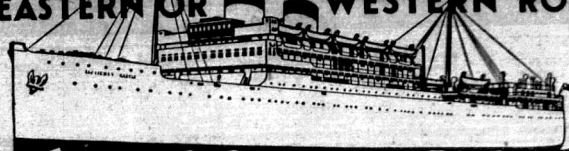

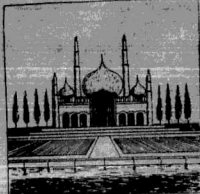

Two and a Half Days to East Africa GOVERNMENT'S PLANS FOR EMPIRE AIR MAIL SERVICE

Three Times a Week AIM TO REDUCE FEES TO ORDINARY POSTAGE RATES

London December 20. Sir Philip Sassoon announced in the House of Commons today his far-reaching scheme for Imperial air mail development. The scheme represents many months of work by the Air Ministry and the Post Office in consultation with Imperial Airways.

The three main features of the scheme are the expediting of time schedules, increased frequency and a provision that all first class mail be carried by air at fees approximately to the present ordinary mail rates. The scheme depends upon the co-operation of Empire governments, so the matter is at present purely provisional.

The new scheme envisages the following schedules— To India Just over two days. To East Africa Two and a half days. To Cape Town Three days. To Australia Seven days.

There will be four or possibly five services weekly to Africa and Australia. There will be four or possibly five services weekly to India, three to Singapore and East Africa and two to South Africa and Australia.

GROUND ORGANISATION

An integral feature of the scheme is a comprehensive programme of development of the ground organisation for Empire air routes embracing the services to be built both to passenger and mail traffic respectively.

Sir Philip Sassoon was able to give further details as to the nature and types of aircraft pending negotiations with the other governments concerned. He was also able to give the date of the inauguration of the scheme, but said the scheme could be brought into full operation, furthermore a three half penny rate would be introduced by 1937.

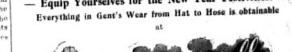

A Method of Producing Proteins

ENSURES A FIRM CARCASE

INTERESTING EXPERIMENTS AT DUTHIE STOCK FARM

The following article by Mr. A. H. Blissett of the Duthie Experimental Stock Farm, Aberdeen, appeared in a recent issue of "The Farmer's Weekly."

Although the article deals with the feeding of pigs in Great Britain the conclusions reached are not without interest to pig breeders in Kenya.

There is reason to believe that an inadequate supply of protein is a common mistake in the feeding of bacon pigs in the Colony.

The value of dairy products as an important source of protein has long been established. No doubt, especially the pig, is a receptive animal to these valuable foods were prepared simply because it was the easiest method of covering unobtainable by products that really cost a great deal less than what they are worth.

There is no doubt that the fresh milk products are highly valuable foods and numerous experiments have demonstrated their value in increasing the growth rate and during the amount of milk required per pig for weight gain. The limited information that is available in what is published in the present article is that the amount of protein in production may be estimated.

Fish Meal Comparison

Whole milk separated milk and fish meal are the three main sources to be compared with each other as regards milk and fish meal. It is possible to compare milk, fish meal and meat and bone meal. On a protein basis, one gallon of milk contains about 1.5 gallons of fish meal. The value of these milk products is worth 0.64 lb. fish meal as that with fish meal costs £18 per ton compared with £12 per ton for milk. The value of fish meal is approximately 1.5 times that of milk. This value does not take into account the special value which fish meal has for breeding and young stock. The health and vigor imparted in the final stages remain throughout the life of the animal and the economical production of milk is difficult to value in the Public Experimental Stock Farm 60 gallons of separated milk daily for 100 pigs during the suckling ones and all pigs under 12 weeks old. The average number of pigs per sow is 10. The average weight of the pig at 12 weeks is 100 lbs. and the average gain in which all the pigs reach 12 weeks is 100 lbs. The gain is less than 200 lbs.

These figures may not be so good as those obtained in more recent experiments but are somewhat higher than the average. If a pig's gains may be taken as a guide, much of these good results must be attributed to the separated milk.

Control by Quota

In the November issue of the "Lloyd's Bank Monthly Review" Professor Lionel Blyden, Professor of Economics in London University, expresses the belief that the complete Socialisation of Agriculture is the ultimate end of the industrial revolution of machine control.

Referring to restriction of production, he writes that, whether importation is free or whether there is a large quota, the restriction of the competitive struggle is continuous apart from fluctuations of quota reduction. Under ordinary regulation of production this control is in the hands of the farmer, and, to quota which is based on his average of a period, rendered more and more into the hands of the State.

He is not permitted to increase his output by lowering his price; whatever his efficiency and his cost of production, he must stick to the figure which secures profits for his competitors. The farmer who does this is not in a position to be replaced by synthetics and it is therefore a pure waste of time for the State to interfere in the industry. It is not, perhaps, a very happy approach to a good job as proposed to lead to a quota of eight million, and had just down 5,000 miles purely to stimulate and encourage the local industry.

Prospects of Flourishing Industry in Kenya

THE BOGEY OF SYNTHETIC SUBSTITUTES

IMPORTANCE OF PURITY AND QUALITY

At a recent meeting of the Dominions and Colonies Section of the Royal Society of Arts, Mr. E. W. Bovill read an interesting paper on "Essential Oils of the Pertumato." Mr. Bovill's paper was devoted to the large perfume industry in Kenya, and the following extracts will be of interest to local producers.

After general references to the industry of Essential Oil Mr. Bovill said: "Before going any further I should like to deal with the question of the replacement of essential oils by synthetic substitutes."

The first time I went to East Africa to a business concern I met a man who assured me that in a few years all essential oils would be replaced by synthetics and it was therefore a pure waste of time for the State to interfere in the industry. It is not, perhaps, a very happy approach to a good job as proposed to lead to a quota of eight million, and had just down 5,000 miles purely to stimulate and encourage the local industry.

Mr. Bovill's attitude is not an uncommon one. Synthetics have for many years been used in Kenya to replace the essential oil world.
