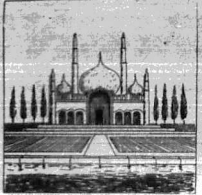

Elected Members Propose
European Trust Board

THE GOVERNOR TO REFER ALL REPRESENTATIONS HOME

Special Council of Council

On Tuesday morning a special session of the Kenya Legislative Council was opened in Nairobi for the purpose of debating the views of the Elected Members on the Carter Land Commission Report. In the course of his opening speech His Excellency the Governor made it clear that Government would be able to meet its deficit on land representations made on the subject, but that all would be forwarded to the Secretary of State after careful consideration.

In outlining the attitude of the settlers to the report, the Acting Leader of the European Elected Members recommended the formation of a European Land Trust Board with powers similar to those of the Native Land Trust Board. This proposal was made on behalf of the European Elected Members. They emphasised the need for complete security in respect of the European Highlands.

His Excellency in his speech announced that negotiations for the establishment of a bamboo pulp industry by a London group were well advanced. The factory will be sited near the Embu and will be of a capacity of 25,000 acres at the Kiyoa East Empment.

Financial Statement Deferred

His Excellency the Governor announced that the financial statement for the year ended in 1963 will be presented to the Legislative Council in the next session. He said that he had not yet decided whether to call for a special session of the Council to consider the statement. He said that he would call for a special session if he considered it necessary to do so.

His Excellency's speech was followed by the presentation of the annual report of the Civil Service Commission. The report was presented by the Chairman, Mr. Robert B. Jones. He said that the Commission had been successful in its task of reducing the civil service establishment to the level of 100,000.

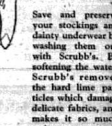

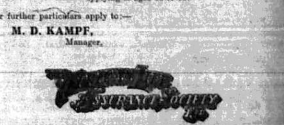

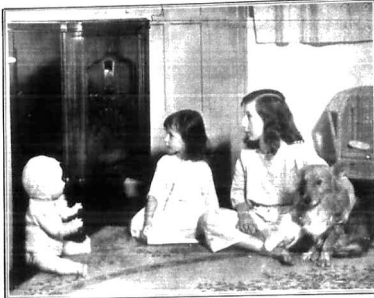

put the point of view of his constituents on this controversial question and to outline the alternative suggestion which has received the approval of the general body of Elected Members. # THE LOCUST REPORT

## Details of Flying Swarms

### From Many Districts

**NO SIGNS YET OF YELLOW COLOURATION**  
The following Report Locust Report dated October 15, has been received from the Kenya Department of Agriculture—  
During the last fortnight the phenomena of flying locusts have been reported—  
On October 12 a nomadic swarm was seen at Mito and Ansoi moving in a north westerly direction. The swarm was observed at Manganoni on the 2nd and was estimated to be about 3 square miles in extent.

A small swarm was reported on October 13 to be doing considerable damage to sugar cane at Hamidi. Numerous small swarms have been reported from the Kericho district through the Ukamba swarms flying in a north westerly direction. A small swarm was observed on October 13 coming from the north easterly direction split up into three portions, the flying in a north easterly direction towards Nanyo Moroti, another in a westerly direction towards a few miles south of Nyirra. Damage was negligible, but confined to the small millet crop. A small swarm was reported on October 14 moving in a north westerly direction. The swarm last left at Manganoni on the 2nd and was estimated to be about 3 square miles in extent.

**Minor Swarms**  
Details those enumerated above several reports from Voi, Kericho, Kilifi and other centres but no serious damage has been recorded. The specimens examined still reveal no indications of approaching maturity, nor is there any sign of the typical yellow colouration of the males, which takes place shortly before mating time and is a firm indication that the swarms are immature. Information has just been received that a very large swarm was observed in the Kilifi area flying west over Bamba on October 5.

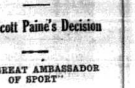

# MANURING OF SMALL FARMS

## Essential Plant Foods

### VALUE OF FERTILISERS

### IMPORTANCE OF CORRECT DRAINAGE

In the agricultural section of July 28th we published an article by Beatrice Wall on the merit and treatment of Kikuyu grass for the small dairy herd which is run on the intensive system.

Several farmers expressed keen interest in that article, and in the possibility of developing the "small holding" or more intensive method of farming in Kenya.

We therefore publish, herewith, extracts from a further article by Beatrice Wall which appeared in the Johannesburg "Sunday Times" Farmers Supplement.

During the past season I have had a large elementary school balance which are all, in various degrees of importance, essential to the health of the soil. To the smallest, however, the soil must be supplied with nitrogen, phosphorus, potassium, calcium, magnesium, iron, zinc, copper, boron, and molybdenum. These elements are all essential to the growth of plants, and if any one of them is deficient, the plant will be stunted and its yield will be reduced. It is not actually impossible, to grow anything.

**Plant Foods**  
Nitrogen, phosphorus and potassium are the three essential elements in the soil, and are the most important. # Notes on Biochemical Works

## TENTATIVE OBSERVATIONS

### INITIATION OF VALUABLE RESEARCH

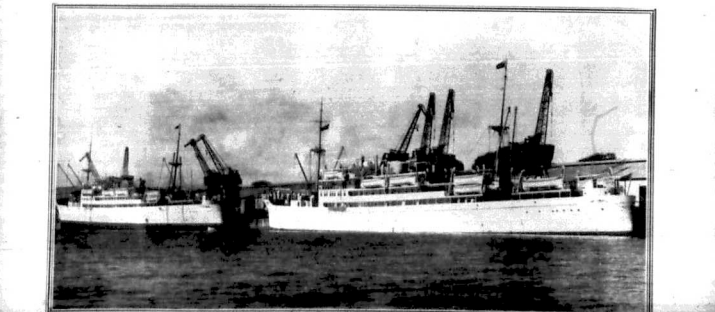

Trust Board should be established. The Hon. Member proceeded to deal in general terms with the question of native land and the importance of providing sufficient land for present and future needs of the country which he contended had not been done by the Commission's recommendations.

## HON. SHAMS-UL-DEEN Letting the Natives Have Their Choice

The Hon. Shams-ul-Deen (Indian Elected Member) opened his speech with the assertion that the debate was costing the country at least £2 a minute and had already cost over £200. In his opinion it had been a futile debate and a waste of money because no statement was nothing more than a comment on a judgment of a court that was already being carried into practice.

When the debate was resumed on Wednesday the Hon. Member instanced the Masai moves as an example of law operating which they considered necessary for the natives to take from that residue what they could best use.

In the meantime in 1930, there had been enacted the Native Land Trust Ordinance under which areas of land which in 1924 had been set aside for native reserves for the Highlands and the Masai were transferred to a Native Land Trust. Notwithstanding the existence of that Ordinance the feeling of insecurity by native subjects in the Colony, especially in the Highlands, was a considerable one.

The only Government spokesman in the debate was the Commissioner for Land Government, Lands and Settlement (the Hon. Mr. W. Logan, O.B.E., and the Attorney-General (the Hon. Mr. W. Harragin).

The Board has decided that it cannot agree to any suggestion that binder twine manufactured in Tanganyika from sisal shall not be marketed in Britain and Major Conrad Walsh disputes the contention of the Colonial Office that when he was encouraged in 1922 to manufacture sisal bags it was on the understanding that such bags and other sisal products would only be marketed in East Africa.

Figures are produced by him to show that though the British Rope-makers' agency do encourage the use of English Sisal, the tendency has been in the other direction and that increasing quantities of foreign Manila are now being imported.
