3m. housing development for Kenya

Over £3,000,000 will be spent on housing projects in Nairobi and areas between 1969 and 1973, the Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Housing, Mr. J.N. Olwoch, said yesterday.

Mr. Olwoch, speaking at a Press conference, said that the Ministry had embarked on a major programme of housing both in urban and rural areas. Some of the projects are already under way.

Mr. Olwoch said that the Government had already provided 210,000 sq. ft. of housing in Kenya, and was planning to provide another 1,000,000 sq. ft. in the next five years.

He said that the Government was planning to build 100,000 houses in the next five years, and was planning to build 50,000 more in the next five years.

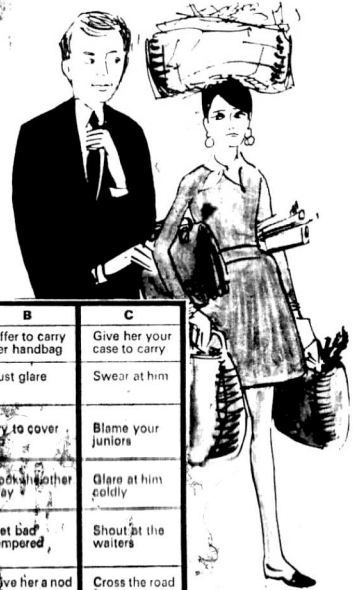

How to succeed as the power behind the phone

The minute they step out of secretarial college armed with shorthand and typewriting certificates, girls in this country expect to walk straight into top secretarial jobs with high salaries.

Because there is such a shortage of secretaries in this country they very often do just that, with the happy situation — for the girls at least — that they are overpaid.

For these girls who consider that office work requires no more than a pair of hands to work the typewriter and clutch a notebook and pencil, a book which has just arrived in this office from the publishers, Allan and Sons, called *Personality in the Office* by Audrey Price, would be quite an eye-opener.

One of the most important sections describes telephone technique and good speech, essential factors to make a good impression. I remember somebody remarking to the one that she could not bear to do secretarial work. "Far too dull," she proclaimed, though her own working career was spent within the fascinating realm of a shop.

Of course the remark was made in complete ignorance of what secretarial work entails, and as I was doing just that at the time it was difficult to refrain from com-

menting that since the work demanded a certain amount of intelligence and character she could not have made the grade anyway.

This is just typical of the general ignorance concerning one of the highest regarded jobs for women. I know from my own secretary's life that there is a great deal of pride and proficiency amongst the secretaries who never allow their jobs to become dull and routine.

For the few whose minds never see further than the monthly pay packet, secretarial work remains a kind of routine rut from which there is no escape, and in a lifetime of office work, the light may never dawn.

This book is some intelligent suggestions for making life in the office something of a glamorous one: developing your confidence and ability to deal with awkward callers, looking after the boss's interests, and keeping yourself on your feet. It should be a good idea for all secretaries, typists and receptionists to read it.

The book also teaches oral communication skills to the department students at the Crawley College of Further Education and in this book she laid emphasis on the social aspects of employment such as interviewing, receiving and working with people generally.

By means of appropriate practical exercises depicting everyday situational problems, students learn to face the problems of communication that will face them at all times.

The etiquette of introductions is clearly explained and at the end of the chapter exercises include introducing a new visitor to her superior who in turn will introduce her to members of a small typing pool, and introducing visitors from other firms to members of your own firm.

There is also a list of points about good grooming. You may not always be able to have as many clothes as you would like, but you can always be clean and tidy, iron your dress and personal hygiene.

Next, use a good deodorant regularly and make sure your shoulder straps are firmly fixed so you are not writhing with them all day.

Clothes should be well pressed and where pressing is needed and always hung up properly when taken off. Dressing habits more so, leaving a slip showing, so take a glance in a long mirror before going out.

In one section of the book the student is asked to prepare to speak for three minutes on one of the following: what she would choose to wear as an office outfit and why; grooming; individuality; or the advantages and disadvantages of an accent in the business world.

Persuasive talking exercises include a three-minute talk in support of the abolition of blood sports, barber punishment for juvenile criminals, the neglect of the arts in education and the harmful effects of advertising.

Although the book has some amusing drawings of office situations, the theme is serious, and the advice given is very practical.

After reading this will be impressed by the efforts made to improve the lot of secretaries with the book.

Feast of fashion in a Nairobi home

Three facets of the Kenya art scene were blended into a single, exciting whole recently when members of the American Federation of Arts were entertained at the Nairobi home of Dr. and Mrs. Robert H. Udall.

