CONTROVERSIAL CLAUSE ACCEPTED BY C.P.U.

Protest Registered.

AREAS TO BE CONTROLLED BY SERIES

At Thursday's annual meeting of the Coffee Planters Union of Kenya and East Africa there was a lengthy debate on the controversial clause contained in the Coffee Industry Bill which permits the growing of roffee by natives.

At the conclusion of the discussion, and after a resolution had been withdrawn, the following motion was carried

That this Union, while maintaining its opposition to the growing of coffee by natives—which it believes will not be for the benefit of the natives themselves and will constitute a serious menace to the European industry, which is to-day the chief mainstay of the rejecting the Coffee Industry Bill on the ground of the inclusion of sub-section 9 (5) in the Bill.

Thus, while accepting the Bill the Union registered a protest against the inclusion of this clause, but was no desirous of delaying the introduction of the whole measure on these grounds.

During the discussion the Chairman, Mr. W. McLellan Wilson, stated that, in the opinion of the Attorney-General, if a native to-day went to the Supreme Court he could receive a mandamus whereby no District Commissioner would be able to refuse to give him a licence to grow coffee. It was now proposed to safe-to-day the district he the revokation of rules. guard the coffee industry by the provision of rules under the Crops Production and Livestock Ordinance. under which permission to grow coffee would have to be received from the Director of Agriculture.

Powers of the Director of Agriculture.

While the controversial sub-section 9 (5) of the proposed Coffee Industry Bill was ac-cented the Coffee Planters cepted, the Coffee Planters' Union of Kenya and East Africa, at its annual meeting on Thurs-day, reiterated the objection of cay, reiterated the objection of non-native coffee planters to the growing of coffee by natives. The debate was opened by the chairman, Mr. W. McLellan, Wilchairman, Mr. W. McLellan Wil-son, stating that the bone of contention, this sub-section, had been turned down at the recent Coffee Conference. 





A Committee was appointed in 1929 to examine the question of Government housing policy. Its terms of reference, however, were restricted to certain aspects of the problem.

What is now required is a comprehensive examina-tion of the whole question of Government housing in relation to present-day conditions.

At the same time it is desirable to bring under review the municipal by-laws with a view to determining whether or not they are not too restrictive.



J. A. Mollison, the holder of the Australia to England and England to South Africa air records, has completed the first east to west crossing of the North Atlantic in a light aeroplane. Leaving Portmarnock. near Dublin, he landed, thirty hours later, at Pennifield Ridge, near St. John, New Brunswick,

Instead of continuing his flight to New York Mr Mollison. who was exhausted on arrival, decided to fly to an Air Pageant near Montreal on Saturday He was expected to continue to New York on Sunday.




