The Microscope Again in Use.

Kenya's Tennis Championships.

Bruder and Mrs. Davies as Probable Winners and Finest.

"Hacquet." The Mixed Doubles event is likely to be the "prize de resistance" of the tournament, as it is, as it does, a galaxy of talent, and the mention of the names of a few of the entrants will amply bear out this assertion.

The present holders of the title are Owen and Miss Fletcher, but the former being on leave, Miss Fletcher is this year partnered by Dunlop. Although Dunlop has already won both the Singles and Men's Doubles Championships, he has never yet succeeded in being a joint holder of the Mixed Doubles title, and will, naturally, be all out to add this further title to his bag.

The only couple amongst this year's entrants who have won the title as a team is the pair of Mrs. Hayward, but there are a number of joint ex-holders or runners-up who are playing with different partners on this occasion. R. D. England and Mrs. Pines, who are playing together, have been joint holders in different years. Mrs. Pines and Finest have both been runners-up in this event. In addition, Bruder, J. England, Harrison, Mrs. Lobbinger, Mrs. Master, Miss Keeling and Mrs. Kirk have also been winners or runners-up in other events. It is obvious, therefore, that the stakes in this event will be of a high order.

In the Mixed Doubles there are not so many unknown quantities as in the Men's Doubles, most of these competing being fairly well known to the Nairobi public.

The Last Night. The last night should be R. D. England and Mrs. Pines, Harrison and Mrs. Fowler, Hayward and Mrs. Hayward, Pines and Mrs. Roberts, J. England and Mrs. Keeling, Bruder and Mrs. Davies, Bolt and Mrs. Kirk, Dunlop and Miss Fletcher.

The most doubtful of these are Harrison and Mrs. Fowler, who may not be able to surmount the Russell and Mrs. Russell obstacles, and Mrs. Lobbinger, who are given the verdict over Davis and Mrs. Pines, and Bolt and Mrs. Kirk.

With regard to the last named couple, as it was suggested that the couple of Bolt in the Men's Doubles, it is worth mentioning that he is partially, please Bolt and Mrs. Kirk in the last night in preference to Allen and Miss Strachan.

Semi-Finalists. The last four should be England and Mrs. Pines, Hayward and Mrs. Hayward, Bruder and Mrs. Davies, and Dunlop and Mrs. Fletcher. Both can keep the ball in play until the other has had time to get their feet under them. Mrs. Pines' Fletcher is better at the net, Mrs. Hayward is a better server. Bruder is particularly good at the net. Dunlop, and has recently been serving well lately, and has developed a habit of double faulting. This tendency may be corrected when the time comes, but after watching the press and seeing the writer is inclined to give Bruder and Mrs. Davies to the first against Hayward and Mrs. Hayward.

Whatever the result of this match might be for the time being, it is any of the four suggested semi-finalists appear to be well equipped to provide a fitting and thrilling finish to an event that will be full of interest throughout.

revising study of superstitious military technique.

Strain on Allies.

Hindenburg at this time was commanding Germany's armies in the East, and early in August, 1914, the Russian commander, Samsonov, through the Lake District of East Prussia with 200,000 men in an endeavour to ease the strain which was being placed on the Allies by the German forces on the Western Front.

Samsonov spread consternation in Prussia, but was lured into the Mianster Lakes, where Hindenburg, practically destroyed the Russian forces, taking 80,000 prisoners and hundreds of guns.

Plans Well Laid.

Hindenburg had his plans with military skill. He had a force of 100,000 men, and he used to protect him from the lakes and the forest, which he stationed his artillery in a clear field of fire. Between the lakes he dug trenches and dug in his troops, and he used the railway and motor system behind him to carry out an evolving movement.

Moral Effect.

Tomburg was Hindenburg's victory, the result of his individual military genius. It had an immediate moral effect on the German army, a demoralizing influence on the Russian forces and had a demoralizing effect on the hard-pressed Allies on the Western Front.

In addition, it provided proof of the fact that despite the modernization of warfare which marked the opening of the war in 1914, it was still possible for a commander, by his own military genius to secure a victory over a more powerful army.

