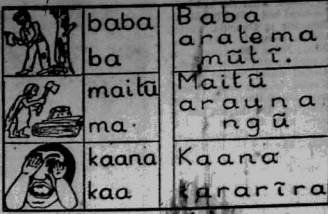

TEN-CENT COINS COST 16 CENTS EACH TO MINT

Kenya's five- and ten-cent coins would have cost £75,000 to mint if their copper content had been maintained at the same level as in the old E.A. Currency Board pieces.

This was part of an explanation given during Question Time by the Assistant Minister for Finance, Mr. Bahaa, in response to a suggestion from Mr. J. M. Njoroge (K.P.U.) (vice versa) that the quality of copper in the new coins was poorer than in the old.

Mr. Njoroge also asked: "Is the Minister aware that these coins have very quickly and look ugly?"

The Assistant Minister pointed out that the quality of the copper used had not changed. At the same time, however, he admitted that the composition was different. The new coins were made up of 95 per cent copper, 20 per cent nickel and 1 per cent zinc. E.A. Currency Board coins, on the other hand, had been composed of 95 per cent copper, 3 per cent tin and 1 per cent zinc.

The price of copper has risen to such an extent that whereas with 95 per cent copper coins it was possible to mint them at less than their face value, it now costs the Central Bank of Kenya approximately 10.3 cents and 16 cents respectively to mint five- and ten-cent coins.

Mr. Bahaa said that 28,000,000 five-cent pieces and 26,000,000 ten-cent pieces had been minted, and more had been issued.

The need to reduce expenditure, some at the expense of appearance, will be appreciated by the House.

It was expected that the coins would lose their original lustre with age. He did not, however, consider them ugly.

Busy life of a city councillor

More than fifty University women attended a luncheon at the City Hall, Nairobi, to hear Miss Margaret Kenyatta speak about her work as a councillor.

"The first step," she told them, "is to join a political party." She herself is a leading member of Kains and represents Electoral District 1 on the Nairobi City Council.

Listening to her talk enthusiastically about her work, it was difficult to realise how much it involved before one can even hope to be chosen as a prospective candidate.

"The Ward Political Committee must like you and nominate you as their representative, after you have indicated to them that you would like to stand for the Council," Miss Kenyatta said.

Then the man in the street must also approve of you if he is going to give you a vote.

She went on: "Perhaps the most important thing is that you must be prepared for disappointment— you don't win all the time— more than often you lose, even when all the odds seem to be in your favour."

Unless you do keep this philosophically, she advised her listeners, "you might as well give up."

Miss Kenyatta went on to talk to her council ladies. She is chairman of the Public Health Committee and serves on at least three other committees as well as representing the Council on a number of standing bodies. It is her duty she takes most seriously is that of keeping the Council at all times with her agenda.

"Don't expect that you because you are a woman that you will get away with any excuses. Whatever you have promised beforehand you are elected you have got to follow up and try to do something about it when you have returned to Council."

Miss Kenyatta described being a councillor as a rewarding job. "I've been four years on the council and I am always learning—it is hard work and you can never know it all!"

She concluded by appealing to the University Women to consider choosing the field of politics and local government, where she felt that, with their special skills, they could be of tremendous value in the task of nation-building.

The Italian actress Gina Lollobrigida underwent tests in a luxury Rome clinic yesterday after breaking her knee in a car crash on the Rome-Florence motorway.

Her doctor, Prof. Attilio Rampoldi, said he was carrying out the tests before operating on the knee by her 16-year-old son Mikko, who flew to Rome from school in Switzerland.

The stage and film director Franco Zeffirelli, who received compound and several broken bones in his face in the same crash, was hospitalized at Orvieto, near the scene of the accident.

There was also a large turkey, also covered in the cold white sauce, and decorated with little clusters of roses, made from the peelings of tomatoes and a few real leaves.

Wooden bowls and large chamois contained salads and seafood, and still-life type of arrays of fruit and banana leaves lent a local flavour to the decoration. The main decorations such as the margarine statuettes and another fascinating piece—a rhino's head made of marzipan and painted with food colouring, are not supposed to be eaten—unless of course one of the guests unconcernedly dips in. They are used again for other catering requirements, then replaced by fresh ones every two months.

The main bulk of the smorgasbord is prepared from Kenya foods, but the smoked salmon, herring, rollmops, caviar and other Scandinavian fish are imported, and of these about 60 kilos are required for one month.

