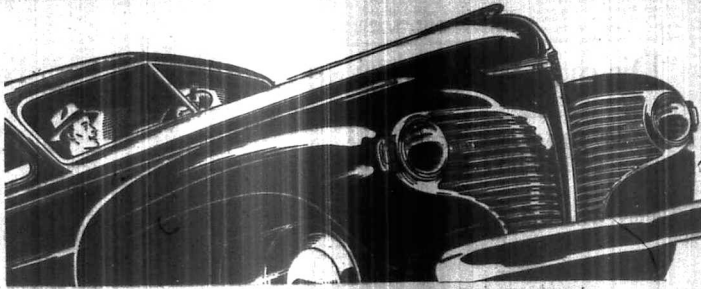

The Editor: The out-of-date accounts for the year 1940 given to you by the corresponding in these columns and in all other papers containing a letter, are necessary for publication as a means of giving the public the information they are entitled to have.

COFFEE CONTROL BOARD

The Editor: "E.A. Standard"
Sir—Colomb Jirik in a letter published in a recent issue of the East African Standard has produced certain figures regarding the cost of Coffee Control in the season 1940/41 which require correction or explanation.

It will be much appreciated if you can afford space in your columns for this purpose.

The statement that the Coffee Board paid control costs amounting to 2782 is incorrect. The actual amount so shown in the audited accounts of the Coffee Board and as stated in the Auditor's report upon Coffee Control accounts is £127. The difference of 2655, is included in the published accounts of the Coffee Control under the heading "miscellaneous" and "miscellaneous".

The following are the expenses of the Control as detailed in the published accounts. Figures are given in the nearest pound for sale of liquid coffee.

If the costs paid by the Coffee Board as stated by the figure £2,782, Colomb Jirik very properly omitted insurance charges from his comparison between control costs and pre-control commission charges. Warehouse expenses should also be omitted. The position is that £662 was given for warehouse charges in his comparison with the £2,782 which was included in the price paid to the Control. £203 was expended in warehouse rent on other coffees. For several months during the season coffee was not sold or allowed to be sold in quantity and/or shipping space. Rent incurred in this respect is normally allowed for by the buyer in his purchase price and it was agreed as between Control and buyer that to avoid unnecessary work by debited stock rent should be charged there by warehouse to control up to date of sale. This arrangement resulted in receipt of full sale value by the Control without deduction by the buyer of rental charges.

A comparison of the expenses of Control into terms of cost per ton and per cwt gives the following:

As regards the number of people present of the Show, apart from exhibitors, buyers and stewards, I am happy to know they were enthusiastic and put themselves to great trouble to see some good stock, if small in quantity, made up in quality. The East Africa Kennel Club has been able to pay credit in full sum of money to the East Africa War Charities from proceeds of shows, thanks to the work of the Executive, and the cooperation of exhibitors, judges and stewards, and the support of the public.

The present policy of the Executive is to ask all breeders and owners of pedigree puppies and adults to register them with the Club, and thereby avoid the calamities in which owners could themselves and their who had to face enormous difficulties looking for reliable breeding stock. The registrations so far this year are up to average and we hope to the end of the year to announce they have exceeded last year's total. The Executive have also unanimously decided to re-organise another show to take place in Nairobi during December of this year.

As a last recommendation in "Twenty Bars" write "The President of the Kenyal Club is right when he says the Stud book and registration must continue at least until it is wrong through neglect."

Propaganda: An Address To Rotarians

Nairobi Rotary Club met on Friday, when **Laurel Dickson** addressed the members on the subject of "Propaganda and Rotarians". Forty Rotarians and guests being present.
Laurel Dickson opened his address by quoting the policy which the League of Nations and the League of Nations had done as best in the campaign against the Turks in the Great War, when orthodox principles of warfare were recommended. The abandonment in favour of the method of inducing and justification of an attack or battle for our enemies could not possibly win.
Propaganda, said the speaker, must be conducted on similar lines with such success it happened to null his immediate purpose.
Ladies and gentlemen referred to the points by which every generation was designed to create civilization, community antagonism and class by the use of propaganda and subtle nature. He mentioned particularly the propaganda of the League of Nations by the enemy concerning the League of Nations and the League of Nations in Germany. General's **Walter and Mad in Russia**, which were designed to induce a feeling of ease and complacency. A popular method of propaganda, said the speaker was to furnish articles and labour trouble and that insure mutual distrust and suspicion.
Superficially innocent poets and magazine articles were another subtle form of propaganda intended to foster the defeatist spirit and the idea that the Germans could not lose the war. The speaker noted that the propaganda which attracted world leaders had been sent to war-time in America, offering them favourable terms of employment after the War—designed to create the same impression.
The speaker then referred to British propaganda and the dissemination of the propaganda in the world, which on the surface appeared to be neutral, but which on closer examination were an essential weapon of war. During the war, propaganda was usually taken as bad news, hence the need for the dissemination of propaganda news. In his view, said **Laurel Dickson**, the essentials of successful propaganda were speed, truth, policy, consistency, sincerity and vigour with emphasis on the "V". Propaganda directed against the enemy should be designed to create fright and a spirit of defeatism by emphasizing losses, setting propaganda, reminding occupied countries of the oppression and worse inflicted and on behalf of the League of Nations.

