ENGLAND'S CHANGES IMPROVE SLIGHTLY.

(Continued from page 1.)

had not only lost her wicket-keeper but also a very fine batsman. In addition she had to face the Australians again without their services.

No Follow-on.

In view of the position it might have been thought that Woodfull would enforce the follow-on, but instead he selected to bat again, leaving the home country the ignominy of having to follow-on. Evidently the Australian captain feared the possibilities of the Oval wicket. England might go in again and make a huge score, leaving the tourists a crumpled wicket of which to get rum, and the risk was not his. He being.

Woodall as Wicket-keeper.

Brown and Ponsford opened the "Aussies" second innings to the bewilderment of Clark and Allan. Woodley took Ames' place behind the stumps, while Gregory and McMillan fielded as substitutes for the Kent men and Brown.

Ponsford never appeared comfortable, and indeed he was in the case in each test which he has played in. The opening over always found him rather undecided and uncertain what to do with the attack. Clark exploded his 57 bag trap, and the Australian never seemed sure as to how to win it. The Northern man had Sutcliffe, Hammond, Verity, Allen, and Gregory—five men on the leg side.

Jeers from the crowd greeted Ponsford every time he disced from one of Clark's deliveries, and often he did so unsuccessfully. Brown was the first to fall a victim to Clark's method of attack, going when there were only 18 runs on the board. With the attack at 42 Ponsford went, being taken by Hammond off the Northern player.

Bredman in Form.

Bredman and McCabe came together, and the rate of scoring increased markedly. The 100 was sent up after an hour and twenty minutes. Bredman was in one of his irascible moods, and once sent Clark for six. The English attack without the aid of Brown definitely lacked sting, and the batsman had the complete mastery. Ponsford was raised at cover point when eight, and then was brilliantly taken by Hammond. Allen was bowling at the top of his form and once beat McCabe, but Sutcliffe missed him in the slip.

Brown has undergone an operation in the hopes that he will be able to take his place in the home country's team for the fourth day's play, in which case the English attack will be strengthened.

At the close of play on Tuesday Australia had scored 186 for two wickets, and both Brown and Ponsford being out for 18 and 22 respectively, while Bredman was 76 not out and McCabe 50 not out.

Rain at the Oval.

Rain, states Reuter's in a message yesterday (Wednesday) morning, fell in London. It was heaviest in the vicinity of the Oval test stumps, and it was expected that the wicket would be on the moist side, with the outfield slow. As the morning progressed, the weather freshened, but the turf looked to be in wonderful condition, and it was the opinion that the rain would be the means of preventing the wicket from crumbling.

But interest today in the result had practically evaporated.

Gone were the all night and early morning queues; gone were the spectators and the crowd; and at 9:30 a.m. there were only a few hundreds waiting for the gates to open. It was a striking contrast to the scenes which greeted the early morning on the previous day, the English public had given up all hope of winning that day.

The operation to Brown, and the injury to Ames still further detracted from the situation. With regard to Brown's ability to take the field the matter remained in doubt. Stanley Jackson, chairman of the England Selection Committee, stated that no decision would be made until just before the resumption, but he thought they were unlikely starting.

It is perhaps by way of a coincidence that yesterday Woodfull was celebrating his 37th birthday. To win a Test and "The Ashes" would be a fitting occasion to mark it. Whether such was to be, however, remains in the lap of the gods.

A Turn for the Better.

There was reason for a more cheerful outlook when the lunch-time scores came through yesterday. The Australians suffered a crushing defeat, losing only one to his overnight total, and McCabe 10. Brown was able to take his place on the field, and he and Clark wrought havoc among the batsmen. What took time some eight wickets had fallen for 250. What will the last two batsmen to come out be? It is England are now over 300 runs behind, and such a total in the fourth inning hardly seems on the impossible. At Sydney in 1924-25 the home country were set 600 in the center to win, and they passed the 400 mark before the last wicket fell. It is a superhuman task which will be set them, and if they accomplish it, then it will be one of the most amazing feats yet accomplished.

Australia will welcome her victorious team on the return, but the flush of their success will be tempered by the criticisms which have been levied with regard to the home country's representation, and also by the veiled hints of a diplomatic pressure.

Without a doubt Australia have proved themselves the superior side all the way through. England contributed to her own defeat by her palpable weakness in the field, but it does not detract from the fact that the better side won, and that by 562 runs.

Criticism of English Selectors.

Standard Correspondent and Reuter's London, August 23.—The English selectors have been criticised for their selection of the team which won the last test, but the criticism is not directed against the selectors themselves, but against the players who were selected.

Vyasa says his parents, engaged by the article, killed Misha at midnight and took the body to a distant field. Vyasa spent about the murder for three months fearing a similar fate but finally decided to tell.

THE LOST SELECTORS.

Mr. Fuchs Returning to Nairobi.

Mr. Fuchs, leader of the Lake Rudolf Expedition, is expected to arrive in Nairobi on Tuesday or Wednesday next for the purpose of consulting with Government regarding any further work to be taken with a view to recovering traces of Dr. Dyson and Mr. Martin, the two members of the expedition who failed to return from South Island and who it is feared have been drowned.

