London, October 27. Among accusations made against Andrew John Gibson at the Bristol Police Court were that he posed as a Government Medical Officer and Chief Inspector of Mines in Kenya. He forged Kenya official documents and attempted to obtain £50 by false pretences from a Bristol scientist whom he offered an appointment as Chief Chemist and Assayer in the Kenya Mines Department. Evidence was led that Gibson impersonated a Kenyan. Dr. Theodore Gibson and offered the scientist a commencing salary of £900 with a pension. The scientist then became suspicious and asked for £50 in respect of passage money. Gibson was committed for trial after a Colonial Office official had given evidence. (Reuter.)

A PRINCESS AND HER SON.

Orders by King Carol.

INCREASE IN ALLOWANCE.

Instructions as to Residence.

Bucharest, Oct. 28. The Government has granted Princess Helen's first demand to increase by twenty per cent. her allowance, making a total of £14,000. She is permitted to spend a month each year with her son but only in Switzerland. She may visit Rumania but must reside where the Government desires. She must reply by tomorrow. (Reuter.)

Prince Michael's Visit.

ATTEMPT TO WRECK PRESIDENT'S TRAIN.

On Curved Embankment.

SEVENTY SPIKES REMOVED FROM RAILS.

Washington, Oct. 28.

A sensation has been created by the reported attempt to wreck President Hoover's special election campaign train as it passed near Athens, Ohio, on Saturday.

It is alleged that the railway authorities to-day discovered about 70 spikes removed from inside the rails on a high curve. The outside spikes held firm or the train might have crashed over the embankment.

The Election Campaign.

New York, Nov. 1. The Presidential election campaign reached its climax in a speech by President Hoover at Madison Square Garden in the heart of the "Rumny's country." There were 20,000 enthusiastic listeners present when he declared the "grass will grow in the streets of a hundred cities and a thousand towns if the protection built up by prohibition is taken away. He condemned the Democratic candidate, Mr. Franklin Roosevelt, and his proposals to lower the tariffs and inflate the currency. He assured an audience of thousands of Democrats at Salem, Massachusetts, that after March when the special Congress meets the "witch of depression" will be banished ten feet deep. He grouped the Republicans as trying to scare the voters and urged the five day week and the unemployed. While the Republicans and Democrats are at loggerheads, the Socialist candidate, Dr. Foster, Mr. Norman Thomas is attacking both. In a speech at Buffalo he declared they had conspired to pass the Sales Tax. This "putting the burden of a staggering deficit on the shoulders of the workers." (Reuter.)

WORLD'S GREATEST LINER.

Launched by French President.

St Nazaire, October 29. The world's greatest liner of 75,000 tons, "Normandie", with which France is determined to win the Atlantic, was launched today by President Le Brun. Huge crowds cheered as the vessel majestically ran down the slipway. The new liner was built for a French line with the assistance of Government and is expected to be finished in the spring of 1934. She will be 1,027 feet long and will have eleven decks and will develop 100,000 horsepower giving a speed of thirty knots. She will accommodate 4,500 passengers and will have a crew and staff of 1,400. (Reuter.)

ANGLO-IRISH SITUATION.

Death of Tanganyika Financial Adviser.

STANDARD'S SUBSCRIPTIONS.

London, October 31.

Sir Sydney Arncliffe-Smith, K.C.B., C.B., recently Financial Adviser to the Tanganyika Government, died to-day.

Late in February this year, Sir Sydney's services were placed by the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury at the disposal of the Tanganyika Government for investigation into the basis of public revenue and expenditure in the Territory.

For some years Sir Sydney was Assistant Secretary to the Treasury. He acted as Financial Adviser to the Persian Government in 1920-1921 and was later Secretary General of the Reparations Commission.

Sir Sydney Arncliffe-Smith died before the publication of his report on Tanganyika finances. (Copyright.)

M. HERRIOT IN SPAIN.

Demonstration by Students.

Madrid, Oct. 31.

M. Herriot's arrival to orient Franco-Spanish friendship was marked with some confusion and a demonstration by students and a shouting "Death to Herriot and to the Emperor!"

The fact that M. Herriot's mission was announced before a meeting of the Spaniards was undoubtedly unfortunate for the Spaniards. But as all sections of the press referred to M. Herriot as a man of high prestige and a deeply respected statesman, the demonstration was unimportant.

Deeply Wounded by Disturbance.

Madrid, November 1. Nothing could have wounded me more deeply than to find there is a section, however small of the Spaniards who are incapable of coming to your country as a preparation for war on the very doorstep of my having peace of Europe with the most advanced plan for the organization of peace. In these words M. Herriot referred to the disturbance on his visit to Madrid. M. Herriot was concerned with projected Franco-Spanish military engagements. (Reuter.)

