Councillor Mortimer, however, argued that the Council was taking steps by permitting these advertisements, and if the amendment were carried he would do his utmost to get the Council not to agree to the scheme at all. The advertisement of an intoxicating liquor was to cost £100 a year, and the advertisers would expect something for their money, so that such an advertisement would influence the public to purchase. Who is it you want to drink more?" asked Councillor Mortimer. Was it the Council's staff Government servants the Railway staff? The heads of these staffs would not want their employers to drink more, neither would his honours like their boys and girls leaving school to start work to begin drinking. Why offer inducements to them? It was contended to have such a sign on top of a building where they could not allow the sale of drink? "O God, Creator and Preserver of all mankind, Ruler of the World, Who has entrusted to the Governments of Great Britain and Commonwealth the care of many peoples in distant lands, grant we beseech Thee that the members of our widespread Empire may ever be bound together in mutual love and unity under our Sovereign Lord the King. Give to those who have the responsibility of Government Wisdom, Patience, and Courage, and grant that at this time the guidance of Thy Holy Spirit may be with them in their deliberations, so that all that is now said and done shall be for the good of our Nation, for the welfare of mankind and the reputation of Thy Kingdom throughout the World."

[This is the prayer offered by Sir Hon. Stanley Baldwin to the Government of the (I.C.A.S. Conference)]

The Kingdom System will be written, not selfish rivalry. Service before self will be the guiding principle of the New World Market. The merchants of the earth will compete one with another for the honour and glory of bringing the representation of abundance into it.

We have a long way to go yet before the full establishment of this new and better system. But Christ was the turning-point and the crisis of our fate in this great revolution.

It is not surprising then to find the Hon. Stanley Baldwin (who interprets better than any living Englishman the sentiments of all sincere British people) feel, among the Ottawa Empire, not built up as a trade agreement nor one to be maintained solely by tariffs and duties, but a new economic system, the ultimate goal of the Empire, the whole British Empire.

That is a challenging assertion but not one challenging what is supported by the grand and prophetic outlines revealed in Holy Writ.

Finally, the realization of the new meaning and significance of the title *Christus Britanicae Sumus* (I am a British citizen), should lead us to consider our duty as citizens of God's Kingdom on Earth. If we are citizens of the Kingdom we are citizens of no mean city. And as we watch the destruction of the World, City encompassing the world, site, let us strive to become worthy builders of the new and better city—the City of God, which is to occupy this site to the glory of God and the joyous welfare of all humanity.

Indeed the purpose of the present economic tribulation is to create the *Economic Life of the World to the glory of God*. If we seek after a living wage and a higher standard of life for all, here can we better attain it than by returning to the Everliving God? For by seeking a spiritual adjustment to His law for all, here can we better bring our lives into harmony with His will for the happiness of all mankind.

As a Race we are being brought to the point where we must take the oath of allegiance: *In Truth for Justice and Right*. This must be *British Race* throughout the world, and must inspire all our activities and all our thoughts. Nationally as well as individually, we must learn to consider all selfish aims.

So shall we cause the nations to bless God and praise His name. He returns upon our heads so shall our living conditions improve according to the standard of abundance and the everliving providence of Almighty God. For who can better improve our living conditions or

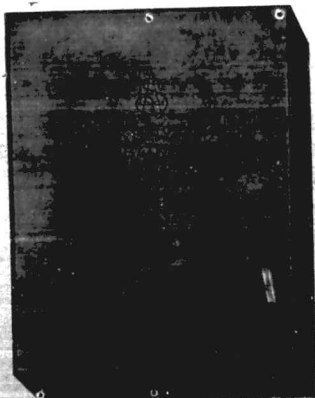

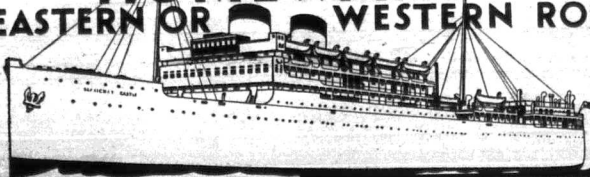

## RIFLE SHOOTING.

### CONDITIONS FOR "BYRNE" CUP.

#### Date of Commencement.

The following are the conditions for the "Byrne" Cup, presented to the Kenya Rifle Association by His Excellency Sir Joseph Byrne, for annual competition.