Hindenburg Dies

The old Field-Marshal was later appointed Commander-in-Chief of Germany.

Legislative Council Business.

Eight Bills Disposed of on Tuesday.

VEHICLE LICENCES.
Establishment of District Education Boards.

At Tuesday's sitting of the Kenya Legislative Council eight of the remaining Bills passed and one was sent to a select committee.

The first took the form of amendments to the C.A.R. Ordinance inspired by the Secretary of State. Of these, the most important was the deletion of the phrase "minimum punishment," leaving it to the discretion of the court to decide the suitable punishment in cases of offences.

The amending bill to the Traffic Ordinance was sent to a select committee comprising the Commissioner for Local Government, as chairman; Treasurer; the Director of Public Works; the Hon. A. C. Tannahill (Nairobi South); and the Hon. N. S. Mwangi. In this measure, the principal changes proposed were with respect to the licensing of carts and vehicles with a tyre width of less than four inches.

As explained by the Commissioner for Local Government at an annually increasing license was imposed in order to keep such vehicles off the road, thus preventing surface damage. It had the result that Native users of the carts had not been able to pay the tax and had withdrawn them from use. It was therefore decided to revert to the 1932 scale and to consolidate them for the future.

Cart Licences.
Another amendment was to permit of the license for carts and vehicles other than motor-cars being paid annually instead of quarterly or half yearly, thus making for easier collection. Other clauses were described as safety measures. They include the restriction of pillion riding to one person on a proper seat securely fixed; and were followed by an announcement on a proposal of some time ago that third party insurance on motor vehicle owners be made compulsory.

The matter, said the Commissioner, had been referred to various bodies for their opinion, which was that while the principle was one of importance, the scheme would be far too expensive for legislation along those lines to be introduced at present. The sum mentioned in the cost to owners was £27,000.

Arising out of a recent court decision at Mombasa he continued, an amendment would be suggested to enable a person who lived a taxi and wanted to drive it himself, to be free of the regulations that applied to taxi drivers.

Mr. Harvey strongly objected to the withdrawal of the quarterly and half-yearly licensing for vehicles other than motor-cars, on the ground that many of these were used by farmers at only one period of the year—

when their crops were ready for transport.

Inequitable Measure.
For that period they took a quarter's license; during the rest of the year the vehicles were laid up. He described the proposal as an attempt to make the unfortunate farmers, and was astonished that Kenya Government should perpetrate such a measure of injustice.

He also commented upon a contradiction that existed in the principal Ordinance and the rules. In one, he said, it was stipulated that the tablet indicating that the vehicle was licensed should be displayed on the right side; the other provided that the tablet should be on the left side!

The Hon. Shama-ud-Dewan wondered whether the date of the new licensing rates could not be advanced. Major the Hon. F. W. Cavendish-Bentinck (Nairobi North), supported Mr. Harvey.

The Hon. A. C. Tannahill (Nairobi South) suggested that weekly or fortnightly licenses be made available for trailers, which were seldom used, and warranted an annual license.

The Commissioner readily agreed that the various points raised be considered by the committee to which, after a second reading, the bill was sent.

An amending bill to the Asiatic Widows' and Orphans' Pension Ordinance of 1927 was said to be the outcome of the fusion of the Kenya and Tanganyika Postal and Telegraphic services, enabling Asian officers of the latter to become contributors—a provision that will become compulsory on future entrants.

Bank Returns.
To obviate the banks having to render two sets of returns as provided under the old 1926 Companies Ordinance, now repealed, and the new one, an amendment was made to the Bank Ordinance so that only one return will be necessary in future.

In 1922 Mr. H. Blackwell was appointed an E.P.C. of the Kenya Police Force. He was re-elected in 1932, and almost immediately afterwards he was appointed to Government service in Uganda. This was treated as a transfer, his Kenya service counting. A bill was introduced to permit him to reserve his option for a gratuity and reduced pension until the time of his ultimate retirement.

The next two bills, amending the Land and Agricultural Bank Ordinance and the Agricultural Advances Ordinance, appointed the Bank as agent for the administration of the agricultural advances scheme, and not the Bank Board; and gave the Bank wider powers in the methods to be adopted for ascertaining monies already due to the Central Agricultural Advances Bank.

