LACK OF DECISIVE POLICY.

Estimates Passed But No Indication of How Money to be Spent.

Severe criticisms of Mr. de Valera were made in the Daily Express on the assumption of the Emergency Estimates debate. It was stated that a settlement of the dispute with Britain was possible if Mr. de Valera dropped his political humbug.

An Independent Labour Member expressed the belief that his attitude was actuated by spite and hatred. Mr. de Valera was composed of "men and women who were potential looters and bank robbers and everything else."

In reply to the debate Mr. de Valera said that it was impossible to indicate how the money would be spent. He stated that he would prefer independence to a partnership in which he had many advantages he would have many disadvantages.

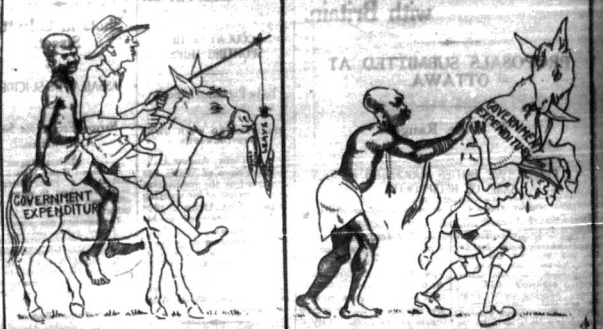

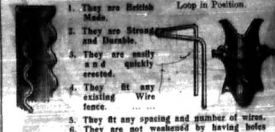

Debate on Coffee Growing by Natives.

CONTROVERSIAL CLAUSE ACCEPTED BY C.P.U.

Protest Registered.

AREAS TO BE CONTROLLED BY SERIES OF RULES.

At Thursday's annual meeting of the Coffee Planters' Union of Kenya and East Africa there was a lengthy debate on the controversial clause which permits the growing of coffee by natives.

At the conclusion of the discussion, and after a resolution had been withdrawn, the following motion was carried unanimously—

"That this Union, while maintaining its opposition to the growing of coffee by natives— which it believes will not be for the benefit of the natives themselves and will constitute a serious menace to the European industry, which is to-day the chief mainstay of the Colony's economic position— set on foot measures for rejecting the Coffee Industry Bill on the ground of the inclusion of sub-section 9 (5) in the Bill.

Thus, while accepting the Bill the Union registered a protest against the inclusion of this clause, but was not desirous of delaying the introduction of the whole measure on these grounds.

During the discussion the Chairman, Mr. W. McLellan Wilson, stated that, in the opinion of the Attorney-General, if a native to-day went to the Supreme Court he could receive a mandamus whereby no District Commissioner would be able to refuse him a licence to grow coffee. It was now proposed to safeguard the coffee industry by the provision of rules under which permission to grow coffee would have to be received from the Director of Agriculture.

Powers of the Director of Agriculture.

While the controversial sub-section 9 (5) of the proposed Coffee Industry Bill was accepted, the Coffee Planters' Union of Kenya and East Africa, at its annual meeting on Thursday, reiterated the objection of the non-native coffee planters to the growing of coffee by natives. The debate was opened by the Chairman, Mr. W. McLellan Wilson, stating that the home of coffee in this section is not a political party—members of all parties did not see why natives should not be allowed to grow it, and it was specifically mentioned in the report of the Joint Committee on Closer Union in East Africa.

He believed that his first thought, in reading the Bill, was that it upset them a party to native growing coffee in this section, was that it meant that natives should be allowed to grow it in the reserves, when all it said actually was that natives should not pay any licence fee in respect of coffee grown in reserves.

Provisions to be Taken. The saving clause, therefore, in the Bill, which is intended to include natives from the operation of this Bill, so that Government might take steps with a view to the future of the coffee industry, would be a serious menace to the future of the coffee industry, which is to-day the chief mainstay of the Colony's economic position— set on foot measures for rejecting the Coffee Industry Bill on the ground of the inclusion of sub-section 9 (5) in the Bill.

Thus, while accepting the Bill the Union registered a protest against the inclusion of this clause, but was not desirous of delaying the introduction of the whole measure on these grounds.

