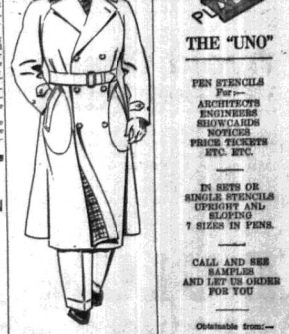

GAME POLICY IN KENYA

An Enquiry

The announcement included in the speech by His Excellency the Governor of Kenya at the opening of the present session of the Legislative Council that Government intends to appoint a Committee of Enquiry into Game Policy will be received with great satisfaction throughout the country. The early notice that Government has taken of the recent expressions of public opinion on the subject of National Parks is a pleasing assurance of the whole situation, though it is a many years since the first long-ignored enthusiasts began in our columns and elsewhere to agitate for a policy which the Colony is now promulgating.

The problems of Game Policy in Kenya are not simple and they are not concerned only with the establishment of National Parks. They relate to a wide range of questions bound up in the conflicting interests which have arisen from the development of large areas of the Colony on civilized lines. Before the advent of European settlement the vast tracts which by its inevitable results in the earmarking of great tracts of country for agricultural or other uses, were the habitat of the African people had been the home of herds of domestic stock, the African people had their own methods of hunting and their own methods of tending the herds, and their own methods of selecting the animals which were the preserve of large

members of game imposed on their simple economy. Over today in some of the larger areas such as the Masai and the Samburu and in the North Eastern Province these conditions have not materially altered in their essential relationships. But times and the experience of colonization have together imposed certain principles upon us. Mainly these are that the needs of the human race must come first, that the pressure of economic growth in whatever area it may be exerted, cannot be diverted or lessened by consideration for animal life, but that generally where man and Nature are not in conflict, or where their opposition can be adjusted, the wild things shall be preserved and their limitation or destruction controlled by humanitarian principles.

These principles we believe to be broad and strong enough to maintain a sane regard for the future of Kenya is fortunate in possessing large areas of terrain of such a character that there is no practical conflict between man and beast. It is also fortunate in the fact that there is no practical conflict of game control and preservation was recognized as a State duty, with the result that certain Game Reserves have been in existence for many years. In addition, there is a widespread interest in game not only arising from the material value of an asset which can be exploited, alive or dead, but also from a genuine and creditworthy appreciation by the European community of the Colony for the wild life which Nature has so generously provided for our interest and admiration. An important change has occurred in the public attitude to game in recent years. Time was, and was not so very long ago, when mainly concerned the organization of safaris by wealthy visitors who, under expert guidance and under complete effort and rapidly helped enormously by the advent of the motor car and the invention of the express purpose of combining the thrill of hunting with the collection of a heterogeneous and brightly colored trophy that is not now the case. The development of the camera has created a new and infinitely more fascinating excitement which can be much less expensive and which is not a matter of fact of rifle and shotgun. In addition, liberal shelves and book stalls are now plentifully stocked with both the magazine game written by lovers of wild life who have communicated their words enthusiastically and in large number of people. No longer is every centred in a dressed head, spreading horns and glassy eyes, rather is it kindled into a desire for evidence by magnificent photographic success. Places like the Serengeti, and the wide policy it represents, have done a great deal to alter the public outlook and so Committee of Enquiry in Kenya can afford today to ignore that lasting change in the conception of things and responsibility for future generations.

