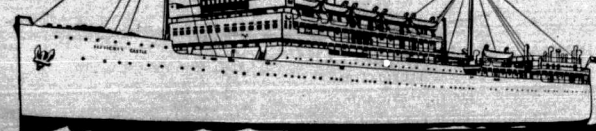

American Bankers' Advice to Government.

GRANT OF MORATORIUM RECOMMENDED.

Further Discussions.

SIGNIFICANT MOVE BY U.S. DELEGATE AT GENÈVA.

It is stated from New York that American bankers have advised the U.S. Government to consent to a moratorium for war debt payments due from Britain and France, despite the hostile attitude of Congress.

Efforts to Avoid Crisis.

According to other statements, American administration is considering the possibility of facilitating British payments by other means than by direct cash advances, and efforts are still continuing to avoid the threatened crisis on December 15.

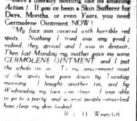

To the Pakaneusi Syndicate, Nairobi.

Dear Sirs,

The Pakaneusi Syndicate is promoting a Company to prospect and develop 168 claims and an Alluvial Concession within the Kakamega goldfields.

The ground held by the company includes 168 claims in eight distinct blocks covering 3000 acres. On each block earth searching has proved the probability to be sufficient. The only logical conclusion that can be drawn from this is that the values have been ascertained from gold bearing rock.

The risk in prospecting ground such as this is that the gold may have been derived only from the stragglers. While these are plentiful on the Kakamega goldfields, the odds are probably that eight blocks totaling 168 claims should contain nothing but unpayable stragglers.

Interruption comes and quartz reefs as narrow as a foot bearing only ten pennyweight may possibly prove profitable mining propositions. This seems very little to ask of a field in which the talk is of nothing but ounces to the ton.

The streams draining these areas contain a profusion of quartz that which is often gold bearing. There can be no doubt that the quartz as derived from veins intersecting the drainage areas are extremely rich.

To particularise, in the Western form block of two claims quartz boulders up to 6" in diameter have been shown by reliable assays to run as high as 6 oz. contained in a ton. While the assays of individual boulders may vary, for example the vein from which they were derived the presence of such boulders is proof that at least one surface vein as wide as 6' exists in the vicinity.

ANTICIPATED DEFICIT AT END OF YEAR.

Speech at Nakuru.

DIFFICULT TASK, FACING ECONOMY COMMITTEE.

Lord Francis Scott, the Leader of the House of Lords in the Kenya Legislative Council, was the chief speaker at the annual dinner on Wednesday last of the Caledonian Societies at Nakuru. He was the toast of the Land West Coast.

His speech was in the nature of a political and financial review of the past year, during which he warned his hearers that there was likely to be a deficit at the end of 1932 of about £200,000. It was pointed out that there would be no cash reserves left and nothing realizable in surplus balances.

After reference to the work of the Expenditure Advisory Committee, he said that if a deficit could be avoided in 1933, he felt that the country could hope that 1934 would show signs of improvement.

Lord Francis Scott appealed to everyone in the Colony to help, during this period of stress, in order to economize in Government services, and not make the situation more difficult by asking for all the services to which the country had become accustomed. He regretted the criticism of the Government in the Police Force.

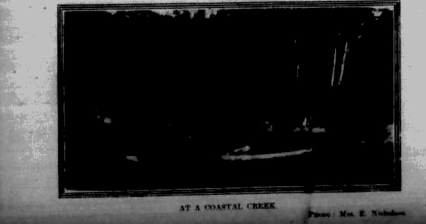

JAPANESE DUMPING

Questions in the House of Commons.

Stockport) when he asked that five-sevenths of the cotton goods imported into Kenya for the nine months from January 1 were from Japan.

The Secretary of State for the Colonies, Sir Philip Cunliffe-Laker, said that the question was being carefully considered. The only Colonies where Imperial preference was operating under active consideration were East Africa and West Africa, which were based on amount of Treaty obligations.

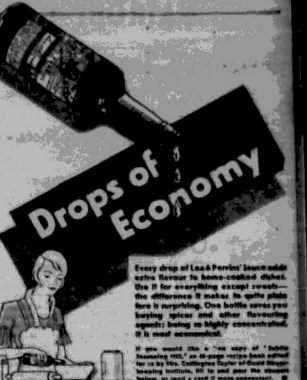

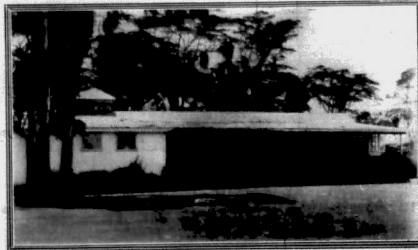

I believe that my last article on the lungs of a dog was all about pneumonia of the thorax giving the "wheezing" and the "cough" for this operation.

