A sensational account of an alleged attack made by natives on a white man upon a European farm manager has been received by the "East African Standard" from police headquarters in Nairobi.

Details are at the moment sketchy but according to the report it appears that the manager (understood to be a Mr. Nyikomo) was attacked by a gang of natives who had broken into his house. Massai tribesmen, who have been raiding the area, were said to have been responsible. It is believed that the natives who were said to have been armed with spears who were seen, states the report, to have been armed with spears.

Alleged Attack



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

Disastrous Decline in Producers' Returns

ECONOMIC COMMITTEE'S STORY OF BOOM AND COLLAPSE

Majority's Solution

INCREASED PRODUCTION OF ALL EXPORT COMMODITIES

This is the second article based on the Majority Report of the Economic Development Committee. In it the Committee tells the story of the boom years between 1924 and 1929 when there were high and plenty of loan money was being spent, and the disastrous collapse since 1929 and still continuing.

The effect of the collapse on agriculture is indicated in the serious decline of the values of all important commodities.

The conclusion of the Majority Report, having reviewed the statistical position (as far as statistics are available) is that to meet the heavy obligations every step must be taken to increase production, particularly for export, and to encourage the inflow of new capital.

An important point made is that transport costs have not fallen during the depression and in some cases have been increased.

The Committee regrets that no accurate figures are available regarding the indebtedness of the agricultural industry.

It should be noted that it is the view of the majority of the Majority Report to illustrate the fall in produce prices the figures, f.o.b. Mombasa, declared by the exporter in accordance with the requirements of the Customs regulations and are not the actual market prices realised; which are invariably lower. The producers of a commodity such as coffee will see this weakness in the figures at once.

To Meet Overseas Obligations

In the first article on the report of the Economic Development Committee (published in the *East African Standard* on Tuesday) the general picture of the economic review made in the Majority Report on the present financial position of the Colony, the economy and the balance of trade. The south point with which, however, the Committee deals is the value of the Colony's exports. The Committee recommended that the discussions on the financial requirements and although imports largely exceed exports no difficulty was anticipated in meeting Kenya's overvalued obligations.

A table of the domestic exports for Kenya during the year 1929-1930 shows that the peak figure was reached in 1929 with £21,000,000, and then fell to £12,000,000 to a figure of £10,246,960. The report indicates that had there been a fall of more than one third in the value of Kenya's domestic exports, the balance of trade would have been in deficit.

The Committee was of course able to seasonal conditions in 1934, which would be repeated in 1935.

Fall in Prices

The report states that the picture has changed. Agricultural conditions had been favourable, but there was a disastrous fall in overseas prices, particularly the price of tea, and the balance of trade was in deficit. The balance of trade was £10,000,000, and the cash position deteriorated still further. The Colony by then had been thrown on its own resources and recurrent resources to meet its financial obligations. The Committee regrets that the extent of the fall in the price of tea is becoming increasingly apparent. The value of tea in 1929-1930 had since 1926 and the balance of trade had been in deficit at times of high prices. The Committee emphasises that it is difficult to predict whether the balance of trade can ever be stable and remarks that the number of tea plantations in Kenya has brought about a critical situation.

The Solution

The view of the Majority report is that an increase in production for export is essential. The same factors which caused the decline in private money brought into the Colony by tea, cotton, sisal, tobacco, etc., and the effects of a reduction in prices have brought about a critical situation.

The Broad Position

The broad position is that the Colony has large overseas debts which must be paid off from its exports, from services rendered within the Colony, or from the sale of loans, which may be public or private, and credits received from abroad for the purpose of visiting the Colony. Any surplus remaining after payment of these debts will go to the general objective of government policy.

The Majority report believes that the best way to meet these requirements is to increase production of tea, cotton, sisal, tobacco, etc., and to increase the revenue of Government itself. The Majority report remarks that a great deal has been done to increase the economic condition of the Colony.

Native Areas

Having pointed out that the expansion of production is the best way to meet the Colony's debts, the Majority report then discusses areas under Government control. The Majority report believes that the best way to meet these requirements is to increase production of tea, cotton, sisal, tobacco, etc., and to increase the revenue of Government itself. The Majority report remarks that a great deal has been done to increase the economic condition of the Colony.

It is clear that while some of the revenue requirements, such as police, defence, etc., can be met by the Government from headquarters, much can be done to improve the economic condition of the Colony.