The cup is a service rifle class B competition, single entries, and open to individual members of the Kenya Rifle Association or licensed club members of the Association. The competition shall commence with the first club or K.R.A. shoot after the conclusion of the Inter-Territorial shoot for the Manning Cup and shall conclude on the 1st day of June in the following year. For the 1932-1933 shoot the date of commencement shall be November 19, 1932. All shoots shall be held on the approved range for club or K.R.A. competitions. Shoots on private or unauthorised ranges shall not be allowed. Distances: 200, 300, 500 and 600 yards.

All competitors must state their classification at the time of entry and on every score card submitted. Competitors are defined as follows:—A Class T. (Tyro) competitor is a competitor who has never won a prize in money or kind in an individual squadded competition at a K.R.A. meeting, the National Rifle Association Meeting, Royal, English, or a Dominion or State Rifle Meeting. A Class M. (Medium) competitor who has not won a prize in money or kind in the Class X. (Expert) Class or played First in the Class M. (Medium) class during the past two years in an individual squadded competition as defined under Class T.

A Class X. (Expert) competitor is one who has won a prize in money or kind in a squadded competition. The individual competitors under the auspices of the Kenya Rifle Association referred to are the Championship, the First of the East African Standard Cup and the Service Men's Cup. Therefore under the above conditions an expert is a competitor who has been placed in the First of the Championship, the First of the East African Standard Cup and the First of the Service Men's Cup or has been placed First in the Class M. of these competitions during the past two years.

**Number of Rounds.** One sighter and seven runs to count at each distance, except where the conditions of any club or inter-club competition provide for two sighters, these shall be allowed. Where the conditions of the club or K.R.A. competition provide for 10 shots per distance the first seven only shall be allowed to count.

The number of shots to count at each distance shall be Class T. (Tyro), The best 2 at each distance; Class M. (Medium), The best 4 at each distance; Class X. (Expert), The best 8 at each distance. For the 1932-1933 competition the number of shots to count at each distance shall be: Class X. (Expert) 4 shots; Class M. (Medium) 3 shots; Class T. (Tyro) 2 shots.

Competitors may fire not more than two shots at the same distance on any one day. A third or subsequent shot shall not be allowed to count for this competition. Sighters, Open or sporting; Slings may be used. Coaching: Allowed unless prohibited by the rules of any club or K.R.A. competition.

#### Entries.

Competitors must submit their entry through their club Secretary as soon as possible after the date of commencement of the competition. In no circumstances will entries be accepted after February 1, in the year in which the competition closes.

It shall be the sole responsibility of the competitor to submit scores

to the Honorary Secretary of his club who shall transmit them so as to reach the Honorary Secretary of the K.R.A. on or before the following dates:—19th October, 19th January, 19th April and 19th June. All scores submitted must be signed and dated by the regular keeper and the range officer. For this purpose a supply of score cards will be issued by the Kenya Rifle Association to all Club Secretaries who shall issue them to competitors, any alterations to the score unless signed by the Range keeper and Range Officer will disqualify the whole score made at that distance.

The winner shall be the competitor whose combined average range totals at each distance makes the highest total. In the event of a tie or ties such tie or ties shall be counted out as follows:—(1) By the average range totals in order of distance, commencing with the longest (i.e. 600 yards). (2) If still a tie, by the value of each shot in order commencing with the last (3) If still a tie, it shall be decided by the fiat of the Council of the Kenya Rifle Association.

The entrance fee is Shs. 2/50, and the winner will hold the Byrne Cup for one year, and a replica value Shs. 40/-. Additional prizes may be awarded according to the number of entries.