One of these methods was the resale by the Bank of the property of crops and so on as fresh advances.

The Hon. J. B. Paisley was doubtful about the soundness of this proposal, believing it would

lead to the writing-off of many debts.

Keeping Farmer on Land.
On the other hand, Mr. Harvey looked on it as an essential means of saving the commercial community to Government for making two amendments to the Regulations of Business Ordinance of 1933.

One of these reduced the cost to an applicant for the registration of a design by dispensing with the requirement that two representations of designs, and the certificate of the Comptroller-General of the United Kingdom.

The other will enable the Registrar to correct any error in an application, and not only a clerical error.

A bill introduced by the Director of Education as of some importance, was the making proper provision for the establishment of District Education Boards in the Colony.

It named he said, as bringing the African through the Local Native Councils into much closer touch with the administration of education by replacing the existing School Management Committees, which were purely advisory with these Boards, which had extensive powers.

Votes Out of Own Funds.

NATIVE CANTEENS.

Resolution Passed by Municipal Council.

It was agreed at Tuesday's meeting of Nairobi Municipal Council that a meeting of native canteens, passed by the Native Affairs Committee, be adopted. The resolution was as follows:

That the cook-houses and dining rooms provided at the Quary Road Housing be now opened and controlled by the Council as a canteen for the use of the native road gangs, as an experiment, for a period of six months; that members of the road gangs be given the option of purchasing their rations from the canteen; that the whole native staff be given consolidated wages equivalent to the existing rates of pay, plus the cost of the present rates of rations; that any member of the native staff be permitted to purchase food at the canteen and if it is necessary to supply food on credit, the amount of each purchaser be entered upon the purchaser's labour card; that the supervision of the issue of cooked food to the native staff be placed in the hands of the Municipal Labour Superintendent.

PEDAL CYCLES.

Municipal Council Discuss Regulations.

Recently a letter was read at the General Purposes Committee of the Nairobi Municipal Council, from the Superintendent of Police, drawing attention to the danger of pillion riding on pedal cycles, and also to the desirability of disallowing the practice of pedal cyclists carrying an electric torch in their hands, instead of a light properly fixed to the cycle.

It was pointed out by the Commissioner, however, that under the Local Government (Municipalities) Ordinance, the Council had no power to prohibit pillion riding, but that the matter of lamps on pedal cycles, could be dealt with by amending a by-law.

It was then decided that the draft amendments be approved, and that Government be asked to insert a clause in the proposed amendment to the Traffic Ordinance prohibiting pillion riding on pedal cycles. The Council approved of this action at its meeting on Tuesday.

How Europe Was Plunged into War.

BRITAIN'S ELEVENTH HOUR EFFORTS FOR PEACE.

Nairobi in August, 1914.

STIRRING PROCLAMATIONS OF THE STATE OF EMERGENCY.

Twenty years ago today Europe was on the brink of the catastrophic war which in two decades has brought such grief and misery in its train.

Mr. Edward Grey, British Foreign Secretary, had just made his historic speech in the House pledging Britain to uphold Belgian neutrality and guaranteeing the defence of the northern French coast.

An ultimatum had been sent to Germany asking for an assurance that Belgium's neutrality would be respected. Germany refused and Britain, which had been trying to save the situation by diplomatic means and had proposed an international conference for the purpose, was brought down into the war.

British East Africa, as Kenya then was, had its own share of the world excitement and something of the atmosphere is conveyed in the Proclamations of the early days of August 1914 reprinted below.

Protecting the Railway.

The French mobilisation is complete.

GERMANY'S TRIBUTE.

(Continued from page 1.)

Striking Coincidences.

Two striking coincidences are connected with the death of the President, which occurred on the twentieth anniversary of the outbreak of the Great War, when President Von Hindenburg was precisely the same age as his father, namely eighty-six and three-quarters.

Nazi-Gauleiter is still barred to everybody and a detachment of Reichswahr has been stationed round it. The police fiercely bar anyone attempting to approach it, threatening punishment with arrest.