For the occasion their house had been transformed into a gallery in which were displayed contemporary African paintings and sculpture and hand-drawn mounted exhibits of Kenyan tribal jewellery and apparel. In this dramatic setting the guests also viewed a fashion show featuring African fabric and the original designs of Mr. Bill Grant.

Mr. Grant, an American designer now working in Kenya, was co-host of the evening and welcomed the guests in company with Mrs. Udall and Mrs. Robert H. Udall, both of whom were wearing designs which he had created for them in silk-screen printed, marigold fabrics.

Mrs. Udall had collected the art works which were on display and Mrs. Brown, a recent fellow of the Cultural Division of University College, had assembled the tribal artifacts from a store of materials which she has been gathering for the National Museum and the University from all corners of Kenya in an attempt to preserve this aspect of the country's cultural heritage.

Also present at the gathering were the various artists whose work was on display. Among them were the National Museum and the University's Mr. Mwangi, and the textile designer Mr. M. Mwangi, who had created a chiffon batik used in one of Mr. Grant's evening gowns as well as a wall-hung batik. Mr. Labon Ngugi also had two batiks on display while Miss Robin Anderson represented a large batik of a Masai home and, in a departure from her usual medium, by a metal sculpture.

Guests were drawn to the work of the sculptor, Mr. F. X. Naogaenda, which dominated the two areas in which it was displayed.

His tall, colourful wooden figures with an admixture of metal were bold and imaginative, but embodied still elements of traditional African design. Mrs. Mary Michie, an American resident in Kenya, exhibited three striking cast aluminium sculptures.

Mr. Grant's brilliant-hued and imaginative collection of designs elicited continuous and excited audience comment. It featured silk-screen printed fabrics, batiks and the vivid, challenging colours of Kanga cloth which she shared into pants suits, short-skirted day time wear and flowing evening dresses with equal dexterity.

All of the fashions were made up at the Institute of Tailoring and Cutting which Mr. Grant established three years ago in Nairobi to train Kenyans in the techniques and skills of dress-making. From the Institute's graduates, who now number 200, and its current student enrolment of 100, Mr. Grant has been able to operate to manufacture ready-made dresses in Kenya utilizing the output of the country's five textile mills.

Mr. Grant, a graduate of the Fashion Institute of Technology in New York, worked for five years as a designer at Junior in New York before coming to Kenya at the invitation of the American Labor Centre.

Many of the fashions shown were designed by Mrs. Udall, a Colorado artist who has spent four years in Kenya studying traditional and contemporary African art screens and fabrics, and batik.

DOING AWAY WITH THE OPERATOR

Nairobi telephone subscribers spend more time on the telephone than people in any other country in the world, the E.A.P. and T. Assistant Regional Director, Mr. R. V. Addison, told members of the Nairobi Business and Professional Women's Club.

When the Nairobi exchange put in a tender for new equipment it received a query to the effect that there must have been a mistake in the figures. "No one can talk that much!" was the comment.

Mr. Addison explained the new subscriber trunk dialling system which will be operating in a few months' time. At present, he said, the Nairobi exchange has 200,000 subscribers and 200,000 trunk lines. The new system will allow telephone subscribers to dial their own numbers directly, thus eliminating the need for an operator.

One advantage of this system to subscribers will be that trunk charges under the present system are paid whether or not the subscriber is charged a minimum of three minutes. Under the new system, the amount of time is required with the new system subscriber will be the amount of time in minutes and seconds plus a meter so that subscribers will be able to dial their own numbers to make it.

How to succeed as the power behind the phone

The minute they step out of secretarial college armed with shorthand and typewriting certificates, girls in this country expect to walk straight into top secretarial jobs with high salaries.

Because there is such a shortage of secretaries in this country they very often do just that, with the happy situation — for the girls at least — that they are overpaid. For these girls who consider that office work requires no more than just a pair of hands to work the typewriter and clutch a notebook and pencil, a book which has just arrived in this office from the publishers, Allan and Sons, called *Personality in the Office* by Audrey Price, would be quite an eye-opener. One of the most important sections describes telephone technique and good speech; essential factors to make a good impression to the one that the candidate has to remember somebody remarking to the one that she proclaimed her own working career was spent within the fascinating realm of a shop.

Of course the remark was made in complete ignorance of what secretarial work entails, and as I was doing just that at the time it was difficult to refrain from com-

menting that since the work demanded a certain amount of intelligence and character she could not have made the grade anyway. This is just typical of the general ignorance concerning one of the highest regarded jobs for women. I know from my own experience that there is a great deal of pride and proficiency amongst these secretaries who never allow their jobs to become dull and routine.

