try to arrange entertainment so that they can buy the National Flag and see it flutter on their self-made flag-pole. The students see other children driving off in school buses to play matches with neighbouring schools.

The pupils of Afraha School walk and weak with hunger as many of them are, they are often exhausted before the match starts. They enjoy singing but there

is no piano, there is a reading room but without books, newspapers or periodicals. Subjects for painting they possess; but these are rarely depicted on paper because the school cannot afford crayons. They give blood when they themselves are in need of new vigour.

Long, cold nights out in the stables or 'dormitories', after their one meal of the day — maize meal, ground and boiled in thick chunks like lumpy, hurriedly cooked porridge — are spent singing choruses. Then, as the moonlight fades from the stable doors, they stretch out a string of cord mat on the bare earth, wrap a tailored blanket around themselves and lie down. Sometimes six or seven students occupy the area which once housed one horse.

'They started from nothing, nothing', Mr. John Mwangi, a founder of the school and a member of the East African Legislative Assembly, said as he heard his school being called up first on the stage at the conclusion of the 1968 Drama Festival.

Mrs. Anne Walbe, the headmistress, summing up the school's achievements, said: 'For children with no opportunities to enjoy the luxuries or refinements of modern life, the atmosphere of this School in a Stable is, for the greater part, the happiest I have enjoyed in my forty years of teaching. Everyone who visits our unusual school, expresses surprise and pleasure at the gleaming smiles, the good manners and the team spirit of the teenagers.'

All this despite the fact that lunch breaks are often spent probing into dustbins or searching the country gutters for edible remains. Hot meals on dining tables are not available.

Ask the students to write an essay on 'Shopping' and one does not get exciting accounts of colourful purchases as in the cases of most other schoolchildren. One student gave vent to his feelings as follows:—

'When I went to the dukas to buy some salt for my mother, I suddenly saw a roll of bright blue cotton cloth on the shelf. What

a boy thinks that would make for my mother, I thought. But I have no money to buy it.'

'As I stepped out, a Nairobi-bound bus rumbled by. Suddenly a twenty shilling note fluttered out of the window. Picking up the note, I ran after the bus, waving it. A European shouting 'Keep it through the window. So back I went to the shop.'

This is the dream of every student, to possess money, often not for himself but for others.

What else is there to dream about when the student so often hears ultimatum to bring fees (60/-) within a day, or not to return to the school? It is not uncommon for a family of up to ten to reside in one-room hovels. Rooms are without furniture, not even beds, yet the students trod steadily along the path of education, without ever shedding a tear.

At night a student sees his candle flicker and die. His homework remains undone. Next morning the courageous student does not plead lack of time or want of ability. Instead he submits his page.

The student alone can escape the predicament. If only his book had not refused his meagre financial aid.

The evils, both social and economic, which arise from the large number of students being deprived of opportunities for further education affect the few years in schools, so that the repercussions are now evident in towns.

The worst effects of their relapse into complete illiteracy are practically non-existent. The bare-foot student asks himself whether he will be welcomed by the local librarian. He gains courage to enter



the building. A notice 'Library for members only' greets him. The successful few are those whose fathers will sacrifice their mid-day meal to purchase a newly-published book, whose brothers will give up the daily mug of porridge so that they can pay for the school uniform. They may be the sons of mothers who wash utensils for a month — for only 40/-.

One often sees a student staring at the window of a bookshop, his eyes glued to a particular book. But he dare not enter for his young mind knows that the book-seller will not accept part payment of 2/- — shillings he earned perhaps by selling freed groundnuts.



A daily newspaper, even if a year old, is welcomed.

What is striking is the extent to which so pathetic conditions even the poorest Africans not only desire education but are willing to make pecuniary sacrifices to secure it, sacrifices which are huge compared to their incomes.

The astonishing and rewarding thing is that graduates and technicians are pouring out — but not in many cases, out a desperate struggle.

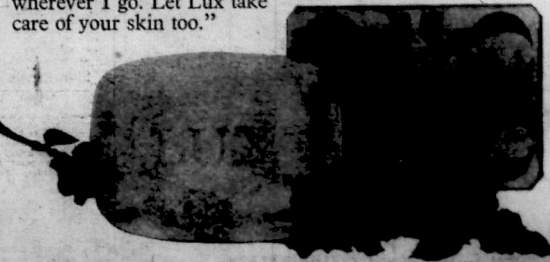

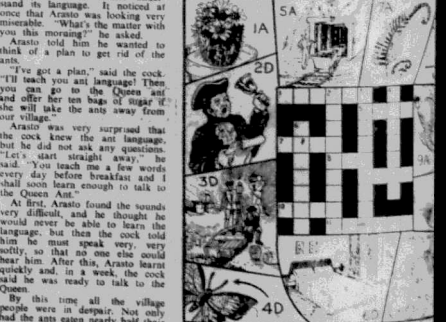

Kenya ahead in family planning

Kenya is one of seven developing nations in Africa and the Middle East that is making 'great strides' in the family planning field, despite setbacks and criticism, according to the Population Council of New York in a report published in the British medical journal, *The Lancet*.

Under the Government's Fourth Development Plan, Iran will spend \$2,750,000 on family planning projects.

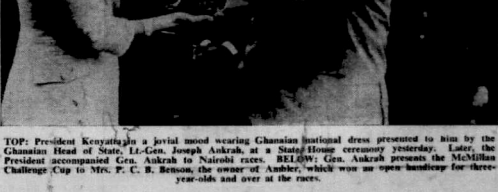