No information has hitherto been given out regarding the President's final hours and last words. Within a few minutes of his death telegraph and telephone lines were completely blocked by official messages. Fast cars bore official work.

Funeral Arrangements.

Berlin, August 2. It is believed that the official funeral ceremony will be held at will afterwards be buried with a simple ceremony at Godesburg in accordance with the President's wish.

Orders have been issued for fortnight's general mourning and for Protestant and Catholic churches to ring their bells for an hour daily between eight and nine o'clock. All public entertainments and restaurant music have been forbidden until the day of the funeral. In one minute's silence will be in accordance with the national mourning.

Placards on August 19.

A placard on the new law appointing Herr Hitler Reich leader and Chancellor will be held on August 19. Out of respect to President Von Hindenburg the Stock Exchange was closed today and will be closed again to-morrow. All horse racing has been cancelled for the present. The Minister of War has issued a proclamation to the army ordering them to take the oath of allegiance to him.

Not Assuming Title of President.

Herr Hitler is not assuming the title of Reichs President, and

wishes to be known as Leader and Chancellor, as heretofore.

The reason for this decision is made clear in a letter he has written to Dr. Wilhelm Frick, Minister of the Interior, in which he says the greatest of the departed President has given the title of Reichs President a unique meaning. "It is, he states, indisputably connected with President Von Hindenburg."

Herr Hitler has requested Dr. Frick to make arrangements for a free, secret placard, stating that he wishes the functions of Reichs President, entrusted to him by the Cabinet in accordance with the constitution, to receive the same form of the German people.

Nation Learns of Death.

All broadcast programmes were suddenly stopped at 9.35 a.m., when all stations switched over to Berlin. After an interval Dr. Josef Goebbels, Minister of Propaganda, announced to the nation the death of the President. Halt on hour's silence followed, then Dr. Goebbels announced the new laws and details of the State funeral and mourning, after which an orchestra played the famous military song, "I Had a Comrade."

In the course of his broadcast Dr. Goebbels said it behooves President Von Hindenburg on behalf of his Cabinet colleagues, adding that the President was a man whose whole life, because of his honour and integrity, would always be remembered by his Fatherland.

Oath of Allegiance.

General Von Blomberg, Minister of Defence, has ordered the army and navy to take the oath of allegiance to Herr Hitler, while Herr Lott, in a manifesto to the Storm Troops, extols President Von Hindenburg.

All newspapers appear with black borders and glowing tributes are paid to the late President. All flags on public buildings, as well as flags on many private buildings, are at half-mast and are draped with crepe. Even the trams and buses are flying streamers of crepe. All underground entrances display the national and swastika flags draped with black.

Minister of Economics.

The Reichsbank President, Doctor Schacht, has been appointed Acting Minister of Economics for a month, owing to the illness of . (Continued on page 8)

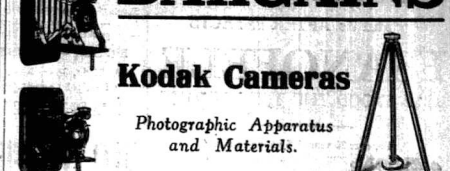
The call for a volunteer force is the result of Imperial direction, but it is not to be deduced that any danger is anticipated. It is a wise precautionary measure that the available regular troops should be reinforced by volunteer assistance, and while it is not desired that those who drive important interests in the country shall, even temporarily, relax attention to those interests, it is felt that there are many in our community who may be able and willing to give their time to the public service without serious interference with private business.

The main objective of the Government is to ensure the safety of the Uganda Railway. The Government does not anticipate that any advance across the frontier will be attempted, or that the Post will be seriously threatened, but the necessity of taking precautionary measures will be obvious to all, and the real meaning of the present mobilisation is that, in the unlikely event of an advance being attempted, we shall not be caught unprepared.

I am directed by His Excellency the Governor to take this opportunity of expressing his high appreciation of the enthusiastic response which is being made to the call for volunteers. It is in His Excellency's estimation, a sign that all are prepared to take their place loyally in any programme which may be evolved for the defence of the Protectorate and to do their share in maintaining unimpaired the integrity of the country in which they have made their homes.