For the girls whose minds never see further than the monthly pay packet, secretarial work remains a kind of routine rut from which there is no escape, and in a lifetime of office work, the light may never dawn. This book has some intelligent suggestions for making life in the office something of a pleasure. One: develop your confidence and ability to deal with awkward callers, looking after the boss's interests, and keeping yourself on your toes. It could be a good idea for all young and inexperienced secretaries, stenographers, typists and receptionists to read it. The book teaches oral communication and deportment to students at the Crawley College of Further Education and in this book the author places emphasis on the social aspects of employment such as interviewing, negotiating and working with people generally.

By means of appropriate

practical exercises depicting every day situational problems, students learn to face the problems of communication that will face them at work.

The etiquette of introductions is clearly explained and at the end of the chapter exercises include introducing a new friend to her superior who in turn will introduce her to members of a similar group, and introducing a visitor from other firms to members of your own firm.

There is also a list of points about good grooming. You may not always be able to have as many clothes as you would like, but you can always be clean and tidy, your dress and personal hygiene. Next, use a good deodorant regularly and make sure your shoulder straps are firmly fixed so you are not wrestling with them all day. Clothes should be well pressed and always hung up properly when taken off. Nothing looks more slovenly, says the author, than leaving a slip showing, so take a little time in a long mirror before going out. In one section of the book the student is asked to pretend to speak for three minutes on one of the following which she would be expected to wear as an office outfit and why: grooming, individuality, or the abolition of blood sports. Feast of fashion in a Nairobi home

Three facets of the Kenya art scene were blended into a single, exciting whole recently when members of the American Federation of Arts were entertained at the Nairobi home of Dr. and Mrs. Robert H. Udall.

For the occasion their house had been transformed into a gallery in which were displayed contemporary African paintings and sculpture and hand-painted murals. The guests also viewed a fashion show featuring African fabric and the original designs of Mr. Bill Grant. Mr. Grant, an American designer now working in Kenya, was co-host of the evening and welcomed the guests in company with Mrs. Udall and Mrs. Brown, both of whom were wearing designs which he had created for them in silk-screen printed materials.

Mrs. Udall had collected the art works which were on display and Mrs. Brown, a research fellow in the cultural division of University College, had assembled the tribal artifacts from a store of materials which she has been gathering for the National Museum and the University from all corners of Kenya in an attempt to preserve this aspect of the country's cultural heritage.

Also present at the gathering were the various artists whose work was on display. Among them were the painters Eli Kwayana and Mwangi, and the textile designer Mch. Lodiody Saffa who had created a chiffon batik used in one

of Mr. Grant's evening gowns as well as a wall-hung batik. Mr. Labon Ngugi also had two batik on display while Miss Robin Anderson was represented by a large batik of a Maasai home and, in a departure from her usual medium, by a metal sculpture.

Guests were drawn to the work of the young sculptor, Mr. F. N. Nsongeria, which dominated the two areas in which it was displayed.

His tall colourful wooden figures with an admixture of metal were bold and imaginative, but embodied still elements of traditional African design. Mrs. Mary Michie, an American resident in Kenya, exhibited three striking cast aluminium sculptures.

Mr. Grant's brilliant-hued and imaginative collection of designs elicited comments and excited audience comment. It featured silk-screen printed fabrics, batiks and the vivid, challenging colours of Kanga cloth which she shaped into party suits, tailored dresses, time wear and flowing evening dresses with equal dexterity.

All of the fashion sense made up at the Institute of Tailoring and Cutting in Nairobi, which she established three years ago in Nairobi to train Kenyans in the art of the manufacture of ready-made dresses in Kenya utilizing the output of the country's textile mills.

Mr. Grant, a graduate of the Fashion Institute of Technology in

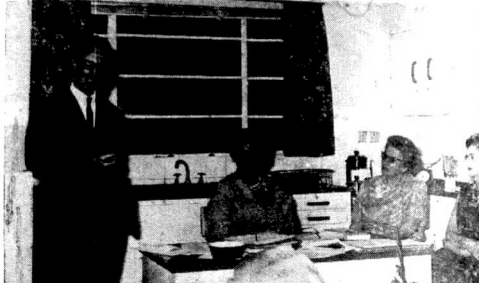
New York, worked for a time as a designer at Jantzen Inc. in New York before coming to Kenya at the invitation of the American Labour Centre.