port on his financial mission to Tanganyika, made in the published message published yesterday in order to cause surprise and a sense of uneasiness. Vague and unsatisfying as the message is, there is no doubt that the Report does deal with the Customs agreement at present in force in East Africa and the task of reconsideration of the existing arrangement is necessarily disturbing, especially when the reference is amplified by the suggestion that the scheme is operating to the prejudice of Tanganyika. Ever since the inception of the Association of Chambers of Commerce of East Africa in 1920 there has been at each half-yearly session of the organization at least one resolution framed with a view to furthering the promotion of a closer economic union between the three mainland territories. Progress, in spite of visiting commissions and local committees, was slow in the extreme, even though on all sides economists admit that the tendency in world affairs to-day is towards the grouping of territories into larger economic units. Within the last few weeks publication of the minutes of the Ottawa Conference indicates quite clearly how that ideal influenced the discussions and decisions arrived at in Canada. In East Africa, the only practical steps that have been taken are the establishment of a joint customs tariff for Kenya, Uganda and Tanganyika and the Conference of Officers and Technical advisers, excluding of course the joint Customs, Postal and Railway services enjoyed by Kenya and Uganda over a much longer period. The question of closer economic union came up in clear focus at the last session of the Associated Chambers when the minutes of the discussion which centred round the advisability of revising the Congo Basin Treaties in the Tanganyika Mandate it was agreed that to integrate a common system, but any steps should be taken which might result in loosening the present trading bonds between Kenya and Uganda, on the one hand, and Tanganyika on the other. It is somewhat difficult in view of the above statement in the earlier message to discuss the subject confidently, as the use of the word "reconsideration" may mean nothing more than that the arrangement between the territories for a home market in their grown produce should be reconsidered in the light of developments since the arrangement was first entered into. Such a reconsideration of course would be reasonable, but until the full report is available for study, there is bound to be an element of nervousness amongst the commercial community. Last night is any proposal which might result in a loosening of inter-territorial trade relations and, indeed, the re-creation of tariff barriers or other obstacles to free trade in East Africa which it had been hoped, were abolished once and for all. It may be that the recommendation is inspired by the seeming failure of the existing system of indirect taxation to supply the revenue needs of the countries as it did formerly. But if this is so, it would seem rather like putting the cart before the horse to deal with it, after all, only one minor point is being questioned, namely that of the balance of taxation. There is no doubt that the various Chambers of Commerce in East Africa will take an early opportunity of considering the question in the light of further details which the full report will supply.

visit to Tanganyika in the capacity of Financial Adviser to the Government of the Mandated Territory do not make the full text available. What no doubt the full text contains arguments leading up to the conclusions quoted, the latter are so extraordinary and some of them are so damaging as to warrant immediate repudiation. It is apparent that we have here another instance of an expert who, after a few weeks' stay in a country, with which he had no previous personal acquaintance, considered himself qualified to indulge in sweeping condemnations and to make recommendations which are bound to prove, not only unacceptable to many of the people living in the country, but in some instances impracticable and even prejudicial to the best interests of those they are primarily intended to benefit. The first paragraph of the summary published to-day suggests that the enquirer began his task with an incomplete knowledge of the terms of the Mandate which he quotes. He refers to that instrument as giving "precedence to the needs and aspirations, actual and potential of the native inhabitants" whereas actually the Mandate speaks of inhabitants without the word qualification. It is a very important distinction. The summary does not indicate whether or not the Report contains any reference to the benefits derived by the native population from contact with white settlers, in view of the whole tenor of the extracts and especially of the last paragraph it seems reasonable to infer that the investigator has either ignored or been immediately aware of the fact that what is known as the Dual Policy is meant to apply in Tanganyika as in Kenya. With the present need for severe economy there will be general agreement and if the financial situation is such as to require recourse to systems of revenue and expenditure without attempting to lay down a political programme for Tanganyika, his comments would have been more successful than it is likely to prove if there was any effort made to implement the whole of the Report. The concluding paragraph which is quoted here for a formal repudiation of the theory that the proper destiny of East Africa is to provide a sanctuary where the unscrupulous capitalist is privileged to exploit the resources of the land without being required to pay income Tax, super tax or death duties, is bound to cause offence. It can only be contrasted as a cynic's attack on what settlement since quite clearly it suggests that settlers in East Africa have an entirely selfish and prejudiced outlook on the question of taxation. That of course is very far from being the case; and to assume that they are governed by such considerations is gravely to malign people who may quite legitimately hold that forms of taxation applied successively in other parts of the Empire are not necessarily suited to the entirely different conditions obtaining in new countries where the prevailing is the initial stages of development. It is to be regretted that such reports are presented without the investigator expressing his criticisms in the light of local experience. Such documents would have a greater practical value if their compilers followed the legal practice in East Africa where in certain cases a technical staff, namely the Judge, has the benefit of the advice of the local lawyer. The views referred to by the white population are very ill-advised. After all, people who have spent many years in African territories, most of the calibre of Lord Lugard and the late Sir Robert Coryndon, were convinced that European and native development could proceed advantageously side by side and experience has shown that such development has been of even greater mutual benefit as that was anticipated when the Dual Policy was first initiated. Without in any way wishing to challenge the late Sir Sydney Arncliffe-Scott's honesty of purpose, it is to be feared that he was another unhappy example of a Treasury official who had never come into contact with the hard facts of practical politics and who wished to put into practice theories which are entirely out of touch with conditions as they exist in this part of the Empire.