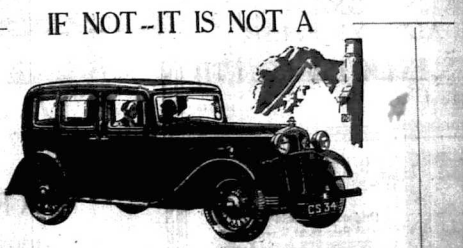

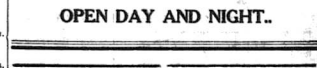

“A PALATIAL CASINO.”

Judges' Comments on Indians' Appeal.

Three Indians, who had been found guilty by the Resident Magistrate, Nairobi, during June with managing or assisting in managing the business of a gaming house named a scene on the first floor of a building known as “Walter Hill's Building” in River Road, Nairobi, appealed to the Acting Chief Justice and Mr. Justice W. K. House sitting in the Supreme Court. Mr. Reed has worked against their conviction and sentence.

Mr. Trevellick appeared on behalf of the appellants. Cuthbert Huson and Naimin Ram, who had each been sentenced to a fine of Shs. 400, or, in default two months imprisonment and Kerim Bux, who had been sentenced to a fine of Shs. 200, or, in default of payment, one month's imprisonment. A fourth Indian, Dey Dost, had also been sentenced to a fine of Shs. 400, or, in two months' imprisonment for the same offence, but he did not appear, while a fifth Indian—Mistry Swami Dhan—had been similarly charged, but was acquitted before the close of the Magisterial hearing.

Grounds of Appeal.

In the memorandum of appeal it was submitted that there was absolute no evidence that the appellants managed or assisted in managing the business of a gaming house, that there was no evidence that any collection was taken in the appellants' favour on behalf of the owner or occupier of the house, that there was no proof that any commission was taken by the appellants from May 11, June 3, 1934, and that the finding of the trial magistrate was contrary to law and against the weight of the evidence.

Mr. Trevellick argued that the managing of the gaming house should be proved the owners of the gaming house, but His Honour the Acting Chief Justice pointed out that this was quite unnecessary. “I can't see the owner of a public house at Maida Cross, but I might argue the place,” he said. “I could have a few of my managers, one for the public room one for the card room and so on.”

PREVENTION OF SOIL EROSION.

Duty of Farmers and Their Organizations.

Below is given the third of a series of press notices, dealing with methods of preventing soil erosion, that are being issued by the Kenya Department of Agriculture.

“In these press notes, the Agricultural Department is attempting to bring home to the farmers in Kenya the seriousness of the process of soil erosion which is taking place all over the Colony, not merely on cultivated lands, but also in the veld, particularly where the land is over-stocked.

“Unfortunately the Department has not the staff to give whole-time services to this work of assisting farmers to prevent soil erosion, but wherever agricultural officers are stationed they will give assistance, when asked to do so, within the limits of their provision for travelling. The Department will shortly publish a comprehensive bulletin giving in some detail the methods of prevention for the different kinds of erosion.

Organization and Propaganda.

“It is desired to impress upon farmers, and particularly upon farmers' associations, that organization and propaganda are necessary if this work is to be prosecuted with any appreciable results and this organization and propaganda must be left very much to the farmers themselves. These activities are obviously best done through farmers' associations, and it is hoped that every live association in the country will take the matter up seriously and appoint a committee to organize addresses on the subject, as well as demonstrations on private farms.

The response which the Department has received to its circulars making this request is gratifying, but it is not complete as had been hoped. Assistance must be placed on the associations themselves for the prosecution of this work.

“ACTED FOR by a check-book,” Mr. Justice House added, “I would be assisting in managing.” Judgment was reserved.



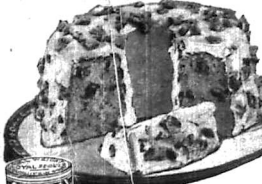

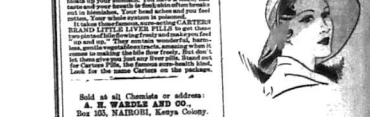