Many of the fabrics used in the fashion show were designed by Mrs. Udall and Mrs. Brown, who has spent four years in the African continent and has designed in silk screens and for the Kenyan batik.

Her "Arabesque" print carved wooden doorway was printed in gold on a blue background and was a dress which embodied the very essence of the design.

Another print in which Mrs. Udall and Mrs. Brown were designers was a wide white dress with high-waisted bodice and long skirt. The Kanga fabric used in the dress was a traditional Maasai design.

The evening gown which Mrs. Grant created from a grey and tan silk-screen print was sleeveless and had a high collar. This contrasted with the more traditional Maasai and African designs.

DOING AWAY WITH THE OPERATOR

Nairobi telephone subscribers spend more time on the trunk than people in any other country in the world, the E.A.P. and T. Abosani Regional Director, Mr. R. V. Addison, told members of the Nairobi Business and Professional Women's Club.

When the Nairobi exchange put in a tender for new equipment it received a query to the effect that there must have been a mistake in the figures. "No one can talk that much!" was the comment. Addison explained the new subscriber trunk dialling system which will be operating in a few months' time. At present, he said, subscribers are required to dial the number and pay telephone charges as new operators were taken over to deal with the trunk traffic.

In a few months' time equipment for a trunk service will be installed after which Nairobi subscribers will be able to lift the receiver and dial any exchange in the country. The procedure will be to dial 1 to get onto the trunk equipment, then dial the number to be exchanged then two more numbers to get the right area and the right person.

Therefore, if a subscriber in Nairobi were telephoning a subscriber in Nairobi, the number to dial would probably be something like 0 11 85 234 - eight digits all together.

The call will be connected in five seconds, whereas at the moment it takes an operator about three minutes to set up a call. The subscriber will be charged a dialled number and the charges of the call will be automatically recorded by the equipment. Together with this new innovation will be a different system of billing subscribers. The total amount of bills will be shown; individual calls will not be listed.

One advantage of this system to subscribers will be trunk charges. Under the present system a subscriber is charged a minimum of three minutes, whether or not that amount of time is required. With the new system the subscriber will be charged only for the time actually required by pulses on a meter so that subscribers can be billed as the subscriber wants to make it.

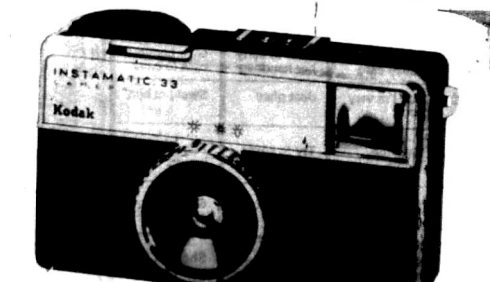

Kiambu landless move to Ithanga PLOTS HANDED OVER

Plots on the Ithanga settlement scheme in Murang'a district have been allocated to 110 people from Kiambu district in a ceremony at the location.

The Murang'a District Officer (D.O.) Mr. R. E. Uthuru, deputising for District Commissioner, Mr. E. M. Pausan, told the new plot holders, who were each given seven acres, that since they had come to Murang'a district to answer the President's call of 'land come to land', he appealed to them to be hard shambas, as the residents of Ithanga expected to see good examples in farming from Kiambu people.

Mr. Uthuru added that the area was very fertile and that they could grow cotton, which was most suited to the area.

It was high time they forgot their old differences and start afresh in their new plots.

The district officer for Murang'a Division, Mr. G. K. Abwaha, said that Ithanga location contained plots which could bring in good farming methods to a person who used good farming methods.

Those people who had come from Kiambu were the fortunate ones who could show good farming methods to the people of the area.

In a message from the District Commissioner for Kiambu, Mr. Stephen M. Timothy, read by a settlement officer from Kiambu, Mr. Stephen M. Timothy, read by some people who were saying that the Government had done nothing to allocate land to the area.

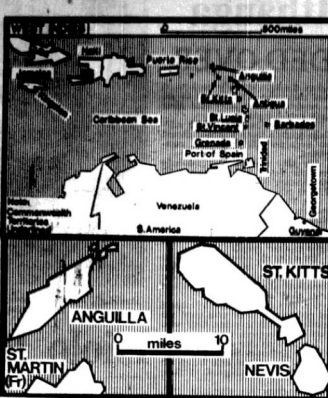

Passed the Euro-Test

The worst crisis in Anglo-French relations since 1962 - when France first vetoed British entry into the European Common Market - is what political observers are calling slant. They believe that President de Gaulle said to the British Ambassador, Mr. Christopher Soames, at the Elysee Palace on February 23: "An incident known as the 'Paris plot'."