JEW-ARAB PROBLEM.

A "Simple Solution" Suggested.

London, Nov. 2.

The ex-Khedive Abbas Hilmi who has recently returned from Palestine, in an interview advanced what he regarded as a "simple solution" to the Jew-Arab problem in Palestine, namely that all the Jews should become Arabs. He declares that as the Jews are of Arab blood they should merely be returning to the fold. It would be unnecessary for the Jews to change their religion or language and European culture, would be a definite advantage. He also blends with Oriental culture; but the Jews must make it clear they are returning home and that they are not new-comers. Nevertheless, the British Mandate is intended, perhaps for a lifetime. (Reuter.)

A White Paper Issued.

ON RECENT CONFERENCE.

Why Payments to Britain Were Refused.

Dublin, October 26.

The Free State Government to-day to deal with various bills, but the Abolition of the Oath Bill was not included although the Dail discussed the matter a week ago. The Negotiations.

Rugby, October 29. A White Paper issued this morning contains correspondence relating to the recent conference in London between the United Kingdom and the Irish Free State representatives.

The main features of these documents were outlined in a statement in Parliament on October 10 by the Dominions Secretary, Mr. J. H. Thomas, when he made a statement on the result of the abortive discussions. The first document is a memorandum indicating the reasons why the Irish Free State declined to make certain payments to the Government of Great Britain. In this the Free State is very explicit that there is any binding force in a certain instrument upon which the British Government rely. They state the instrument of October 12, 1926, is not binding because among other reasons it was not submitted to the Irish Parliament for ratification. It was only provisional. The heads of the ultra-sterile settlement of March 1926, it states, are open to the same objections.

The Free State Government contends that land stocks are part of the public debt of the United Kingdom and should therefore under the 1925 Agreement, which amended the Treaty, remain the liability of the United Kingdom. It also contends that under the Government of Ireland Act of 1920 annuities were gifted to the two legislatures contemplated under that Act.

The memorandum asserts that, respecting the Royal Irish Constabulary that neither Treaty nor agreement to the Treaty imposed on the Government of the Free State any liability of pensions or pre-Treaty pensioners or compensation to discharged members of the Force.

A further memorandum is attached to the White Paper for recoupment in respect of over taxation under an Act of 1901. It claims also compensation in respect of loss sustained by the Free State in consequence of the abandonment of the British Government of the gold standard. (British Official Wireless Service.)

Mr. de Valera's Demands.

London, October 29. The substance of the negotiations between Mr. J. H. Thomas and Mr. de Valera has been published in a "White Paper" which shows Mr. de Valera's demand as his colonial claim of £400,000,000. Apart from the land annuities and the claims in respect of over taxation he demands a share in the road fund, a share in the assets of the former United Kingdom, a reduction of the land annuity, rendered redundant by the Irish claims, and he contends that the 1929 and 1930 Agreements are not binding unless they are ratified by Parliament. He declines responsibility for any civil claims. (Continued at foot of previous column.)

DEVELOPMENT IN EXPORTS OF DAIRY PRODUCE.

Steady Progress.

INCREASE OF NATIVE INTEREST IN POULTRY FARMING.

Despite adverse conditions during 1931 considerable progress was made in the various sections of the livestock industry of Kenya, according to a report on the work during that year of the Animal Husbandry Sub-Section of the Department of Agriculture.

The development of the dairy industry was one of the chief activities of the Department and the important part played by the primary producer is stressed in the report. It is stated that while improvement in the quality of produce for export was achieved, further efforts are necessary.

Sheep and sheep industries passed through a very difficult period, but held their own. The need for animals is emphasized.

Farmer training had been taken up with increasing interest during the year and it is stated that it is evident that there will be in the near future a large surplus of eggs beyond local requirements. The native producer has also shown greater interest in this industry, as a result of the work by the Department.

The Export Market.

During the course of an active year the Department has endeavored to secure for 1932 the various sections of the Live Stock Office. At the request of the Director of the Kenya Cooperative Creameries, Mr. W. D. D. Jardine, the Live Stock Office has issued a report of the activities of the sub-section of animal husbandry for the year 1931-2. The report is as follows:

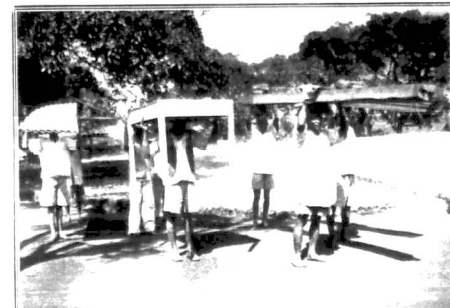

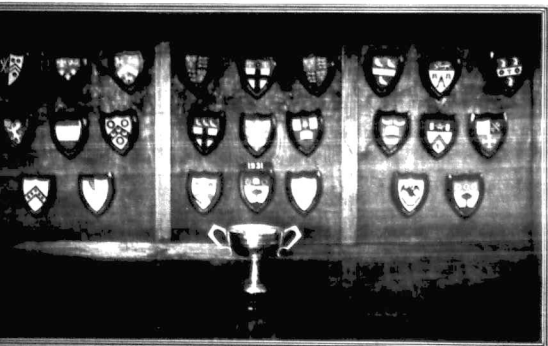

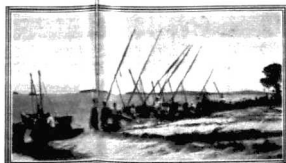

NERITICHIN'S EASY CESAREWITCH.

King and Queen Present.

 London, October 13
 (By Air Mail)
 It was one of the easiest wins on record in the Cesarewitch at Newmarket. Yet the race itself did not attract much attention, since none of the horses was outstanding. Moreover, all the chief races nowadays are overshadowed by the Irish Sweepstakes.

The King and Queen were present, arriving early from Slough, and were in time to have luncheon before the first race of the day. The Queen wore a long coat of deep cerise-blue-buff fancy wool material, with narrow panels set in at the back form a pattern. After Manitoba had finished first in the Middle Park Stakes, three parts of long odds, and first of Falcation and Start, M. Boxing in Great Britain.

 I doubt if any result in the history of the Cesarewitch has been more popular than the victory of Nitsichin. The actual favorite, Manbo, was sent down, while the first past the post, Nitsichin, however, had run a very good race, and was the favorite for this race when narrowly beaten by Roi de Paris in the Newbury Autumn Banked competitors, not only in the afternoon of the race, but all through the ante-post betting. What is more, she was carrying an unusually stiff weight for a filly, in being in fact, the opponent of the hordes, which Noble Star carried to the front last year. Hearing of Evidence Commenced.

TWO MURDER CHARGES AGAINST YOUTH.

Elaborate Safari Plans.

STATEMENT BY ACCUSED HANDED IN TO MAGISTRATE.

The hearing of the case against Charles William Ross, accused of murdering Miss Winifred Stevenson and Miss Margaret Keppie on the night of October 6 was begun before the Resident Magistrate, Nakuru on Thursday.

The first witness was the mother of Miss Stevenson who told of an invitation given by Ross to her daughter to accompany him to the pictures, an invitation which subsequently included Miss Keppie. Later she found a note in which Ross said he had taken the girls to Nairobi.

Other witnesses spoke of the big quantity and variety of stores which, it was alleged, Ross had purchased a day or two prior to the tragedy on the plea that they were wanted for a dinner party at Rengai. They included foodstuffs and drinks, plates, cutlery and glasses and also shawls, rugs, a bedspread, sheets and so on.

Medical evidence showed that Miss Keppie died practically instantaneously from a gunshot wound at the back of the head. Miss Stevenson had a similar wound.

A statement made by Ross to the District Commissioner was handed to the Magistrate but was not read.

Story of Target Practice.

[SPECIAL CORRESPONDENT]

Nakuru, Thursday. It was intimated at the opening here today, before the Resident Magistrate of the case against Charles William Ross, formerly employed by the Kenya Farmers' Association, that the charge of the murder of Miss Margaret Keppie and of Miss Winifred Stevenson would be prepared against Ross in the criminal proceedings.

Large numbers of Nakuru people assembled in the little court house about a quarter of an hour before Ross, who was dressed in the dock. Mrs. Stevenson, mother of the late Miss Winifred Stevenson, was sequestered at the adjacent table. She was dressed in deep mourning, and was accompanied by her husband, Mr. Harry Stevenson.

"A person of my name was led into the prison official and a European police, both of whom remained outside the hall. His hands were bound and he was taken to the court house. He was dressed in a dark suit and was accompanied by two men, one of whom was the driver of the motor car in which he was taken to the court house. "Ross showed a certain amount of distress, and was later given a seat in the dock. When the trial was started, the court house was filled with both Europeans and Indians, and among them were three women. The witness was Mr. C. W. Ross. Ross was understood, and the prosecution was in the hands of Mr. P. F. Branson, Crown Counsel. Mr. Neil Stewart, Superintendent C.D., was also present in court.

Two Charges.