The investigation which is pending in Kenya must, therefore, be concerned with the practical aspect of game control and preservation, more than with the problems of the stockowner in Nanyuki as completely as the problem of the lion and leopard have the whole country turned into a National Park. We are certain that both can be done. We hope, too, that there is a talk in terms of magnificent hunting levels of increased game, in a Kenyan Park, a system of patrolling or some other method of keeping animals in their own areas can be substituted. We hope, too, that there is an unduly sentimental regard for so-called African Reserves. For instance, how long has it been in jeopardy yet we doubt very much whether the native inhabitants of that area who have been in every complaint by immediate and expert control, are not perhaps so much there was a British Government in this matter, as we are now aware of what were left to their own methods of selecting the animals which were the preserve of large

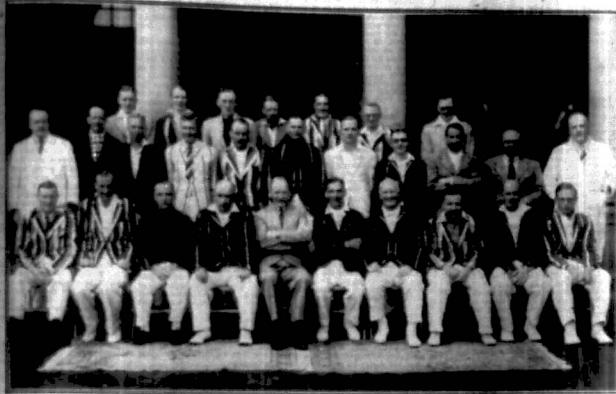

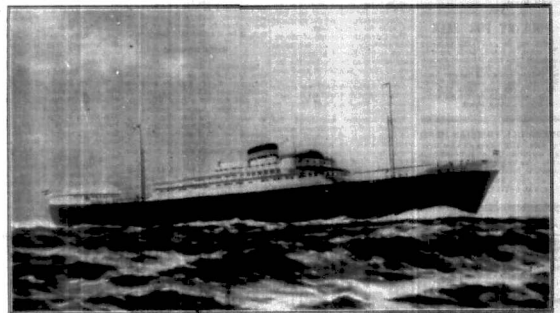

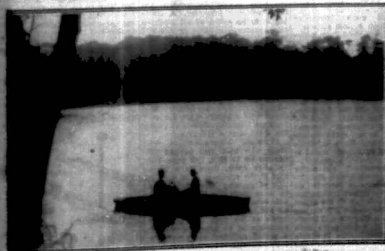

ST. GEORGE, And Of Course, the Dragon

St. George was not an Englishman. All the historians seem to be agreed on that, even if they doubt the historical existence of the dragon. Englishmen of today have to take their Patron Saint on trust, a little fearful of the moment when an industrial Axis researcher will discover that he was a non-ryan and St. Gideon, by his famous and monumental work, asserts that George was a turbulent bishop of Alexandria who was torn to pieces by the populace. But there are others who declare that he was a gentleman of noble Christian parents and sentiments who flocked in Armenia, visited Britain on an Imperial expedition and was ultimately beheaded by Decianus at Nicomedia on April 23, in the year 304, after a vigorous protest against the persecution of the early Christians. Anyhow his great fame persisted among Eastern and Western Christians and even among Mohammedans. He was not the prime dragon-slayer, St. Michael slayed the dragon and even two women, St. Margaret and St. Martha, are also credited in mythology with equally good records as white hunters. But, his shrine was raised near the scene of the great Greek legend of Perseus and Andromeda and it is accordingly alleged by the historians that though it was Perseus who slayed the dragon, the woman that ended the virgin, George in the centuries that followed collected the legendary tales. King Arthur pleased the picture of St. George on his banners in the sixth century and the famous dragon slain by the knight, it is all so long ago now that nobody bothers to contradict the legends of St. George's. It seems indispensible that St. George—and the Dragon—whether naturalized or not, constitutes the first English Protected Subject. He was elevated to the distinguished position of Patron Saint of England by Edward the Third and it is well that Mussolini should remember that at that time the republicans of Genoa and Venice were also under the protection of George. Nor should Englishmen forget that St. George's Day was at one time commonly regarded as a "day of deception and oppression," because it was then that new leases and contracts were wont to be made. And it is just as well to remember, too, that St. George was the Patron Saint of the Portuguese, which gives our Goa's friends an interesting note.