Now for those who are most interested I am about to write on accumulation of the lungs and even an emphysema with plenty of practice and the careful observation of the various sounds can learn quite a bit, and by listening to the breathing with the animal standing, the animal at the side of the cage, or by lying down, either by putting the ear directly against the walls of the chest, or by using a stethoscope.

The first method is best especially with restless animals, and is sufficient under ordinary conditions. On the other hand a stethoscope is almost invaluable in all cases of determining, or judging more accurately, very weak sounds, and especially those restricted to small areas.

In listening to the lungs of long-haired, or wiry coated dogs, it is very easy to become misled by the crackling of hair itself; to avoid this danger the coat should be just moistened with oil.

By producing irritation that will cause a cough the doubtful cases can be better diagnosed, and the respiratory rate thus increased, and under certain conditions by inducing the appearance of wet sounds.

The ear distinguishes the respiratory sounds and the accessory sounds. In the former we hear a vesicular respiratory hiss, which has a lapping character, and the bronchial respiratory hiss, and lastly, an indistinct respiratory hiss, which has neither a pronounced crackling character nor a pronounced blowing character. The vesicular respiratory hiss is heard wherever any portion of the lung that is filled with air lies against the wall of the chest. Normally the sound is a smooth, regular murmur only audible in large animals and proves the air going directly into the alveoli without resistance.

"Listen in" to your healthy dogs until you get the above sounds established in your ears. These healthy sounds vary greatly in intensity; sound can be increased very much even during health by active movement or excitement; it thus changes and louder in very thin animals, also in dogs such

as grey-hounds who are very thin.

According to the amount of irritation present, the vesicular murmur is hoarse, loud, or is bronchial snarl, where it is more swelling of the mucous membrane and secretions collected, in stasis (throwing or obstructing) of the tubes. The vesicular murmur disappears entirely in the case of one of the large bronchial tubes, and in complete obstruction of parts of the bronchus caused by pneumonia.

The vesicular murmur is increased in dyspnea (difficulty in breathing) in the healthy portions of diseased lungs, the healthy portions being called on to do all the work.

I have tried very hard to write the above description clearly, but it is more or less understood, so I do hope I have succeeded, but very weak sounds, and especially those restricted to small areas, require a hearing sound may be heard in the normal respiratory hiss, and in the latter part of the chest in diseased conditions where any part of the lung is deprived of air, and where the disease has spread up the smaller bronchi and extended to the larger bronchi, and where a quantity of mucus is coming up into the trachea, and disappears when the mucus is coughed up.

Lastly, we find it where to use it, and in cases of severe dyspnea of anterior air-passages, I have been told by a doctor that it takes three years' hard work and practice to learn the use of the stethoscope. I should also say that it moreover needed an acute ear and stout memory to remember and distinguish between the various sounds.

Through a stethoscope, a layman gets comparatively little chance of listening to the various respiratory diseases, but what we can do, is to get a healthy respiratory sound, and learn the sounds so well and thoroughly, that any varying sound, or lack of sound we know, is instantly called for notice.

My dog likes to suffer through examination of throat, chest, and lungs, nearly every night. They come back upon the same way, and will even on their backs in readiness. I only hope every suggestive measure will not cause disease. I hardly think it in such normal methods, as our canine pals invariably possess.

I thank Mrs. Bidley very much for her letter and enclosure. I am sure she will find the processes beneficial—the dogs ought to get two courses each. Also I should advise a bath of Kier-magnesium soap as I described in my last article, and raw places with Talcum or Benzoin powder. I should very much like to hear how the dogs are in a month's time. Exercise are usually slow, and after the skin is healed, it takes a long time for the coat to grow properly again. The growth of hair can be greatly encouraged by rubbing with warm salted oil and salicylic acid—this is a good method of aid—It may help in the dressing before application. It should be rubbed in daily for a week. The use of the "kennels" will be of great value in such cases. It should be used for a week, but it should not be used on an ill dog.

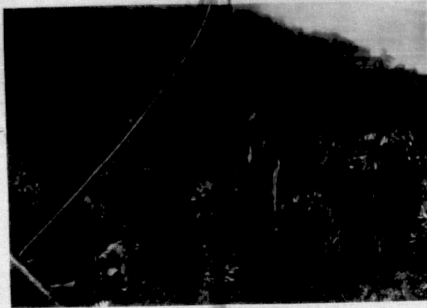

It is obvious that if the railways continue to be administered on the present basis, the deficit will cripple the Territory for an indefinite period, and it is necessary to take steps for their development.

Cause of Deficit. The principal categories of losses carried by rail to the coast have hitherto been copper (from Katanga), steel, and cement. In addition, coal and cotton goods, grain, salt, and sugar, while the principal exports have been copper, steel, and cement. 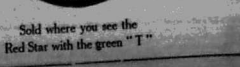

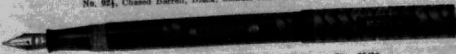