It will be recalled that the expedition on Wednesday telegraphed to the Government in the Northern Frontier Province at Jaldapao asking if it was considered desirable to send a boat to make a further search on Lake Rudolf. The message was passed on to the Police at Marsabit who replied on Wednesday night that Mr. Fuchs was at the station, waiting their cars to be expected back at Marsabit on Thursday.

To Borrow a Boat.

Yesterday Mr. Fuchs himself telegraphed from Marsabit to the Government. He suggests it may be possible to borrow a boat and that this is done a search could be carried out for traces of the ill-fated members of the expedition. He also asks the Government to see that the matter with Government as soon as he reaches Nairobi.

AUSTRALIA'S DEFENCE.

menting the result of the Conference a large number of Great Britain, the United States and Japan, but in its most important clauses it does not limit France and Italy, except in so far as they are already tied by the Treaty of Washington of 1922.

The aim is to fix the tonnage that may be possessed by the British, United States and Japanese Navies in the various classes of ships, so as to end any possibility of shipbuilding competition between them.

Under the Treaty of Washington the three Powers had the right to lay down certain capital ships between 1911 and 1916, for replacement purposes. That right they declared their intention of not exercising in terms of the London



NATIVE TAXATION—THE HUT TAX.

To the Editor, "E.A. Standard,"
Sir—Whatever other arguments may exist for raising from 20 to 18 the age at which the African Native should commence to pay the Hut Tax, the time put forward by Archbishop Owen and Mr. Pilsbry that 16 is too young an age for the Native to go out to work, compensation is, of course, possible between Native and European youths, as the former develop physically much quicker than the latter. The "impressionable" age of the Native is reached long before he is 16 years old. At this age a large number of native youths are already married, according to native custom, and if they are fit to take on such a responsibility as marriage at that age, surely they should be prepared to help to support the State.

Talking of "impressionable youths" what about the thousands of native children of an age from 10 years downwards who are forced on to the labour market by their parents in order to collect the hut tax? And this at an age when they are most susceptible to disease and most easily should be receiving most careful moral and other education? I should imagine that if Archbishop Owen and his friends were to devote a portion of

NAIROBI LENDING LIBRARY.

To the Editor, "E.A. Standard,"
Sir—I regret that your correspondent in today's issue should have so misinterpreted in the exact position of the Nairobi lending library, by firstly stating that the library is housed only through the Nairobi Municipal Management Committee. The Nairobi Municipal Council give a grant to the library. The Council is used purely for the purchase of books for the lending use and the larger building used for the upkeep of the library. On the understanding that the staff of the institute help in the housing of the books and the distribution thereof. On this statement, her second article stated that "the library is entirely financed by the subscriptions of its borrowers" must be incorrect. I may point out that in a discussion held in the Council in October 1933, many Councillors advocated that the 5000 worth of more use to the Ratepayers of Nairobi to the sum of £1000 it was used solely for the support of the Lending Library, and further views were expressed in that despatched times that the Council held best better use for their money than subscribe to Public Institutions.

As the 5000 subscribed by the Ratepayers of Nairobi is applied to procure books for them, it can in sympathy with certain of your correspondents who express dissatisfaction with the present Management Committee.

PUBLIC SECURITY.

To the Editor, "E.A. Standard,"
Sir—The whole Colony has had read your report of the debate in Legislative Council on "Public Security with absorption."

Might I suggest that an argument confined to the increase of the Police force is inadequate and does not touch the root of the evil. The truth is that during the past few years a form of law enforcement has grown up in our country which is not in accordance with the policy of administering the increasing responsibilities of the various tribes or of securing the peace of mind of the people living in the Colony. Whether this law enforcement was originated in Kenya or in Downing Street, I do not know, but I strongly suspect the latter. The fact is that law does not in my opinion lie in the power of the Police Force of the Colony, however competent that force may be, but rather in the inability of the present Government to handle the administrative task together with the responsibility of enforcing the Administration thereof.

I am not satisfied that an endeavor to enforce upon the ignorant people an administration controlled by the placidities of the present public and would either vote for a reorganization of the school staff or take steps to protect their property (and lives) from the depredations of the squalls.

Many of us however have the highest opinion of our school staff and only harbor the fear that the Board of School Governors in Downing Street will not allow them powers to control their pupils. Prior to the Great War this Colony was ruled by a handful of men imbued with a high sense of the duty of the application of the law to the needs of the moment and I maintain that that system was recognized, understood and respected by the administered tribes.

That understanding respect and recognition need this Colony from the very beginning of the first few days and held the people in reasonable loyalty to their Government throughout the War when Administration was reduced by a minimum and when White Colonials were conspicuous by their absence in the Colony by reason of their response to the call of those times. That loyalty and general good behaviour when the

Native really believed that White Rule had practically come to an end, was a great feather in the cap of our Administration.

Let the people of this country know that the following of the civilized law and custom of their Rulers and limit by just and quick retribution, on the return to the old relations.

Discipline is not bullying, and the disciplined Native, in company with any one else of the human race is far more likely to be a happy man than he is at present.

Nearly a quarter of a century of close association with the tribes of Eastern Africa in their various circumstances of Administration and their evolution into the large labour markets of the Agricultural Industries of the Colony, have taught me that the Native will simply accept just and impartial discipline and it is only by an insistence of its firm maintenance that we shall expect our Trust and make secure true Native welfare which assure for ourselves our desire for Public Security.