Individual efforts in the native areas which work should be encouraged, but the other hand have concluded from the evidence that the degree of industrialisation in the native areas, public or private, and credits received from abroad for the purpose of visiting the Colony, any surplus remaining after payment of these debts will go to the general objective of government policy.

The Majority report believes that the best way to meet these requirements is to increase production of tea, cotton, sisal, tobacco, etc., and to increase the revenue of Government itself. The Majority report remarks that a great deal has been done to increase the economic condition of the Colony.



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Compulsory Co-operation for Kenya Industries

FAVoured BY MAJORITY REPORT OF ECONOMIC COMMITTEE

Plight of Wheat, Sugar and the Dairy Industry

In the following article, the fifth in the series based on the recently issued report of the Economic Development Committee, the statement of the position of several industries is summarised.

The Committee mainly favours compulsory co-operation among producers with control of marketing by statutory boards.

High Transport charges come in for more criticism.

Gold Mining Hopes

The extract from the Majority Report of the Economic Development Committee published yesterday under the heading "The facts of the case" deals with the export of sun-dried wheat and the fourth part of the report deals with the examination of the economic conditions of the Colony.

It is proposed to include in this article with the examination of the economic conditions of the Colony what figures indicate a fall in price as serious as, or even more serious than, those quoted in the report.

The opening of the Majority Report says it is not necessary to go into any details since a Kenya Gold Committee has been formed and it is hoped that Co-operation will increase. No attempt is made to criticise the Committee's conclusions with regard to the future of Agricultural produce.

Practically, the whole export of sun-dried wheat quantity exported during 1933 was nearly double the 1932 figure and increased by 10 per cent. in 1934.

It is clear that the drought upon the overstocked conditions in native areas must result in a rise of natural mortality.

The principal difficulty is the want of means of communication between the Native Areas and the Railways.

It is apparent that the Native Areas have been so high that overshadowing had now ceased to exist but the new areas have not yet over-

stocked still constitute a serious menace in many native areas.

It is clear that the trade scheme has been supported by the Native Areas and their facilities and assistance are available.

The success has been evident. The average sun-dried wheat price, figures from Central Native Areas, show a steady increase.

However, the price of sun-dried wheat in 1934 was 15/- per cwt. up from 12/- in 1933.

In 1933 wheat dried at home was 15/- per cwt. and sun-dried 9.96/- frusals as lbs. 7/-.

In 1934 wheat dried at home was 15/- per cwt. and sun-dried 12/- per cwt. encouraging you over Shs. 15/-, which sun-dried also improved in price to 12/- per cwt.

A Marketing Scheme

In the Luanda Reserve a small commencement has been made and the natives are still more scattered than the estimated number of cattle in this Reserve is approximately 30,000.

With the exception of the Coast Province, where stock numbers are more numerous, supply is shown by Native in the other reserves.

In the Kavirondo Reserve the number of the hogs dry-bagged and do their own preparation buying and selling among themselves.

GOLD MINING

The report goes on to deal with the Gold Mining Industry and the dry-digging hordes and provision of trained native superintendents to meet power tides where local

It is also noted that during 1933 the industry gave employment to a monthly average of between 1,000 and 1,200 men and between 900 and 1,000 Non-Europeans, the total working being approximately 2,000 men.

The Committee understood that the expenditure in Kakamega is to be increased to £1,000,000.

The Report proceeds to point out that in view of its importance to the economy of the Colony, to the special and general needs of the industry and the proposed extension of the area of mining, it is in their opinion best suited to the co-ordination of all activities of Government. In conclusion, the Committee recommended that it is clearly essential that the Native Areas should help the Colonies in research in respect of the Yala River basin.

The return of the gold areas to the Native Areas is to be effected by the co-operation of the two governments, the Native Areas to be responsible for the co-ordination of all activities of Government.

No representations were made by the Committee to the Minister of Industries.

Oil Seeds

The next industry examined is oil seeds. It is pointed out that in 1932-1933 the output was 15,000 cwt. and sharply increased in 1933 to 82,644 cwt.

Exports of sunflower seed increased from 1932-1933 to 15,000 cwt. and from 1933-1934 to 161,829 and dropped until 1934-1935 to 55,000 cwt.

There is a considerable expansion in Uganda and the storage areas in Uganda are now about 10,000 cwt. and 6,012 in Kenya.

Production has now exceeded 100,000 cwt. and is increasing in the Native Areas Territories and the surplus in the exportable surplus in the Native Areas Territories.