Abyssinian Raiders Enter Kenya.

SLAUGHTER OF FRONTIER TRIBESMEN.

Theft of Livestock.

OFFICIAL REPRESENTATION TO ADDIS ABABA.

According to a statement made in the House of Commons by the Secretary of State for the Colonies, Abyssinian raiders recently crossed the frontier of Kenya Colony and penetrated 70 miles into the country. A large number of tribesmen were murdered during the course of the raid while a considerable amount of cattle was stolen.

Troops Despatched.

In the House of Commons today, Sir Philip Cunliffe-Lister, Secretary for the Colonies, related a story of Abyssinian marauders into Kenya, when 94 tribesmen, including women and children were slaughtered by raiders who stole 7,000 cattle. The raiders afterwards penetrated into Kenya territory for 70 miles, murdering 25 tribesmen and stealing livestock. The tribesmen were armed only with spears, while the raiders were equipped with rifles.

The Kenya Government sent troops to the scene of the raid and the British Government at Addis Ababa obtained an audience with the Emperor, who asked the British authorities to deal with the raiders.

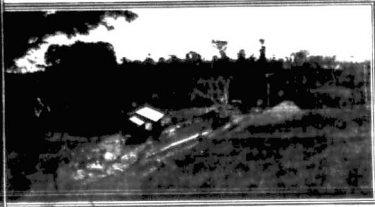
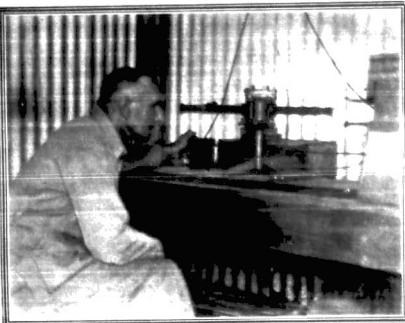

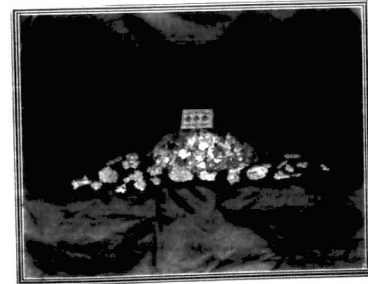

# COTTON SEED AND OIL CAKES AS MANURES.

### THE NITROGEN SUPPLY IN THE SOIL

#### Artificial Fertilizers.

The following article on soil and oil cakes as manures has been prepared by the Senior Agricultural Chemist of the Kenya Department of Agriculture.

One of the factors limiting the production of cereal crops is the nitrogen supply. Artificial and other rapidly available nitrogenous manures are not uncommon in use. They are rapidly converted into nitrate which during the rains are readily leached from the soil or lost from the feeding system of cereals. It has been found during some experiments at the Kenya Agricultural Laboratories on typical unmanured maize that as much as 30 lbs. of nitrate nitrogen are leached from an acre of soil during the rains. This is the equivalent of 100 lbs. of nitrate of ammonia per acre. Also it has been found that in ten weeks all the nitrate nitrogen present in the soil is washed out by the rain. It is therefore essential to dress the soil with a fertilizer which is slowly available and which is not so readily leached. One of the best of these is cotton seed cake. It contains 10 per cent of nitrogen and 15 per cent of phosphorus. It is also a good source of potash. It is a very valuable fertilizer for cereals and other crops. Fighting with the Masai.

Further evidence regarding the early days in the Kikuyu country is given before the Land Commission sitting in Nairobi. Following the evidence of Mr. John Bayes on Monday, Mr. J. J. Watcham and Mr. Henry Taitton both recalled the situation when 1800 came to the country.

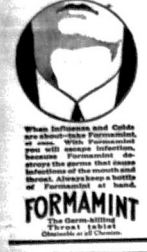

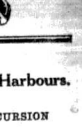