During the discussion the Chairman, Mr. W. McLellan Wilson, stated that, in the opinion of the Attorney-General, if a native to-day went to the Supreme Court he could receive a mandamus whereby no District Commissioner would be able to refuse him a licence to grow coffee. It was now proposed to safeguard the coffee industry by the provision of rules under which permission to grow coffee would have to be received from the Director of Agriculture.

Powers of the Director of Agriculture.

While the controversial sub-section 9 (5) of the proposed Coffee Industry Bill was accepted, the Coffee Planters' Union of Kenya and East Africa, at its annual meeting on Thursday, reiterated the objection of the non-native coffee planters to the growing of coffee by natives. The debate was opened by the Chairman, Mr. W. McLellan Wilson, stating that the home of coffee in this section is not a political party—members of all parties did not see why natives should not be allowed to grow it, and it was specifically mentioned in the report of the Joint Committee on Closer Union in East Africa.

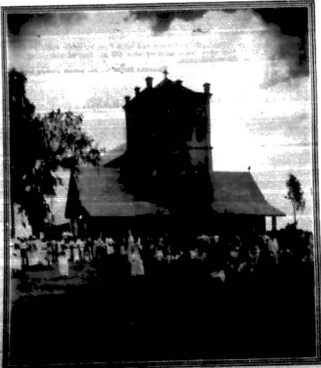

ARTHROPOD-TRANSMITTED DISEASES IN STOCK.

Parasites Which Cause Losses in Kenya.

LECTURE BY EXPERT.

How the Various Types of Insects Spread.

CLASSIFICATION ACCORDING TO NATURE OF ORGANISM OR AGENT.

The following is a summary of a lecture on "Some Arthropod-transmitted Diseases of Domestic Live Stock" which was given by Mr. H. Danney, Assistant Chief Veterinary Research Officer, at the recent scientific meeting in Nairobi. The insect or arthropod transmitted disease of domestic live stock may be roughly classified according to the nature of the causal organism or agent. The group includes diseases caused by the presence of single celled animals, by filtrable viruses, by Bacterium and finally by the various more important bacterial diseases of domestic animals which transmitted in various ways.

There is, however, a group of diseases, the haemorrhagic septicaemia group, which has many points of resemblance to plague, and there are circumstances which suggest that on occasion haemorrhagic septicaemia of cattle and buffalo may be transmitted by mosquitoes or buffalo-gnats. The work of this subject awaits confirmation. Sporadic cases of haemorrhagic septicaemia do appear in localities in Kenya Colony but it is not proposed to discuss the disease at any length.

Round Worms.

All the other groups, parasites belonging to the mollusca do not commonly cause specific diseases in the generally accepted sense of the term. Most of these molluscan parasites belong to the group Nematodes or round-worms, and they may be regarded as occasionally well adapted to parasitism in that they can live with their hosts, consuming only the minimum amount of physiological disturbance of the host, so long as they are present in small numbers only. Generally the progeny of the animal which parasitizes another goes to larvae, take the earliest opportunity of quitting the host and establishing their development under favourable conditions or in the body of an intermediate host.

As an example of this group one may cite the case of *Haemonchus contortus*, a common parasite of the horse, the cow, the ox and the buffalo. The eggs of this parasite pass out on to the grass with the faeces of the horse, and for their further development it is essential that they should be ingested by the larvae of the common house-fly, *Musca domestica*. In the larva of the fly development of the worm continues, until when the imago emerges the parasite has reached the adult stage. It then enters the body of the horse, and continues its life cycle.

Parasites in Dogs.

As an example of a slightly different type of life history one may take the common blood-sucking parasite of the dog in Kenya, *Dirofilaria immitis*. This parasite lives in the right heart and pulmonary arteries of the dog and transmits its progeny to a suitable intermediary host, which in this case may be a mosquito of the genus *Culex* or *Anopheles* group. In this type of life cycle we have in addition to the disturbance caused by the presence of the adult parasite in the heart, further complications which are the result of the circulation of the parasites in the blood stream. There are, for instance, no serious diseases of large domestic animals caused by parasites of this group in Kenya.

The next group, that of the protozoan parasites, is a very important one for us here in East Africa and it is proposed to take two diseases of the group as illustrations of the general type of disease caused by these parasites.