The East African Command now, of course, separate and self-contained, are presumably glad to have nothing to do with the need for speed and vigour in our local war. The excuse was given so often in the past.

TO THE BRITISH EUROPEAN WOMEN OF KENYA

You will have all seen in the press that under the Defence Regulations the Governor has ordered the compulsory registration of all British Women in Kenya. Every woman concerned has to fill in a special form giving her particulars. The Governor has also power when the registration has been completed to introduce the conscription of women, to allot to any woman the work she should do, and if necessary, send any woman to a training school to have her trained for some special work.

Before exercising these powers it has been decided by Government to appeal to women to volunteer their services for the special war work for which they are fitted and Government has placed this appeal and this drive for volunteers in the hands of the K.W.E.O., which performs the same function in Kenya for civilian women as the Women's Voluntary Services do in Great Britain.

Whilst at the start of the war many women registered with the K.W.E.O. for war work, enthusiasm waned as the immediate danger receded and registrations have latterly decreased. It is known that many women have independently decided for themselves what they can do and have offered their services in one capacity or another to the Government or Military Authorities, and of most of these the K.W.E.O. has no record.

From today the Central Offices of the K.W.E.O. are in Sirona House, Sadler Street, Nairobi. Here a staff is stationed to answer all enquiries, and to give assistance in every way to all volunteers for war work.

Whilst we have in Kenya no opportunity to serve in factories or as munition workers, there are continuous calls for full-time and part time paid workers for accountancy, book-keeping, store-keeping, clerical work, filing, typing, etc., as well as for trained nurses, teachers, and children's nurses. Volunteers for craft work, Red Cross Services, making and distributing comforts, and catering are also needed.

The difficulty is that many women are quite vague as to what they would like to do, or indeed what they could do, and this is where the K.W.E.O. can help. You decide what time you can spare, tell us, and wherever possible we will find a use for your services.

The supreme duty of women is motherhood, the care of the young, the care of the home, but remember if Hitler were to win the war, Kenya would be a land of slaves and all the happiness of home life would be gone for ever. Women must fight to preserve their home life by making every effort and sacrifice in their power. Many jobs seem not worth while, but any work that is helping forward our soldiers, sailors and armament to victory is well worth while. It is all honourable, all necessary and all patriotic.

The power of the Empire Women's War Effort can be compared to a great river as its flood approaches the sea, but trace that river back to its source and its beginnings, this great effort has only been made possible by the scores of little streams which flow into and make one large stream. Every contribution counts, however small. Let Kenya's war effort be whole hearted, if we cannot win the war by ourselves, we can help others to win it.

There are two posters that have been published in England. The first portraying two women helping the homeless and disabled in the bombing of London has the slogan:

"If you are doing your best you are doing your bit."

Visualise the poster and take your minds to England. Think of these pathetic and courageous stories we have all received from mothers, sisters, and daughters, of demolished homes, narrow escapes from fire and bomb; and not so narrow escapes of some. Perhaps our best can be bettered? Perhaps we who live here in safety and plenty still have got some way to go before we reach our best?

The other poster which is to be seen in Kenya, it is of the three fighting services in action. The R.A.F. flinging the Hun out of the skies, The Navy protecting a convoy of food. And the Army in action with anti-aircraft. They are all superb pictures and the slogan is simple: "Back Them Up."

It is our job to Back Them Up, and Hitler and his grisly gang are swept off the face of the earth.

PILOT WALKED 18 DAYS

Escaped From Italians

Blinded and choked from smoke pouring from his aircraft, which had been hit by enemy machine gun fire, a pilot of the South African Air Force landed his plane within 500 yards of an Italian fort. With the aid of a Parrot Force he managed to escape and eighteen days later after travelling for more than a hundred miles, he has rejoined his squadron.