Crown Counsel said there were two charges against Ross. He was accused of the murder of Miss Keppie and the second charge was that he murdered Miss Stevenson. Mrs. Emily Stevenson was the first witness for the Crown. Her daughter, she said, was 32 years of age, and had been employed by Dalgety and Co. at Nakuru. On Thursday, October 6, she had been present at a dinner. Previous to that date Ross had been in her house on three or four occasions, but he had never sat out with her.

Dear Winnie. I suggest it is a most idea of yours regarding Miss Keppie, and I shall stand by it up to the limit of my power. Yours, C. W. Ross.

The Alarm. Mr. Stevenson said that about 6.45 that evening she and Donald Keppie had been in the house when Ross had been in the house with Ross and Winifred was

to go to her bath. Witness returned about 10.30 p.m. and went straight to her room. At 3 o'clock next morning she awoke, and realised that Winifred was not at her room. Coming out of the room in the morning being slight, she and Winifred shared the same room.

Witness at once went to Miss Keppie's room and found she was not there either. Witness's husband was in Nairobi.

She went immediately to her room and searched the drawers and the shore of the lake before daylight. When he had left witness dressed, and then called the boys to prepare. While hot water presents it was noticed a letter on the sitting room table addressed to her. It read—

Dear Mrs. Stevenson, As Winnie and Miss Keppie have persuaded me to take them down to Nairobi for the weekend I am afraid that we shall not see you again until Sunday.

Yours, C. W. Ross. Ross had been at the house on a previous Sunday when he came with Donald, they had been out over the estate and wanted a wash. Ross remained then about an hour. While hot water presents it was probably he had mentioned the proposed trip to Nairobi because "we had it very much on our minds," Miss Keppie, Winifred, and herself had been going.

When Winifred left with Ross she had been wearing a thin silk night dress and had her hair done, fancy brown shoes with high heels.

The next thing witness heard about the affair was on Saturday night at 10.30. Blinky came to her and said: "We have found the body of Miss Keppie."

When Ross was asked if he wanted to question the witness, he said "No," and then asked her to ask Mrs. Stevenson before he left for Nairobi.

Tragic Discovery. "You can ask questions now, or you can reserve them," the Magistrate informed him. Ross declined and said he would reserve them.

"I was employed by Mr. and Mrs. Stevenson and he recognized Ross as being the man who came to the house at 8 p.m. on October 6. Ross was then dressed in a dark suit and he saw Ross leave the house and enter Miss Keppie's house, accompanying him. "Since that night I never saw the two women again," witness said.

Ross did not desire to question the witness. The next witness was a native girl employed by Mr. and Mrs. Stevenson who said she had been in their employ for five years. On the night of October 6, Ross arrived at the house by car. He went to the bedroom and remained about half an hour, leaving with the two ladies. One was wearing "a very beautiful dress" and overcoat.

When this witness said he had seen Ross on a few previous occasions at the Stevenson's home, Ross said: "The Motor Car was to about four years ago when I was at school." He added that Mrs. Stevenson had been running a boarding house there since she had been at that time the witness replied in the affirmative.

Mr. Donald Ingley Shaw, working as a motor mechanic at Nairobi, said he knew Ross fairly well and they had had meals together, starting on October 1. They did not reside in the same bungalow. On October 4, Tuesday, in the mess Ross asked another man named Price whether a car could be hired from the Motor Mart. He understood first of all that he was going down to Nairobi on K.F.A. and he would see Mr. Shaw said.

A Hired Car. On the morning of Thursday, Ross came to see witness in the garage, at about 8.30. Ross asked her to take a car to the Motor Mart in the garage, would witness lend him his, because he wanted to go to Nairobi to sell his motor-cycle. He wanted to see the car on Friday night. Witness agreed—that the car should be taken on the new parking system. Ross did not want to see the car on Friday. In the afternoon of the

same day witness took the car from the garage, made all adjustments and pressing having been done. It was fetched by a K.F.A. driver with a note asking for the car and a receipt for the car. Witness signed C. W. Ross. Witness handed the vehicle over. The car was a Chevrolet box body, was in number 25-3033. Later in the morning, when witness had gone home, Ross appeared and said the car had stopped working. Witness the matter with it so far as witness could see; he was able to drive it perfectly. He then purposely took the car up to the house to see if Ross could drive it round all right. Witness saw Ross again between 7 and 7.15 p.m. when he came to the mess. He went into the bedroom, as witness was having a bath. When witness came out, Ross went and had his bath.

"Seemed Excited." He seemed a little excited and did not talk his usual way, he only had his soap and half the bath course. He then put down his knife and fork and made some remarks about "getting off" and put on his coat.