Botulism.

The first disease to be discussed is the common Botulism of Texas Fever. The history of the researches that have been carried out on Botulism is of particular interest since this was the first of all protozoan diseases in which transmission of the parasite by an arthropod intermediary host was proved. In the late 80's of the last century, it was the custom for large herds of beef cattle to be moved by road from Texas and the neighbouring states to the North Atlantic seaboard. Some of these cattle, there appeared in states north of latitude 36 degrees a new and extremely fatal disease, characterized by profuse salivation, haemorrhagic discharges, jaundice and extreme prostration. There was a conviction that these outbreaks were traceable to the migration of the Texas cattle, but the parasites were found to be of a type which was quite different from that of the Texas cattle. It was also the fact that it was transmitted by the blow fly, *Stomoxys calcitrans*, and that the parasite was found to pass from the adult fly through the eggs to its transmission in the next generation. As a development of this valuable discovery, certain numbers of protozoan diseases were soon proved to be transmitted by arthropods.

It is the fact that the blow fly was not recognized as existing in Texas in that the link was interrupted in this state, and that all animals passed through an attack of the disease early in life. There is a marked sex susceptibility and animals attacked in the early months of life may contract the disease in such a mild form that the attack will escape detection. In the adult animal the disease is much graver and may be responsible for a heavy mortality. After an attack of the disease there is an incomplete recovery in the sense that the animal's blood may contain a few parasites for a prolonged period, extending for several years, and the animal during this period will serve to infect tick or to infect other cattle by blood inoculation, even though the parasites are so scanty that they may not be detected by microscopic examination.

When exposed to adverse conditions, recovered animals may relapse and even die of an attack of Botulism. Relapses may occur at such times as halving, during an attack of anæmia or during a period of prostration. The severe symptoms method against relapse is to treat the animal with a natural attack in early life. The tick is an unimportant factor remaining on the same host for a period of 20 or more days during which time it passes through the stages of larva, nymph and adult. It is therefore a comparatively easy tick to destroy by short-interval dipping, and is the first tick to disappear on farms were systematic short-interval dipping has been continued on page 26.

Progress of Publicity Campaign for Kenya

FORMATION OF THE CENTRAL ORGANISATION.

Its Aims and Objects.

POLICY EXPLAINED BY CHAIRMAN OF THE CONVENTION.

The future activities of the Kenya Association (1922) a central organisation formed to deal with publicity on behalf of Kenya, were outlined and explained by Mr. Kenneth Archer, Chairman of the Convention...

He stated that this central body, which had been brought into being by the Convention, had no intention of working in opposition to any existing organisations...

The main object was to attract new settlers to Kenya and to be an authoritative body for consultation by new settlers and visitors.

A Great Step Forward.

The Kenya Association (1922) explained to members of the Nairobi Rotary Club at their weekly meeting held on Friday at the Hotel...

Mr. Kenneth Archer, Chairman of the Convention of Associations, from which body the idea first developed of forming a central publicity committee for Kenya...

Mr. Archer made it clear that the Convention was not an organisation which was doing any work for Kenya in the way of publicity work.

At the last Convention a committee was appointed to proceed with the work, and that work had been done by Mr. Archer, Mr. Cavendish-Bentinck, the chairman, and a member of the Nairobi Club...

The New Organisation. Mr. Archer went on to say that from the start it was felt that the organisation would be a central publicity committee for Kenya...

One of the items that have grown for formidable proportions in the Kenya Budget is that under the heading of 'Rents of Offices and houses and house allowance in lieu of quarters.'

IN 1922 THIS REPRESENTED AN EXPENDITURE OF £29,576. IN 1922 THE FIGURE HAD GROWN TO £38,500. IN 1923 THERE WAS A REDUCTION TO £47,300 BUT THE ITEM ROSE AGAIN LAST YEAR TO THE PEAK FIGURE OF £50,500.

The expenditure under this heading approved for 1923 is so startling in present-day circumstances and call for the most searching attention to the Expenditure Advisory Committee.

The Estimates do not refer of how and what amount is expended in providing houses for officials.

Within recent years over a hundred houses for Government servants have been erected in the Colony out of loan funds.

