Early Reputation by Japan Expected

NON-FORTIFICATION OF PACIFIC

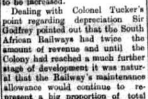

What we really wish to obtain is an extension of inter-territorial commercial union on the future basis of coordination of services with particular reference to the Departments which should come under the list for liquidation. If we agree in principle to-day, we shall have no objection to the extension of inter-territorial commercial union to the territories which I have referred to as long as it does not involve any reduction of the duties on any commodity.

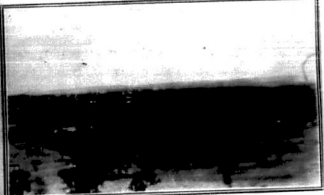

Sinking Fund Charges

MEMBER FOR NYNZA ASKS FOR ASSISTANCE FOR MINING INDUSTRY

London Comment on Kenya's Finances

MAJOR GROGAN TAKES UP COLONY'S CASE

Letters to "The Times"

The financial predicament of Kenya as an illustration of the problem of the Colonial Empire is attracting increasing attention in Britain.

Major Grogan writing to "The Times" denounces the policy which leads the present generation with the entire costs of colonial development.

The City Editor of the "Daily Express" declares that countries such as Kenya deserve somebody to fight their battles and calls for a reduction in the interest burden.

Burden on Present Generation

[THE STANDARD CORRESPONDENT.]

London Nov. 23. The City Edition of "The Times" says the Kenya deficits call attention to the growing plight of the Colonial Empire in consequence of the fall in prices of primary products and the contraction of international trade.

Kenya will have had deficits for six years, a bleak prospect for a small population.

The proposal to introduce income tax is inopportune and it is certain to be strongly opposed since incomes have been seriously reduced.

The unskilful contrivance of Colonial loans, by which Kenya suffers, cannot be solved by the debtors alone.

Major Grogan

London, Monday. Major Ewart S. Grogan in a letter to "The Times" referring to his Nairobi correspondence in 1929, says that Kenya's debt has risen for six years since 1929 amount to £780,000 points out that the bald statement, though true, may give an entirely false impression of the nature of the Colony's financial malady. ROAD AND WEATHER REPORT

Mr. Galton-Fenzie writes as follows:

Disastrous dry weather still obtains over East Africa, either at two or three isolated towns in Kenya, a couple of towns in Tanganyika and two or three villages in Uganda, where there has been no rain, showers.

In Kenya the wettest place this week was Nakuru with nearly 11 inches followed by Macheloa, Tlaka and parts of Bura with an inch. Makindu with three quarters of an inch, and Makuju and Meru with 6.65 inch each. All the roads are in good to fair condition, except the Kerong Valley road and the Malakoti road.

The Mombasa road is in good condition as is borne out by the performance of Mr. Van Dyk, who covered the 410 miles from Mombasa to Nairobi in 11 hours 21 minutes. This gives an average of about 37 miles an hour, including stops and one puncture delay which cost him half an hour. He told me that at times his speedometer stood steadily at 70 m.p.h. for long stretches.

Tanganyika and Uganda

In Tanganyika the lack of rain is getting more and more serious. The only places to record any appreciable rainfall during the week were Tukuyu with 11 inches, Kigenya with an inch and Tabora with half an inch. Practically all the other reporting stations show a nil return or a negligible amount of rain. All roads are in good to fair condition. In Uganda the weather has been dry this week. Butiaba had a really good downpour of rain which totaled nearly two inches. In other parts of the country showers fell.

The motor rally which is to be held by the Club De Congo Ridge at Cottermanville, and to which members of the Royal East African Automobile Association have been invited, appears to be attracting considerable interest. As mentioned in my last letter to members there will be no coupons for sale other than to be paid, or formalities to be completed, when entering the country.

LEG BEFORE RULE

Three Points to Watch

What Umpire Must Bear in Mind

A Maxim for Every Player

ACCEPT DECISION WITH GOOD HUMOUR

Quite a lot of ink has been spilled over the question of the leg before rule or cricket, but I think the main thing to keep in mind is that the ball must be pitched on the wicket. If the ball pitches off the wicket even if it would have hit the wicket the decision of the umpire must be not out. The umpire has to maintain in his mind's eye two imaginary lines drawn from the outside of the off stump; the ball pitched anywhere between these lines and which would have hit the wicket then an appeal the umpire must give "out". There are three considerations which an umpire must bear in mind: (1) That the ball has hit the wicket? (2) Did it pitch in a straight line between wicket and wicket? (3) Was it not of the batsman's person other than the hand which is holding the ball? If these questions are answered in the affirmative the batsman would be out. It is immaterial whether the ball bounces or not. It is questionable and probably for a bowler looking round the wicket to obtain a leg before wicket decision with a barking umpire. I know that in the opinion of quite a few players, who occasionally umpire during a match in which they were actively engaged are under the impression that the ball which they have hit was the wicket in "not" whether it pitched off the wicket or not. They are not fully acquainted with the rule governing the question.

An Umpire's Association

It seems to me that a very wise course to adopt would be to form an Umpire's Association. A small committee of knowledgeable people well acquainted with all rules, and experienced could sit in judgment on any queries that may arise. They would refer to the Association for their decision. They would also have the honor of the Association. Why not then a cricket umpire's association? Much of the dissatisfaction which has been expressed in cricket circles in the colony has been due to the unsatisfactory practice of drawing upon players engaged in the match. I feel sure that there are many cricket club players who have more or less retired from the game, and would be only too keen and well placed to take up this side of it. They would feel that they had not lost too close a touch but rather had increased it. Until something of the nature is adopted, the satisfaction will continue, and it is spreading a grand game.

Second Day

A few days ago the Advisory Cricket Committee decided that for 1935 season, cricket market, that the laws relating to the leg before rule should be changed to read that a ball pitched outside the off stump, and which in the opinion of the umpire would have hit the wicket should be adjudged as a trial if it is the end of the origin opinion in such cases it is found expedient to refer to the old rule, then this will be done.

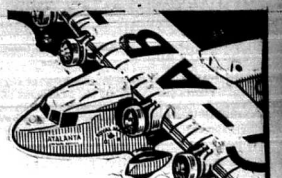

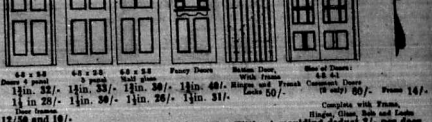