Arabs warned on plane attacks

REPRISAL THREAT

Arabs warned on plane attacks

Israel's Transport Minister, Mr. Moshe Carmel, has warned the Arab countries to curb immediately the terrorist activities against Israeli planes or to face inevitable destruction of their civil air routes in the Middle East.

The Arabs cannot expect to continue their normal services while our countries are being attacked and passengers wounded.

The flight director of Israeli El Al Airlines said in Zurich last Tuesday night that nine crew members were wounded and seriously injured during Tuesday's Arab commando attack on one of the airline's planes.

Mr. Nadev Yagar, speaking at a press conference said some of the 17 passengers aboard were injured and they would be returning to Tel Aviv shortly.

Mr. Yagar's statement conflicted with earlier reports that three crew members and two passengers were wounded when four Arab guerrillas sprayed the El Al airliner with machine-gun bullets as it was taxiing to the take-off runway.

Mr. Yagar said the attack lasted four minutes. Three men and a woman riddled the plane with machine-gun bullets and also used three hand grenades. The Arabs were also in possession of the aircraft.

He declined to reveal the identity of the Israeli who shot down one of the attackers. He is believed to be an airline security guard.

According to an eye-witness account of the attack, a low Israeli Security Guard, wielding a pistol, fought off the band of Arab gunmen who attacked the plane.

One of the passengers in the aircraft, Dr. Marvin Sauer, an American doctor, said: "We were lying on the airplane floor as the attackers sprayed the plane with bullets when I suddenly saw a man crawling with a pistol at the ready."

Leaving out through the emergency exit, the man fired on the terrorists. The account, which was published in Tel Aviv, was not confirmed by the Israeli Government.

Among the returning passengers was Mr. Gideon Ruffal, director-general of the Foreign Ministry, who was aboard the plane when it was attacked.

He told reporters at the airport: "Israel will take all necessary and logical steps to protect her civil aviation."

He said the attacks on Israeli airliners were "aided and abetted by Arab Governments."

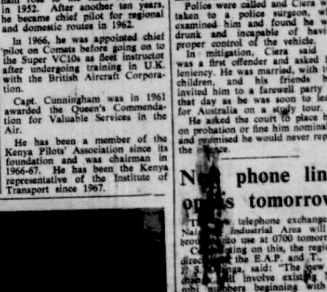

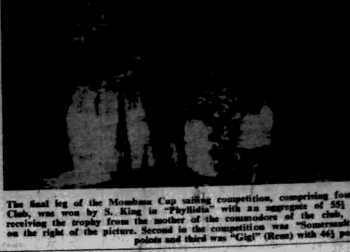

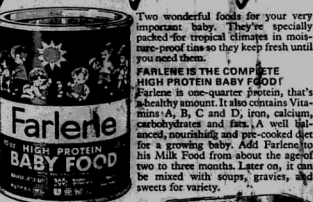

Kenya is no exception in wanting to see the country achieving speedy development in its various fields.

The construction of new hospitals and clinics and the expansion of health services is one of the ways of bringing this about.

To the people living in the Nairobi area many medical facilities are available, including Government and private hospitals, but in many parts of Kenya the story is very different. Thousands of citizens just do not have medical services within their reach or they may be available, but only after a trek of many miles which if you are common and malnutrition abound.

One medical institution which for years has been giving a fine service in the rural areas is Chogoria Hospital, near Meru. The hospital has been a source of development changes for nearly half a century.

Under the guidance of Chogoria Mission it has been more than a hospital. It has assisted the economy of the area and now, five years after independence, Chogoria Hospital is forging ahead in a new effort to change the face of the area.

Under the scheme to modernise and extend it is in full swing it is expected that an all-weather tar road between Meru and Embu will spring from it. A telephone line, an electricity supply and an hospital may also be established.

A great deal of money will be required for the project and the larger share of the cost may be covered by funds from the Evangelische Zentralstelle für Entwicklungshilfe E.V., a church organisation in West Germany.

The church will channel about 100,000 shillings of the sum received, through the Presbyterian Church of East Africa; the rest, 100,000 shillings, will be raised by the Eastern Province.

The Eastern Provincial Commissioner, Mr. Mahlu, said: "This is a national project and I am going to do all for assistance from everywhere in the country." A vice-man is a burden to Kenya's development and should be assisted by the State.

It was in 1922 when the Church of Scotland Mission, now the Presbyterian Church of East Africa, started evangelistic, medical and educational work among the 35,000 people of the area.