It is understood that a case of suspected rabies, which occurred on a Kilei-Limba horse farm near Nairobi, where a case was made in the correspondence of the "East African Standard," was not reported to any Government official. In fact, the East Information Government received on the subject was through those corresponding columns.

The Department state that in such cases legal proceedings will be taken in order to enforce the regulations, with particular reference to accuracy for reporting suspected cases. In one case of alleged failure to report, it is understood that proceedings are now pending.

THE EMPIRE SETS UP A NEW BUTTER RECORD.

The Peak of the Pig-Cycle.

HUGE IMPORTS OF BACON AND CONDENSED MILK.

Britain now imports more butter, by value, than any other single commodity. In 1931 Britain paid more for imported bacon than for imported wheat. Imports of condensed milk in the same period were the largest ever recorded, with the exception of the abnormal imports just after the war. These and many more interesting facts are revealed in the report, issued recently, by the Empire Marketing Board, on Dairy Produce Supplies in 1931.

In regard to butter it is of particular interest to note that among the Empire countries mentioned as increasing their exports of butter to the United Kingdom, South Africa and Kenya are specially mentioned.

Over 3,000,000 eggs reached the United Kingdom during the year and the report states that the per capita consumption is about 140. The volume of Empire supplies was the largest ever recorded and accounted for about 24 per cent. of the total imports.

Increase in Home Production of Eggs.

The United Kingdom in 1931 would a large quantity of butter and produce which amounts to the value of £1,000,000, including eggs and poultry. Value of Bat Guano as Manure.

LARGE DEPOSITS IN THE ELGON CAVES.

Result of Analysis of Samples.

The following article on Bat Guano deposits in the Elgon caves and their value as manure has been issued by the Kenya Department of Agriculture.

In many of the caves in Mt. Elgon there are deposits of bat guano which are believed to be of considerable extent. In view of the increasing need for fertilizers in this Colony and the desirability of finding a local supply which would not be rapidly exhausted and could be worked without too much difficulty and at a low cost for transport, analyses of these deposits and determinations of their manurial value have been made.

With the co-operation of a farmer in the locality on whose farms there are some of these deposits the District Agricultural Officer took samples three of which were considered alike enough to be analysed as one sample. The fourth was darker and heavier and the fifth was taken from below four inches from the surface.

The first analysis was the composition of the Kenya Department of Agriculture. The results are as follows:-
Sample 1:- Total ash 57.25, total Phosphoric oxide 1.56, total Nitrogen 5.32 approx manurial value per ton (dry weight) Shs. 87.
Sample 2:- Total ash 51.00, total Phosphoric oxide 1.83, total Nitrogen 4.80 approx manurial value per ton (dry weight) Shs. 81.

Sample 3:- Total ash 61.82, total Phosphoric oxide 8.20, total Nitrogen 3.93, approx manurial value per ton (dry weight) Shs. 89.

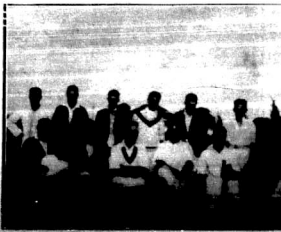
Analysis shows the material to be about 15-20 times as rich as ordinary bone manure, and thus but limited quantities in the order of one ton to the acre would supply suitable amounts of total phosphoric oxide and nitrogen; much of the nitrogen would only very slowly become available. The materials would also contain small amounts of potash.

The appearance of the materials show them to be light, very friable, fluffy powders, containing much very inert organic matter of animal origin. Examination under the microscope shows them to contain much chitin, derived from the exoskeletons of insects. Chitin contains about 9 per cent. of nitrogen which would be but slowly rendered available in the soil.

Taking the unit value for nitrogen and phosphoric oxide in these materials to be of the order of Shs. 12½ and Shs. 5½, respectively, the manurial value of the three samples would be of the order of Shs. 80, 81 and 89. This would be for the dry material only. The price of similar material when made available would depend on its moisture content, etc. It is estimated 50 tons of material with 10 per cent. moisture would be valued at Shs. 4000.

BETWEEN MOMBASA AND NAKURU.

Bill to be introduced.