Why is the county between France and Britain so deep-seated? What has happened in the years since the war to destroy the alliance between the two nations? Why is it so essential for Mr. Wilson to outflank the General in the corridors of Europe?

Twenty years ago Britain could have had the leadership of Western Europe for the asking. She lost for a place in the European Economic Community. How did this come to pass?

It began with the grim aftermath of the Second World War. All those countries in Western Europe which had suffered the humiliation of defeat, or occupation by foreign troops, agreed that their only hope for the future lay in something greater than the nation-State.

The old concept of a united Europe, which had from time to time caught the imagination of a few farsighted statesmen, was reborn.

Already during the war, Churchill had looked forward to a Council of Europe which would be "a really effective league". In a speech at Zurich just after the war, he renewed his call for "a kind of United States of Europe".

Then, in 1948, he addressed a "Congress of Europe" at the Hague which called for a European Parliament and a European Charter of Human Rights, with a European Court of Justice to enforce them.

Churchill was no longer in power; his wartime coalition had given way to Clement Attlee's Labour Government. But the aura of victory still clung to Britain, and it was in London more than anywhere else that the Hague's call was directed.

The response was likewise to the special relationship with America meant much more than the leadership of Europe. The Council of Europe, whose Report was signed in London in May 1949, was a mere shadow of the lofty body that had been envisaged at the Hague.

It was, simply, seated in Strasbourg, was tiny, and its jurisdiction was limited to what recommendations it could only make to governments which were not obliged to accept them.

This is not nearly good enough for the ardent Europeanists, most of them Socialists or Christian Democrats, who at that time were making all the running in France, Italy,

West Germany, Holland, Belgium and Luxembourg. In 1950, these six countries, desiring to make progress to talk through the "Paris plot" negotiations, decided to try a different approach.

Together, they set up a supra-national commission for coal and steel, hoping that thereby war between France and Germany would be ruled out for ever.

It was historic. From now on, said Jean Monnet, "from now on the new Community, all the Belgians, the French, the Germans, the Italians and the Luxembourgers, and Europeans. For the first time in our history the barriers separating the nations of Europe are coming down."

Britain was invited to become a founder member of the new Community. The Atlas Government declined on the grounds that Britain's coal and steel industry, publicly owned, must not be subjected to international control. The Wilson Government does not have the same qualms today.

So the golden chance was missed. But the Labour Party as well as the Conservative Party have never renounced faint hopes in the European breast. That was left to the French, who at Strasbourg lashed the Labour Government, and the Conservatives do not for Europe once they were back in power.

A European army? Why, in 1950, was Churchill himself who, in 1950, first proposed it - "the immediate creation of a European army and honourable part."

Came the dawn - the dawn of the "blackest day" in the history of Europe's history: November 23, 1957. The French Government, in office with Churchill as Foreign Secretary, announced that it was withdrawing its support for the European project.

The Strasbourg Assembly, then in session, was humiliated. The day after for a European army - known in diplomatic circles as the E.D.C. - was from that moment doomed. It took three more years to finish it off.

Mystery of 'thaw' in Chinese relations

Within the last few weeks China has made a number of moves that indicate that she is gradually thawing.

On the surface, her postponement of diplomatic talks with the Americans in Washington makes it seem that she is still her same old aggressive China. But she has indicated that she is willing to return to the table at a later date, meaning that she is willing to maintain the fairly flexible foreign policy she pursued before the Cultural Revolution.

Another even more important sign that the "thaw" may be getting set in is the news that she is delegating to Peking a ten-member trade mission.

This is the first time in ten years that the Yugoslavs have had any sort of dialogue with China. All that time they have been the butt of some of the worst polemics that China could hurl - "Revisionists", "Capitalists", "imperialists" and on through that special dictionary of abuse that Communist countries reserve for one another from time to time.

It could be that the Chinese are making a move to irritate the Russians. The flare-ups on the Sino-Soviet border are escalating. Moscow as much as possible, short of outright war.

Another little Chinese diplomatic move was the meeting between Peking representative in Pakistan and Burma's Prime Minister, General Ne Win. This move has proved diplomatic relations between China and Burma, severely disrupted by the anti-Chinese riots in Rangoon in 1967.

Official sources here said the summit was broken off after a two-point communiqué was issued the day before the summit.

The project would stem from the Soviet's apparent desire to transform its squabble with Peking into a Soviet issue.

Confidence sources indicated however that it was unlikely the pact allies in Budapest publicly scolding the Chinese.