But all that does not matter much today. St. George, and of

course, the Dragon, stands for something peculiarly English—the defence of liberty of thought and religious freedom, a dauntless gallantry where belated young women are concerned and the extermination of all dragons, symbolic of the evil, just as still in the world. It is a pleasing conceit. It is not recorded that St. Andrew slew any dragons, or St. Patrick either, though doubtless both had their moments. We see the spirit of St. George abroad in many things. Some of us, as now, by looking a lance with the local tyrants who would deprive the British working man of his game of darts and his beer in the local inn. Or, discarding the lance, he hurries into the international fray against the dragons of our day brandishing nothing more formidable than an old umbrella, covered four times instead but still serviceable in sun and rain. But the umbrella is being discarded, too. The British people are rallying to the spirit of St. George, armed to the teeth with all that genius and industry can invent and produce are prepared to do battle if necessary with the evil things of our times in defence of liberty. On this day there is much in our hearts which we can probably remember. As Lord Lytton reminds us in a letter to the Editor of the Empire in this issue, the British Empire is not decadent, whether the pessimists may say and whatever the reactionaries and pagandists would have the world believe. It is giving up its spirit for a day that it does not want and is not of British seeking. Small and defenceless nations are looking for succour against the dragons that are breathing fire, and they will not call on St. George in vain.

British and in Kenya, too, the Englishman still stubbornly clings to his right to grose and complain and criticize. He still considers that should not be asked for sacrifices if his need is not apparent, but if he is satisfied that somebody is starting a fight without reasonable cause and in the process is bullying the small and the helpless, he rises a little feverishly to his feet, squares broad shoulders and walks in just to see that there is no mistake. He has a right to feel that everything in his life as it should be in his own little island or his Empire, because if everything was done there would be no dragons, even little ones, and St. George would simply get a front lack of exercise, his steed would go to the knees and no maidens would give a glove or a handkerchief to an elected knight. It is an encouragement to unpromising recklessness. Lord Byron had it all typed, as it was quite him:

"England, with all its faults I love thee still," said a Coleridge, and I have not forgot it; I like to speak and to laudate my fill; I like the Government (but that is not it); I like the freedom of the press and quiet; I like the "Rabies Curia" when we've got it; I like a parliamentary debate, particularly when 'tis not too late; I like the taxes when they're not too many; I like a second fine when we're too deaf; I like a bear-skin, too, as well as any coat; Have no objection to a pot of beer; I like the weather, when it is not a rat's nest; That is; I like two months of every year; And so God save the regiment, church and king! and every thing.

Our standing army and disbanded sea-men. Poor's rate, reform, my own, the nation's debt, as a national debt. Our little riots just to show we are freemen.

Our trifling bankruptcies in the day of the General. Our easy climate, and our own, a chilly woman.

If these few things, and these four, And greatly venture our recent glories.

And wish that they were not owing to the tories.

BRITAIN'S TRADE OUTLOOK

(*STANDARD CORRESPONDENT) London.
The most international of all countries, Britain has a seriously adverse effect on trade but the indications point to three recent months of a hopeful character.
For example, the average daily output of goods in the country in February showed an increase of 1.2 per cent on compared with February of last year.
The output of the railways which has months have been running for some time has for few weeks shown a much superior rate of decline.

Building
More significant still, however, are the statistics of building plans approved by those local authorities which have their statistics monthly and which between them contain more than one-third of the population of the country.
Following on the crisis last September the value of plans approved has shown a rapid decline, but in the month of February there was a marked reversal of this trend. The value of the plans approved in that month was 27.5 per cent above the same month of last year, and was actually 71 per cent greater than in February that year.
The plans approved are a measure of building of those engaged in the building trade and therefore represent to us an immediate index of the confidence felt by those in the industry who regard it as their profession. Accordingly, they are a reflection of the prospects of future employment. On the other hand, it must be borne in mind that plans approved are not in all cases intended for immediate construction. In fact, many for March are available, it will not be possible to judge to what extent they will be put into effect. It would seem, however, that the results will prove to be an adverse surprise.