ATTORNEY-GENERAL'S WARNING TO APPLICANTS FOR LICENCES.

At last week's meeting of the Road Transport Control Board, the Attorney-General announced that during the next session of the Kenya Legislative, a Bill would be introduced providing for the prohibition of the carriage by motor vehicles of goods for reward.

The prohibition, he explained, would apply to any section of the road between Mombasa and Nakuru, with a proviso permitting the carriage of goods over certain sections of the road in order to serve places 25 miles from the railway. The Machakos road would also be exempt.

Effect of Competition.

At the next session of the Kenya Legislative Council a Bill will be introduced to prohibit the carriage of goods by motor for reward. This warning was given to applicants for new licences, by the Attorney-General last week preceding one meeting of the Transport Control Board of the application they were refused, as also was the case, while four were granted to stand over till the next meeting, and the application was withdrawn.

The legal representatives of several of the applicants were called in, and the Attorney-General said he would give them the limitation "that it is the present intention of Government to prohibit the carriage of goods by motor for reward along any section of the road between Mombasa and Nakuru."

He went on to say "There will be a proviso for the carriage of goods over a certain section of the road."

A Proviso.

He proceeded to explain that there would be a proviso to permit the carriage of goods over certain sections of the road between places 25 miles from the railway, but beyond that there would be complete prohibition. That prohibition would be extended to places which had already received licences from the Board, after the issue of 250,000 licences at the first survey of the year, and the latest date of any such licence is February 1st.

If any licences were granted by the Board after that date, they would be subject to the same conditions as those on the payment of the licence fee, and for a period that would be as long as the middle of next February. That was the Attorney-General's intention in consideration of a full year's licence fee.

Mr. C. G. Ginnason, one of the members of the Board, asked if prohibitive measures would apply to a man carrying his own goods?

The Attorney-General replied that the Bill would still contain the proviso that goods which had been sold or were being conveyed for sale were exempt. It would not prevent a man making profits from the road, but it would prevent him carrying those goods away, but it would be an offence for him to transport to road goods up to the branch in Nairobi for sale.

There was a further exemption required in the conveyance of farm products from the fact that they were produced on the nearest railway siding or township.

Mr. B. D. H. Hooper, one of the legal representatives, the Chairman said an obvious case was the case in Machakos, where the prohibited road was left to the owner of the land, and he suggested a proviso was added to permit a man to take up to

the opposite direction, and the application was refused. Another application has been before the Board since December last, 1931, but the man has never attended. To clear the Secretary's books, the application was written upon.

Formerly a fitter on the railway, afterwards running a transport business at Mombasa and in the Mombasa area, the applicant said he had a taxi-hire business at Njira. A Mombasa motor driver, unable to make a living there, also hoped to do better in the country, but he had not been without success.

"On learning that he would have to pay 100 to receive a licence for a period of not more than six months, the applicant said he would think it over, and if necessary come back again. The recommended chairman said it will only be five months."

Including the last was one European, of Nakuru, who was formerly a transport contractor to the P. W. O. Since his contracts, concluded about a year ago, he had not sufficient money to pay for a licence. The Board, after hearing the evidence, granted the licence.

The actual business day of the Board was the transfer of three existing licences to which there was no objection.

Railway Losses.

This announcement by the Attorney-General follows the demand by the railway administration that the Government should make a heavy financial loan which the road commission has refused to make. Up to the end of last February 25 licences had been taken out, and since that time the Board has issued none at all. In two special cases, however, a licence was issued on the K. T. H. of over 200,000 rupees, and a licence was issued in the schedule of the Ordinance.

It is to be added that at least 200,000 for loss by road transport, but the licences were not required. INDIAN POLICY OF NON-CO-OPERATION.

Rejected by Head of E.A.I.N. Congress

"ILL-ADVISED."

Deputy President Resigns from Organisation.

Believing that the policy of non-co-operation has proved ineffective and that it is wrong for the East African Indian National Congress to persist in such a policy, Mr. Abdul Wahid, Deputy President of the Congress, has resigned from the office of the Executive of that body, his point of view is the right one, he resigned.