The pilot, who is a captain in a famous RAF squadron, after returning from his raid, found his plane had been hit.

"I was sure I couldn't get home," he said, "but the spectators in a Press Office, 'I was surprised to get up and find I had landed within 500 yards of an Italian fort. I was in a bit of a predicament as I was not sure when I had to open down."

For the next several days the pilot travelled on a small narrow narrow whirling cart, carrying a few supplies to avoid Italian detection, for more than 18 miles. A detachment of Ethiopian soldiers treated him kindly. The journey was not without incident. "At times I was out like a candle."

The party spent the nights in villages where the pilots were always warmly welcomed. "The Italians had one like a fighting cock," the pilot said. "In one village six men were killed at a special trial. They were had built, I used to see them all so that my blood would not be offended. That really shook me."

The pilot came across several strange native customs. When he drank thick milk he was always surrounded from behind by a white sheet and he was expected to drink at least three cups of coffee, or three cups of tea, or three cups of beer. The food was served in conical pots from which each person helped himself.

At last the pilot reached a town recently occupied by Italian forces. He was given a bed room with hot and cold water installed. "I was in a real home from home," he said. "I had been unable to wash for the first eight days of my journey but I made up for that by bathing every day."

The pilot's squadron had already been alerted by radio messages that he was safe and a second message was sent informing them that the conditions in the desert were being made favorable. Traveling over a distance of 180 miles, the pilot delivered the message within 48 hours. The pilot and his S.A.A.F. base landed safely on the aerodrome and the pilot was transported back to his squadron.

The next morning, after he had shaved off his heavy beard, he heard the captain, some 200 miles from his experience, was again flying with the South African Air Force. "It was a great experience," he said.

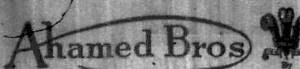

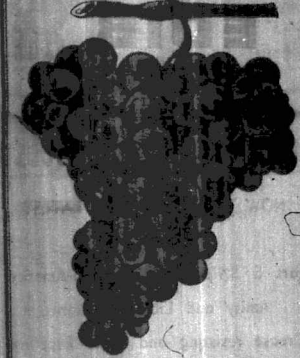

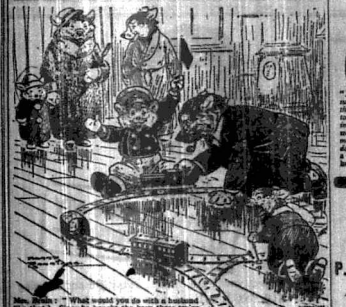

THE NEW AUSTRIA

(From a correspondent)

Hilder tries hard to convey the impression all over the world that his invasion of small and powerful countries is the only logical and inevitable conclusion. But the invasion is still alive which knows the nature of German aggression in 1934-38. The proclamation of a new order is intended to conceal from the German people and the oppressed and subjugated nations the fact that Great Britain unswerving resistance has made it impossible for the German war machine. Hilder will not definitely decide the war, but he will definitely decide the problem of the future Austria.

The problem of the future Austria will be solved solely by the establishment of political democracy. Favouring democratic institutions in the economic field will have to take place as well. There has been a fundamental in Great Britain's public life. A new type of social development is being initiated. It will be an essential part of Austria's reconstruction. The political quality of all national movements is being improved unless accompanied by economic security within the framework of a functioning social system. Liberty and equality of rights for all citizens are the political aim. Characteristic of the new economic security is the right of the present living generation and a share of cultural goods for everyone and the economic and social development of the future.

Democratization

Any future Democratic constitution must not be dependent upon special conferences and special resolutions which are binding on no other part. The constitution must be democratic in this respect. Like the other states, the Austrian people must be able to express their own political will. There must be a clear definition of the powers of the state, which the individual members must be able to exercise. The political situation of sovereign rights must be equally in all states and must be equally in all states.

The main activities of the Federal Government, such as foreign policy, trade, and customs policy, currency affairs, defence, etc., shall be preserved intact and a common social minimum standard of life shall be maintained.

The rights of the representative within the Executive Committee corporations must be equal.

A Federal High Court shall decide upon any present against the law of an individual state which may violate federative principles.

The settlement of international relations shall be settled by a Federal Court of Arbitration. All decisions made by the Executive body or its Courts shall be entered by equal and federal executive power. There should be definite regulations for the administration of the Federal Government on a basis of equality for all member-states.

While Austria must never again become an arena for the ambitions of foreign powers, she will maintain her independence and will be ready to negotiate with other nations on an equal basis with the other nations. Demographic boundaries may be an economic