In all probability, this will be kept in hand until the World Communist Parties Conference in Moscow set for May.

Move to modernise K.G.U.

MEET THE OPEN COMPETITORS

Nairobi golf club captains are hoping to modernise the Kenya Golf Union — by amending what they call the 'old boys' constitution. They will introduce a number of constitutional amendments at the coming meeting of the General Council, scheduled for Good Friday at Royal Nairobi.

The meeting will be asked to consider amendments, designed to create a greater degree of democracy within the union. A three-man team — John Burrow, last year's Kenya captain, office at Royal Nairobi, last year and John Dickens, currently in charge at Royal, spent some weeks working on the amendments before they were tabled and subsequently approved at a meeting.

Dr D M Britton, the K.G.U. president, has already been told of the amendments, and has received a copy of the proposals. But the captain perhaps unwilling to give the impression of wanting to bulldoze a path for the ideas, do not intend to discuss them immediately at the Easter meeting. Instead they will ask that delegates consider the amendments and give their views, which should be proposed formally at a subsequent meeting of the council.

Members of the union answered the captain's appeal that all past presidents shall pay for members of the union without annual subscription and shall be entitled to vote at all meetings of the general council. Under the proposed amendment membership in this clause would be restricted to only the outgoing past president.

There are thought to be 26 past presidents still alive, though many of them no longer live in Kenya.

Delegates at the meeting will be asked to consider an expansion of representation on the general council for higher golf clubs.

one delegate for clubs with fewer than 75 golfing members, and two for clubs with 75 or more.

The authors of the proposed amendments are decidedly unhappy, it seems, with the change in the present constitution which declares that a quorum will be six members, but that any meeting without a quorum may continue with business after waiting half an hour from the appointed opening.

They prefer that a meeting without a quorum should be initially postponed, reconvened 14 days later, and then permitted to carry out business without a quorum if necessary.

Changes are expected too, in the method of election of the K.G.U. president, and the retiring president is responsible for nominating the president of a general meeting.

Some of the changes have been suggested by members of an Advisory Committee which was set up to consider the proposals. The committee was set up by the K.G.U. president, Dr Britton, in 1967.

South African hold on Namibia challenged by U.N. Afro-Asians

A resolution condemning South Africa's continued administration of South West Africa as illegal and detrimental to the people of the territory was adopted last night by the U.N. Security Council members of the African continent, Senegal, Algeria, were listed to vote.

U.N. members and the African continent were the focus of the resolution which was adopted by a vote of 12 to 0 with 12 abstentions. The resolution called on South Africa to comply with the U.N. Security Council's mandate on South West Africa.

U.N. Secretary-General U Thant said that the resolution was a landmark in the history of the U.N. and that it would lead to the eventual independence of Namibia.

Eastern Europe seeks peace

Decisions taken at Monday's Warsaw Pact summit meeting in Budapest were aimed at achieving a "real, lasting result" towards a detente between Eastern and West Europe, the First Secretary of the Czech Communist Party, Mr. Alexander Dubcek, said.

In an interview with the party newspaper *Rude Pravo*, Mr. Dubcek said:

"We want to say sincerely to the peoples of Europe that the detente countries do not and do not want to be their enemies."

The decisions reached at Budapest were not adopted for propaganda real, lasting results. Mr. Dubcek was referring to the appeal made at the conference for a meeting of East and West European countries to discuss security questions.

He said he did not believe that such a meeting could be held in the near future, but everyone with "European eyes could hear" the appeal would work towards making it a reality.

He stressed that all decisions taken at the summit were reached unanimously and that all Warsaw Pact countries are absolutely unanimous in their support of the Warsaw Pact's aim of safeguarding peace and progress in the world.

Mr. Dubcek said the Warsaw Pact nations had to adopt certain measures in the face of the increasing military spending of the NATO countries and the failure to combat "neo-Nazi and fascist" forces in West Germany.

Two important tasks at the summit would facilitate a more effective military direction and the perfecting of a more economic "warrior system".

They were the creation of a Ministerial Council and the constitution of a united economic apparatus.

Mr. Dubcek said that the Warsaw Pact nations had to adopt certain measures in the face of the increasing military spending of the NATO countries and the failure to combat "neo-Nazi and fascist" forces in West Germany.

Battle looms on U.S. defence system

Congressional battles over the Washington Post's Senate anti-ballistic missile bill, the Defense Department's plan to build the multi-stage missile, and the House's long-range shipping program by the time it presented its 1973 budget.

The 1973 budget was presented on Wednesday, called for \$1,100,000,000 for shipbuilding and the amount proposed by the Administration.

