Application by Council dismissed

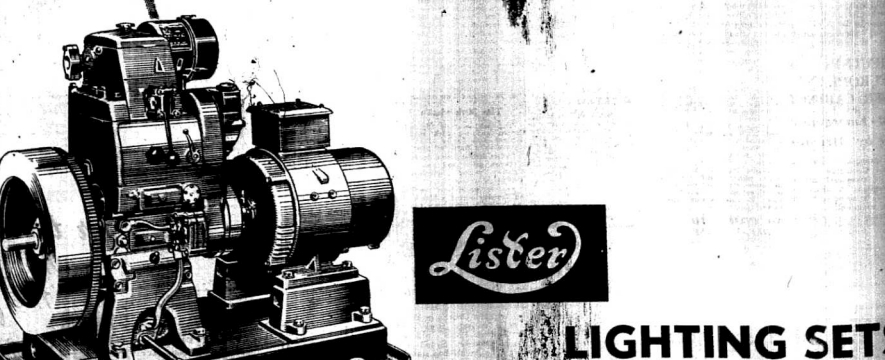

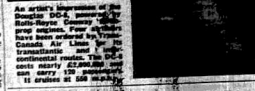

The signing of the communique was delayed by protracted talks on the Algerian situation, France wanted Russia to condemn outside interference in Algerian affairs and express understanding for the French position as a necessary step for French diplomatic aims.

At a reception after the talks, Mr. Khrushchev proposed a toast to "the Arabs and all people who are struggling for their national independence." He said: "When some people tell us there are no Arab states, I laugh at them."

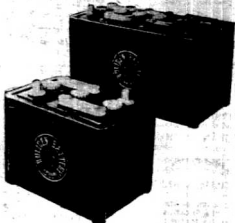

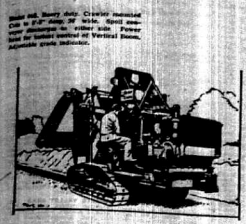

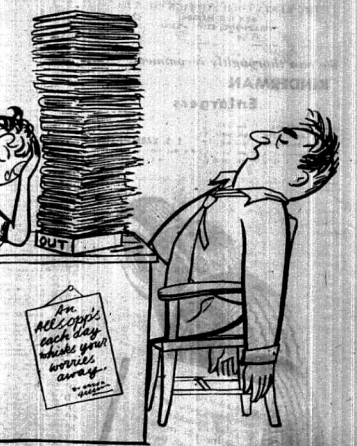