His reasons are set out in the following letter addressed to the Editor of the "East African Standard":

Sir, Having been advised by the Executive of the Congress at Simla (whose advice cannot lightly be ignored by us in view of the fact that we have all along our career turned to the Government of India for assistance and guidance) and with the words of Kanwar Maharaj Singh, the Agent General of the India Government in South Africa, who is still in the country, and lastly beginning to realize myself along with many other prominent local persons that the Indian National Congress is suffering considerably (and will continue to suffer) by our ill-considered policy of non-co-operation with the Government of the East African Standard, I have decided to resign from the office of Deputy President of the Congress.

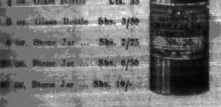

Kenya Coffee in Canada and the United States.

VISIT BY REPRESENTATIVE OF THE INDUSTRY. The Importance of San Francisco.

WAYS OF INCREASING ATTRACTIVENESS OF LOCAL PRODUCT. A representative of the Kenya coffee industry recently visited Canada and the United States of America with the object of promoting interest in the local product and of discovering ways in which it might be made more attractive to the buyers in those countries.

On Thursday Mr. C. J. Valentine was entertained to luncheon in Nairobi by the Coffee Planters' Union of Kenya and East Africa and outlined the work which he had carried out during his visit to those countries.

In Mr. Valentine's opinion, San Francisco was definitely the place upon which Kenya should concentrate as in this city the coffee industry was taken very seriously. At present a large proportion of the coffee brought there came from Colombia.

It was particularly stressed that the quality of Kenya coffee should be consistent and complaints were heard that this had not been so in the past. Other difficulties with regard to methods of bagging were also mentioned and remedies suggested, as ways in which a greater demand for Kenya coffee might be created.

Methods of Bagging.

Mr. C. J. Valentine was the guest on Thursday of the Coffee Planters' Union of Kenya and East Africa, at a luncheon when he summarized his impressions of his recent visit to Canada and the United States of America during which he carried out work on behalf of the Kenya coffee industry.

The Pacific Coast. Coffee, he went on, could be divided into Brazilian and mild, and following the track of the latter—in which Kenya was ranked very highly by a discriminatory committee—definitely took them to the Pacific coast with San Francisco as the center there. Here were imported 12 to 13 per cent of the consumption of the United States, which was one and a half million bags, a quantity of all types.

London. In Mr. Valentine's opinion, San Francisco was definitely the place for Kenya concentrates upon. There they took the business very seriously, their exports were highly paid and, there was very much to be made from the concentrates would demand what the export was not up to standard; those concentrates should be made in Kenya.

Improvements Needed. As the chairman said in thinking Mr. Valentine both for what he had done and for what he was doing, it was important that the Kenya industry should be able to supply the market. The speaker had shown them, and he was told that the 1931 crop was up to the standard.

prove valuable amongst coconuts, and where found growing should be encouraged.

"It may be added that it does not seem difficult to teach boys what plants to leave; the Leguminosae family is so easily recognized that little trouble should be experienced. The value of this selective weeding is to be stressed if it does afford a method of keeping the shamba in condition in a time when costs have to be cut down to the absolute minimum. Further, there is plenty of material available and one can expect there are other good plants to be found. It would also be appreciated if planters would send soil to the Station of soil, so that plants they consider may be useful.

Having said so much, however, it may be said that good soil must be used if it does not follow this method. Results will not be obtained by one or other of the methods planned under trial. Some of these have seen a complete success; others are only just being tried. Mentions will only be made of Centrosema pubescens the most promising cover crop so far, and the Mat Grass, which seems very suitable for the Coast and is a quick maturing green manure.

Conclusion.

"A rapid survey of the work of the Station has now been completed and it is hoped some idea has been conveyed of the type of work being done. In considering the value of it all one must remember that in agriculture results cannot be hastened and that if steady progress is made year by year better results will be obtained than by attempting to proceed too quickly. One must also remember that all the experiments are not necessary but every one that succeeds is a clear gain.

Finally the writer would like to express his indebtedness to those who have helped the work either through undertaking or trials or by supplying seeds. Particularly must he thank Mr. Lillywhite, who has facilitated the work in many ways and has always been willing to put at his disposal his long experience of the Coast."