After dinner there had been some ordinary conversation, in which Ross had said that he was out. Ross was wearing a dark blue suit, blue striped shirt, black crepe felt shoes, collar and so, totally different from what he had been made fairly recently. After he left he said "Cheerio" as he took leave, and added that he would be back late on Friday night or on Saturday morning, on Saturday morning. A man named Marston who shared the mess with them and who worked at a hotel, said that he should go to bed and he, Marston, would call him about 2 o'clock in the morning so that he could get down to Nairobi in the morning fast on Friday morning.

He replied that there were two families with whom he had got a shake-down for the night and he returned to go to bed. He could not see with him when he left similar to the one produced in court, with a car which was not strapped to it was a blanket rug.

Car in a Ditch. "Did you know if the accused had a revolver?" asked Mr. Branson. "No, only afterwards," witness said. Ross did not mention purchasing a revolver on Friday afternoon as the result of information from Marston and Price, witness went to the Havens. Ross showed seven or eight years, and there found his car in a ditch. The front wheels were in it. It was facing the road. The car had to be hauled back to the road. The front bumper started it again. The front bumper was also bent, and the front support to the seat was cracked.

"Did someone have a blue blazer?" asked Crown Counsel. "I cannot tell you," witness replied.

Mr. R. H. Price, who also shared in the mess and also worked at the Motor Mart, Nakuru, said he had known Ross for about three years, and that he and Ross shared a bungalow with him and Marston. They had been sharing the mess for 14 or 15 months. Ross was taken to the Motor Mart that there was no car available. Ross could drive a car, and possessed a careful driver. Describing what occurred in the mess when Ross was leaving, he said he asked Ross if he were taking his rifle, and Ross replied: "I might as well take it." Witness proceeded to give corroborative evidence, and identified the blue blazer as belonging to someone who had been in the mess at School Road, 1914, was on the pocket. He knew that Ross owned a Colt revolver. It had belonged to a man named Ross. Ross had K.F.A. and accused Ross witness that he had got a car from Driver on 1st Oct. Accused kept it in a small driver in his bed room.

Revolver Practised. On the morning of Thursday, the accused was taken to the Motor Mart, Nakuru, to practice with his revolver. He came back and said he had

PROVISIONS OF AMENDMENT TO ACT.

Cycle Pillion Riding.

TO BE RESTRICTED TO ONE PASSENGER ONLY.

According to the provisions of a Bill to Amend the Traffic Ordinance, the draft of which has been published in the "Official Gazette," third party insurance will be made compulsory for drivers of all classes of motor vehicles.

This insurance is at present compulsory on drivers of public service vehicles, but it is stated that Government is of the opinion that the time has now arrived when this principle should be applied to all motor vehicles. A clause also provides that in the case of a policy being allowed to lapse, the holder of the vehicle to which the policy relates, automatically becomes void.

Under the proposed new law, the carrying of more than one passenger on the pillion of a motor cycle will be forbidden. The passenger must further ride on a seat securely fixed to the machine.

UNEMPLOYMENT PROBLEM.

Royal Commission Report Issued.

SUGGESTIONS FOR MAKING FUND SOLVENT.

The "Means Test."

DEFINITE SCALES ACCORDING TO DISTRICT RECOMMENDED.

The Royal Commission appointed to investigate the Unemployment Insurance Scheme has issued its report. Among its recommendations for the placing of the fund in a solvent position, it is suggested that part of the cost of relief should be subsidised by local authorities.

The report points out that unemployment benefits cost £1,800,000. For safety, it is recommended that the estimates should be based on a figure of 3,000,000 unemployed.

Agriculture is now the subject of attention in connection with the unemployment situation. It was stated in the House of Commons that a scheme is in hand for a reduction of meat import into Britain in order to assist the British livestock industry.

The Government has become restless over the Government's agricultural policy, and they were stated by the Premier, during the debate on unemployment, that agriculture could not expect any preferential treatment not accorded to other industries. Agriculture, he added, must contribute its full quota in taxation by taking advantage of the existing tariffs.

Premier Reviews Position.

In a speech at London, November 3, Mr. Stanley Baldwin, Conservative Premier, reviewed the whole position of the unemployment problem and the hope that the Government had had in mind some of them in a scheme to be introduced on November 12 (Reuter).

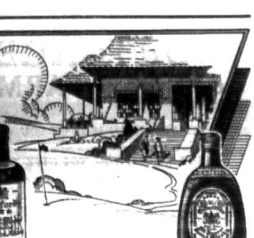

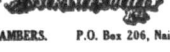

REVENUE ESTIMATES IN TANGANYIKA.

MARKED REVIVAL OF TRADE NOT EXPECTED

Principal Variations

The Revenue (By Mail) Tanganyika estimate for 1932-33 has been framed on the assumption that there will be no marked revival of trade during the year.