Dr. and Mrs. Clive Irvine offered their services and a site was chosen at Chogoria, 140 miles northeast of Nairobi. Mrs. Irvine's father, Mr. Ernest Carr, a Nairobi businessman deeply interested in human work in Africa, supplied all the finance.

In addition, he offered materials for a hospital, which were transported on 70 ox-wagons and a motor. He also donated a 20 h.p. electric plant which is still the main supply of light and power.

Dr. and Mrs. Irvine remained in Chogoria until 1951.

At that time in the twenties the area was unparished following the war in East Africa. In 1919 typhoid and the influenza epidemic had followed it. Yaws was very

More than a hospital

The area has developed tremendously and today it is no longer just a mission. It has a fine church, part of the P.C.E.A., two secondary schools, one for boys and one for girls financed by the Government, and a 119-bed hospital. The area, however, is an area with poor communications and it is far from any other general hospital.

The general secretary of the P.C.E.A., the Rev. John Gatui, said the geographical position was the main factor in deciding to develop the hospital.

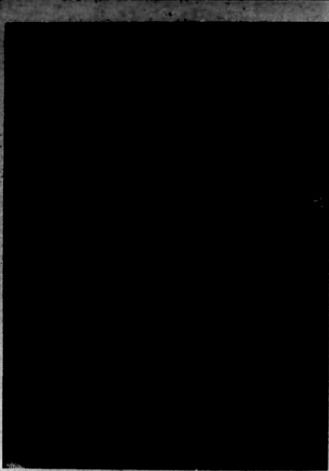
Chogoria has the enthusiastic support of the 13,000 local people. It has an average of 158 patients a day for whom it provides full medical, surgical and midwifery services, outpatient facilities and clinics.

It also has preventive medicine clinics and a leprosy hospital accommodating up to 20 patients. It has a nurses' training school and maintains seven dispensaries throughout.

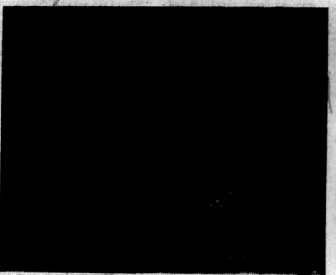
In 1964 it cost 100,000 to run, of which the Government donated 64,235. By 1965 the figure had risen to 134,000 of which the patients paid 231,000. The Government donation in the years mentioned remained the same and the balances were met by overseas agencies.

The Rev. John Gatui said the church was willing to assist the Government in its development projects, and in this one — believed to be the most expensive self-help project — the people themselves had shown initiative. A special Chogoria Hospital Development Trust has been opened.

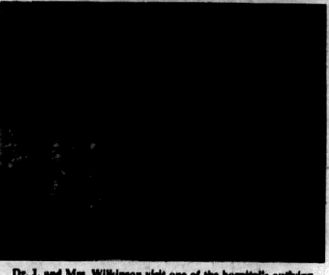

PENNY MOORE asks why women cannot have a bigger say in the selection of a new car

As you will look while your husband sits with a motor salesman, advantages of a 4-cylinder engine, you'll be taking glances at the new model and appreciating your own feminine dignity.

I jumped at the chance of test driving a car from a woman's point of view. My model was a Renault 16.

Little things mean a lot to the feminine mind, such as the screen wipers that automatically operate the wipers without having to push a separate knob, the padded doors and side panels in the interior that stop hands from getting hurt during a sharp turn, the easy gear-shift and pleasant steering.

The *Revue Automobile* magazine in Switzerland wrote after test driving the car: "It might be thought that a few exceptional engineers created it for their own use and that of their wives and children, without worrying about the taste of the public." After town and out along the airport road myself, I wholly agree.

Its complete comfort is one of the great features of the car — you could not be more comfortable in your favourite sitting-room armchair, and the wide wind screen and windows enable you to have a clear view all around. (This, as the men will agree, is important for women drivers, unaccustomed as we are to peering round corners.)

Another marvellous feature from a woman's point of view is the

ventilation which can be controlled and directed into the car without blowing away your hairdo. So your husband will not complain on a hot day when you have asked him to shut the window.

The sunroof between the front seats can be pushed up so that a child can sit in the middle. This also makes it easier to change seats after you have been driving the car round. You can just slide over instead of having to get out.

When you go shopping in this car you can take the children and the dog as well — there is plenty of room for all. The Motor Service Co. arrangement of the use that can be made of the Renault's seating and luggage space.