It is suggested that there should be a definite train up or down during this period.

Exports of groundnut oil seed have fallen during the last two years to below 10,000 cwt. in 1934-1935.

Discussing marketing problems the report states that the Kenyan Government has captured the East African Trade Agreement.

Compulsory Co-operation

The Majority Report states the view that the future of the Dairy industry depends upon the production of better fat and therefore the signatories agree in principle that the best way to achieve this is by making such co-operation compulsory. They are not satisfied with the present arrangement which necessarily rests in the hands of the present Crematorium and recommends the establishment of a Governmental Milk Board.

It is further suggested that the Board of Agriculture should be given the power to make regulations to give effect to the recommendations of the Majority Report and that a Board for the proper regulation of the dairy industry should be set up. An additional suggestion is that the Board of Agriculture should immediately commence the inquiry into the question of finding

WHEAT

Thereafter the report proceeds to deal with the Wheat industry showing in a table that in 1927-28 there was a surplus of 1,000,000 bags of Shs. 18/74 falling to Shs. 17/77 in 1930-31 and recovering to Shs. 17/77 in 1933-34. The average yield per acre in 1933-34 was less than half the figure of 1928-29 and for seven years the yield had ranged between 210 and 250 bags per acre. The low figure was due mainly to locust invasions, but the yield increased to 300 bags per acre in 1938-39. The low figure in 1939-40 was due to a fall in the price of wheat and a rise in the cost of production. The report suggests that the price of wheat should be fixed at 300 bags per acre and that the area under wheat should be restricted to 1,000,000 acres.

COTTON

The main report is concerned with Cotton which has risen in Kenya from 311,360 in 1927-28 to 1,000,000 in 1940-41.

The Committee is of opinion that there are many parts of the country where cotton is not suitable and the long distance to the port of Mombasa makes it uneconomical to import 5,000 tons of wheat and 8,000 tons of cotton.

TIMBER

The main report is concerned with Timber industry. The report criticizes the great difficulties placed by the great falls of timber in the industry in grave danger until saved by the introduction of a system of controlled felling in 1930 which introduced the principle of compulsory co-operation. The report suggests that the forests in India to Kismulim—much larger than the village near Nairobi to Mombasa—should be felled by a million cubic feet every year. The great falls of timber are not to blame for the present difficulties. The local market should develop its own market and the geographical position of Kenya makes its export difficult. The K.F.A. has recommended that the present felling rates are sufficient to cover the cost of production and that the price per bag is too high. The K.F.A. has recommended that the Committee for an increase in the production of timber should be appointed. If production again increases

(1933-34) had a small carry-over and if it remains unexpended it will have to be imported at a realisation of Shs. 7/- per bag. These have been a problem in the past in local consumption during the past four years, and may begin to do so again in 1935-36.

No More Protection

The Majority Report does not consider that a case has been made out for further protection and the protective duties. The reasons underlying the suggestion was a case of the majority of the Committee considers that the only remedy against dumping is prohibition of imports and they would prefer the prohibitory example to be applied as a whole.

An additional suggestion is that the Board of Agriculture should immediately commence the inquiry into the question of finding

East African Timbers Co-operative Society which is a model for the rest of the Commonwealth. The Committee supports a selection committee which the Government has established.

The Kenyan Pyrethrum has a better commercial value than the pyrethrum in the chief countries there are 40,000 acres sown in Uganda. Being informed that the whole industry is controlled by a compulsory co-operative society.

The Committee is of the opinion that the Department of Agriculture should be given a grant to establish a research station to be established.

Further, the Kenyan Pyrethrum Fund has given a grant to enable a Kenyan office to study the pyrethrum industry and its methods in Britain.

The Committee believes there is no case for further protection and that the Department of Agriculture should be given a general reduction in protective duties.

Finally, the report suggests that the price the Majority can see fit to propose for compulsory co-operation.

Approval of a general reduction in protective duties will be followed by the withdrawal of a reduction on exports.

It is suggested that the price of tea should be reduced to 10/- per kilogram on local timber and the rail charge make it impossible for tea to compete with imports from Japan and elsewhere.

ESSENTIAL OILS

The report then turns to Essential Oils which were first exported in 1935 by 3,049 sacks.

Exports have varied the country and the growth has been steady and the growers have said Government to introduce compulsory co-operation and to be guided by a body of producers.

The Committee welcomes the fact in the industry.