Elephants are on the way out

Findings made during studies of the Murchison Falls and Tsavo National Parks indicate that many elephant populations may disappear within 50 years unless both the elephants and their habitats are managed scientifically.

The findings are contained in a report by the director of the Tsavo Research Project, Dr. R. M. Law, and Mr. I. B. C. Parker, of Wildlife Services, Nairobi. The paper was published recently by the Zoological Society of London.

Most of the research was done in the Murchison Falls National Park on the north and south banks of the Nile near Murchison Falls.

Some elephants were found that look increasing pressure on the land they occupy in these areas have suffered a 'population explosion' which is thought to be the result of a high density of elephants throughout Africa with the probable exception of those in the west.

It is almost a relief to get along with a car which is not really worthy of the name 'Safari' when I sit in the back seat of a Volvo 142S. This year's finest drivers, Joginder Singh and Bharat Bhardwaj, are driving a positive run over this year's Safari course.

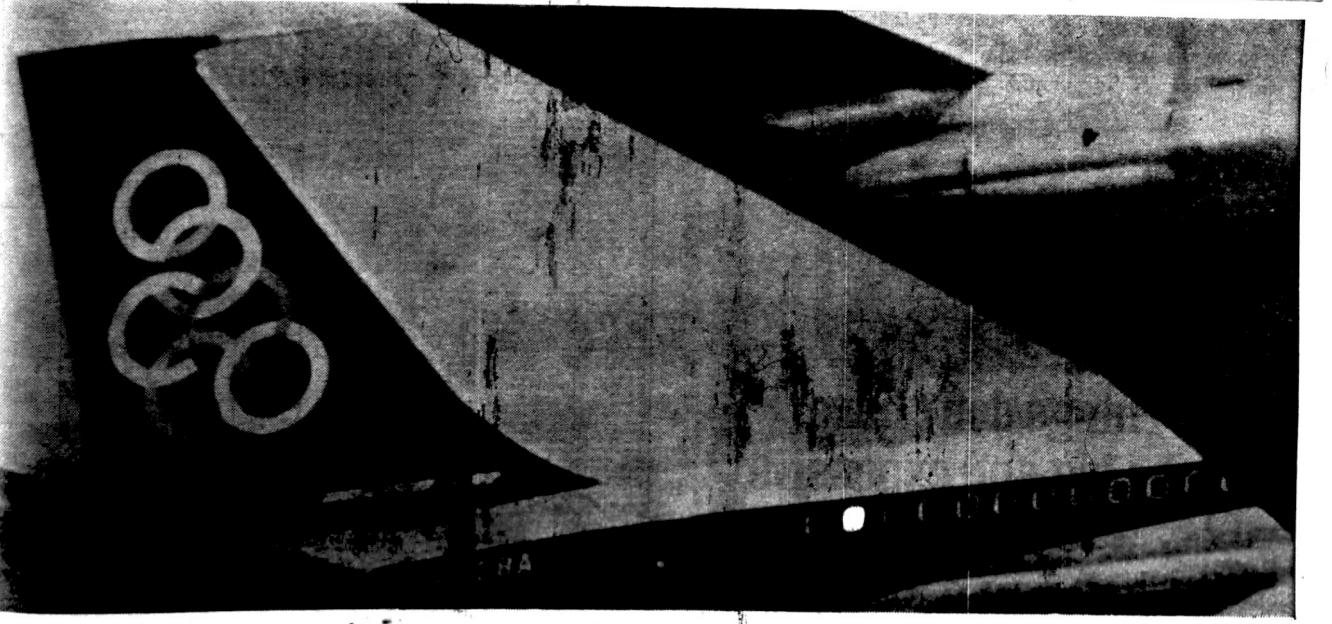

Servant who helped inspire a great book

The news that a film of the life of Karen Blixen, based on her 13 years as a farm outside Nairobi in the district that now bears her name, has led to a revival of interest in the solitary Dane and those she described in her evocative book, *Out of Africa*.

Although her maternalistic attitude may irritate some readers, Karen Blixen probably had greater understanding and love for the Africans she came into contact with than any other settler of her period.

One of the people to attract her most devoted attention was Kamante, a little Kikuyu boy she found herding goats and described as "the most pitiful object that you could set eyes on".

She wrote: "Here on the plain he looked so extraordinarily small so that it struck you as a strange thing that much suffering could be condensed into a single point. In his flat, angular, hardened and infinitely patient face, the eyes were without a glance, dim and like the eyes of a stone."