The statement is made in the memorandum which accompanies the Budget Estimates presented to the recent session of Legislative Council at Dar es Salaam.

The trade conditions improve the figure of the surplus balance for the January term of 1932-33 (£260,000) will not be so great as anticipated.

Considerable Difficulty

Low prices leave little or no spending margin to the producers and this combined with low wages has severely reduced the purchasing power of the community. In addition, the present volume of dutiable imports is yielding less in Import Duties than it would in previous times on account of the use of a reduced basis of the majority of the duties. As the value of commodities goes down so does the Import Duty. There is a further factor, namely, the increased production and consumption of local East African commodities, e.g., sugar, tea, tobacco, which also tend to reduce the value of the exports.

INCOME TAX ADVISER.

Arrival of Expert in Nairobi.

ATTACHED TO GOVERNORS' CONFERENCE.

Anxious to Obtain Views of Kenya Bodies.

Mr. J. M. Surfleet, H. M. Inspector of Taxes, from Somerset House, London, seconded to Kenya Government, arrived in Nairobi this week as the adviser to Government on income tax.

It may be recalled that at the July session of the Legislative Council, Government announced that it would introduce at the budget session a Bill to provide for the imposition of income tax next year. The Governor stated that he believed a case for a low income tax was unworkable and that the proposal would have the approval of a large section of the community.

His Excellency also announced that a request had been made for the loan of an experienced Somerset House official "to advise Government on the necessary legislation and to set up the requisite administrative machinery suitable for local conditions."

Hence Mr. Surfleet's presence in Kenya. Mr. Surfleet has had nearly twenty years experience of the administration of Income Tax in England, and is attached to the Governor's Conference as Adviser. For the time being he has been given the duty of surveying and it is understood that he is anxious to appreciate the various views and opinions of the people in Kenya on the subject of Income Tax, and hopes to meet in due course the people and representative bodies who may be able to assist him in his work.

Interviewed by a representative of the East African Standard, he declined to offer any views as to the form any legislation might take.

AERODROME AT KAMPALA.

Opinion of Air Ministry Expert.

Kampala, November 11. Last week Grylls, R.E., the Air Ministry expert sent out here to advise on aerodromes, met the sub-committee of the Uganda Chamber of Commerce last Friday on the question of the establishment of a Class A aerodrome near Kampala. His opinion appears to be that the siting of the ground around Kampala places the Class A aerodrome outside the scope of practical politics for the moment, although two sites capable of being made into landing grounds for light and medium weight aircraft are definitely possible.

The present aerodrome at Entebbe, apparently could receive a certificate to land machines of any class. Everyone can understand that the first object of the Air Ministry is to secure 100 per cent safety and we all applaud this as being the basis of British flying. But we are still not convinced that Kampala can be ruled out entirely. Anyway, a detailed survey of two sites, the one about three miles from Kampala towards Entebbe, and the other about eight miles toward Gayaza, is now being made and it is hoped that Mr. Grylls will find some fine site in Uganda on his way back from south India to report on these propositions.

This will be the first "hiking" travellers of modern commerce. At least 30,000 miles will be covered on foot. From Germany the party goes to Constantinople thence to Asia Minor, Palestine and Africa. When they have crossed the Indian Ocean, the route will be by Karachi, Madras, Singapore and Shanghai. After visiting Australia, they will cross to South America, and make their way through the Andes to the United States and Canada. They reckon to be on the road for three years.

Progress Made by Local Native Councils.

PROMOTING SOCIAL WELFARE IN THE RESERVES.

Growth of a Tradition.

DIVERTING ENERGIES INTO PRODUCTIVE CHANNELS.

Some interesting facts regarding the progress during 1931 in the Local Native Councils system in Kenya are recorded in the annual report of the Native Affairs Department for 1931. The system has proved successful and great strides have been made in certain areas.

In other districts difficulties have been found in making the natives appreciative of the true meaning of the scheme. In Turkana for instance the quarterly meetings were looked upon as social gatherings at which there should be athletic contests and an ngoma rather after the style of the Annual Scottish Games or a Scout Jamboree! It is therefore possible that the Council in this area may be abolished.

Elsewhere money has been voted by the Councils for education, roads, water supplies and other purposes which will benefit the social and physical welfare of the natives. Much is being done to divert the thoughts and energies of the rising generation, particularly among the more advanced tribes, from political agitation to questions which will advance the prosperity of the Reserves.

Educational Facilities.

In a session of the annual report of the Native Affairs Department for 1931 the Chief Secretary of the colony outlined the progress that has been made during the year in the Local Native Councils system.

It has been found that the Local Native Councils are a valuable way of keeping the inhabitants of the reserves informed as to the wishes and policy of Government. The various reserves are divided into small units and that on many occasions the members had expressed the desire to have a Primary School, Dispensary and District Council. In some instances the Government has been able to meet these wishes.

Separate Councils were originally established in Baringo District to which was thought better to have one Council for the Pokoon or East and one for the Kamusa and Njempes or Transvaal. This was due to the amalgamation of the (a) Elgeyo and Marakwet Councils and (b) two Baringo Councils. Amalgamations. Originally the Elgeyo and Marakwet Councils were established separately as there were at that time two administrative areas with Headquarters at Embasa and Marakwet. For some years now the two districts, and therefore the two Councils, have been administered by one District Officer and it appeared that there was no real distinction in administration between the two parts of the districts and at the same time, the two Councils were amalgamated. The Marakwet actually are an extension of the Elgeyo and prefer to be called Elgeyo and as a result of this the new Council is called the Elgeyo Local Native Council.

THREEPEN A MILE FLYING.

Cheapness of New Air Taxi Service.

The West London (Fly Mail) service will serve with aeroplanes the best seats still without its airport. Recently an air passenger was held at Hillman's aerodrome, Maylands. The reason was that the pilot had for the chief objection the drawing of the public attention to the need of an airport in Essex. The Lord Mayor of London and the Lady May were flown from Hester to this airport escorted by machines belonging to No. 600 (City of London) Squadron of the Auxiliary Air Force. There were the usual passenger items and there was a display of formation flying by Bristol "Bulldogs" belonging to No. 84 Squadron of the Royal Air Force. The case of handling these machines and the way in which the various manoeuvres were timed by the pilots were much admired.

Mr. Hillman provides air service at the extremely low rate of threepence per mile per passenger. It is stated that he proposes, when he has put some more machines into service, to offer fares for the journey between London and Paris much below anything attempted up to the present. Mr. Hillman uses "Fox Moth" light aeroplanes and "Fox Moth" and his new machines are also being built by the de Havilland Company. They will be twin engine aircraft seating six people and it is hoped that they will combine the work of the "Fox Moth" in making air transport economical.

four passengers can be carried. The aircraft is completely covered under the pilot's feet and a rack in the after part of the cabin. An explanation of the steps that have been taken by the Tanganyika Government to reduce its recurrent expenditures is given in the memorandum which accompanied the draft estimates for 1933.

The total ordinary recurrent and special expenditure budget for 1933 is £1,701,016 as compared with an amount of £1,904,367 estimated for the year 1930-31, being a net decrease of £203,351.

The estimated general expenditure for 1933 (including Railways and allied services and Loan Expenditure) amounts to £1,712,523 as compared with £1,736,503 estimated for 1932-33, showing a net decrease of £23,981. The total expenditure for 1933 is made up as follows—

The Memorandum summarizes the reduction in expenditure which has taken place since the issue of the first economy circular.

In addition, it is estimated that approximately £160,000 will have been paid in increments between July, 1930, and July, 1933, so that the gross reduction in expenditure since 1930, taking into consideration reimbursements by Railways for departmental services (£29,340) which are now credited direct to revenue, is in the neighbourhood of £770,000.

Recurrent Expenditure.

The total recurrent expenditure (£1,696,020) including special expenditures of £4,967, is broken down as follows—

A general reduction in programme of work has been effected with a consequent decrease in expenditure under Other Charges.

Many posts have been suppressed or abolished and particularly all existing vacancies in European and non-European establishments continue to be left unfilled, promotions being made only when efficiency would be definitely impaired by leaving a post vacant. Such promotions are not made unless and until it has been firmly established that the duties of the vacant post cannot satisfactorily be performed by officers holding posts of a similar or higher grade, whether by prolongation of tours or by redistribution of work or by cessation of activities that in present circumstances can be regarded as non-essential. Practically all promotions in the African staff are in arrears, and the rate of pay has generally been revised.

Efficiency tests have been held in the case of all officers and their work has been reviewed.

Allowances

All acting allowances, except those payable to officers acting as Heads of Departments, Judges or Provincial Commissioners, and to Officers of the King's African Rifles, have been suspended.

Certain allowances paid in respect of special duties have either been suspended or reduced and the payment of outfit allowance has been abolished except in the case of Nursing Sisters and officers appointed to the King's African Rifles.

Courses of instruction involving the expenditure of public funds have been suspended except in the case of compulsory courses of instruction for medical officers.

All travelling allowances have been suspended, except those payable to Judges when acting as members of His Majesty's Court of Appeal for Eastern Africa. Commuted and field allowances have been similarly suspended. If an officer travelling on duty is compelled to stay at a club or hotel, a refund is made of necessary lodging expenses (not including the expenditure of meals) or a refund is made of necessary lodging expenses in lieu of a refund drawn by officers entitled to travelling allowance has been discontinued.