And later: "His forehead of soil and the lines of pain were the fortitude of an old warrior. A thing could never be so bad as to surprise him. He was so sure of his own philosophy, prepared for the worst".

Kamante went on to be her most accomplished cook and among other things served food for the Prince of Wales when he visited Baroness von Blixen's house in 1930.

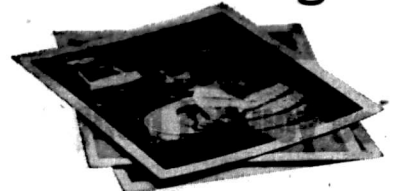

America faces European challenge

For some years the increasing number of foreign cars imported into the U.S. has caused concern to the American automobile industry. During the middle and late fifties, the American "compact" car appeared on the motoring scene. This represented the first attempt by the American car industry to combat the growing number of cars being imported from Britain and Europe.

This streamlined, four-litre car firm appears to have followed the American automobile industry would be attracted to a medium-size car selling at around \$2,000, with smaller bodies and, in many cases, a more powerful engine. The bird that flew in from a prehistoric age

It is difficult to realise that acorns before man looked up into the sky some of the species of vulture we know today were wheeling around in the prehistoric blue. More than 36,000,000 years ago the secretary bird, with its grey and black plumage and bunch of quills behind its ear, was striding across the plains.

Its haunts extended beyond Africa to Southern France. Can it be that certain species were so well adapted that they survived through the centuries with so little change? Certainly the secretary bird and indeed most of the predator birds, are well adapted to survive. Its long legs are heavily amouset-plated to protect it against its prey, the snake. Slipping carefully through the grass it strikes with a sudden rush, gripping the snake sufficiently low down to be able to beat its head against a rock or hard ground.

Any reader who has observed an incident connected with game, which he thinks may be of interest to others, is invited to send details to the E.A. Wild Nairobi.

If this does not suffice it will fly up carrying the snake and drop it from a height, hoping to stun it. This practice, however, is not to be recommended as intervention by a neighbour can lose a good snake. Van Someren, in *Days with Birds*, records a noisy fight over a puff adder between a secretary bird and a tawny eagle following such a drop.

The secretary bird is a big bird by any standards. Standing about 4ft tall it has a wing span of seven feet and though usually seen walking or running through the grass it is nevertheless a graceful bird in flight. Being so big it has the same difficulty in take-off of

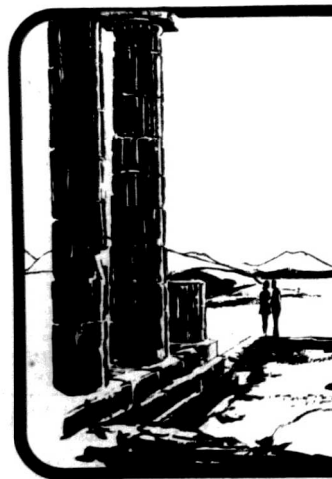
POP MUSIC IS GETTING LOUDER

Deafened parents have suspected ever since the Beat Boom began, doctors have warned against it and forecast the dangers it can bring. Now the latest electronic sound-assessing gear has confirmed their worst fears. Pop music is getting louder.

It now costs a pop group at least £1,000 to produce the quantity of noise the fans demand, using laser-beam-level amplifiers and gadgets like "luzz-boxes" and "cry-halbs" which can distort musical sound into a series of roars and shrieks—and in the process make it even more deafening.

But not loud enough for the fans. A conference of British public health inspectors, discussing noise-control, was told recently that a pop-group is now judged reckoned to be giving good value for money unless it can produce a sound registering at least 110 decibels, the noise of a heavy lorry flat out on a motorway.

"Less than 85 decibels would appear to be quite unacceptably low for the group and the audience,"

"He is an undeniable giant of an author, but a poet-creator in everything else. This was the opinion of John Everett Millais about Ruskin, but perhaps he was prejudiced — after all he did fall in love with Ruskin's wife.

He was in London 150 years ago, John Ruskin was so cooed by his parents, morally and spiritually, that he developed into a gentle intellectual with an inflated regard for his own gifts.

To extreme estrogen he added a strong pre-occupation that rendered his relations with women completely artificial. Moreover a number of family wills that his grandfather went mad and killed himself, mixed with finally effeminate tendencies, persuaded him from ever coming to proper terms with life.

In 1836 Ruskin was allowed by his parents to attend Christ Church, Oxford, where, three years later, he won the Newdigate Prize for Poetry. Even then he was not left alone, for his mother, who was dying from which she could keep an eye on him.