Minor Economies.

Other minor economies effected have been—
Officers proceeding on local leave may now receive free transport on the Railways and in Government steamers only, in all circumstances in travelling allowance paid.
In many cases European officers are now required to share their

cars and the additional housing allowances previously paid to non-Europeans in Dar es Salaam and certain other townships have been withdrawn.

Considerable reductions have been made in the scale of furniture allowed, and the issue of mosquito nets to officials has been discontinued. Expenditure on minor improvements to quarters has practically ceased, except at the expense of the officer desiring the improvement.

RABIES MENACE IN NYANZA.

Campaign Undertaken in Earnest.

[STANDARD CORRESPONDENT.]

CHITWAL, November 11.—We have had some very welcome showers which have helped the cane and the grass. Cane growers are hoping to reap about 25 per cent. of their crop if not eaten again by the locusts.

The rabies menace is being tackled in real earnest at last. It is a matter of regret that the steps now being taken were not adopted months ago. Poison bait in small quantities has been scattered throughout the district with very good results mostly amongst the native dogs and hyenas.

I am told that one settler almost to shoot the native dogs on his farm in preference to having them poisoned. The total bag numbered over 70. This will give some idea of the huge number of native dogs that had got to be dealt with by the Veterinary Department.

The District Officers are anxious to make every effort to keep the number of dogs down to a minimum, but I understand that the results are encouraging.

It is very difficult for a man to find work and if he is fortunate enough to get a job, he will probably be signed on at Shis a month with food, so it takes him three months to earn his but tax. We are all hoping that Kakamega will give a boost to native wages for black and white alike.

Kisumu, November 11.

COMPANY AND PARTNERSHIP REGISTRATIONS.

Kakamega Needs.

UP-COUNTRY OPPOSITION TO GRANTING OF SOLE CONCESSION

Considerable interest is being aroused by the formation of a number of companies and syndicates to work claims at the Kakamega gold fields. To date some four companies have been registered while others are pending. In addition a number of partnerships have been formed.

Suggestions are made by an up-country correspondent of the "East African Standard" as to ways in which conditions at Kakamega may be improved. The lack of telegraphic and telephonic facilities is felt, while the distance from the registration office to the Boma is a disadvantage that is being encountered.

At a meeting at Eldoret addressed by the Hon T. J. O'Shea, Elected Member for Plateau South, reference was made to the opportunities which the development of the goldfields held out to the township and it was emphasised that it was necessary for the people there to work together.

Eldoret Views.

To date, four syndicates have been registered to work claims in the Kakamega goldfields, and enquiries for registers are pending from four others and there have been four partnerships registered under the Business Names Ordinance. Letters of transport to and from the Kakamega gold fields are not issued until the future of Kakamega has been decided. It is a disadvantage that is being encountered.

There are the companies which have been registered to work claims in the Kakamega gold fields. The Kakamega Gold Fields Ltd. has a capital of Shs. 40,000 divided into 2,000 shares of Shs. 20 each. This is mainly a Nairobi concern. Eldoret Kakamega Mining Ventures Ltd., a public company, formed at Eldoret with a capital of Shs. 40,000 divided into 2,000 shares of Shs. 20 each. Valukoa Mining Co. Ltd. a public company based at Kitale, has a capital of Shs. 200,000, capital of 10,000 shares at Shs. 20 each. Kenya Gold Mining Syndicate, Ltd. known as the "Kagem" company in which the capital is £10,000 divided into £1 shares. Here the capital is invested by people in London and in Kenya. There has been registered a fifth company to operate in Tanganyika, but it also has the right to work in Kenya. This is the Ngori Gold Mines Ltd., with a capital of Shs. 150,000 divided into 7,500 shares of Shs. 20 each. Tanganyika Concessions, Ltd., one of the earliest companies to begin work, has yet to register in Kenya, so that to all intents and purposes there are five companies now in the field.

Inquiries as to registration are pending from four others, which will be known as the Kerkwa Ridge Mining Ltd., the Kenya Uganda Minerals Exploration Ltd., Lane Mining Co., Ltd., and Bokone Mining Co., Ltd. It is believed that within a short time several other and much larger companies will have been floated and registered.

Partnerships.

Under the business Names Ordinance several partnerships have been registered. Among these are Pakamezi Syndicate, Egozi Syndicate, Kakamega Mining Syndicate, and the Forest Syndicate. Some of these contain a number of partners; one has six partners interested in it.

As far as Nairobi is concerned it is known that several groups of people with limited capital have been formed privately. The directors of each group are pooled, and a man is sent up
